

## BIG EAST WOMEN'S SOCCER #13 Connecticut vs. #15 Notre Dame



Sunday, Oct. 21, 2007 Alumni Field (Notre Dame, Ind.)



SENIOR SALUTE – Six veteran members of the ND women's soccer team could be playing in their final regular-season home game today ... those players include goalkeeper Lauren Karas, defender Jennie Bireley, M/D Ashley Jones, F/M Amanda Cinalli and forwards Kerri Hanks and Susan Pinnick (both of whom have one year of eligibility remaining) ... ND's fourth-year seniors (Cinalli, Jones and Karas) have helped ND compile an 82-9-3 record (.888) from 2004-07 while winning the 2004 NCAA title and being the 2006 runner-up ('05 quartefinalist) ... Bireley – who played previously at lowa State and Texas-Dallas – has been a valuable addition to the ND defense this season, after becoming a rare walk-on via the 2007 spring season ... Karas has yet to allow a goal in BIG EAST play this season and owns a 0.57 career goals-against avg. (would tie ND record, held by Liz Wagner), while her 45-4-1 career record (.910) is on pace to best Jen Renola's ND record for career win pct. (.903) ... Jones has played all 94 games of her ND career and has matched her career-high with nine points this season (2G-5A; career-best five-game point streak) ... she owns a 3.98 cumulative GPA as an accounting major (27 A grades, 2 A-minuses) and is a top candidate for Academic All-American of the Year ... Cinalli is one of 12 all-time ND players with 30-plus goals and 30-plus assists in their careers (34G-30A), reaching double-digit goals in each of the previous three seasons (also all-BIG EAST each year) ... Cinalli also is a member of the U.S. U-21 National Team and serves as ND's 2007 team captain ... Pinnick did not play in 2004 (due to injuries suffered in a summer van accident with her club team) but made an inspirational return to rank as one of ND's top forwards over the past three seasons (12 career goals) ... see next page for Hanks info.

**TODAY'S GAME** – Notre Dame is riding a seven-game win streak that includes a 26-2 scoring margin and four straight shutouts, while allowing only 39 shots (5.6/gm), 12 shots on goal (1.7/gm) and 10 corner kicks (1.4/gm) in the win streak ... the Irish have won six straight by a margin of three or more goals ... ND is looking to extend its 13-year home unbeaten streak versus BIG EAST teams (76-0-1) ... the Irish also have a 32-game overall unbeaten streak against BIG EAST foes (31-0-1), since mid-2005 ... ND has won 255 consecutive games when taking a 2-0 lead and owns 74 straight wins when scoring 3-plus goals (also 153-1-0 in the past 154 games when scoring 3-plus, since 1995) ... the Irish are 46-2-2 in their past 50 home games (2004-07) but have two losses this season at Alumni Field ... ND's all-time record at Alumni Field (199-16-4/.917, from 1990-2007) includes a .961 win pct. against teams not ranked in the NSCAA top-25 (136-4-3).

THE SERIES – ND leads the series with UConn 16-4-3 (10-2-2 in the past 14), including 9-1-0 at Alumni Field (only 3-2-3 at Morrone Stadium) and 9-2-0 in the postseason (7-1-0 in BIG EAST title games; 2-1-0 in the NCAAs) ... the ND seniors are 4-1-1 vs. UConn (13-2 scoring edge) ... the Irish posted three straight shutout wins over the Huskies (2-0 in the '04 NCAA 3rd round/at ND, 4-0 in the '05 regular season/at ND, and 5-0 in the '05 BIG EAST title game/at Marquette) before the 2006 scoreless tie at UConn (ND 24-8 shot edge/8-2 in shots on goal) ... UConn handed the Irish their only loss of the 2004 national-title season (25-1-1), rallying to win the 2004 BIG EAST final (2-1) ... the Irish won both earlier and later games vs. UConn in the 2004 season (1-0 at UConn and 2-0 in NCAA 3rd round/at ND).

**CONFERENCE COMMAND** – ND is riding a 13-year home unbeaten streak versus BIG EAST teams (76-0-1; tie vs. Rutgers in '04), since losing 5-4 to UConn in '95 ... ND has a 32-game overall unbeaten streak against BIG EAST teams (30-0-1, since '05 loss at Marquette) that ranks as 8th-longest conference unbeaten streak in D-I women's soccer history (3rd-longest by ND team) ... ND's all-time record in BIG EAST regular-season games is 113-8-4 (.920), plus 27-2-0 in the BIG EAST Tournament and 2-1-0 in the NCAAs vs. BIG EAST teams (all vs. UConn) – for an overall record of 142-11-4 versus BIG EAST teams ('95-'07) ... the Irish have not been outshot in 64 straight vs. BIG EAST teams (since mid-'02).

**BIG EAST RACE** – ND (8-0-0; 24 pts) has clinched a 1st-round bye in the 10-team BIG EAST Tournament and will play host to a BIG EAST quarterfinal (Nov. 3 or 4) ... the Irish are on the verge of clinching the National Division title, as Louisville (16; 5-2-1) is eight points back with three to play (three pts for win, one for tie; ND has head-to-head tiebreaker vs. UL) ... the National Division also includes Seton Hall (10; 3-4-1), Villanova (10; 2-2-4), Georgetown (9; 3-4-0), Cincinnati (9; 3-5-0), Rutgers (8; 2-4-2) and DePaul (3; 1-7-0) ... GU had a game called off at South Florida due to rain (likely to be made up) ... the top five from each division advance ... UConn and West Virginia are co-leaders of the American Division (22; 7-0-1), followed by Marquette (13; 3 4-2-2), USF (10; 3-3-1), St. John's (9; 3-5-0), Syracuse (8; 2-4-2), Providence (6; 2-6-0) and Pitt (4; 1-6-1).

IRISH TEAM NOTES - Becca Mendoza's pair of goals sparked ND to another strong second half, in Friday's 4-0 win over Providence ... despite its slow start, ND ranks 14 the in the nation with 2.7 goals/gm (25 in past six games, or 4.2/gm in that span) .... in league play, the Irish lead the BIG EAST in scoring (3.7 goals/gm) and goal margin (+28; 30-2) while ranking second in shots (19.9/gm) and shutouts (6), and third in goals-against avg. (0.25) ... the Irish have three players with 30-plus career goals (Hanks with 59, Amanda Cinalli 34, Bock 34), the first Irish team since 1999 that can make that claim (the 1998 offense had six players with 30-plus career goals) ... Cinalli missed a game for the first time in her four-year career (at Syracuse; also three more DNP), due to a hamstring injury ... sophomore center back Haley Ford has missed 11 straight games due to her own nagging hamstring injury ... Ford's absence actually has impacted the ND offense, as freshman M/F Lauren Fowlkes has shifted to a starting center back role (alongside Dew) ... all four of freshman Rose Augustin's goals have come in the past six games ... junior left back Elise Weber's seven points (1G-5A) are most among the ND defenders ... ND's 20-year women's soccer history now has included 23 winning streaks of six games or longer ... the Irish have scored only 14 first-half goals (in 15 games) but have totaled 26 goals in the second half ... Hanks (5) is one shy of tying Jenny Heft's ND record for career hat tricks (6) ... Hanks has been involved in 27 goals in her ND career that have come on set-play/dead-ball situations: six free-kick goals, five penalty-kick goals, nine corner-kick assists and seven free-kick assists ... Hanks is the 39th player in D-I history to reach 40 career goals and 40 assists (now 59G-46A, in 67 GP) ... Hanks totaled 22G-22A in 2006, joining former UNC great Mia Hamm as the only players ever to finish a season as the national leader in goals and assists ... she was the youngest player (by class year) – in men's or women's soccer history – ever to receive the Hermann Trophy player-of-the-year award ... Hanks is a member of the U.S. Under-21 National Team pool and is one pace to set ND record for career points per game (2.45) and goals per game (0.88) ... her 28 goals in 2005 tied the ND record were 4th-most ever by a D-I freshman ... Hanks is the only ND player ever to have both a hat trick and a three-assist game during NCAA Tournament play.

**BOCK'S TWO-WEEK TEAR** – Junior **Brittany Bock** had been named national and BIG EAST offensive player of the week in each of the past two weeks, after totaling 4G-1A in wins last week at Syracuse and St. John's and adding 4G-1A in wins over Georgetown and Villanova (first ND player in 10 years to score four-plus goals in back-to-back weeks) ... she had a career-best five-game goalscoring streak, after a seven-game goal drought ... Bock is the third BIG EAST player since '95 to be named the league's offensive player of the week in consecutive weeks ... her eight goals in that four-game span represent one of the top two-game scoring tears in ND women's soccer history ... she is one of only six Irish players ever to score the first three goals in a game (vs. Syracuse), as are current ND players **Kerri Hanks** and **Michele Weissenhofer**) ... Bock leads the BIG EAST with 10 goals (15th in the nation) while Hanks leads the BIG EAST overall in points (27) and is one of only five players in the nation with 9-plus goals and 9-plus assists ... five different ND women's soccer players have been named national players of the week over the past two seasons, with others including Cinalli, **Carrie Dew**, Weissenhofer and Hanks (all in '06) ... Hanks (Sept. 21, vs. DePaul) and Bock are the first ND teammates with hat tricks in the same regular season since Amy Warner (vs. Providence) and Meotis Erikson (vs. Georgetown) in 2000 ... Weissenhofer (Nov. 24, 2006), Hanks and Bock each have turned in hat tricks over the span of ND's past 18 games ... Hanks and Bock are the only ND players ever to score goals 1-2-3 in a road game ... 16 of Bock's career goals with the Irish have come on headers (three last week), in addition to four rare corner-kick assists in her career ... Bock has reached double-digit goals in all three of her seasons while her 10 game-winning goals over the past two seasons (4 in '07) are tied with Hanks for the most by an ND player.

*HUSKIES NOTES* – UConn is riding an 11-game unbeaten streak (10-0-1) while battling West Virginia for the BIG EAST American Division title ... the Huskies have BIG EAST wins over Providence (6-0), South Florida (1-0), Marquette (5-0), Seton Hall (2-1), Pittsburgh (4-0), WVU (2-0) and DePaul (2-1), plus a scoreless tie vs. Rutgers ... UConn also owns wins over Princeton (1-0), Central Connecticut (2-1), Brown (5-1) and Fairfield (4-1), with losses to Stanford (0-1) and Penn State (0-1) ... ND and UConn have faced four common opponents this season (ND beat PC and DePaul, both 4-0, while losing 2-1 games to Stanford, in OT, and PSU) ... the Huskies returned 10 starters and 14 of 17 letterwinners from their 2006 team that went 11-7-4 and placed second in the BIG EAST American Division (7-3-1) before losing to Rutgers in the BIG EAST quarterfinals (on PKs) and similarly losing to Texas in the second round of the NCAAs (also on PKs).

FRIEND OR FOE? – UConn's Elizabeth Eng is a former teammate of four ND players: Brittany Bock (ODP Region II; Eclipse Select), Kerry Inglis (ODP R-II), Michele Weissenhofer and Amanda Clark (both Eclipse) ... ND's Kerri Hanks and UConn's Meghan Schnurr were two of the top players on the U.S. U-19 National Team (Bock has trained alongside Schnurr at U.S. U-19 camps) ... ND's Amanda Cinalli and UConn's Brittany Taylor played for the U.S. U-21 National Team at the Nordic Cup (summer '06) ... ND's Micaela Alvarez and UConn's Lauren Ebert were ODP Region I and Parsippany Mischief club teammates ... ND's Rachel VanderGenutgen and UConn's Annie Yi helped the Carmel Cyclones win the 2007 USYS national club title (U-19).

ND RESULT NOTES - ND's challenging first 11 games (two exhibitions) saw the Irish face eight top-25 teams (UNC, Virginia, Florida, Santa Clara, Stanford, Oklahoma St., Penn St., Louisville) ... ND had won 37 straight when scoring first, prior to the 2-1 loss to PSU ... Amanda Cinalli matched her career-high with five points (2G-1A) in the 4-2 win over Princeton ... Kerri Hanks scored on direct free kicks vs. Princeton and OSU, as offensive MVP of the Inn at Saint Mary's Classic (also 1A vs. Princeton) ... the 2-1 OT loss to OSU halted ND's 43-game home unbeaten streak (41-0-2), third-best in NCAA history ... that was the first time the Irish had lost when Hanks scored (now 36-2-0, from '05-'07) ... ND's 27-game regular-season unbeaten streak (25-0-2) ended the previous weekend at #3 Santa Clara (7-1) ... the 2-1 loss to Stanford ended ND's OT unbeaten streak at 21 games (14-0-7) ... ND played to a scoreless tie with Michigan in the '07 regular-season opener, despite a 28-6 shot edge and 10-1 corner-kick margin ... that game ended ND's home win streak at 32 games (3rd in D-I history) ... the crowd vs. Michigan (3,264) is the largest ever for an official (non-exhib.) ND women's soccer home game ... the 2-0 win at #7 Florida saw ND endure two rain delays totaling five hours ... ND's exhibitions included a 2-2 tie with preseason #1 UNC (rare quick rematch of NCAA title game) and a 3-1 win over #11 Virginia ... the crowd for the UNC game (3,412; unprecedented 1,318 presold) was an Alumni Field record for a women's soccer game and was the biggest crowd at the facility since the 1994 ND-SMU men's soccer game (3,502).
