ROAD WARRIORS - Notre Dame players typically hit for a higher average in the home confines of Eck Stadium but two 2005 starters hit at a higher clip on the road during the ' 05 season ... current senior RF/C Cody Rizzo hit . 244 at Eck but 34 points higher (.278) in all road games during the ' 05 season ... current $2 B$ Ross Brezovsky hit 29 points higher on the road (.262) than at home (.233) in 2005.

LANGFORD LOST FOR SEASON AFTER ELBOW SURGERY - Notre Dame sophomore Tony Langford - who was poised to be a valuable two-way player for the Irish in 2005 - will be lost for the season after undergoing reconstructive "Tommy John" elbow surgery on Feb. 22 ... Langford was in line to be on the top late-game righthanded relievers for the Irish and also figured to be heavily in the mix as a righthanded-hitting DH.

VETERAN UNIT - Notre Dame's 2006 opening-day lineup includes six seniors, a junior and two sophomores ... it marks just the third time in the 12-year Paul Mainieri era (and only second time since his first season at ND, in '95) that the Irish have not featured at least one position starter:

THORNTON'S SITUATIONAL PITCHING - Allowed 41\% of leadoff batters to reach (avg. of 3.8 per 9 IP) in 2005 while allowing opponents to hit .318 with runners on base but just .243 with 2 outs ... totaled nearly the same number of groundouts (120) and flyouts (106) in '05 ... averaging team-best 6.0 IP per start ... his 9 -inning averages included 3.8 Ks , 1.8 walks, 10.8 hits allowed and 11.3 groundouts ... LH batters hit 311 vs. him in '05 (. 304 by RH batters).

GAME-1 STARTER - Nearly half of Thornton's starts in '05 were in the first game of a series/tournament, etc. (listed above, vs. Dayton, A\&M, Georgetown, Rutgers, Villanova, Cleveland State, BC in the BET and UNC in the NCAAs) ... Thornton met with mixed results in those games, compiling a $3-3$ record, $18 \mathrm{Ks}, 12$ walks and 61 hits allowed in 47.1 innings (his only 2 WP of the season also came in game-1 starts) ... his most impressive game-1 outing in ' 05 came in the Friday-night opener vs. Villanova at Eck Stadium (9 IP, 2 R, 10 H, BB, $2 \mathrm{Ks}, 5-2$ win).

BIG GAME PITCHER - Tom Thornton made a name for himself as a big-game pitcher during the 2004 season, capped by a stellar outing vs. Kent State in an NCAA elimination game (career-high 12 Ks in $8.1 \mathrm{IP}, 3 \mathrm{H}, \mathrm{R}, 2 \mathrm{BB}, 29 \mathrm{BF} / 4$ over min.) ... Thornton took a no-hitter into the 5th inning of that game and 21 of his 25 outs came via Ks, groundouts (7) or infield popups (2) as he allowed just six balls to leave the infield (two through the left side) ... he located nearly $70 \%$ of his pitches for strikes (81 of 118), allowed just two leadoff batters to reach, held Kent State to 2-for-8 batting with runners on and allowed no 2-out hits (0-for-8) ... Thornton's six career postseason appearances (BIG EAST and NCAA) include a 3.50 ERA, 2-1 record (4 GS) and better than a 4-to-1 K-to-walk ratio (21/5) with nearly as many IP (28.1) as hits allowed (29).

TALL TOM TERRIFIC - Senior LHP Tom Thornton in 2005 becaome the first pitcher in the Paul Mainieri era (since '95) to toss three consecutive 9 -inning complete-game victories (vs. Boston College, UConn and Villanova) ... Thornton's season ERA dropped from 5.59 to 3.84 during that stretch of three straight 9-inning CGs.

LEADER OF THE PACK - Thornton was the season-long leader of a 2005 ND pitching staff that coped with the departure of three key regulars (Grant Johnson, Chris Niesel and Joe Thaman) and the injury limitations of three other pitchers (Jeff Manship, John Axford and Jess Stewart).

DON'T WALK - Thornton entered the 2005 postseason with just 2 walks in his previous 47.1 IP (avg. of 0.38 BB per 9 IP in those 7 GP) ... he did issue a pair of walks in the BET vs. Boston College (none in NCAAs vs. UNC) and ultimately totaled just 19 walks in 96 IP of the '05 season (1.78 BB per 9 IP) ... his career avg. of 2.05 walks per 9 IP ranks 7th in the ND record book (3rd-best in the Mainieri era):

HOME BOY - Tom Thornton posted a 4-0 record and 2.25 in 2005 home games ( $15 \mathrm{Ks}, 5 \mathrm{BB}, 38 \mathrm{H} / .277$ opp. avg. in 36 IP) but he went just 2-6 with a 6.15 ERA in all '05 road games ( $25 \mathrm{Ks}, 14 \mathrm{BB}, 77 \mathrm{H}$ in 60 IP ).

AMONG THE BIG EAST'S BEST - Thornton led 2005 BIG EAST pitchers in starts (16), also ranking 2nd in innings (96), 6th in complete games (4) and 10th in wins (6-6) ... in BIG EAST games only, he finished 13th among the league's pitchers with a 2.83 ERA, also ranking 4th in wins (5-2) and 5th in innings (54.1).

JUST THE STATS - Thornton led the '05 staff in starts (16) and innings (96), also 2nd in wins (6) and 4th in Ks (40) ... situationally, he led the staff in groundouts (120) and IP per outing (6.0), also 2nd in low walks per 9 IP (1.8), 3rd in groundouts per 9 IP (11.3) and 4th in opp. 2-out batting (.243).

SEASON RECAP - Thornton bounced back from a 1-3 start to win 4-of-5 decisions in '05 ... his top '05 outings included a no-decision at UCF ( $5 \mathrm{IP}, 5 \mathrm{H}, \mathrm{R}, 3 \mathrm{BB}, 3 \mathrm{Ks}$ ), 9-inning CG wins vs. BC (3-2; $8 \mathrm{H}, 1 \mathrm{ER}, 5 \mathrm{Ks}$ ), UConn (7-1; $6 \mathrm{H}, 4 \mathrm{Ks}$ ) and Villanova (5-2; $10 \mathrm{H}, \mathrm{BB}, 2 \mathrm{Ks}$ ), and the win over WVU in the final series ( $5-1 ; 6 \mathrm{IP}, 7 \mathrm{H}, \mathrm{R}, \mathrm{BB}, \mathrm{K}$ ) ... he was in line to win the BET opener vs. Boston College but the bullpen lost the lead before the Irish rallied to win, 6-5.

STEADY STARTER - Thornton in 2005 became just the seventh ND pitcher to start 16-plus games in a season (four have started 17-plus), with the others including fellow LHPs Tom Price, Chris Michalak and Tim Kalita, plus RHPs Brian Piotrowicz, Eric Madsen, Alex Shilliday ... Thornton also is one of six ND pitchers ever to log 15-plus starts in multiple seasons (also 15 in '04), joining Price, Madsen, Michalak and RHPs Pat Leahy and Chris Niesel in that distinction .. Thornton also is one of 13 all-time ND pitchers to post 20-plus wins in their career:

ALL-CONFERNCE (finally) - Tom Thornton's all-BIG EAST honors in 2005 (2nd team) ostensibly arrived a year late, as he turned in a more consistent and statistically impressive season in 2004 (when he was overlooked even for 3rd team allBIG EAST) ... he is the 10th different Notre Dame pitcher to earn all-BIG EAST honors, joining a group that includes current big-leaguers Aaron Heilman (2nd team in '98; 1st team in '99-'01; '00 and '01 pitcher of the year) and Brad Lidge (1st team/pitcher of the year in '98) ... others who have been all-BIG EAST include (all RHPs): Darin Schmalz (2nd team in '96 and '97), Danny Tamayo (1st team, '01), J.P. Gagne (3rd team in '01 and '03), Chris Niesel (1st team/pitcher of the year in '03, 2nd team in '04), Grant Johnson (1st team, '04) and Ryan Doherty (2nd team, '04).


Opening Week - a .296 career batter in opening-week games, with a pair of home runs and 12 runs scored ( 8 -for- $27,4 \mathrm{RBI}$, 3B, 2B, 4 BB, $7 \mathrm{Ks}, 0-1 \mathrm{SB}$ ).

Home \& Away - hit 34 points higher in '05 home games (.250, 9-for-36, $9 \mathrm{RBI}, 8 \mathrm{R}, \mathrm{HR}, 3 \mathrm{~B}, 32 \mathrm{~B}, 8 \mathrm{BB}, 4 \mathrm{Ks}$ ) than in all road games (. 216 , 17 -for- 74 , 16 RBI, $19 \mathrm{R}, 4 \mathrm{HR}, 52 \mathrm{~B}, 12 \mathrm{BB}, 6 \mathrm{HBP}, 18 \mathrm{Ks}$ ) ... 4 of his $5 \mathrm{HRs}, 16$ of 25 RBI in ' 05 came on road ... 11 of his 17 career HRs have come outside of Eck Stadium ... hit well on the road in 2004 (.317, 3 HR, 21 RBI, 20 BB ).

2005 Team Ranks - finished 3rd on team in slugging pct. (.455), 4th in home runs (5) and 5th in walks (21).
Situational Summary - ranked 7th on 2005 team in 2-out RBI (11) ... his junior-year totales included a . 286 leadoff on-base pct. while batting .220 with runners in scoring position and .275 with 2 outs ... hit . 238 in '05 vs. RHPs and . 182 vs. LHPs (1-for3 with the bases loaded; delivered RBI 5-of-10 times with runners on 3rd and fewer than 2 outs).

Lineup Notes - slated to open 2006 season batting in cleanup spot (he hit in the 4th spot 27 times in his first three seasons) ... his ' 05 starts included 18 in LF, 9 as DH, 1 at C (owns 59 career starts in LF) ... made 13 starts in ' 05 as cleanup batter, with other starts in the 3rd (8), 5th (4), 7th (2) and 8th (1) spots.

A Little Extra - totaled more extra-base hits (14; $5 \mathrm{HR}, 3 \mathrm{~B}, 82 \mathrm{~B}$ ) than singles (12) in the 2005 season ... his career totals include 61 singles and 47 extra-base hits ( $17 \mathrm{HR}, 73 \mathrm{~B}, 232 \mathrm{~B}$ ).

Milestone Watch - enters 2006 season eight runs shy of 100 for his career.
Plate Discipline - ranked 5th on 2005 team with a +6 plate-discipine ratio (19 BB $+6 \mathrm{HBP}-19 \mathrm{Ks}$ ).
At the 2005 BIG EAST Tournament - hit team-best 4-for-9 in 3 GP/2 GS (4 RBI, HR, 2 2B, 2 R, HBP, 2 Ks ), boosting his season batting avg. from . 203 to .223 ... led off top of the 9 th inning with pinch-hit single as Irish scored twice to claim 6-5 lead and win over BC in BET opener ... smacked 2 -run HR the next day for 3-0 lead in winners-bracket game vs. Pitt (4-2) ... closed with pair of doubles (one a 2-run hit) and scored a run vs. the Panthers in 11-4 title game ... now is a . 345 career hitter at the BET (10-for-29, 10 RBI, 7 R, HR, 3B, 5 2B, $5 \mathrm{BB}, 2 \mathrm{HBP}, 8 \mathrm{Ks}, \mathrm{E}$ ), well above his overall .279 career batting avg.

In '05 BIG EAST Play - hit . 148 in $12 \mathrm{GP} / 7 \mathrm{GS}$ (4-for-27, $5 \mathrm{RBI}, 6 \mathrm{R}, 32 \mathrm{~B}, 7 \mathrm{BB}, 4 \mathrm{Ks}, \mathrm{SF}$ ) ... a . 282 career hitter in all games vs. BIG EAST teams (44-for-156, 36 RBI, 5 HR).

In a Pinch - owns . 407 career batting avg. as a pinch-hitter (11-for-27), including 3-for-6 in '05 (rest of team is 7-for-27/.259).
Left-Coast Lounge - one of three California natives who patrol the Notre Dame outfield (also junior Danny Dressmman from San Jose and senior RF Cody Rizzo from Temecula).

Generation Gap - 4th-generation ND student who combines with William Andres as first great-grandfather and great-grandson ever to monogram with ND baseball program ... William Anddres was a catcher on the 1916-18 teams (his teammates included future ND Hall-of-Fame coach Jake Kline) and he also was a right end on the Knute Rockne-coached 1917 football team.

Opening Week - saw limited duty in opening-week games his first two seasons (2-for-5, R, 2 Ks ), suffering broken hand after being hit-by-pitch on first trip to the plate in 2005

Home and Away - hit 77 points higher in '05 home games (.345, 19-for-55, 11 RBI, 6 R, 4 2B, $6 \mathrm{BB}, 5 \mathrm{HBP}, 7 \mathrm{Ks}, \mathrm{SAC}$, SB, E) than on the road (.268, 11-for-41, $5 \mathrm{RBI}, 8 \mathrm{R}, 2 \mathrm{2B}, 4 \mathrm{BB}, 2 \mathrm{HBP}, 10 \mathrm{Ks}, \mathrm{SAC}, 2 \mathrm{SF}$ ) ... had solid . 306 batting avg. in 2004 road games ( $7 \mathrm{HR}, 30 \mathrm{RBI}$ ).

(.542), and 4th in batting with runners on (.321) ... hit . 286 in ' 05 with 2 outs, 2-for- 8 (.250) with the bases loaded ... delivered RBI 7-of-10 times with runners on 3rd and fewer than 2 outs.
