Irish Face Northern Michigan In CCHA Semifinal Showdown

- All-American and Hobey Baker candidate Jordan Pearce leads Irish to Joe Louis Arena with back-to-back shutout performance versus Nebraska-Omaha in second round series.
- Notre Dame making third consecutive appearance in CCHA Championship at "The Joe" and eighth as member of the conference.

BACK TO THE JOE: Notre Dame returns to Joe Louis Arena and the CCHA Championships for the third consecutive year and the eighth time in the program's history (1982, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2007, 2008 and again this season). In '02, '03 and '04, the championship was known as the Super Six as six teams advanced to Detroit. The Irish advanced to "The Joe" after defeating Nebraska-Omaha last weekend, 5-0 and 1-0, to take the second round series, two games to none. Notre Dame, the tournament's top seed, brings a 29-5-3 overall record into the game and is in the midst of an eight-game winning streak that started on Feb. 13 versus their semifinal opponent, Northern Michigan. The Wildcats, who finished sixth in the CCHA this season, advanced by upsetting third-seed, Miami last weekend, taking the series in Oxford, Ohio, two games to one. Northern Michigan meets the Irish on Friday at 4:35 p.m. with an 18-16-5 overall record. The CCHA third-place and championship game will be played on Saturday, March 21 at Joe Louis Arena. The third-place contest is at 3:35 p.m. while the title tilt starts at 7:35 p.m.

IRISH VERSUS WILDCATS: Notre Dame and Northern Michigan have met four times this season with the Irish taking all four games. The teams met in Marquette on Oct. 31-Nov. 1 with the Irish taking 3-2 and 4-2 wins. They then met at Notre Dame on Feb. 13-14, with the Irish prevailing, 9-5 and 5-2. All-time, the teams have met 43 times in the all-time series with Northern holding a 20-18-5 overall record. On neutral ice, NMU owns a 2-1 advantage. The two squads have met three times in CCHA Tournament action. In 1998-99, the Wildcats eliminated the Irish, two games to one, in a first round series. In 2001-02, they defeated Notre Dame, 3-1, in a Super Six game and last year, the Wildcats beat the Irish, 2-1, in the third-place game.

IRISH VERSUS MICHIGAN: These two teams have played 117 times in the series with the Wolverines holding a 66-46-5 edge in those games. The teams met twice this season - on January 30-31 - with the Wolverines winning, 2-1, at the Joyce Center and the Irish taking a 3-2 verdict at Yost Arena. Notre Dame has won five of the last eight meetings in the series, dating back to the start of the 2006-07 season. The teams have met in CCHA playoff action five times (1981-82, 1992-93, 1997-98, 2004-05 and 2006-07) with Michigan holding a 6-4 edge. The last time they met in the CCHA Tournament, the Irish won the CCHA playoff title with a 2-1 win in March of 2007.

IRISH VERSUS NANOOKS: Notre Dame and Alaska have met 49 times in the all-time series with the Irish leading the series, 25-20-4. This season, the two squads met twice at the Joyce Center (Jan. 9-10) with the Irish blanking the Nanooks, 2-0 and 3-0 behind the stellar goal-tending of senior **Jordan Pearce (Anchorage, Alaska)**. Notre Dame is 9-0-1 versus Alaska in the last 10 meetings since the start of the 2006-07 season. In CCHA playoff action, the teams have met twice - 2006 and 2007. In 2006, the Nanooks swept the Irish with 3-1 and 1-0 wins a first round playoff series at the Joyce Center. In 2007, Notre Dame won by 7-1 and 3-1 scores in a second round series to even the record at 2-2.

IRISH CCHA PLAYOFF HISTORY: The Irish have played 49 games in CCHA playoff history and are 21-28 in those games. Notre Dame has won two regular-season titles (2007, 2009) and one playoff title (2007) since becoming a member of the conference.

THE COACH AND THE PLAYOFFS: Irish head coach **Jeff Jackson** has had his share of success in the CCHA playoffs. In this, his 10th CCHA playoff appearance (six at Lake Superior State and four at Notre Dame), Jackson is 32-7 (.821) in conference postseason play. At Lake Superior, his teams were 24-2 while at Notre Dame, he is 8-5. His teams have advanced to Joe Louis Arena in nine of those 10 seasons (six at LSSU and three at Notre Dame).

THE CENTURY MARK: With Friday night's 5-0 win over Nebraska-Omaha (3/13), head coach **Jeff Jackson** recorded his 100th career win at Notre Dame. The 100 wins have come in less than four seasons as Jackson is now 101-47-14 (.667) since starting behind the Irish bench in 2005-06. Notre Dame's six-man senior class also has that record of 101-47-14 in their four years at Notre Dame and they are the most successful class in the program's 41-year history.

WINS MARK: Notre Dame is now 29-5-3 for the year with the 29 wins the second-highest wins total for the Irish. The mark trails the '06-'07 season when Notre Dame won 32 games. Last season, the Irish were 27-16-4, giving the Irish three consecutive seasons of 27-or-more wins. Only one other time in the program's history did the Irish win 27-or-more games - 1987-88 when they were 27-4-2.

MR. ZERO: Notre Dame goaltender **Jordan Pearce** has been a man on a mission over the last five games. On Feb. 21, at Omaha, Neb., Pearce shutout the Mavericks, 1-0, to help the Irish clinch their second CCHA regular-season title. Since then and including that game, Pearce has surrendered just one goal over a five-game span, recording four shutouts. The senior is 5-0-0 in that span, playing 299:59 minutes with a 0.20 goals-against average and has stopped 111-of-112 shots for a .971 save percentage. He will enter Friday's game versus Northern Michigan with a 145:51 minute shutout streak. The last goal he gave up was on Feb. 28 at 14:09 of the second period to Michigan State's Jay Sprague.

MR. RELIABLE: Notre Dame's All-American and Hobey Baker candidate and honorable mention all-CCHA selection - senior goaltender **Jordan Pearce** - has been Notre Dame's No. 1 man in goal over the last two seasons. Since Jan. 5, 2008, Pearce has appeared in 59 of the last 60 Irish games. Of those 59 games, 58 have been starts. Pearce has now appeared in 34 straight games for the Irish, making 33 starts in that span. The last game he did not start was on Nov. 29 when **Tommy O'Brien (Jr., Mokena, Ill.)** made his second career start. Pearce came on in relief after 23:15 of action as O'Brien surrendered two goals on eight shots. Pearce has appeared in 36 of Notre Dame's first 37 games this season and is 28-5-3 with a 1.62 goals-against average and a .934 save percentage with eight shutouts. **Pearce played in all 20 games of Notre Dame's 20-game unbeaten streak from Oct. 31 to Jan. 30, going 17-0-3 with a 1.36 goals-against average with a .944 save percentage and three shutouts.**

HOW GOOD IS PEARCE: Going into the CCHA Championship weekend at Joe Louis Arena, Notre Dame goaltender **Jordan Pearce** leads the nation in wins (28), goals-against average (1.62) and shutouts (8). He is ninth in minutes played (2,146:46), fifth in save percentage (.934) and third in winning percentage (.819).

TURNING ON THE POWER: In four meetings this season between Notre Dame and Northern Michigan, the Irish have scored 15 power-play goals, going 15-for-31 for a 48.4% success rate. The Irish were 6-for-8 in the 9-5 win on Feb. 13 and then went 4-for-8 in the 5-2 win the following night. The Irish have 21 goals in four games versus the Wildcats, but just six have come at even strength. Northern Michigan scored just once on the power-play versus Notre Dame in those four games.

WELCOME BACK RYAN: Junior left wing **Ryan Thang (Edina, Minn.)** returned to the Notre Dame lineup in game one of the series versus Nebraska-Omaha after missing seven games (since Feb. 8) with a high ankle sprain. He scored his 10th goal of the season in the 5-0 win over Nebraska-Omaha in the first period. The seven games he missed were the only games he's missed in his Irish hockey career.

AWARDS TIME: The CCHA has started handing out its postseason awards heading into the second round of the CCHA playoffs. Irish freshman right wing **Billy Maday (Burr Ridge, Ill.)** was named to the league's all-rookie team. Senior goaltender **Jordan Pearce (Anchorage, Alaska)** was named to the CCHA's Scholar-Athlete team for the second consecutive year. Four Irish players were named to the all-conference team. Sophomore defenseman **Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.)** was named first team all-CCHA, becoming the third Notre Dame player along with **David Brown '07** and **Benoit Cotnoir '99** to be named first team. Three players - **Erik Condra (Sr., Livonia, Mich.)**, **Christian Hanson (Sr., Venetia, Pa.)** and **Kyle Lawson (Jr., New Hudson, Mich.)** - were selected second team. Pearce and sophomore **Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm, Sweden)** were honorable mention choices.

CCHA MARKS: Notre Dame's 2-1 win at Michigan State on Feb. 28 gave the Irish 21 league wins this season to tie their record of 21 set during the 2006-07 season when that team was 21-4-3. Notre Dame finished this season with a 21-4-3-3 mark in the CCHA, good for 48 points, a new team record for points in the CCHA. The Irish have three extra points in the league standings due to winning three shootouts this year.

RAISE A BANNER: Notre Dame clinched its second CCHA regular-season championship on Saturday, Feb. 21, with a 1-0 win at Nebraska-Omaha. This is the second regular season title won by the Irish in the last three years as they also won it in 2006-07.

A MOMENT OF SILENCE: The Notre Dame hockey program lost one its biggest ambassadors on Friday, Feb. 27. The "Voice of Notre Dame Hockey" **Mike Lockert** passed away in his sleep early that morning. The 43-year old Lockert had been Notre Dame's hockey broadcaster for seven years (2002-09). He was buried in his hometown of Los Angeles, Calif., on Saturday, March 7th. Notre Dame held a memorial service for their voice on Thursday, March 12 in the Joyce Center.

CLOSE ONES: Notre Dame's 1-0 win over Nebraska-Omaha was the 12th game this season that the Irish won by one goal. In those 12 games, the Irish are 10-2 (.833). The Irish also own a 6-1 mark in games decided by two goals. In overtime, Notre Dame is 2-0-3 and in the three ties, the Irish have been on the winning end of the CCHA's shootout. Last season, the Irish were 11-6 in one-goal games. The .833 winning percentage this season is third best behind a pair of undefeated years - '87-'88 (6-0) and '68-'69 (4-0).

CAPTAIN CONDRA: For the fourth consecutive season, right wing **Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.)** leads Notre Dame in scoring. This season, the senior has 13 goals and 24 assists for 37 points. For his career, Condra now has 48 goals and 109 assists for 157 points in 156 career games. He is now 13th on Notre Dame's all-time points list and is tied for seventh all-time in assists with Dave Bankoske '93. He picked up his second game-winning goal in the 5-0 win versus Michigan State to move him into a tie for sixth all-time with 11 game winners in his career.

ON THE SIDELINES: Sophomore goaltender **Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.)**, has been out for the season, on the injured list. Phillips injured his right knee in the preseason and has not played this year. He was 4-1-0 as a freshman with a 1.53 goals-against average and a .923 save percentage. He has begun skating again and is expected to return to the lineup in 2009-10.

WINNING TEAMS: Since the start of the 2006-07 season, Notre Dame (88-28-10) has had the winningest hockey program in the country. The Irish have recorded 88 wins and a .738 winning percentage in that time frame. Michigan is second with an 87-30-5 record (.734) while Miami is third with a 77-34-10 record (.685). On the weekend of Oct. 24-25, the Irish lost a pair of games to No. 10 Miami, 2-0 and 3-2. They knocked off No. 2 Boston College, 4-1, on Nov. 7. Last season, Notre Dame faced 15 teams that were ranked when they faced the Irish. They were 5-9-1 in those games.

POWER OUTAGE: After scoring 10 power-play goals in the series against Northern Michigan (Feb. 13-14), the Irish have scored just twice on 21 chances with the man advantage in the last six games. Prior to Feb. 20, the Irish were 14-for-27 (51.9%) on the power play against Ohio State and Northern. For the season, the Irish are 50-for-211 for a 23.7% success rate on the power play. They lead the nation in power-play percentage and are second in power-play goals to Boston University's 52.

LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD: Two members of the Notre Dame hockey team are among the list of 10 finalists for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. Named to the list are senior forward **Erik Condra** and goaltender **Jordan Pearce**. The award is given annually to an NCAA Division I student-athlete in nine sports based on achievement's in the "Four C's" of classroom, character, community and competition. CLASS is an acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School. Last season, senior **Mark Van Guilder '08** was one of 10 finalists for the award and in 2007, goaltender **David Brown '07** was selected as the first winner of the hockey award. Through March 10 in the fan voting, Pearce is the leader with 17% of the votes and Condra is second with 16%.

NOTRE DAME WIN MARK: With his two wins versus Nebraska-Omaha, **Jordan Pearce** has now won 28 games this season and 57 for his career. The 57 career wins are the most for a Notre Dame goaltender in the 41-year history of the program. He passed **Lance Madson '90** who held the record for 19 years with 56 wins. Pearce's 28 wins in the regular season are the second-highest single season total, trailing **David Brown's '07** mark of 29 set in 2006-07. Pearce is the only goaltender in Notre Dame history to have 20-or-more wins twice in his career. He now owns a career record of 57-25-7. Brown also set the Notre Dame shutout mark versus UNO, getting his eighth this season. That gives him 12 for his career, tying Brown's career mark.

HONORING LUKE: Notre Dame senior defenseman **Luke Lucyk (Fox Point, Wis.)** was honored by South Bend's Robinson Center on Feb. 20 when he received the Rev. Don McNeill, C.S.C. Award presented each year to a Notre Dame student whose commitment to service has strengthened the relationship between Northeast neighborhood residents and the academic community by building relationships with youth and/or adult participants. The award was presented at the Robinson Center's 8th anniversary party. The center presented Lucyk the award at the Joyce Center earlier in the week with his teammates in attendance. Lucyk was instrumental in starting a program with the Robinson Center to teach inner city kids about the game of hockey. The program was modeled after the NHL's "Hockey in Harlem" program. Participants got a chance to skate at the Joyce Center, attend a Notre Dame hockey game and get weekly instruction from Lucyk and his teammates playing floor or street hockey at the Robinson Center.

NOTHING ON THE BOARD: With the two shutouts versus Nebraska-Omaha, the Irish have extended their single-season mark to nine white-washings this year (**Jordan Pearce - 8, Tom O'Brien - 1**). The previous mark was seven and was set in 2006-07 when **David Brown '07 (6)** and Pearce (1) combined for seven.

A CHILL (ING) REUNION: When sophomore **Calle Ridderwall** and freshman **Billy Maday** were put on the same line with center **Kevin Deeth** in the second game of the Miami series (Oct. 25), it marked the first time that Ridderwall and Maday played together at Notre Dame. The two aren't strangers though as they spent the 2005-06 season as linemates with the Chicago Chill Midget AA program, helping the Chill to a second-place finish at the USA Midget AA championships. Maday had 38 goals and 87 assists for 125 points in 74 games with the Chill while Ridderwall had 52 goals and 66 assists for 118 points that season. In 33 games together this season, the duo has combined for 28 goals and 28 assists with Maday having 13 goals and 13 assists for 26 points while Ridderwall has 15 goals and 15 assists for 30 points in those games.

NEW HOME FOR THE IRISH: The University of Notre Dame announced on Feb. 12, 2009 that construction on a new, freestanding, on-campus ice arena designed to meet both the needs of the nationally ranked Irish hockey team and the local community would begin next year.

The announcement was made by Notre Dame executive vice-president **John Affleck-Graves** and athletics director **Jack Swarbrick**. The construction is expected to begin in the spring of 2010 on a projected 5,000-seat arena - with the venue ready for play to start the 2011-12 season.

The University's Board of Trustees approved the project at its meetings on campus during the first week of February.

"We're thrilled about the plans for a new ice arena on our campus, particularly based on the superb job **Jeff Jackson** and our hockey team have done to position our program as one of the best in the nation," said Swarbrick.

"In addition to providing a first-rate home for our hockey team, this new facility will be made available whenever possible to our community as a whole, and, in particular, to the many area youth hockey and figure skating programs that are in need of an additional venue," Affleck-Graves said.

"This is the most important and missing piece of the puzzle to this hockey program. The new building will create an environment that our fans, the students, the players, and our hockey alumni can be proud of," said Irish coach Jeff Jackson.

The new ice arena will be located south of the Joyce Center, just north of Edison Road, and just west of where the new Irish track and field facility is being constructed. In addition to the track and field project, the University currently is in the process of building new stadia for both soccer and lacrosse (both scheduled for completion this year) - in addition to the ongoing Joyce Center arena addition and renovation that began in September 2008.

The majority of the general public arena seating will be of the chair-back variety. The facility will include two sheets of ice (one of them Olympic-sized), with limited seating availability for the second sheet.

The plan also will include offices and locker room and weight and cardio training facilities for the Notre Dame hockey program. Locker rooms also will be available for campus and community use of the facility.

The new ice arena will replace the Joyce Center fieldhouse as Notre Dame's home for ice hockey. The Joyce Center was dedicated in December 1968 as the Athletic and Convocation Center. It was renamed in 1987 in honor of **Rev. Edmund P. Joyce, C.S.C.**, Notre Dame's executive vice president and chair of the Faculty Board on Athletics from 1952 to 1987.

BACK ON TOP: Notre Dame returned to the top of the USCHO.com/CBS CollegeSports.com poll this week. The Irish are ranked No. 2 in the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* poll for this week. This is the third time this season that Notre Dame has occupied the top spot and the fifth time in the program's history that the Irish have been No.1. They were ranked No. 1 the week of Feb. 23 by *USA Today* and earlier this year were No. 1 for seven straight weeks from Dec. 1 through Jan. 26.

RANKINGS UPDATE: Notre Dame entered the 2008-09 season ranked fourth in both the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* and USCHO.com/CBS College Sports polls. The Irish finished the 2007-08 campaign ranked third in the *USA Today* poll and 12th in the USCHO.com polls. During the '07-'08 season, the Irish were ranked every week of the season for the first time in the program's 41-year history. Going back to the 2006-07 season, Notre Dame has been ranked in both polls for 56 consecutive weeks, the longest stretch for the Irish icers. During the '06-'07 season, Notre Dame was ranked No. 1 for seven straight weeks from Feb. 5 to March 25. This season, the Irish were No. 1 from Dec. 1 to Jan. 26, a span covering seven weeks. The Irish moved into first in the *USA Today* poll again on Feb. 23 for the second time this season and this week is ranked No. 1 in the USCHO.com poll. SIX-PACK: Notre Dame's six power-play goals versus Northern Michigan on Feb. 13 marked the second time this season that the Irish scored six power-play goals in a game. The first time came on Nov. 22 in a 9-1 win at Bowling Green. They were 6-for-12 that night.

A FIVE SPOT: Senior captain **Erik Condra** recorded the third, five-point game of his career in the 9-5 win over Northern Michigan on Feb. 13. He also had five point games in his sophomore year versus Lake Superior State (2g, 3a) and Robert Morris (1g, 4a). He followed that up with two assists in the 5-2 win on February 14.

BACK-TO-BACK BLANKINGS: The Irish have recorded back-to-back shutouts four times this season. Last week, they got two versus Nebraska-Omaha. In February, Notre Dame had one in back-to-back series, getting a 1-0 shutout at Nebraska-Omaha on Feb. 21 and followed that with a 5-0 shutout of Michigan State on Feb. 27. Previously, the Irish had two shutouts at the Joyce Center on Jan. 9-10 versus Alaska by 2-0 and 3-0 scores. Senior goaltender **Jordan Pearce** was between the pipes for both blankings. In October, Notre Dame shut out Sacred Heart, 3-0 and 7-0, on Oct. 17-18. The last time the Irish had back-to-back shutouts in CCHA play came on March 15-16, 2003, when **Morgan Cey '05** blanked Miami, 1-0 and 5-0, in games two and three of the CCHA playoffs. The Irish have never had back-to-back shutout wins in a CCHA regular-season series before this season.

THE PASSMASTER: Junior center **Kevin Deeth (Gig Harbor, Wash.)** has become the team's top playmaker, dishing out a team and personal best 25 assists this season to go with four goals for 29 points. His 25 assists rank him sixth in the CCHA in that category. For his career, Deeth has played in 124 games and now has 32 goals and 61 assists for 93 points.

POWER-PLAY PRODUCERS: Notre Dame has scored 50 power-play goals this season. The six top point producers for the Irish are: Left wing **Calle Ridderwall** (11-9-20); center **Kevin Deeth** (3-14-17); freshman right wing **Billy Maday** (7-9-16); senior **Erik Condra** (5-9-14); defenseman **Brett Blatchford** (0-14-14) and center **Christian Hanson** (6-7-13).

SWEDISH POWER: Sophomore left wing **Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm, Sweden)** has had a break out season in 2008-09 as he is third on the Irish scoresheet with 15 goals and 15 assists for 30 points. He has proven to be a sniper supreme on the power play as he leads the Irish and the CCHA with 11 power-play goals this season. That ties him for third nationally. Ridderwall also is tied for first in the CCHA with five game-winning goals this year.

COLE ON A ROLL: Sophomore defenseman **Ian Cole** picked up the first four-point game of his career, scoring a pair of power-play goals with two assists in the 9-5 win over Northern Michigan. He followed that up with an assist in the 5-2 win on Saturday, Feb. 14. At Ohio State (Feb. 6), Cole had a goal and two assists in the 4-3 win over the Buckeyes. The first team all-CCHA selection leads Notre Dame defensemen in scoring with 23 points on six goals and 17 assists. Cole is tied with Kyle Lawson for the team lead in plus-minus with a +15.

LAW(SON) AND ORDER: Junior defenseman **Kyle Lawson** equaled a career high with three assists in Notre Dame's 9-5 win over Northern Michigan. He followed that with the game-winning goal and an assist the following night to record a five-point weekend. He ranks third on the Notre Dame defense in scoring with three goals and 17 assists for 20 points. The game-winning goal was the third of his career. The leader and warrior on Notre Dame's defense tied for the team lead with a +15. He was a second team all-CCHA selection this season.

RYAN'S STORY: Sophomore center **Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.)** has gotten the hot hand at the right time this season. In the series against Northern Michigan, Ryan had a pair of multi-point games, scoring a goal and two assists in the 9-5 win and then getting a goal and an assist the following night. He has 11 points (3g, 8a), getting points in seven of his last 10 games. After a slow start to the season, Ryan now has 25 points on 10 goals and 15 assists. As a freshman last season, he had 10 goals and 16 assists for 26 points.

LATEST AND FASTEST: **Erik Condra's** goal with 1.3 seconds left on Feb. 6 against Ohio State was the latest goal in regulation scored by the Irish to send a game into overtime. That was followed by **Calle Ridderwall's** overtime game winner that was the fastest that a Notre Dame team has ever scored in overtime - 49 seconds. That beat the previous quickest overtime game winner by **Dan Carlson '01** who scored just 52 seconds into overtime on Jan. 21, 2000 to beat Western Michigan, 4-3.

STREAK RANKINGS: When Notre Dame lost on Jan. 30 to Michigan, it not only snapped an overall 20-game unbeaten streak, but it snapped a 16-game CCHA unbeaten streak (13-0-3). That ties for the seventh-longest conference unbeaten streak in NCAA history and was the third-longest CCHA unbeaten streak in history. The streak trails just Lake Superior State's 28-game conference unbeaten streak (26-0-2) set in 1992-93 and a 17-game conference unbeaten streak (16-0-1) set by Michigan in 1993-94.

STREAK NUMBERS: In Notre Dame's 20-game unbeaten streak, the Irish gave up one goal or less in 12 of the 20 games. The Irish only gave up three goals, four times - a 3-3 tie with Lake Superior (11/14), a 3-3 tie with Western Michigan (11/29), a 4-3 win over Bowling Green (12/13) and the 3-3 tie with Lake Superior (1/17). During the streak, the Irish out scored the opposition by a 72-29 margin (3.60 to 1.45).

LETTERS OF INTENT: In November, Notre Dame head coach Jeff Jackson announced that five players signed national letters-of-intent to play hockey at Notre Dame beginning in the fall of 2009: The list included two defensemen and three forwards. Expected to join the Irish for next season are: **Sam Calabrese (Park Ridge, Ill.)**, **Cam Fowler (Farmington Hills, Mich.)**, **Nick Larson (Apple Valley, Minn.)**, **Kyle Palmieri (Montvale, N.J.)** and **Riley Sheahan (St. Catharines, Ont.)**. Since the announcement, Fowler has announced that he will now play junior hockey in Canada. Calabrese and Palmieri play for the USA Under-18 team while Larson plays

for Waterloo in the USHL and Sheahan is a member of the St. Catharines Falcons organization in the Greater Ontario Junior Hockey League. Calabrese and Palmieri are eligible for the 2009 NHL Entry Draft next June while Sheahan can't be drafted until the June of 2010 draft. Larson was selected in the fourth round of last year's draft by the Calgary Flames.

PENALTY SHOTS: **Ryan Thang's** successful penalty shot goal in the Jan. 31 game at Michigan was the first penalty shot by a Notre Dame player since Oct. 27, 2006 when **Kevin Deeth** was stopped in a game against Army in the Lightning College Hockey Classic. His successful score was the first successful penalty shot by a Notre Dame player since Oct. 12, 2001 when **Rob Globke '04** scored on a penalty shot against Union College at the Joyce Center.

HOUSE OF HORRORS: Notre Dame's win at Yost Arena on Jan. 31 was just the fourth for the Irish since returning to the CCHA in 1992-93. The win improved Notre Dame to 4-21-1 at Yost since the start of the '92-'93 campaign. The Irish have won two of their last three games at Yost since the 2006-07 season.

BIG CROWD: The crowd of 3,007 at the Joyce Center on Jan. 30 was the largest crowd to watch a Notre Dame hockey game since March 3, 1995 when 3,310 saw the Irish defeat Illinois-Chicago, 5-2. The following year, new seating was installed in the Joyce Center and the building was reconfigured to 2,667. A current sellout crowd at the Joyce Center is 2,713. 11 of Notre Dame's 16 home games this season have had crowds of 2,713 or more.

MONTH-BY-MONTH: The Irish were 3-3-0 in the month of October. They followed that with a 7-0-2 record in November and a 4-0-0 mark in December to close out the 2008 portion of the schedule. Notre Dame wrapped up the month of January with a 6-1-1 record and was 7-1-0 in February. March is off to a good start with a 2-0 record to date.

JOINING THE CENTURY CLUB: Senior right wing **Erik Condra** recorded the 100th assist of his Notre Dame career on **Ryan Thang's** third-period goal in the 3-0 win over Alaska on Jan. 10. The assist makes him just the 10th player in the 41-year history of the program to record 100 assists in his career. Condra now has 48 goals and 109 assists for 157 career points.

CLUTCH SCORER: Ryan Thang's game-winning goal on Jan. 9 against Alaska was his second of the season and his first since Oct. 18 against Sacred Heart. The game winner gives him 13 for his career and moves him into a tie for the top spot on Notre Dame's all-time game-winning goal list. Thang is now tied with **Rob Globke '04, Brian Urick '99 and Dave Poulin '82** - as all four players now have 13 game winners to their credit.

PRACTICE ON THE POND: Notre Dame took its Friday practice (Jan. 23) outdoors to a local rink - Merrifield Park in Mishawaka, Ind. - as the players got the chance to play a little shinny. Over 250 kids and adults attended the event that was complete with temperatures in the low teens, stocking caps, hot chocolate and a great deal of laughter. The kids in attendance got a chance to meet the Notre Dame players while they scrimmaged and afterwards with an autograph session. This is the second time the Irish have done this, doing it prior to their series with Bowling Green last January.

FIRST POINT: Freshman center **Patrick Gaul (Pittsburgh, Pa.)** picked up his first collegiate point in the 1-0 win over Ferris State. Gaul started the game-winning play as he moved the puck through the neutral zone to defenseman **Ian Cole** who set up **Dan Kissel's** game winner. Gaul has played in 13 games this season for the Irish.

THE LONG AND SHORT OF IT: Senior right wing **Erik Condra** recorded his second short-handed goal this season in the 3-3 overtime tie/shootout win for the Irish. The goal was the sixth shortie of Condra's career and moved him into fourth on Notre Dame's all-time short-handed goals list. He is one behind the leaders - **Dave Bankoske ('93), Mike McNeill ('88) and Kevin Humphreys ('81)** who had seven in their Irish careers.

WELCOME BACK: Sophomore defensemen **Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.)** and **Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.)** returned to the Notre Dame lineup for the Alaska series after missing both games of the Shillelagh Tournament while playing for the U.S. Junior National Team in the World Junior Championships from Dec. 26 to Jan. 5. The duo helped the U.S. to a fifth-place finish. Cole, playing in his second tournament had two goals and two assists in his six games while Ruth had no points with 25 penalty minutes in his first appearance. The duo are among 12 Notre Dame players all-time to play for the U.S. in the World Junior Championships. They join fellow defenseman **Kyle Lawson** as current Irish players to have played in the tournament during their careers.

IRISH TOURNEY HISTORY: For Notre Dame, the Shillelagh Tournament was the 31st in-season tournament that the Irish have participated in. The two wins give Notre Dame an all-time mark of 25-34-3 in those tournaments. The Irish now have finished first (seven times), second (six times), third (seven times) and fourth (11 times) in those tournaments.

TOURNAMENT HONORS: Notre Dame collected its first Shillelagh Tournament title on Jan. 2-3 at the Sears Centre in Hoffman Estates, Ill. The Irish defeated Union College, 3-1 in the first game and then knocked off Minnesota-Duluth, 3-1, in the title game. Notre Dame placed four players on the Shillelagh Tournament all-tournament team. Selected to the team were: junior defenseman **Kyle Lawson**, forwards **Ben Ryan** and **Garrett Regan** and goaltender **Jordan Pearce**, who also was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player. Lawson anchored an Irish defense that limited Union and Minnesota-Duluth to 41 shots in the tournament while playing over 30 minutes per game. Ryan had a goal and an assist, getting the game winner in the win over Union. Regan scored two goals in the title game, including the game winner versus Minnesota-Duluth. Pearce surrendered just two goals (one even-strength goal) on 41 shots (.951 sv%) and picked up two wins in the tournament. Also selected to the all-tournament team were Minnesota-Duluth defenseman Erik Oberg and forward Justin Fontaine.

THREE IN A ROW: With the win in the Shillelagh Tournament on Jan. 2-3, the Irish have now won one in-season hockey tournament in each of the last three seasons. In 2006-07, the Irish won the Lightning College Hockey Tournament in Tampa, Fla. In 2007-08, Notre Dame was the winner of the Rensselaer Holiday Hockey Tournament in Troy, N.Y. and this season, the Irish got the win in the Shillelagh Tournament.

TAKE ME OUT TO THE HOCKEY GAME: As part of the first-ever Shillelagh Tournament, all four tournament teams attended the NHL's Winter Classic at Wrigley Field on Jan. 1. Notre Dame got to see former Irish defenseman **Brett Lebda '04** score a goal for Detroit in the Red Wings' victory.

PICK SIX: Notre Dame had one of the best power-play performances in program history on Nov. 22 at Bowling Green when the Irish went 6-for-12 on the night with the man advantage. Prior to that, the last time Notre Dame scored six power-play goals in a game was Oct. 21, 1994 when the Irish had six ppg's in an 8-4 win over Waterloo at the Joyce Center. The last time the Irish had 12 power-play chances in a game was on Oct. 8, 2004 at home against Minnesota-Duluth. The Irish were 1-for-12 on the power play in that game.

NINE LIVES: The nine-goal output by the Irish in the 9-1 win at Bowling Green on Nov. 22 marked the first time that Notre Dame had scored nine goals in a game since Nov. 10, 2005 when they scored nine versus Bowling Green in a 9-4 victory.

HOME AWAY FROM HOME: Notre Dame's 4-1 win at Boston College's Kelley Rink on Nov. 7 was the third consecutive win for the Irish on BC's home ice. In 2003-04, the Irish handed the then-No.1 Eagles a 1-0 loss. Two years ago (2006-07), Notre Dame downed the top-ranked Eagles, 7-1 and this year, they handed the second-ranked Eagles the 4-1 loss. In the last three wins at Kelley Rink, Notre Dame has outscored Boston College, 12-2. In the last six meetings between the two schools, the Irish are 4-1-1 against the Eagles.

FIRST TIMERS: Notre Dame's weekend sweep at Northern Michigan (Oct. 31-Nov. 1) marked the first time that the Irish have ever won a two-game series in Marquette, Mich., since the teams began playing during the 1981-82 season. Last weekend's sweep coupled with a 2-1 win on Jan. 5 of last season gives Notre Dame three straight wins at Northern Michigan.

FIRST TIME OUT: Junior goaltender **Tom O'Brien** became the first Notre Dame goaltender to record a shutout in his first career start when he blanked Sacred Heart, 7-0, making 17 saves in the Oct. 18 contest. The previous earliest shutout was held by **Jordan Pearce** who recorded a shutout in just his second start in 2005. **David Brown '07** had his first shutout in his third game as a freshman in October of 2003.

DOCTOR, DOCTOR: Seniors **Erik Condra** and **Jordan Pearce** don't have much in common on the ice as one is known for shooting pucks and the other for stopping them. Off the ice, the senior duo have a great deal in common as they are both pre-med majors at Notre Dame, balancing the books and hockey and doing both rather well. Condra has a double major in psychology and pre-med while Pearce has his double major in anthropology and pre-med. On the ice, Condra is the team's top returning scorer as he led the Irish with 15 goals and 23 assists for 38 points as a junior. Pearce started 43 games in goal for the Irish, going 23-15-4 with a 2.04 goals-against average and a .914 save percentage. He had the best goals against in the CCHA with a 1.80 mark in conference games. The native of Anchorage, Alaska was the team's Most Valuable Player and won the Rockne Scholar-Athlete Award while being selected to the CCHA's Scholar-Athlete team and a second team Academic All-American.

FAMILY GUYS: Three members of the Notre Dame hockey team – senior forwards **Erik Condra** and **Garrett Regan** (Hastings, Minn.) and sophomore goaltender **Brad Phillips** (Farmington Hills, Mich.) – have family ties to the Irish athletics program. Condra's uncle is All-American forward **Kirt Bjork '83** who played at Notre Dame from 1979-83. He scored 76 goals with 85 assists for 161 career points in 141 career games. Bjork took All-America honors in 1983 when he had 29 goals and 34 assists for 63 points. Regan's uncle - **Sean Regan** - was a defenseman for the Irish from 1981-83 before finishing his career at the University of Minnesota. Phillips' uncle, is former Irish quarterback **Terry Andrysiak '89**, who played at Notre Dame from 1985 to 1988.

LEFTY'S RINK: When Notre Dame's new ice hockey arena, located within the Joyce Center is built, the new ice hockey rink will be named the Charles W. "Lefty" Smith, Jr., Rink, in honor of the first coach in the program's history, **Charles "Lefty" Smith**. The announcement was made in April of 2008 at the team's annual awards banquet.

The plans for naming the new ice surface in honor of Smith were made possible by the generosity of the John and Mary Jo Boler family of Inverness, Ill., and Sanibel Island, Fla., their daughter Jill Boler McCormack '84 and her husband, Dan; and their son Matthew Boler '88 and his wife, Christine. They were joined by the family of Frank '57 and Mary Beth O'Brien of Albany, N.Y., who have six children who all graduated from Notre Dame. Their late son, Frankie, played both lacrosse and hockey for the Irish from 1984-88.

Smith came to Notre Dame in 1968 to start the varsity hockey program and coached the Irish for 19 years, retiring in 1987 with 307 career victories. Under his tutelage, Notre Dame produced six All-Americans but most importantly, all 126 student-athletes who played for him completed their collegiate eligibility and earned college degrees.

Smith, who continues to work as the director of the Loftus Sports Center on campus, served two years as the president of the American Hockey Coaches Association. He was inducted into the Minnesota Hockey Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 1992. He played an integral in bringing the International Special Olympics to Notre Dame in 1987.

Married for 56 years, Lefty and his wife, Mickey, are parents of seven living children, with 16 grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICAN HONORS: Goaltender **Jordan Pearce** was selected as an *ESPN The Magazine*/CoSIDA Academic All-American during the 2007-08 season. Pearce, with a double major in anthropology/pre-med, was a second team selection on the At-Large team. He owns a 3.816 grade-point average and has made the Dean's List in four of his first six semesters. Pearce became the first Notre Dame hockey player to take Academic All-American honors since **Dan Carlson '01** and the fifth player overall. He joins Carlson (third team), **Andy Jurkowski '00** (third team), **Forrest Karr '99** (second team) and **Steve Noble '97** and '98 (first team and second team). Two other Irish players were selected to the all-Region V team in '07-'08 – **Mark Van Guilder '08** and **Erik Condra** (Livonia, Mich.)

FAMOUS FATHERS: Two members of the 2007-08 Notre Dame hockey team – senior center **Christian Hanson** and sophomore goaltender **Brian Brooke (Eden Prairie, Minn.)** – have hockey in their blood as their fathers played at the highest level in the National Hockey League. Hanson's father, **Dave Hanson**, played 10 years of professional hockey between 1974-75 and 1983-84, including stints with the Detroit Red Wings and the Minnesota North Stars and the World Hockey Association's (WHA) Minnesota Fighting Saints and the New England Whalers. Fans might also be familiar with Dave Hanson, as one of the famed Hanson Brothers, made famous in the hockey movie - Slapshot. Hanson is still involved in hockey as he currently serves as the director of the Island Sports Center, home of Robert Morris University's hockey team, in suburban Pittsburgh. Brooke's father, **Bob Brooke**, played seven seasons in the NHL between 1984 and 1990 with the New York Rangers, Minnesota North Stars and New Jersey. A 1983 hockey All-American at Yale, Brooke also was a member of the 1984 U.S. Olympic Team.

TRADING PLACES: Sophomore Irish defenseman **Teddy Ruth** was a second round draft choice of the Washington Capitals in the 2007 NHL Entry Draft. The rugged defenseman won't have a chance to play for the Capitals though. At the 2008 NHL trading deadline, Ruth saw his rights traded even up to the Columbus Bluejackets for future Hall of Famer Sergei Fedorov.

HOMETOWNS: The 2008-09 Notre Dame hockey team features players from 10 states, one Canadian province and Sweden. Over the past 14 seasons, the Irish have had monogram winners from 21 different states and provinces – those listed below, plus: Delaware, Massachusetts, Maryland, New York, North Dakota, Alberta, Prince Edward Island, Quebec, Saskatchewan and British Columbia. Sophomore **Calle Ridderwall** (Stockholm) become the first Notre Dame hockey players from Sweden during the 2007-08 season.

NATIONAL JUNIOR TEAM: Sophomore defenseman **Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.)** was named to the U.S. National Junior team for 2009 and was joined by fellow sophomore **Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.)** who becomes the 12th Notre Dame hockey player to participate in the World Junior Championships. Cole, and Ruth, along with **Sean Lorenz (Fr., Littleton, Colo.)** were invited to the 2009 Junior National Evaluation Camp this past August as they tried out for a berth on this winter's team that will play in Ottawa, Ontario. Cole and Ruth join **Jack Brownschidle ('76-'77, '78-'79)**, **Ben Simon ('96-'97, '97-'98)**, **Joe Dusbabek ('97-'98)**, **Dan Carlson ('98-'99)**, **Connor Dunlop ('99-'00, '00-'01)**, **Brett Henning ('99-'00)**, **David Inman ('99-'00)**, **Rob Globke ('00-'01, '01-'02)**, **Brett Lebda ('01-'02)** and **Kyle Lawson ('06-'07)** as former Irish players to play in the World Junior Championships.

NHL DRAFTEES: The Irish have eight players on the 2008-09 roster who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Just one incoming freshman – defenseman **Sean Lorenz** – was selected in the 2008 draft as he was picked by the Minnesota Wild in the fourth round, 115th overall. In the previous draft in June of 2007, Notre Dame saw five of its players selected. Leading the way was current sophomore defenseman **Ian Cole** who was a first-round selection of the St. Louis Blues who took him with the 18th pick overall. Cole became the first Irish player ever selected in the first round and was selected earlier than any other Notre Dame player (**Rob Globke '04** was the previous highest selection when he was picked 40th overall by Florida in 2002). Cole was followed by fellow defenseman Teddy Ruth who went in the second round, 46th overall to the Washington Capitals. **Ryan Thang** was selected in the third round, 81st overall by the Nashville Predators. Sophomore center **Ben Ryan** (Brighton, Mich.) joined Thang when the Predators made him the 114th pick (fourth round). Goaltender **Brad Phillips** rounded out the Notre Dame selections in the 2007 draft when the Phila-

delphia Flyers selected him in the seventh round, 182nd overall. They join senior right wing **Erik Condra** who was selected in the seventh round, 211th overall by the Ottawa Senators in 2006 and junior defenseman **Kyle Lawson** who was selected in the 2005 NHL Draft by the Carolina Hurricanes in the seventh round, 198th overall.
