SETTING THE STAGE ...

Notre Dame will conclude the regular season with a BIG EAST showdown against No. 2 Syracuse at 7:00 p.m. (ET) on Saturday, May 1 at Arlotta Stadium. The game is a sellout. The 12th-ranked Fighting Irish are 7-5 overall and 2-3 in BIG EAST play, while the Orange are 11-1 overall and 4-0 in the league. This will be the fourth meeting all-time between Notre Dame and Syracuse and the first-ever encounter in South Bend. The Orange have won the three previous matchups with the Irish. Saturday's game will be aired live on ESPNU.

ABOUT THE IRISH ...

Notre Dame improved to 7-5 and 2-3 in the BIG EAST with a 13-6 win at St. John's on Saturday ... senior midfielder **Grant Krebs** paced the Irish against the Red Storm with his fourth hat trick of the season ... he scored all three goals in succession in the second quarter (just 3:31 apart) to give Notre Dame a 6-2 lead at half-time ... Krebs was named to this week's BIG EAST weekly honor roll, while senior goalie **Scott Rodgers** was named the league's defensive player of the week for the second time this season ... Rodgers made 13 saves and allowed just five goals against St. John's ... the Fighting Irish are averaging 9.75 goals per game, while surrendering 7.75 per contest ... the Irish defense ranks fifth nationally and their man-down defense ranks second (.808) ... junior midfielder **Zach Brenneman** has team-high totals in goals (22) and points (33) ... senior attackman **Neal Hicks** has a team-best 12 assists to go along with 18 goals ... Rodgers, a third-team All-American last season, is 6-3 on the season ... Rodgers boasts a 7.88 goals-against average and a .586 save percentage ... he has a 21-4 career record ... freshman goalie **John Kemp** has played in four games, including two starts ... Kemp carries a 7.52 goals-against average and a .569 save percentage.

ND-SYRACUSE SERIES NOTES ...

Saturday will be the fourth meeting all-time between Notre Dame and Syracuse ... the Orange lead the series 3-0 ... this will mark the first clash between the two schools at Notre Dame ... the last meeting between the Irish and the Orange occurred in the quarterfinals of the 2008 NCAA Championship and Syracuse clipped the Irish, 11-9, in Ithaca, N.Y. en route to winning the national title ... the two schools first met in the semifinals of the 2001 NCAA Tournament and Syracuse advanced with a 12-5 victory in Piscataway, N.J. ... the Irish and Orange squared off again during the 2004 campaign inside the Carrier Dome in Syracuse, N.Y. ... Syracuse topped Notre Dame, 19-13, in that meeting.

SCOUTING SYRACUSE ...

Syracuse is 11-1 this season and 4-0 in BIG EAST play ... the Orange are coming off a 14-5 victory over Providence on Saturday ... Syracuse's lone loss was an 11-10 setback at Virginia on March 7 ... the Orange are averaging 12.67 goals per game, while allowing 7.42 per contest ... senior Chris Daniello has team-high totals in points (44) and assists (20) and his 24 goals ties him for the team lead with junior Stephen Keogh ... junior John Galloway has started every game in goal and carries a 7.33 goals-against average and a .582 save percentage ... Syracuse went 16-2 last season and won its second consecutive national championship ... the Orange returned five starters and 36 letterwinners from that squad ... head coach John Desko is in his 12th season at the helm of the Syracuse program.

HOSTING THE HIGHLY-RANKED ...

Saturday will mark the first time Notre Dame has played host to a team ranked in the top-two of the national polls ... the Fighting Irish have welcomed in a team ranked third on four occasions ... last season, Notre Dame topped No. 3 North Carolina, 9-7, inside the Loftus Sports Center ... Notre Dame has played host to Loyola three times (1991, 2000, 2002) when the Greyhounds have been ranked third nationally.

OFFENSIVE ATTACK ...

The Fighting Irish have used 8-0 runs in each of its past two games to propel them to victory ... against Providence on April 17, the Irish were down 1-0, yet

broke the game open with an 8-0 run that started with 14:05 left in the second quarter and ended with 3:37 remaining in the third period ... in the St. John's contest on April 24, Notre Dame snapped a 2-2 tie by scoring eight consecutive goals beginning with 7:26 left in the second quarter and ending with a tally at the 3:14 mark of the third quarter.

LOCKING DOWN ...

The Notre Dame defense has only allowed nine goals combined over the past two games (Providence and St. John's) ... the Fighting Irish boast the nation's second-best man-down defense (.808) ... Notre Dame ranks fifth nationally in overall team defense by surrendering just 7.75 goals per game ... since the beginning of the 2007 season, the Fighting Irish defense has only allowed 10 or more goals seven times in the 60 games played during that span.

RODGERS IN THE RANKINGS ...

Notre Dame senior goalie **Scott Rodgers** ranks sixth nationally in both goals-against average (7.88) and save percentage (.586).

SCORELESS QUARTERS ...

When the Notre Dame defense held Providence scoreless in the second quarter on April 17, it marked the sixth time this season that the Irish held an opponent without a goal for an entire quarter ... in the season opener, Notre Dame did not allow a fourth-quarter goal against Duke ... the Fighting Irish held Loyola scoreless during the second quarter of the game on March 6 ... the Irish shut out Drexel in the third period on March 9 ... Notre Dame held Ohio State scoreless in the fourth quarter in the meeting on March 20 ... Notre Dame blanked Rutgers in the first quarter on March 27.

QUALITY QUARTERS ...

Notre Dame has out-scored its opponents 38-22 in the second quarter of play this season ... the Irish also hold a 31-22 scoring advantage in the fourth quarter.

KREBS NETS ANOTHER 20 ...

Senior midfielder **Grant Krebs** has scored 20 goals this season ... that marks the third straight season that he has tallied at least 20 goals ... Krebs scored 26 as a sophomore and followed that up with 29 goals last season.

HAT TRICKS ...

Six Notre Dame players have registered hat tricks this season ... midfielders **Grant Krebs** (Sr.) and **Zach Brenneman** (Jr.) both have four hat tricks ... one of Krebs' hat tricks was a four-goal performance against Georgetown ... **Neal Hicks** (Sr./A) and **David Earl** (Jr./M) each have two hat tricks ... sophomores **Max Pfeifer** (M) and **Sean Rogers** (A) have one hat trick apiece ... Pfeifer's hat trick was a four-goal effort against Drexel.

SPREADING THE WEALTH ...

The Fighting Irish have had 12 players score a goal this season ... Notre Dame boasts four players with double-digit goal totals ... **Zach Brenneman** (Jr./M) has a team-high 22 goals, while **Grant Krebs** (Sr./M) has 20 ... **Neal Hicks** (Sr./A) has 18 goals and **David Earl** (Jr./M) has netted 15.

STREAKING ...

Junior midfielder **Zach Brenneman** has scored a goal in a team-best seven straight contests ... Brenneman has netted 15 goals during that stretch.

FACING OFF ...

Trever Sipperly won 13 of his 15 faceoff attempts against Providence on April 17 ... that marked a personal-best single-game winning percentage (.867) for the senior midfielder ... he ranks 10th nationally this season with a .582 winning percentage (138-99) ... last season, Sipperly ranked 13th nationally with a .559 percentage (85-67).

QUALITY COMPETITION ...

The Fighting Irish have seven teams on their 2010 slate that appear in the latest USILA coaches poll ... three of those squads are ranked in the top 10 ... Notre Dame opened the campaign with an 11-7 victory over current No. 5 Duke ... the Blue Devils were ranked second at the time of the contest ... Notre Dame took down current No. 6 Loyola, 11-9, on March 6 ... Notre Dame topped No. 16 Denver, 14-7, on March 16 ... the Irish fell at current No. 13 Drexel, 7-6 in overtime, on March 9 ... the Fighting Irish were defeated by current No. 12 Villanova, 9-8, on April 3 ... Notre Dame fell at No. 14 Georgetown, 11-8, on April 11 ... the Irish conclude the regular season against No. 2 Syracuse on Saturday ... Notre Dame is ranked in a tie for 19th in the USILA poll.

A COACHING MILESTONE ...

Notre Dame head coach Kevin Corrigan earned his 200th victory at Notre Dame with the win over Denver on March 16 ... Corrigan, who is in his 22nd season at Notre Dame, has a 203-101 (.668) record at the helm of the Fighting Irish program.

HOME SWEET HOME ...

Notre Dame has won 29 of its last 31 home games ... the 10-8 setback to Rutgers on March 27 snapped Notre Dame's 27-game regular-season home win streak ... prior to the loss to the Scarlet Knights, the Irish had not dropped a regular-season home tilt since a 9-6 loss to Denver during the 2005 season.

WORKING OVERTIME ...

The 7-6 win over Ohio State on March 20 was Notre Dame's second overtime game of the season ... the Irish dropped a 7-6 overtime decision at Drexel on March 9 ... the last time that Notre Dame played two overtime contests in the same season was in 2005 ... the win over Ohio State was Notre Dame's first overtime victory since an 8-7 win over Colgate in the first round of the 2008 NCAA Tournament.

CLOSE CALLS ...

Notre Dame's five setbacks this season have come by a combined nine goals (1.8 per game).

A GOOD CAUSE ...

The Notre Dame-Fairfield contest on March 13 was part of the inaugural 'Beating Cancer With a Stick Lacrosse Classic' ... the event, which was presented by Lacrosse 4 All, helped raise money for The Children's Cancer Hospital at the University of Texas M.D. Anderson Cancer Center ... it was the first NCAA Division I lacrosse game in Houston since 1970, when Johns Hopkins played Navy ... four high school programs, Kinkaid, Houston Episcopal, Gulliver Prep (Fla.) and Palo Verde (Nev.), also participated in the event.

A RETURN TO TEXAS ...

The Fairfield game on March 13 signified the second straight season that Notre Dame played a game in the state of Texas ... last year, the Fighting Irish topped Vermont, 13-7, in Dallas ... that contest was part of the Patriot Cup.

BEATING THE BEST ...

Notre Dame has defeated two top-10 teams this season ... the Irish knocked off No. 2 Duke, 11-7, in the season opener ... Notre Dame took down No. 10 Loyola, 11-9, on March 6 ... the last time the Fighting Irish beat two top-10 teams in the same season was during the 2008 campaign ... that season, Notre Dame topped No. 9 Ohio State, 17-12, during the regular season and then downed the 10th-ranked Buckeyes, 9-2, in the title game of the GWLL tournament ... Notre Dame also beat No. 10 Colgate, 8-7 in overtime, in the first round of the 2008 NCAA Championship.

DEFENDING THE CAGE ...

Notre Dame currently ranks fifth nationally with a 7.75 goals-against average ... Notre Dame boasted the nation's top defense in 2009 by producing a school-record 6.19 goals-against average, which shattered the program standard of 6.66 from the 2007 season ... in his first season as a starter, **Scott Rodgers** led all NCAA Division I goalies with a 6.14 goals-against average and a .663 save percentage en route to earning third-team All-America honors in 2009 ... his 15 victories also established a Fighting Irish record ... the Irish had the nation's fifth-best scoring defense in 2008 by allowing 7.04 goals per game ... in 2007, Notre Dame ranked fourth nationally with the 6.66 mark.

ARLOTTA STADIUM ...

Arlotta Stadium is the new home for the Notre Dame men's and women's lacrosse programs ... construction of the facility began in August of 2008 and it held its first event on October 16, 2009 as the Notre Dame men's team played the Iroquois National Team in an exhibition contest ... the official stadium dedication was held on October 17, 2009 ... Notre Dame defeated Denver 14-7 on March 16 in its first regular-season game in the facility ... the stadium features over 2,000 permanent seats, lights, an artificial-turf field, locker rooms, player lounges, restrooms and concession areas ... the state-of-the-art facility is named after Notre Dame graduate John Arlotta, president and chief executive officer of Denver-based Coram Inc. ... he and his wife Bobbie pledged the lead gift toward the stadium, which was built to the east of the Joyce Center as part of the University's new athletics quadrangle ... the Arlotta children - Mindy, Andy and Jon - pledged an additional gift from The Arlotta Family Foundation toward the project ... in addition to their generous donation, alumni and friends of the lacrosse programs donated over two million dollars.

BIG STAGE ...

Notre Dame has played in some big venues over the past few seasons ... on March 6, the Irish defeated Loyola, 11-9, in front of 19,742 fans at M&T Bank Stadium in Baltimore, Md. during the Konica Minolta Face-Off Classic ... last season, Notre Dame topped Ohio State 14-8 in front of an NCAA regular-season record crowd of 30,192 fans at Ohio Stadium ... the game was played prior to Ohio State's spring football game ... the Fighting Irish bested Denver, 10-8, at Invesco Field at Mile High one season ago ... in 2008, Notre Dame faced Denver at Toyota Park, which is home to the Chicago Machine (MLL) and Chicago Fire (MLS).

A FANTASTIC 400 ...

The Penn State contest on Feb. 28 marked the 400th game in the history of varsity men's lacrosse at Notre Dame ... the Fighting Irish carry an all-time record of 266-143 (.650).
