RETURN TO THE JOE: Notre Dame returns to Joe Louis Arena and the CCHA Championship weekend after missing last year's festivities. The Irish have now played in Detroit in four of the last five seasons, winning the championship in 2007 and 2009 while finishing fourth in 2008. All-time, this marks Notre Dame's ninth trip to Joe Louis Arena for the CCHA championships in the 18th year that the Irish have been part of the CCHA. They advanced in 1982, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2007, 2008 and 2009. Notre Dame advanced to this year's championship by defeating Lake Superior State, two games to one, in the best-of-three second round last weekend. The Irish won the opening game, 3-2 in overtime, then lost game two, 4-3, before winning the third contest, 4-2. Notre Dame is now 23-11-5 overall and 8-2-2 in the last 12 games, dating back to Jan. 22. Miami comes into Friday's semifinal game with a 21-9-6 overall record. The RedHawks are 8-0-3 in their last 11 games since Jan. 22. The winner of the Notre Dame-Miami semifinal game will play the winner of the Michigan-Western Michigan game at 7:35 p.m. on Saturday, March 19. The two losers play for third place at 3:35 p.m. on Saturday.

IRISH VERSUS REDHAWKS: The two teams have met 61 times in the all-time series with Miami holding a 35-16-10 advantage. On neutral ice, the two teams have met three times with Miami winning all three games. The teams have met in the CCHA postseason twice for a total of four games. In 2002-03, the Irish won a three-game series at Miami, 2-1, to advance to Joe Louis Arena and in 2007-08, the teams met in the semifinals at the Joe with the RedHawks taking a 2-1 overtime win. This season, the teams met four times with the series being even, 1-1-2. On Dec. 3-4 at Miami, the teams split with the Irish winning 5-4 in the first game and Miami taking the second, 5-2. On Jan. 28-29 at the Joyce Center, the teams played to a pair of ties. On Jan. 28, it was a 5-5 tie with Miami winning the shootout, 3-2. The following night, the teams played to a 2-2 tie with the Irish taking the shoot out, 1-0.

IRISH VERSUS WOLVERINES: The Irish have faced Michigan more than any other team in the program's history as the teams have met 124 times. The Wolverines have a 69-50-5 advantage in the series and are 8-4-0 against the Irish on neutral ice. Notre Dame has played Michigan six times in the postseason, meeting in four series and two CCHA championship games. The Irish won one series (1981-82) and both of the championship games (2007, 2009). Overall, Michigan has a 6-5 lead in CCHA postseason games against Notre Dame. The teams met twice in November with the Irish winning 3-1 and Michigan taking a 5-3 win the second night.

IRISH VERSUS BRONCOS: Notre Dame and Western Michigan have met 76 times in the series with the Broncos leading, 38-31-7. On neutral ice, the Broncos are 1-0 versus the Irish. The teams have met twice in CCHA playoff action with each team winning a series. In 1993-94, the Broncos swept the Irish, 2-0 and in 2003-04, Notre Dame took a 2-1 series to advance to the Joe. The Broncos are 3-2 versus the Irish in the postseason. This year, the teams met four times with Notre Dame winning the series, 2-1-1. On Oct. 29, the Irish won 3-2 at the Joyce Center and the two teams tied in Kalamazoo the following night, 2-2, with Notre Dame winning the shootout. On Feb. 25 at Lawson Arena, Notre Dame took a 3-2 decision and the following night in South Bend dropped a 2-0 game to the Broncos.

THE RANKINGS: Four of the top 12 teams in the nation will meet in this weekend's CCHA Championship. Notre Dame enters its game with Miami, ranked eighth in both the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* poll and the USCHO.com poll. Miami is ranked sixth in both polls while Michigan is fourth and Western Michigan is 12th.

LAKE SUPERIOR STATE RECAP:

Game 3 - March 13 - Notre Dame scored three times in the first period and made it stand up on the way to a 4-2 win over Lake Superior State in game three of the second round series. The win sends Notre Dame on to the CCHA Championships at Joe Louis Arena. **Riley Sheahan (So., St. Catharines, Ont.), Jeff Costello (Fr., Milwaukee, Wis.), Joe Lavin (Sr., Shrewsbury, Mass.)** and **Bryan Rust (Fr., Novi, Mich.)** scored for the Irish while the Lakers got goals from Fred Cassiani and Colin Campbell in the loss. The Irish out shot Lake Superior, 28-15, in the game. Sheahan gave Notre Dame the early lead, netting his fourth of the season, just 3:14 into the contest. Costello made it 2-0, 22 seconds later when he slapped a shot past Laker goaltender Kevin Kapalka from the top of the left circle for his 11th of the season. Lavin closed out the first period with a power-play goal that proved to be the game winner at 19:17. In the second period, Cassiani got Lake Superior on the scoreboard with a goal at 17:19 on the power play. Rust answered that with his sixth of the season, on a highlight reel goal at 18:00. Campbell scored 42 seconds later at 18:42 for his fourth of the season to make it 4-2 but that would be it for the scoring. **Mike Johnson (So, Verona, Wis.)** stopped 13-of-15 shots for the win. Kapalka had 24 saves for the Lakers.

Game 2 - March 12 - Lake Superior State got two goals from Fred Cassiani, including the game winner at 7:40 of the third period and goaltender Kevin Kapalka made 37 saves as the Lakers defeated Notre Dame, 4-3, in game two of the series to even it at 1-1. The Irish had 2-0 and 3-2 leads in the game but could not hold them. **T.J. Tynan (Fr., Orland Park, Ill.)** and **Nick Larson (So., Apple Valley, Minn.)** scored 1:20 apart in the first period for a 2-0 lead. Kellan Lain scored on the power play for the Lakers at 18:37 of the first to cut the lead to 2-1. Cassiani would tie the game with his first of the night at 16:07 of the second stanza only to see **Calle Ridderwall (Sr., Stockholm, Sweden)** get the lead back for the Irish 23 seconds later at 16:30 with his 13th goal of the season. Chad Nehring answered back at 18:55 for the Lakers to send the game to the second intermission tied at 3-3. That set up Cassiani's game winner at 7:40. The two teams traded 79 shots with the Irish having a 40-39 edge. **Mike Johnson** made 35 saves in the loss for Notre Dame.

Game 1 - March 11 - Freshman **Jeff Costello** scored at 4:52 of overtime to give Notre Dame a 3-2 win over Lake Superior in game one of the series on Saturday night. Costello, who also had two assists for a career-high three-point game, whipped a shot/pass from the left boards that found its way past Lakers' goaltender Kevin Kapalka for his 10th of the season. Fellow freshmen **T.J. Tynan** and **Anders Lee (Edina, Minn.)** also scored for the Irish. Chad Nehring and Rick

Schofield had Lake Superior's goals. Tynan gave Notre Dame a 1-0 lead at 6:48 of the first period scoring a power-play goal, his 20th goal of the season. Nehring answered with a Laker power-play tally at 9:28 of the second period when he tucked the rebound of a Fred Cassiani shot past Irish goaltender **Mike Johnson** for his seventh of the year. Lake Superior took the lead at 11:14 when Schofield lifted a back hander from the low slot past Johnson's glove for his 17th and a 2-1 lead. Notre Dame was able to tie the game at 17:42 with Lee getting his team-high 22nd goal of the season to make it 2-2. In the OT, defenseman **Joe Lavin** picked up a loose puck at center and carried it in to the Lakers' zone, leaving a pass for Costello. The freshman left wing carried down the left boards and threw a shot at the net that went in to give the Irish the win. Notre Dame out shot Lake Superior, 37-26 in the game. Kapalka finished with 34 saves while Johnson had 24. Both teams were 1-for-5 on the power play.

THE LAST TIME: Prior to **Jeff Costello** scoring in overtime to defeat Lake Superior in game one of the second round series, the last time a Notre Dame player scored in overtime in the postseason was April 10, 2008 when **Calle Ridderwall** scored in overtime to beat Michigan, 5-4, in the Frozen Four semifinal game in Denver, Colo. Ridderwall was a freshman that season.

CAPTAIN CLUTCH: Mild-mannered team captain **Joe Lavin** had two points in the series versus Lake Superior State, scoring a goal with an assist. Both proved to be important points. In the 3-2 overtime win in game one, Lavin picked up a loose puck in the neutral zone and drove into the Lake Superior zone, leaving a drop pass for Jeff Costello. Costello fired a shot on goal that eluded goaltender Kevin Kapalka for the game winner. In Sunday's game three win, Lavin scored on the power play in the first period for the eventual game winner in the 4-2 win.

THE KIDS ARE ALRIGHT: Notre Dame's freshman class has played a key role in Notre Dame's success this season. The "rookies" accounted for two goals and three assists in the 4-2 win in game three of the series with Lake Superior. In the three games, they had six goals and 10 assists for 16 points. Through 39 games, the freshman class has accounted for 76 of the team's 138 goals (55.1%), 117 of the 242 assists (48.3%) and 193 of team's 384 points this season (50.3%). Freshman goaltender **Steven Summerhays** has five of the team's 23 wins in goal.

CLOSE ONES: With the 4-2 win over Lake Superior State in game three of the second round series, Notre Dame added to its list of wins in close games. So far this year, the Irish have played in 13 games decided by one goal and a total of 21 decided by two goals or less. In one-goal games, Notre Dame is 8-5 for the year. In the 21 "close" games, the Irish are 14-7 on the year, going 6-2 in games decided by two goals.

40 AND OVER: With a goal and an assist in the 3-2 win over Lake Superior on March 11, freshman center **T.J. Tynan** now has the third-best freshman season in the 43-year history of the Irish hockey program. His 21 goals and 28 assists give him 49 points on the season and move him past **Paul Regan '74**, who had 47 in his freshman year. Only **Dave Poulin '82** and **John Noble '74**, who had 59-point seasons are ahead of Tynan. He is the first Irish freshman to record over 40 points in his rookie year since the 2006-07 season when **Ryan Thang '10** finished that year with 41 points. Fellow freshman **Anders Lee** joined him as the 12th Irish freshman to reach 40 points as he now has 41 points on 22 goals and 19 assists. Lee and Tynan are just the eighth and ninth Notre Dame freshmen to score 20 or more goals in a season. Lee's 22 goals are the sixth-best rookie goal-scoring mark.

DYNAMIC DUO: With **T.J. Tynan** scoring his 21st goal in Saturday's 4-3 loss to Lake Superior, the Irish have two, 20-goal scorers (**Anders Lee - 22**) for the first time since the 1990-91 season. That year, **Lou Zadra '92** had 24 goals and **Mike Curry '92** added 20 for the Irish. Lee's 22 goals are the most by a Notre Dame player since **Aniket Dhadphale '99** scored 25 during the 1997-98 season. Tynan's 49 points are the most for an Irish player since the 1991-92 season when **Curtis Janicke '93** scored 50 points.

THE COACH AND THE PLAYOFFS: Irish head coach **Jeff Jackson** has had his share of success in the CCHA playoffs. In his 11 previous CCHA seasons (six at Lake Superior State and five at Notre Dame), Jackson is 36-10 (.783) in conference postseason play. At Lake Superior, his teams were 24-2 while at Notre Dame, he is 12-8. His teams have advanced to the finals in 10 of the 12 seasons (six at LSSU and four at Notre Dame). In those previous 11 seasons, his teams won six CCHA titles (four at LSSU and two at Notre Dame).

IRISH CCHA PLAYOFF HISTORY: The Irish have played 56 games in CCHA playoff history and are 25-31 in those games. Notre Dame was swept in the opening round last season at Ohio State. Under coach Jeff Jackson, the Irish are 12-8 in the CCHA postseason, winning the championship in 2007 and 2009.

EXTRA HOCKEY: The overtime tie with Lake Superior on March 11 was the sixth overtime game of the year for Notre Dame (1-0-5) and the first overtime win for the Irish since Nov. 27, 2009 when they knocked off Bowling Green, 2-1. It also extend the Irish unbeaten streak in overtime games to 20 as they are now 4-0-16 in games that need extra time. The last time that Notre Dame lost in overtime was on March 21, 2008, a 2-1 overtime loss to Miami at the CCHA semifinals. During the '09-'10 season, the Irish were involved in nine overtime contests, finishing 1-0-8 in those games.

THE PUCK STOPS HERE: During Notre Dame's last 12 games, the Irish have gone 8-2-2, since Jan. 22. Sophomore netminder **Mike Johnson** has appeared in nine of the 12 games, making seven starts and is 6-1-1 with a 2.16 goals-against average and a .918 save percentage. On the season, Johnson is 18-8-4 on the year with a 2.48 goals against average and a .907 save percentage. His 18 wins are a career high for the sophomore puck stopper. Behind Johnson is freshman **Steven Summerhays (Anchorage, Alaska)** who has played in four of the nine games and is 2-1-1 with a 2.05 goals-against average and a .907 save percentage. His four-game streak started on Jan. 29 in a 2-2 tie with Miami. In that game, he made just 13 saves, but in the shootout, stopped three of the nation's top scorers - Andy Miele, Carter Camper and Reilly Smith - to earn

the Irish the extra point in the standings. For the year, Summerhays has played in 10 games, making nine starts. His is 5-3-1 with a 3.14 goals-against average and a .859 save percentage.

POSTSEASON HONORS: The CCHA began handing out its postseason awards lastweek. Freshmen **T.J. Tynan** and **Anders Lee** were unanimous selections to the CCHA all-rookie team. Defenseman **Stephen Johns (Wampum, Pa.)** was honorable mention. Senior left wing **Calle Ridderwall** was Notre Dame's choice for the CCHA all-academic team. He is now one of 11 candidates for the CCHA's Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Tynan and Lee also were chosen second team all-CCHA. Defenseman **Sam Calabrese (So., Park Ridge, Ill.)** was an honorable mention all-CCHA selection and senior right wing **Ryan Guentzel (Woodbury, Minn.)** was the only other Notre Dame player to receive votes. Three members of the Irish hockey program are finalists for the CCHA's major awards. Freshman **T.J. Tynan** is one of three candidates for the rookie of the year award. Defenseman **Sean Lorenz (Jr., Littleton, Colo.)** is one of three finalists for the league's best defensive, defenseman award and coach **Jeff Jackson** is a finalist for coach of the year honors.

NATIONAL LEADERS: Freshman center **T.J. Tynan** enters the CCHA playoffs ranked ninth in the nation in scoring with 21 goals and 28 assists for 49 points. Fellow freshman **Anders Lee** is tied for 24th in the nation in points (40) and is tied for ninth with 22 goals.

MR. CLUTCH: Freshman left wing **Anders Lee** has had a banner freshman year for the Irish in 2010-11. He leads the team with 22 goals and is tied for the team lead with six power-play goals. His six game winners are tops on the team and tie him for first in the CCHA and fourth on the national level.

ROAD WARRIORS: Notre Dame's sweep at Ferris State was the second road sweep for the Irish this season (Jan. 7-8 at Northern Michigan) and the 3-2 win at Western Michigan (2/25) improved them to 9-5-2 on the road. A year ago, Notre Dame was 3-10-4 away from the Joyce Center. The Irish are 6-1-0 in their last five road games, dating back to Jan. 7th versus Northern Michigan. At home this season, Notre Dame is 13-4-2.

COMEBACK KID: Sophomore defenseman **Sam Calabrese** leads Notre Dame defensemen in scoring with six goals and 12 assists for 18 points. As a freshman in 2009-10, Calabrese saw action in just three games all season, suffering a broken leg on Dec. 4, 2009 at Miami. Of Calabrese's six goals this season, two have come short-handed. He is second on the team with a +24 and capped his great comeback year by being named honorable mention all-CCHA for the '10-'11 campaign.

CCHA ROOKIE OF THE MONTH: Freshman left wing **Anders Lee** was selected as the CCHA rookie of the month for February. During the month, Lee helped the Irish to a 5-1-0 record while leading all CCHA freshmen in scoring with three goals and four assists for seven points in six games. Lee has been named the CCHA rookie of the month three times this season. Among his three goals were two game winners and one power-play goal.

20-WIN SEASON: Notre Dame enters the CCHA Championships with a 23-11-5 record, an improvement of 10 wins from last season's 13-17-8 record. The 20-win season is the 11th in the 43-year history of the program. Notre Dame has now won at least 20 games in four of the last five years. The 23 wins are the fifth-highest total for the Irish.

STREAK ENDER: Notre Dame's 2-0 loss to Western Michigan (2/26) in the regular-season finale was the first shutout against the Irish in a year and a day. The previous shutout came on Feb. 25, 2010 when Michigan blanked Notre Dame, 4-0, in Ann Arbor. The loss also snapped a five-game Irish winning streak that started on Feb. 11 and an eight-game (6-0-2) unbeaten streak that began on Jan. 22. Both of those streaks were the longest of the season for Notre Dame. The eight-game unbeaten streak was the longest for the Irish since they ran off 10 straight wins from Feb. 13 through March 21, 2009.

CCHA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK: Freshman goaltender **Steven Summerhays** was named CCHA rookie of the week for games played the week of Feb. 14. Summerhays stopped a career-high 29 shots in Notre Dame's 5-2 win over Ferris State on Feb. 19. The two goals he allowed were power-play goals. With the win, Summerhays is now 2-0-1 in his last three starts with a 1.62 goals-against and a .917 save percentage. Summerhays joins **T.J. Tynan (Orland Park, Ill.)** who has been selected four times, **Anders Lee (Edina, Minn.)**, a three-time selection and **Mike Voran (Livonia, Mich.)** as Notre Dame players selected as CCHA rookies of the week this season.

IN GOOD COMPANY: For the past seven weeks, the Notre Dame hockey team has been in good company with the Notre Dame men's and women's basketball teams. All three programs are ranked in the top 10 in the nation in their respective polls, making Notre Dame the only school in the country with a top 10 program in all three sports. The Irish hockey team is ranked eighth in both the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* and USCHO.com polls. With a 26-6 overall record, the Irish men's basketball team entered the week ranked fifth in the *Associated Press* poll and the ESPN/*USA Today* rankings. The Notre Dame women's team is 26-7 and ranked ninth in the *Associated Press* poll and seventh in the ESPN/*USA Today* rankings. The week of Jan. 31, 2010 marked the first time since Dec. 9, 2002 that both basketball programs were ranked in the top 10 at the same time.

PUT THE BISCUIT IN THE BASKET: Notre Dame is fourth in the nation in goals scored with 138 through 39 games of the season. The Irish trail North Dakota (159), Union College (144) and Boston College (139). Per game, Notre Dame is 10th overall with a 3.54 average. Yale is tops in the nation with 4.25 per game. The 3.54 goals-per-game is the most for the Irish since 1990-91 when they averaged 4.06 per game.

FABULOUS FRESHMEN: Freshmen **T.J. Tynan** and **Anders Lee** come into the series against Western Michigan ranked first and second in the nation and the CCHA in rookie scoring. Tynan has 21 goals and 28 assists for 49 points while Lee has 22 goals and 19 assists for 41 points. The 22 goals are tops among freshmen goal scorers in the conference. Fellow freshman **Mike Voran** (4g, 15a, 19 pts) is seventh and is followed by **Jeff Costello** (11g, 6a, 17 pts) and **Bryan Rust** (6g, 11a) who are tied eighth with 17 points. Defenseman **Stephen Johns** is tied for 19th with 12 points (1g, 11a) and center **David Gerths** (8g, 3a, 11pts) and defenseman **Kevin Lind** (1g, 10a) each have 11 points. Costello's 11 goals rank him fifth among league freshmen.

HOBEY BAKER NOMINEE: Freshman center **T.J. Tynan** is one of 68 Division I college hockey players that have been nominated for the 2011 Hobey Baker Award. The first phase of the voting is now underway at hobeybakeraward.com. The fan voting phase will run through March 6. On March 17, the list of 10 finalists will be announced followed by the Hobey Hat Trick (3 finalists) on March 31. The winner of the award will be announced at the Frozen Four on April 8. Award criteria include candidates emulating the exceptional character traits exhibited by the award's namesake, Hobey Baker, a World War I flying star better known as America's greatest amateur athlete in his day. Award candidates must demonstrate strength of character both on and off the ice, contribute to the integrity of his team and display outstanding skills in all phases of the game. Consideration should be given to scholastic achievement and sportsmanship.

FATHER'S DAY GIFTS ... When Notre Dame and Miami settled for 5-5 and 2-2 ties at the Joyce Center on Jan. 28-29, it marked the first time that the Irish had back-to-back ties in a weekend series since Nov. 6-7, 1987 when they battled Kent State to 5-5 and 6-6 ties.

SHORT-HAND SUCCESS: Freshman left wing **Anders Lee** scored Notre Dame's 12th short-handed goal of the season in the Jan. 14, 2-1 win over Alaska. The 12 short-handed goals are tied for tops in the nation with Boston College. With his goal, Lee became the ninth Notre Dame player to get a short-handed goal this season. Defensemen **Joe Lavin (Sr., Shrewsbury, Mass.)** and **Sam Calabrese** join **T.J. Tynan** with two each while Lee, **Bryan Rust (Fr., Novi, Mich.)**, **Riley Sheahan**, **Ryan Guentzel (Sr., Woodbury, Minn.)**, **Billy Maday** and **Sean Lorenz (Jr., Littleton, Colo.)** all have one each. The 12 short-handed goals are the most for the Irish since setting a school record with 19 during the 1981-82 season.

JOIN THE CLUB: Senior center **Ben Ryan** is on the verge of becoming the 46th player in the history of the Notre Dame hockey program to score 100 or more points in his career. Going into the series with Bowling Green, Ryan needs just four more points to reach the "Century Club" as he has 35 goals and 61 assists for 96 points in 154 career games. Following Ryan, senior **Calle Ridderwall** also has a shot at the 100-point mark. He has 54 goals and 34 assists for 88 points in 151 career games.

CAREER YEAR: Senior right wing **Ryan Guentzel (Woodbury, Minn.)** had the best game of his career with three goals and an assist in the win over Canisius (Dec. 29). He is currently third on the team in scoring with six goals and 30 assists for 36 points, all career highs. Earlier this season, Guentzel had a career-best, and a season high for the Irish, seven-game point streak (1g, 9a). His previous best season was 2008-09 when he had four goals and seven assists for 11 points. He is currently tied for seventh in the CCHA in scoring with 33 points and his 30 assists are tied for third in the conference.

IRISH VERSUS TOP-RANKED TEAMS: Notre Dame is 9-6-4 this season against nationally ranked teams after splitting with 17th-ranked Western Michigan. The Irish are 4-2-2 at home against ranked teams, 5-3-1 on the road and 0-1-1 on neutral ice. In 2009-10, the Irish were 5-6-4 versus teams ranked in the national polls. All four teams in this weekend's CCHA Championships are ranked in both polls. Miami is ranked sixth, Michigan is fourth and Western Michigan is 12th.

An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. Ridderwall is sixth on the team in scoring with 13 goals and nine assists for 22 points. Former Notre Dame goaltender **David Brown '07** won the award in 2007.

LATE ADDITIONS: Center **T.J. Tynan's** outstanding rookie season (21g, 28a) has been a key to the 23-11-5 record for the Irish. The 5-8, 156-pound center has moved in to become one of the team's quarterbacks on the power play. The Orland Park, Ill., native wasn't even supposed to be on this year's team. Even though he signed a national letter-of-intent in Nov. of 2009, Tynan was going to defer and play another year with the Des Moines Buccaneers in the USHL where he was the Bucs' leading scorer in '09-'10 and a member of the USHL's all-rookie team. When **Kyle Palmieri** decided to sign with the Anaheim Ducks in early August, the call went out to Tynan and he joined the Irish roster. Freshman defenseman **Kevin Lind (Homer Glen, Ill.)** also signed a letter-of-intent in Nov. of '09 and was going to be playing this season with Tri-Cities in the USHL. He was asked to join the team in mid-August after Jarred Tinordi opted to play in the OHL. The 6-3, 221-pound Lind has played in 29 games and has 11 points (one goal, 10 assists) with a +9 for the year.

ALL-JOYCE CENTER VOTING: In conjunction with the final full season of hockey at the Joyce Center, an 18-man All-Joyce Center team was selected to honor the top players to play at Notre Dame in the 43-year history of the home of the Irish. BUSY WEEK: For four former Notre Dame players, the week of Feb. 8 - Feb. 15 was a busy week, as all four were promoted to the National Hockey League. On Feb. 7, **Victor Oreskovich '10** was recalled to the Vancouver Canucks. He was followed by **Tim Wallace '06** on Feb. 12 when he was brought up by the Pittsburgh Penguins. On Feb. 15, both **Erik Condra '09**, by Ottawa, and **Christian Hanson '09** by Toronto, were recalled to their respective clubs. For Condra it was his first game in the NHL while the other three have played previously in the NHL. Condra recorded an assist in his first NHL game against the New York Islanders.

NOSE FOR THE NET: Freshman left wing **Jeff Costello** ranks fourth on the Irish roster with 11 goals this season and is tied for the team lead with six power-play goals. In 39 games, Costello has 11 goals and six assists for 17 points. He is fifth among CCHA freshmen in goals.

THE SPECIALIST: Senior left wing **Calle Ridderwall** is third on the team in goals with 13 through the first 39 games this season with four of those goals coming on the power play. His goal versus Canisius on Dec. 29th was the 50th of his Notre Dame career. With 13 goals this season, Ridderwall has now been in double figures in goals in each of the last three seasons for the Irish after getting 17 in 2008-09 and 19 last season in 2009-10. Over the last two-plus seasons, Ridderwall has scored 49 goals with 26 of them coming via the power play. Last season, his 11 power-play goals led the CCHA. Ridderwall had 11 power-play goals in '08-'09 to match last season's total and has two this year. His 26 power-play goals rank him sixth on Notre Dame's all-time power-play goal list. For his career, Ridderwall has 54 goals and 34 assists for 88 career points in 151 games. He missed five games between Jan. 8 and Jan. 29 due to an injury suffered on Jan. 8 at Northern Michigan.

GOING ON THE OFFENSIVE: Two of Notre Dame's defensive, defensemen - **Sam Calabrese** and **Sean Lorenz (Jr., Littleton, Colo.)** - have gone on the offensive this season, turning in career years. Calabrese, who saw action in just three games last season, leads Irish defensemen in scoring with six goals and 12 assists for 19 points. Lorenz has four goals and nine assists for 13 points, all career highs for the junior blueliner. The duo is tops in the CCHA in plus-minus as Lorenz is +27 and Calabrese is +24 going into the CCHA Championships.

SHOOTING THE PUCK: Through the first 39 games of the season, Notre Dame has out shot the opposition in 31 of those games. The Irish are 20-8-3 when they out shoot their opponent. In games the opposition has the most shots, Notre Dame is 3-3-2. For the year, the Irish are averaging 33.2 shots per game while giving up 26.0 per contest.

HCA ROOKIE OF THE MONTH:

Notre Dame freshman left wing **Anders Lee (Edina, Minn.)** was selected as the Hockey Commissioners' Association national Rookie of the Month for December. The CCHA Rookie of the Month, Lee had two goals and six assists for eight points in five games during December to finish second to **T.J. Tynan** in scoring in the CCHA for the month. Lee had points in four of the five games, including three with two or more points. On Dec. 3, at Miami, he had a career-best three assists as he helped the Irish rally from a two-goal deficit to beat Miami, 5-4. The three-point game equaled a career-high for Lee who now has 19 goals and 18 assists for 37 points to rank second on the Irish in scoring and second to Tynan in the conference freshman scoring race.

CCHA PLAYER OF THE MONTH:

Notre Dame freshman standout **T.J. Tynan** has been selected as the CCHA's RBC Financial Group Player of the Month for December. The 5-8, 156-pound freshman center led all CCHA scorers in December in scoring as he had five goals and four assists for nine points in five games during the month. Tynan, who is the top rookie scorer in the nation, had points in four of the five games during the month and had three games with two or more points, including a career-best four-point game (2g, 2a) in a 10-2 win over Canisius on Dec. 29. Tynan currently leads Notre Dame in scoring with 18 goals and 21 assists for 39 points on the year. He was the CCHA rookie of the week for last week and was the conference's and the nation's rookie of the month for November. Tynan was an honorable mention selection for the HCA player of the month in December.

TYNAN HONORED: Notre Dame freshman center **T.J. Tynan** was named the Hockey Commissioners' Association rookie of the month for November to add to his honors this month after being named CCHA rookie of the month for the month of November. In eight games during November, Tynan led all CCHA rookies with six goals and six assists for 12 points. Two goals came on the power play, two were short-handed and one was a game winner. He was +5 for the month and took just 19 shots for a .316 shooting percentage. During November, Tynan scored in seven of the team's eight

games with five of the contests being multiple-point games. He was named the CCHA rookie of the month on two occasions - for games the week of Nov. 1 and Nov. 8. Tynan is the second Irish player to take CCHA rookie of the month honors this season as teammate **Anders Lee** was October's winner.

TOUGH SCHEDULE: From Oct. 31 through Dec. 4, Notre Dame played nine of 11 games on the road, including a streak of eight straight games versus nationally ranked teams. The Irish came through that streak with a 4-3-1 record. Starting on Nov. 12-13 the Irish faced #9/#8 Michigan in Ann Arbor, Mich where they split with the Wolverines. On Nov. 19-20, the Irish played host to rv/#17 Michigan State at the Joyce Center, taking two wins versus the Spartans. The weekend of Nov. 26-27 saw the Irish face #10/#9 North Dakota in Grand Forks where they had a loss and a tie. Against #6/#6 Miami Dec. 3-4, the Irish again had a split to give them a 4-3-1 record in the eight games against ranked teams.

FUTURE IRISH: Notre Dame head coach Jeff Jackson announced in early December that five players had signed national letters-of-intent to play hockey at the University beginning for the 2011-12 season. The group includes three defensemen and two forwards. The defensemen are **Eric Johnson (Verona, Wis.)**, **Robbie Russo (Westmont, Ill.)** and **Andrew Ryan (Brighton, Mich.)**. The forwards are **Peter Schnedier (Vienna, Austria)** and **Garrett Peterson (Manhattan, Ill.)**. Peterson signed his letter-of-intent in Nov. of 2009 but returned to the USHL this season with the Lincoln Stars. In making the announcement, Jackson said, "We're very excited about this group of players. We think they have the potential to step in and play. What I like most about them is that they are all strong skaters that play with a little grit to their game." Two of the players - Russo and Ryan - play for USA Hockey's National Team Developmental Program. The other three are all currently playing in the United States Hockey League (USHL). Russo and Ryan are currently listed by the National Hockey League's Central Scouting in their preliminary ratings. For more information on the five players check the Notre Dame website at und.com

TEN SPOT: Notre Dame's 10-goal out burst against Canisius on Dec. 29 marked the first time the Irish had 10 or more goals in a game since Oct. 14, 1995 when the Irish defeated St. Francis Xavier by a 10-2 score.

ANOTHER MILESTONE: Notre Dame's Oct. 30, 3-2 win over Western Michigan was the 200th CCHA win for Irish coach **Jeff Jackson**. Now in his 12th season at the Division I level, Jackson is 215-87-47 in his career in CCHA play in six seasons at Lake Superior State (1990-96) and six seasons at Notre Dame. Earlier in October (Oct. 14 vs. Lake Superior State), Jackson won his 300th career game as a Division I coach. His all-time record stands at 319-127-52 for a .693 winning percentage. His winning percentage is the tops among active coaches with 10 or more seasons.

PENALTY SHOTS: The Irish were awarded two penalty shots this season. In the regular season finale, T.J. Tynan got one with 29 seconds left in the 2-0 loss to Western Michigan. He was stopped by Bronco goaltender Jerry Kuhn. Senior center **Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.)** was awarded a penalty shot just 22 seconds into the Nov. 20 game with Michigan State and was stopped by goaltender Will Yanakeff. It was the first penalty shot by a Notre Dame player since Jan. 31, 2009 when **Ryan Thang '10**, scored in a 3-2 win at Michigan. It was the fourth for the Irish since the 2001-02 season. They are 2-for-4 in that span. The last time the opposition had a penalty shot against the Irish came on Dec. 4, 2009 when Miami's Carter Camper was stopped by **Mike Johnson**.

GOT THEIR NUMBER: From 1992-93 through the 2007-08 season, Notre Dame struggled when it came to facing Michigan State. In that time span, the Irish were just 5-32-7 versus the Spartans. Since March 29, 2008, a span of 10 games, Notre Dame is 7-0-3 against Michigan State, including a 5-0-1 mark at the Joyce Center.

FULL HOUSE: With two sellout crowds of 2,859 at the Joyce Center for the Lake Superior State series, the Irish have now sold out versus Bowling Green (Feb. 11-12), the Irish have now sold out 16 of their 19 home games this season with only the series against Northern Michigan (Dec. 11-12) and game three against Lake Superior last Sunday night having empty seats. Notre Dame has now had sell outs in 30 of the team's last 37 home games and this past year averaged 2,801 fans per game. Since Dec. 13, 2008, the Irish have recorded sellouts in 39 of their last 46 home games. A sellout at the Joyce Center is 2,713 with 2,857 capacity with standing room. Twice during the '09-'10 season - Jan. 15 vs. Michigan State and Jan. 29 against Nebraska-Omaha - 3,007 fans jammed into the Joyce Center. Prior to that number, the largest crowd to see an Irish hockey game was 3,310 on March of 1995 when Notre Dame play Illinois-Chicago. The following season, new seating was installed and capacity was reconfigured.

IRISH WINS VERSUS NO. 1: Notre Dame's win over No. 1 ranked Boston College on Oct. 23 marked the 12th time in the program's history that the Irish have defeated the nation's top team. Prior to Oct. 23, 2010, the last time came on April 10, 2008 in the NCAA semifinals versus No. 1 Michigan. A year ago, the Irish played twice versus the No. 1 team in the nation - Miami University - and lost both games on Dec. 4-5. Notre Dame has defeated Boston College when the Eagles were ranked No. 1 four times since the

POWER LESS: In the Nov. 12 game at Michigan, a 3-1 Irish win, Notre Dame did not have one power-play chance in the game. That marked the first time in seven seasons - since March 5, 2004 - a span of 258 games - that the Irish did not have a power-play opportunity in a game. In the weekend series at Michigan, the Irish did not get their first power-play on the weekend until there was 6:09 left in the third period, a span of 113:51 over the two games without a power play. In the final six minutes of Saturday's game, the Irish did get three straight power plays.

FAST START: Notre Dame freshman left wing **Anders Lee** knows how to get his career off to a fast start. The 6-3, 218-pounder scored a goal on his first shot in the 6-3 win over Holy Cross (Oct. 8), just 1:58 into the first period. He went on to record two more goals for a hat trick in his first-ever collegiate game. Lee then added an assist in the 5-4 loss to Boston University in the championship game of the Warrior Ice Breaker Tournament. For his efforts, Anders Lee was named the CCHA rookie of the week for the week ending Oct. 10. He joins **John Noble '73** as the only other freshman to score three goals in his first game as Noble did the trick on Nov. 15, 1969 in an 8-3 win over Windsor. He joins recent Irish players - **Billy Maday**, **Christiaan Minella '10** and **Tim Wallace '06** - as freshmen who scored on their first shot on goal. Lee added a goal and an assist in the Oct. 15 win over Lake Superior State and through the first 17 games of the season, he leads the team with nine goals, is tied for the top spot with three power-play goals and is fourth in points with 15 (9g, 6a). He was named the CCHA rookie of the month for October.

CAPTAINS: Four members of the Irish senior class will serve as captains for the 2010-11 season. Defenseman **Joe Lavin (Shrewsbury, Mass.)** will wear the "C" for Jeff Jackson's squad this year. His three assistant captains will be **Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm, Sweden)**, **Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.)** and **Ryan Guentzel (Woodbury, Minn.)**. For all four players, this is their first time as captains at Notre Dame.

LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD: Senior left wing **Calle Ridderwall** is one of 20 Division I hockey players to be selected as a candidate for the 2010-11 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. The award is presented annually to an NCAA Division I student-athlete in 10 sports based on achievement's in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition. CLASS is an acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School and the award focuses

and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. This is the fifth year that Lowe's has sponsored an award for hockey. In 2006-07, former Irish goaltender **David Brown '07** won the Senior CLASS Award while in 2007-08, **Mark Van Guilder '08** and in 2008-09, **Jordan Pearce '09** and **Erik Condra '09** were among the top 10 finalists. Team captain **Ryan Thang '10** was the team's nominee last season.

HOME OPENERS: Notre Dame's home opener on Thursday, Oct. 14, a 4-2 win over Lake Superior State, gives Notre Dame an all-time record of 24-18-1 in home openers at the Joyce Center. With the win on Oct. 8 against Holy Cross, Notre Dame is now 21-20-2 in season-opening games.

FAMILY GUYS: Three members of the Notre Dame hockey team – sophomore forwards **Kevin Nugent (New Canaan, Conn.)** and **Riley Sheahan (St. Catharines, Ont.)** and freshman goaltender **Joe Rogers (Marysville, Mich.)** – have family ties to the Irish hockey program. Nugent's father, **Kevin Nugent, Sr. '78** was a member of the Notre Dame hockey team from 1974-78. During his career he played in 131 games, scoring 54 goals with 75 assists for 129 career points. His son becomes the second Irish player to follow his father to Notre Dame. He joins **Rory Walsh '06** who followed his father, **Brian Walsh '77** who was a teammate of Nugent, Sr. Sheahan is a second cousin of former Irish defenseman **Brock Sheahan '08** who played for the Irish from 2004-08. Rogers is a cousin of former Notre Dame defenseman **Tony Bonadio '83** is a Port Huron, Mich., native. Bonadio played in 79 games between 1980-83, scoring one goal with nine assists for 10 points.

NHL DRAFTEES: The Irish have 10 players on the 2010-11 roster who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Leading the way is sophomore **Riley Sheahan (St. Catharines, Ont.)** who became Notre Dame's third-ever, first-round pick last June when he was chosen 21st overall by the Detroit Red Wings. He joins former defenseman **Ian Cole (2007 - St. Louis)** who was selected 18th overall and former right wing **Kyle Palmieri (2009 - Anaheim)**, the 26th pick overall. Sheahan was followed by freshman defenseman **Stephen Johns (Wampum, Pa.)**, who went in the second round, 60th overall to the Chicago Black Hawks. One round later in the third round, with the 80th overall pick, freshman forward **Bryan Rust (Novi, Mich.)** was chosen by the Pittsburgh Penguins. Notre Dame's final player selected in 2010 was defenseman **Kevin Lind (Homer Glen, Ill.)**, who was picked in the sixth round, 177th overall by the Anaheim Ducks. Two other Irish freshman were selected in the 2009 draft. Left wing **Jeff Costello (Milwaukee, Wis.)** was chosen by the Ottawa Senators in the fifth round, 146th overall and six picks later, center **Anders Lee (Edina, Minn.)** was a New York Islanders' choice in the sixth round, 152nd overall. The new group of draftees join sophomore left wing **Nick Larson (Apple Valley, Minn.)**, a 2008 selection of the Calgary Flames in the fourth round, 108th overall; junior defenseman **Sean Lorenz (Littleton, Colo.)**, a member of the 2008 draft class, by

the Minnesota Wild in the fourth round, 115th overall and seniors **Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.)** and **Joe Lavin (Shrewsbury, Mass.)**. Ryan was picked in the 2007 entry draft by Nashville in the fourth round with the 114th pick and Lavin was a Chicago Black Hawks choice in the fifth round, 126th overall

NEW HOME FOR THE IRISH: Construction on Notre Dame's new, on-campus ice facility - The Compton Family Center - began in March of 2010 and is on pace to be finished for the Notre Dame hockey team to begin play there during the 2011-12 campaign.

On Sept. 11, 2010, a project blessing ceremony for the \$50-million facility was held with many of the key benefactors in attendance. At the ceremony, Notre Dame director of athletics, **Jack Swarbrick**, announced that the building would be named the Compton Family Center in honor of the generous donation from Kevin and Gayla Compton and their family. The Comptons are part of the ownership group of the National Hockey League's San Jose Sharks.

Rev. John I. Jenkins, C.S.C., Notre Dame's President began the ceremony with a blessing of the site and offering of a prayer for the safety of those working on the project.

Irish head coach **Jeff Jackson** followed by talking about the original plans and how those plans changed to become the Compton Family Center.

"When I first came here, we were talking about a renovation in the Joyce Center," said Jackson, now in his sixth season behind the Notre Dame bench.

"With Jack's (Swarbrick) foresight and Tom [Nevala] and everyone involved in pushing for this to happen, waiting an additional year to have a new facility is something that is going to have a tremendous impact on the future of our program, and we're very proud of that."

Jackson also thanked the benefactors in attendance for their generosity towards the project.

Notre Dame's head coach was followed by Irish junior **Billy Maday (Burr Ridge, Ill.)** who spoke for his teammates to the benefactors in attendance.

Swarbrick spoke last at the ceremony, and touched upon how important the Compton Family Center will be for the Michiana community.

"There's a limit to how much the community can use our dormitories and our classrooms and our laboratories, but the athletic facilities can be a special point of contact," Swarbrick said.

"I hope we win national championships with teams that train here and I hope we build new programs for our athletes and our students. But the ultimate success of this facility will be if we inspire a young boy or a young girl from the community to shoot higher, if we challenge them to be better people because they spend time on our campus. Then we've realized the potential of athletics at Notre Dame."

The original announcement for the new building was made on Feb. 12, 2009 by Notre Dame executive vice-president John Affleck-Graves and Swarbrick after the University's Board of Trustees approved the plan.

The Compton Family Center will house both the Charles "Lefty" Smith rink, within the new 5,000-person capacity, home of the Irish hockey team and a second sheet of ice (Olympic-sized)

with limited seating availability. The majority of the general public arena seating will be of the chair-back variety.

The Compton Family Center also will include offices for the Notre Dame coaching staff, a state-of-the-art locker room suite that includes both wet and dry locker rooms, meeting rooms, a sports medicine area that includes hot and cold hydrotherapy, cardio and weight rooms, a players' lounge, equipment areas, video operations and a multi-purpose room that will be the location for weekly team Mass and serve as a study lounge and dining area.

The arena also will feature a balcony level with a 200-seat, Irish pub-themed club, multiple concession areas on both levels, spacious restrooms and a merchandise shop.

The Compton Family Center also will serve the Notre Dame and South Bend community as a place for the Irish Youth Hockey League (IYHL) and local figure skating groups to flourish. On campus it will become the home of club and interhall hockey, the figure skating club and intramural broomball, curling and physical education classes.

Multiple locker rooms also will be available for campus and community use of the facility.

Design and construction of the Compton Family Center are under the auspices of the Southfield, Mich., office of Barton Malow, a national design and construction services firm and their project partner Rossetti Architects, also of Southfield, Mich.

LEFTY'S RINK: When Notre Dame's new ice hockey arena is built the new ice hockey rink will be named the Charles W. "Lefty" Smith, Jr., Rink, in honor of the first coach in the program's history, **Charles "Lefty" Smith**. The announcement was made in April of 2008 at the team's annual awards banquet.

The plans for naming the new ice surface in honor of Smith were made possible by the generosity of the John and Mary Jo Boler family of Inverness, Ill., and Sanibel Island, Fla., their daughter Jill Boler McCormack '84 and her husband, Dan; and their son Matthew Boler '88 and his wife, Christine. They were joined by the family of Frank '57 and Mary Beth O'Brien of Albany, N.Y., who have six children who all graduated from Notre Dame. Their late son, Frankie, played both lacrosse and hockey for the Irish from 1984-88.

Smith came to Notre Dame in 1968 to start the varsity hockey program and coached the Irish for 19 years, retiring in 1987 with 307 career victories. Under his tutelage, Notre Dame produced six All-Americans but most importantly, all 126 student-athletes who played for him completed their collegiate eligibility and earned college degrees.

Smith, who continues to work as the director of the Loftus Sports Center on campus, served two years as the president of the American Hockey Coaches Association. He was inducted into the Minnesota Hockey Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 1992. He played an integral in bringing the International Special Olympics to Notre Dame in 1987.

Married for 57 years, Lefty, who lost his wife, Mickey on Nov. 9, 2009, is the father of seven living children, 16 grandchildren and two great grandchildren.
