No. 9/9 Notre Dame Travels To Troy, N.Y., To Participate In 57th Annual Rensselaer Holiday Tournament

- Irish making third appearance in R.P.I. Tournament
- Notre Dame faces Alabama-Huntsville in opening game on Nov. 23; rematch of last March's dramatic double-overtime win in NCAA Tournament.
- Tournament wraps up five games in nine days run for Irish; Notre Dame opened the week with a 2-1 win over Bowling Green on Tuesday in South Bend.

THIRD TIMES A CHARM: Notre Dame will make its third visit to the Rensselaer Hockey Tournament with the Irish looking for their first-ever victory in college hockey's longest running tourney. They made their first appearance in the tournament during the 1988-89 season and finished

fourth with a 6-0 loss to Rensselaer and a 7-5 loss to Air Force. Notre Dame's second trip to the tournament came in 2000-01 with the Irish dropping a 6-3 decision to St. Lawrence in the opening game and a 6-2 verdict to Rensselaer in the third-place game. The tournament starts on Friday, Nov. 23 with Notre Dame facing Alabama-Huntsville in the opening game at 4:00 p.m. Rensselaer will battle American International College in the nightcap with face off set for 7:15 p.m. The Irish, ranked ninth in both the USA Today and the USCHO. com polls, bring a 10-4-0 overall record into the tournament. Alabama-Huntsville, members of College Hockey America (CHA) are 1-6-1 to start the season. Rensselaer, a member of the ECAC, is ranked 16th in the USCHO. com poll and brings a 6-3-2 mark into the tournament. American International, located in Springfield, Mass., is a member of Atlantic Hockey and will face the Engineers with a 2-5-1 record.

NCAA REMATCH: Notre Dame's meeting with Alabama-Huntsville is a rematch of the first round of the 2007 NCAA Tournament in Grand Rapids, Mich., last March. The Irish took that game by a 3-2 score with the game-winning goal coming at 15:18 of the second overtime. Josh Sciba '07 and Ryan Thang (So., Edina, Minn.) staked Notre Dame to a 2-0 lead with goals at 3:18 and 4:26 of the first period. The Chargers would score twice in the second period to tie the game at 2-2 on goals by Dominik Rozman and Cale Tanaka. The score would stay that way until Thang beat goaltender Marc Narduzzi from the top of the left circle to give Notre

Dame the win. The Irish out shot Alabama-Huntsville, 53-30. Narduzzi made 49 saves in relief of starter Blake MacNichol. David Brown '07 made 28 saves for Notre Dame. The game was the longest in Notre Dame history as the two teams battled 95:18 to decide a winner. The Irish lost the following day in the NCAA quarterfinals to eventual NCAA champion Michigan State, 2-1.

BUSY SCHEDULE: The Rensselaer Holiday Tournament wraps up a busy stretch of the 2007-08 schedule for Notre Dame. The two games this weekend will close out a stretch of five games over nine days. Through the first three games, the Irish are 3-0-0 with two wins against Western Michigan (4-1 and 5-1) on Nov. 16-17 and a 2-1 victory over Bowling Green on Nov. 20. This marks the second time this season that the Irish will play three games in five days and five games in nine days. The first time occurred between Oct. 18-27. In that span, the Irish were 3-2-0.

TOURNEY RESULTS: The Fighting Irish have now appeared in 28 in-sesaon tournaments in their 40-year history. They have won five times, finished second six times, were third six times and ended up fourth a total of 11 times. The last in-season tournament won by Notre Dame was the Lightning Collegiate Hockey Classic during October of 2006 in Tampa, Fla.

TOURNAMENT TIME: The Rensselaer Holiday Tournament is the second in-season tournament for the Irish this year. They opened the season at the Lefty McFadden Tournament in Dayton, Ohio, losing to Wisconsin before defeating Mercyhurst for a third-place finish. Notre Dame will again host the Lightning College Hockey Classic at the St. Pete Times Forum in Tampa, Fla., on Dec.29-30. The University of Massachusetts, Rensselaer and Colorado College also will participate in the tournament.

NOVEMBER NUMBERS: Notre Dame enters this weekend's tournament having won three straight games and six-of-seven during the month of November. The lone loss for the Irish in November came at the hands of No. 1 ranked Miami by a 3-1 score on Nov. 10. Notre Dame owns the only win over the RedHawks this season as the Irish won the opener of that series, 2-1, on Nov. 9.

HOT HAND: In four of his last five games dating back to Nov. 9 at Miami, junior goaltender **Jordan Pearce (Anchorage, Alaska)** has held the opposition to just one goal. In that five-game span, Pearce is 4-1-0 with a 1.41 goals-against average and a .941 save percentage. Pearce stopped 27-of-28 Bowling Green shots on Nov. 20 in a 2-1 win over the Falcons. He has started 13 of Notre Dame's 14 games this season and is 9-4-0 with a 1.94 goals-against average and a .920 save mark. He leads the nation with 775:00 minutes played. Prior to this year, in 12 career appearances, Pearce had played just 621:56 minutes.

BOWLING GREEN RECAP: Jordan Pearce made 27 saves and got goals from Ben Ryan (Fr., Brighton, Mich.) and defenseman Kyle Lawson (So., New Hudson, Mich.) in a 2-1 win over the Bowling Green Falcons Tuesday night at the Joyce Center. Derek Whitmore scored the lone goal for Bowling Green. Ryan gave Notre Dame a 1-0 lead at 6:29 of the first period with his third goal of the season. Whitmore tied the game at 9:15 with his 12th goal of the season and the teams went to the first intermission tied 1-1. In the second, the Irish took the lead for good at 2:05 when Lawson scored from the slot for his third goal of the season. Pearce made the onegoal lead stand up, stopping all 14 shots he faced over the final two periods. Bowling Green out

shot Notre Dame, 28-24 in the game. Nick Eno made 22 saves for the Falcons. BG was 0-for-5 on the power play while the Irish were 0-for-4.

CCHA DEFENSEMAN OF THE WEEK: Sophomore defenseman Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.) has been selected as the CCHA defenseman of the week for the week ending Nov. 18. In the weekend sweep of Western Michigan, Lawson collected two assists in Friday's 4-1 win and was +2 in the series. Lawson and the Notre Dame defense limited the Broncos to 23 shots in the two games and killed all seven WMU powerplay chances on the weekend.

STINGY DEFENSE: Notre Dame surrendered just two goals in the weekend series against Western Michigan. In the two games, the Irish out shot the Broncos by a 76-23 margin. In Friday's game, Notre Dame gave up just 12 shots and followed that by giving up just 11 in Saturday's game. The 11 shots are the fewest given up by the Irish this season as were the two shots given up in the third period of Saturday's game.

KILLING PENALTIES: On the season, Notre Dame has given up just four power-play goals. After giving up power-play goals in back-to-back games against Lake Superior on Nov. 1-2, the Irish have killed 20-of-21 opponent power-play chances for a 95.2% success rate, including 12 straight over the last three games. On the year, the Irish have killed 62-of-66 for a 93.9% penalty-killing ratio in 14 games. That ranks the Irish third in the nation and second in the CCHA behind Miami. Yale is tops in the nation with a 97.1% success rate.

SPREAD THE WEALTH: Notre Dame scored nine goals in the two games of the series against Western Michigan. Seven different players lit the lamp for the Irish. Only Erik Condra and Ryan Thang scored more than one goal. Also scoring for the Irish on the weekend were Dan VeNard, Mark Van Guilder, Calle Ridderwall, Justin White and Dan Kissel.

THE MARKSMEN: Senior Mark Van Guilder and sophomore Ryan Thang each scored their seventh goals of the season in the series against Western Michigan. Van Guilder got his seventh on Nov. 16, scoring his fifth power-play goal of the season. That ties him for 4th in the CCHA and tied him for 5th in the nation. Thang scored once in each game with both goals coming on the power play. Thang now has four man-advantage goals, which ties him for sixth in the CCHA and eighth in the nation.

CONDRA CAPERS: Right wing **Erik Condra** (Jr., Livonia, Mich.) now has a three-game point-scoring streak after recording an assist in the Bowling Green win. He had back-to-back multiple-point games (1g, 1a) in the wins over Western Michigan. That gives him three multiple-point games this season. On Nov. 1, he recorded the second, five-point game of his career in the 7-3 win over Lake Superior. Condra scored twice and added three assists for five points on the night. His previous five-point game came on Jan. 5, 2007 at Robert Morris when he had a goal and four assists. Condra currently leads the Irish in scoring with six goals and nine assists for 15 points in the first 14 games of the season.

GOOD NEWS AND BAD NEWS: Through 14 games this season, the Irish have some good news and some bad news to report. In Notre Dame's 10 victories, the Irish have scored 39 goals for a 3.90 average. In the four losses, Notre Dame has scored just three goals for a 0.75 goals-per game mark. In the 10 wins, the Irish have given up just 15 goals (1.50 goals-against average) while in the four losses, they have given up 13 goals (3.25 goals against).

HIGHS AND LOWS: Notre Dame's 44 shots in the Nov. 16 win over Western Michigan are a season high for the Irish. The 11 shots given up by Notre Dame in Saturday's game (Nov. 17) are the fewest the Irish have given up this season. Notre Dame's 11 power-play chances on Friday night were also a season high.

FIRSTS: Two Notre Dame players scored their first goals of the season in the 5-1 victory at Western Michigan. Freshman **Calle Ridderwall (Fr., Stockholm, Sweden)** picked up his first goal of the year and the first of his collegiate career when he scored at 12:10 of the first to tie the game at 1-1. **Justin White (Jr., Traverse City, Mich.)** followed with his first at 17:31 off a face off to give the Irish a 2-1 lead while also collecting the game-winning goal.

THE SNIPER: Notre Dame defenseman **Dan VeNard** scored his second goal of the season in the 4-1 win over Western Michigan, the most he has ever scored in a season. The goal was also the game winner, the first of VeNard's career.

DYNAMIC DUO: Notre Dame's defensive duo of **Brock Sheahan (Sr., Lethbridge, Alb.)** and **Teddy Ruth (Fr., Naperville, Ill.)** have proven to be one of the CCHA's top defensive pairs through the first 14 games of the season. Both Irish defensive stalwarts are +8 for the season, meaning they have been on the ice for nine more goals scored by Notre Dame than the Irish have given up at even strength. That ties them for sixth in the CCHA. **VERSUS THE BEST:** Notre Dame's 2-1 win over Miami on Nov. 9 marked the 10th time in the program's history that the Irish knocked off a top-ranked team. In fact, the last four times that Notre Dame has faced a No.1 team, the Irish have come away with the victory. Here's a list of Irish wins over No. 1 ranked teams in the 40-year history of the program.

WINNING AT MIAMI: Notre Dame's 2-1 win over the RedHawks on Nov. 9 snapped a six-game Irish winless streak (0-5-1) at Oxford, Ohio. The previous Irish win was on March 16, 2003 when they defeated Miami, 5-0, in game three of the first round of the CCHA playoffs to advance to Joe Louis Arena. Last Friday's win came in Notre Dame's first-ever appearance at Steve Cady Arena.

IRON MAN: Senior center **Mark Van Guilder** (**Roseville, Minn.**) has his sights set on Notre Dame's all-time record for most consecutive games played. The record of 153 straight games was set by **Tim Wallace '06** who played in every game of his career – 153 straight. Van Guilder has now played in every game of his career - 130 consecutive games played through the first 14 games this year.

STRONG SCHEDULE: Notre Dame goes into the R.P.I. Tournament having opened the season by playing five of its first 14 games versus nationally ranked teams. The Irish opened the year dropping a 4-1 decision to #14/#15 Wisconsin. They then split a series in South Bend with #5/#5 Denver, winning, 4-3 and losing, 3-1. Last weekend, Notre Dame split with #1/#1 Miami with a 2-1 win on Friday and a 3-1 loss on Saturday. The Irish are 2-3-0 against ranked teams this season.

THE KISSEL EFFECT: Sophomore left wing **Dan Kissel (Crestwood, III.)** collected his first goal of the season in the 2-1 win at Miami. The goal also proved to be the game winner. He added his second goal in the 5-1 win at Western Michigan. In Kissel's career, he has now played in 31 career games and has scored eight goals. Of his eight goals, four have been game winners. Last season, three of his six goals were winning goals.

POWER ON: After going 0-for-7 on the power play at Miami, the Irish scored twice with the man advantage versus Western Michigan in the 4-1 win. They followed with a 1-for-6 night in the 5-1 win on Saturday. The Irish have scored two or more power-play goals in a game five times this season.

SENIOR CLASS HONORS: Notre Dame team captain Mark Van Guilder (Sr., Roseville, Minn.) has been nominated for the Lowes Senior CLASS (Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School) Award. The CLASS award was designed to honor the attributes of seniors who remain committed to their university and elects to pursue the many rewards that a senior season can bring. This award provides a fitting honor for a senior leader that has stood up to the challenge. In the end, the award hopes to recognize the prestige and dignity of being a senior hockey player at the college level. Former Irish goaltender David Brown '07 won the Lowes Senior CLASS award following the 2006-07 season.

FRIENDLY CONFINES: Notre Dame has had three sellouts (2,713) in its first six home games and just missed a fourth against Bowling Green on Nov. 20 with a crowd of 2,711 in attendatnce. The previous two sellout crowds of 2,857 were the largest crowds to watch a Notre Dame hockey game since March 3, 1995 when 3,310 saw the Irish defeat Illinois-Chicago. Following that season, new seating was installed, reducing capacity at the Joyce Center. At the beginning of November, a new section of seating was added to the student section to increase the capacity. Through six games this year, the Irish are averaging 2,620 fans per game.

ON THE MARK: Senior center **Mark Van Guilder** recorded the second four-point game of his career on Nov. 1 against Lake Superior State. Van Guilder scored twice and set up two others in the game. His previous four-point night came at Bowling Green on Feb. 17, 2006 as a sophomore when he had three goals and an assist against the Falcons. The Notre Dame captain leads the Irish in goals (7) and power-play goals (5) this season.

The Irish finished the 2006-07 season ranked fourth in the final USA Today/American Hockey Magazine poll that included the NCAA tournament. The Irish finished the year first in the USCHO.com/CSTV polls that ended with the end of the CCHA Tournament. NEW KID: Freshman goaltender **Brad Phillips** (**Fr., Farmington Hills, Mich.**) made his first career start in goal for Notre Dame on Nov. 2 in the 4-1 win over Lake Superior State. Phillips stopped 16 of the 17 shots he faced, giving up just a five-on-three power-play goal in the game.

ROAD WARRIORS: Notre Dame's two wins on the road between Oct. 23 and Oct. 27 (at Bowling Green and Ferris State) gave the Irish seven-consecutive road wins, dating back to Jan. 19, 2007. The seven-consecutive road wins tied a program record that was set between Jan. 7 and Feb. 4, 1977. That seven-game streak also became part of the team's longest road unbeaten run as the Irish went 8-0-1 between Jan. 7 and Feb. 24 of that season. The streak was snapped on Oct. 28 in a 3-0 loss at Ferris State.

SPECIAL MENTION: Notre Dame freshmen forward **Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.)** earned special mention for CCHA rookie of the month honors for October after scoring two goals and adding five assists for seven points in his first month of play. Miami's Carter Camper took the rookie of the month honors over Ryan.

SEVEN HEAVEN: The seven goals scored by the Irish on Nov. 1 is the most they have scored in a game since March 9, 2007 when they also hung seven goals on Alaska in the first game of the second round of the CCHA playoffs. Notre Dame won that game, 7-1.

HOME SWEET HOME: After six home games this season, Notre Dame is 5-1-0 (.833) at the Joyce Center. A year ago, Notre Dame was 13-2-2 at home for an .824 winning percentage. That was the best mark since the 2003-04 season when the Irish were 14-2-2 at the Joyce Center for an .833 winning percentage. Only two other Irish teams have had better home records – 1987-88 team was 18-2-0 (.900) and the 1969-70 team was 12-1-1 (.893).

THE REAL THANG: Sophomore left wing **Ryan Thang** has now scored goals in seven of Notre Dame's first 13 games this season. He now has goals in back-to-back games and has scored 27 goals in his first 55 career games with 14 of them coming on the power play.

TAKE THE HIGHWAY: The Irish have had their share of success on the road over the last two seasons. This year, Notre Dame is 4-2-0 on the road. A year ago, the Irish were 12-4-1 (.735) away from the Joyce Center. The 12 road wins equaled a school record (1979-80 and 1997-98) for road wins. Only the 1983-84 team's 10-3-1 road mark (.750) is better.

LONG TIME COMING: Notre Dame's 4-3 win over Denver on Oct. 18 snapped a 10-game (0-9-1) winless streak for the Irish against the Pioneers. The last time they had beaten Denver was Nov. 3, 1978, a 3-2 win at the Joyce Center. Notre Dame and Denver played in the WCHA for 10 years from 1971-81 before the Irish left for the CCHA. Prior to last weekend's series, the two teams had met just three times with Denver going 2-0-1.

BIG WIN: Notre Dame's win over Denver on Oct. 18 was the first this season for the Irish against a nationally-ranked team as they are now 1-2-0 on the year. A year ago, Notre Dame was 10-2-1 against ranked teams. The Pioneers were the highest-ranked team that Notre Dame has beaten at the Joyce Center since beating fourth-ranked Michigan State, 4-1, on Nov. 17, 2006.

FIRST TIMERS: Sophomore right wing Stewart Carlin (Jeannette, Pa.) made his first career appearance versus Denver (10/19). Carlin did not play in any games last year and lined up at right wing in his first appearance, getting one penalty for two minutes. Fellow sophomore **Dan Kissel** (Crestwood, III.) made his first appearance of the season since being sidelined in the first week of practice with an injury. **CCHA OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Senior center **Mark Van Guilder** was the CCHA offensive player of the week for the week ending Oct. 14. Van Guilder scored three goals in Notre Dame's two games at the Lefty McFadden Invitational. In the 4-1 loss to Wisconsin, Van Guilder scored a second-period, power-play goal to tie the game at 1-1. In Saturday's 4-0 victory versus Mercyhurst, Van Guilder scored a pair of goals, including one on the power play and one for the game winner. In the game, he set a career high with 12 shots on goal.

GETTING OFFENSIVE: Senior defenseman **Brock Sheahan (Lethbridge, Alb.)** was a finalist last season for the CCHA's defensive defenseman award. This season, Sheahan is showing his offensive game as he already has five assists in the first 13 games of the season. For his career, Sheahan now has three goals and 22 assists for 25 points.

CAPTAINS: Senior right wing Mark Van Guilder will serve as Notre Dame's captain for the 2007-08 season. Joining Van Guilder as alternate captains in '07-'08, are senior defensemen Brock Sheahan (Lethbridge, Alb.) and Dan VeNard (Vernon Hills, III.). They will be joined by junior forward Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.). This is the first season for all four players to serve as captains at Notre Dame.

MR PRESIDENT: Senior defenseman Dan Ve-Nard has been named president of Notre Dame's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) for the 2007-08 school year. VeNard served as hockey's representative to the group last season and was selected president by the group in M. The committee represents Notre Dame's studentathletes with the Irish athletic department.

NEW KIDS: Six of Notre Dame's freshmen made their Irish debuts at the Lefty McFadden Invitational (Oct. 12-13). Leading the way was right wing **Ben Ryan** who recorded three assists in his first two games. Also playing in both games were forwards **Robin Bergman (Stockholm, Sweden)** and **Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm, Sweden)** along with defensemen **Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.)** and **Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.)**. Joining those five was right wing **Ryan Guentzel (Woodbury, Minn.)** who played his first game against Mercyhurst in the second game of the weekend. Goaltender **Brad Phillips** saw his first action on Nov. 2, making his first career start in the 4-1 win over Lake Superior.

SWEDISH CONNECTION: For the first time in the 40-year history of the Notre Dame hockey program, the Irish have two natives of Sweden on the roster. Freshmen **Robin Bergman** (Stockholm) and **Calle Ridderwall** (Stockholm) join the roster this season. Both played last year in the USHL; Bergman for Cedar Rapids and Ridderwall for Tri-City. Bergman had 26 goals and 17 assists for 43 points. His 17 power-play goals were second in the league. Ridderwall led Tri-City in scoring with 27 goals and 35 assists for 62 points. He had 14 power-play goals and seven game winners, the most in the league in that category.

ALL TIED UP: Notre Dame's 3-2 overtime win versus Alabama-Huntsville in the NCAA Regionals on March 23, 2007 gave the Irish a 3-1-3 record in overtime last year. The three overtime wins were the most for the Irish in a single season. In two seasons under Jeff Jackson, Notre Dame is 3-1-7 in extra play.

TOP CLASSES: Notre Dame's incoming freshman class of seven was been ranked among the best for the 2007-08 season. Inside College Hockey.com ranked the group fourth in it's preseason rankings while *Red Line Report* ranked the group fifth in the nation last spring. Inside College Hockey.com rankings:

Red Line Report rankings had Wisconsin first, followed by Boston University, Michigan, Boston College, **Notre Dame**, Minnesota, Ohio State and North Dakota. Four of Notre Dame's seven freshmen were drafted – **Ian Cole** (first round, St. Louis), **Teddy Ruth** (second round, Washington), **Ben Ryan** (fourth round, Nashville) and **Brad Phillips** (seventh round, Philadelphia). WELCOME BACK: Junior defenseman Luke Lucyk (Fox Point, Wis.) returns to the Notre Dame lineup this season after spending the 2006-07 season with the Tri-City Storm of the USHL. Lucyk played in 44 games for the Irish between 2004-06 with one goal and one assist for two points. He returned to Tri-City last season to get more playing time and had nine goals and 13 assists for 22 points in 59 games.

JUNIOR EVALUATIONS: Three members of the Notre Dame freshman class participated in the U.S. Junior Evaluation Camp this past August in hopes of making the United States' roster for the 2007 World Junior Championships. Freshmen defensemen Ian Cole and Teddy Ruth were joined by center Ben Ryan. Irish head coach Jeff Jackson served as one of the assistant coaches at the camp.

NHL DRAFTEES: The Irish have seven players on the 2007-08 roster who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Last June, a total of five Notre Dame players were selected. Leading the way was freshman defenseman Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.) who was a first-round selection of the St. Louis Blues who took him with the 18th pick overall. Cole became the first Irish player ever selected in the first round and was selected earlier than any other Notre Dame player (Rob Globke '04 was the previous highest selection when he was picked 40th overall by Florida in 2002). Cole was followed by fellow freshman defenseman Teddy Ruth (Naperville, III.) who went in the second round, 46th overall to the Washington Capitals. Sophomore Ryan Thang (Edina, Minn.) was selected in the third round, 81st overall by the Nashville Predators. Incoming freshman Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.) joined Thang when the Predators made him the 114th pick (fourth round). Freshman goaltender Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.) rounded out the Notre Dame selections in the last draft when the Philadelphia Flyers selected him in the seventh round, 182nd overall. Those five join junior right wing Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.) who was selected in the seventh round, 211th overall by the Ottawa Senators in 2006 and sophomore defenseman Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.) who was selected in the 2005 NHL Draft by the Carolina Hurricanes in the seventh round, 198th overall.

WORST TO FIRST: Just two seasons ago (2004-05), Notre Dame was 5-27-6 overall and finished last in the CCHA with a 3-20-5 record. In the CCHA's 35-year history, no team has ever gone from worst-to-first in one season. There have been three teams go from worst to first in a two-season span. They are:

1975-76 Bowling Green – Falcons finished last in 1973-74 in a three team conference and finished first in '75-'76 in a five-team league.

1992-93 Miami – RedHawks were last in 1990-91 with nine points in a nine-team conference. They finished first in 1992-93 with 49 points in a 12-team conference for a 40-point improvement over two seasons.

2006-07 Notre Dame – Irish were last in 2004-05 with 11 points in a 12-team conference. In '06-'07, the Irish took first place with 45 points for a 34-point improvement over two seasons.

FAMILY MATTERS: Two members of the Notre Dame hockey team – forwards Erik Condra and Garrett Regan (Hastings, Minn.) – have family ties to the Irish hockey program. Condra's uncle is All-American forward Kirt Bjork (*83) who played at Notre Dame from 1979-83. He scored 76 goals with 85 assists for 161 career points in 141 career games. He took All-America honors in 1983 when he had 29 goals and 34 assists for 63 points. Regan's uncle - Sean Regan - was a defenseman for the Irish from 1981-83 before finishing his career at the University of Minnesota.

MORE FAMILY MATTERS: Freshman goaltender **Brad Phillips** also has a family connection to Notre Dame. His uncle is former Irish quarterback **Terry Andrysiak** who played at Notre Dame from 1985 to 1988.

PUTTING ON THE FOIL: Notre Dame junior Christian Hanson (Venetia, Pa.) is the sixth player to play for the Irish whose father played in the National Hockey League. His father, Dave Hanson, played 10 years of professional hockey between 1974-75 and 1983-84, including stints with the Detroit Red Wings and the Minnesota North Stars and the World Hockey Association's (WHA) Minnesota Fighting Saints and the New England Whalers. Fans might also be familiar with Dave Hanson, as one of the famed Hanson Brothers, made famous in the hockey movie - Slapshot. Hanson currently is the director of the Island Sports Center, home of Robert Morris University's hockey team, in suburban Pittsburgh.
