### Storylines

- ◆ Notre Dame has won 21 consecutive exhibition games and is 26-1 in preseason contests dating back to the start of the 1993-94 season.
- ◆ Notre Dame and Southern Indiana are meeting for the second time in any sport (first since a softball doubleheader in 1989).

**M**ore than seven months after a close loss to second-ranked North Carolina in the second round of the NCAA Tournament, Notre Dame gets back on the hardwood Thursday at 7 p.m. (ET) when it plays host to Division II foe Southern Indiana in the exhibition opener for both teams at the Joyce Center.

Notre Dame returns eight monogram winners and three starters from its 2006-07 squad that posted a 20-12 record and earned a fifth-place tie in the rugged BIG EAST Conference. Add in the nation's 11th-ranked rookie class and you have the makings of a deep and talented team built for the long haul.

On the other hand, USI will have many new faces in uniform this season, with only four players returning from last year's 16-12 club. However, the Screaming Eagles are no strangers to Division I success, having won at Morehead State, 75-74 in an exhibition game last year.

### Setting The Standard

Under the guidance of 21st-year head coach **Muffet McGraw**, Notre Dame has evolved into one of the country's leading women's basketball powers. The Irish have appeared in 14 NCAA Tournaments (including a current streak of 12 in a row) and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 six times in the previous 11 years. Notre Dame also has reached the NCAA Women's Final Four twice, winning college basketball's ultimate prize with the 2001 national championship.

In its history, Notre Dame has developed nine All-Americans, nine WNBA players (including six draft picks in the past seven years) and four USA Basketball veterans (nine medals won). Now in their 31st season in 2006-07, the Irish own an all-time record of **613-278 (.688)**.

## A Quick Look At The Fighting Irish

Even after a 20-12 record and a trip to the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 2006-07, Notre Dame still continues to fly below the national radar. Head coach **Muffet McGraw** wouldn't want it any other way.

Last year, the Irish learned quickly that respect is something that isn't handed to you, but rather earned on the court. It's also a quality that takes time to develop and doesn't come from trophy cases or record books. So although Notre Dame doesn't appear in the preseason ESPN/USA Today coaches poll, and was tabbed fifth in the preseason BIG EAST Conference balloting, it's not a great concern to McGraw and her charges. Instead, they focus on the things they can control and prefer to let the outside world judge them when the season is over.

This year could prove to be unlike any in recent memory for Notre Dame. For one, the Irish will roll out some impressive depth, going virtually two-deep at every floor position. In addition, Notre Dame's new offensive system (a Princeton-based set with four guards and a post) continues to evolve, building upon last year's 70.1 point-per-game average that was its highest since the 2000-01 NCAA national championship season.

Senior guard **Charel Allen** is the top returning scorer and rebounder for the Irish, leading the team in both categories last year (17.0 ppg., 6.2 rpg.). She also was a first-team all-BIG EAST and WBCA honorable mention All-America selection, and was a finalist for the 2007 USA U21 World Championship Team that struck gold this past summer in Moscow.

Allen's backcourt partner and classmate is

point guard **Tulyah Gaines**. Now in her second full season at the helm of the Notre Dame offense, the speedy Gaines averaged 9.6 points per game along with team highs of 3.9 assists and 2.0 steals per contest. She also is a two-year team captain who commands instant respect from teammates, coaches and opponents.

The Irish will benefit from the return of junior guard **Lindsay Schrader**, who missed the entire 2006-07 season with a torn ACL in her right knee. Schrader, who retains three years of athletic eligibility, was Notre Dame's second-leading scorer (10.5 ppg.) and top rebounder (5.4 rpg.) as a rookie in 2005-06 and will look to regain that form this season.

Last year saw Notre Dame break new ground by becoming the first school ever to put three players on the BIG EAST All-Freshman Team. Guards **Ashley Barlow** (10.3 ppg., 5.4 rpg.) and **Melissa Lechlitner** (6.3 ppg., 2.7 apg.) will provide a superb complement to the veteran Allen-Gaines tandem, while center **Erica Williamson** (6.1 ppg., 5.3 rpg., 1.3 bpg.) showed flashes of potential throughout her rookie season and is poised for increased development this year.

Heading a three-player freshman class (ranked 11th nationally by *Blue Star Basketball*) is **Devereaux Peters**, a smooth 6-2 forward who was a consensus All-American as a senior last year at national powerhouse Fenwick High School in Oak Park, Ill. Fellow post **Becca Bruszewski** (Valparaiso, Ind.) finished third in last season's Indiana Miss Basketball voting and was a perennial all-state pick. And, guard **Brittany Mallory** (Baltimore, Md.) offers a perimeter shooting threat, as well as a cerebral player who will mesh well in the Irish offensive system.

## Gameday Services

Gameday packages containing game notes, flipcards and other information will be available on press row prior to all home contests. A pre-game meal also is served in the arena level media room (exit court via Gate 8 ramp behind visitors' bench, make first right, enter first door on right) beginning 75 minutes before tipoff.

A bank of statistics monitors is located on press row for the media's convenience. Final statistics books include an official NCAA box score and play-by-play. Telephone, copier and fax services are available on a first-come, first-served basis. The Joyce Center also offers wireless Internet capability — check with **Chris Masters** for access.

## Post-Game Press Conferences

Following each Notre Dame home game, Irish head coach **Muffet McGraw** and selected players, followed by the visiting head coach and selected players, will be available to speak with the media. Post-game press conferences are held in the Joyce Center auditorium, located near Gate 1 on the first floor of the arena (exit floor via Gate 1 ramp to right of press row, go straight and turn right at WBB office).

## Potent Notables About The Irish

- Notre Dame is among the nation's winningest programs during the past 11 seasons (1996-97 to present), ranking seventh with 267 victories in that span.
- Notre Dame's incoming class of 2007 was ranked 11th in the nation by *Blue Star Basketball*, marking the 11th consecutive season that the Irish attracted a Top 25 recruiting class. Notre Dame is one of only three schools (along with Connecticut and Tennessee) to have an active streak of that length.
- Last season, Notre Dame ranked 10th nationally in attendance (6,364 fans per game), marking the seventh consecutive campaign the Irish were among the national top 20 in attendance. Notre Dame also has attracted 5,000-or-more fans to 94 of its last 96 home games, including three Joyce Center sellouts of 11,418 (most recently on Dec. 31, 2005 vs. Tennessee).
- The Irish have become a regular fixture in the WNBA Draft in recent years, as six Notre Dame players have been selected in the past seven seasons. **Megan Duffy** was the most recent Irish player to be chosen,

going to the Minnesota Lynx in the third round (31st overall pick) of the 2006 WNBA Draft. Duffy and **Ruth Riley** (San Antonio) both have been active in the league during the 2007 season, with Riley making her sixth playoff appearance (on her third different team) in a solid seven-year pro career. All told, seven Notre Dame alums have competed in WNBA regular-season play, with three of them combining to win four league championships — Riley won a pair of crowns with the Detroit Shock (2003 Finals MVP, 2006), **Coquese Washington** toiled for the 2000 Houston Comets, while **Jacqueline Batteast** was Riley's teammate on the '06 title-winning squad in Detroit.

- Notre Dame has been an elite program in the classroom as well. For the second year in a row, the Irish posted a perfect 100-percent Graduation Success Rate (GSR), according to figures released by the NCAA in October 2007. Notre Dame was one of 23 Division I-A programs to achieve this distinction, and one of only two BIG EAST schools (Syracuse was the other). Furthermore, since **Muffet McGraw** became the Irish head coach in 1987, every Notre Dame women's basketball player that has completed her athletic and academic eligibility at the University has graduated (a perfect 53-for-53 success rate).

### A Quick Look At Southern Indiana

If any team could truly say it was unsure of what lies ahead this season, it would likely be Southern Indiana. The Screaming Eagles return just four players (including one starter) from last year's squad that registered a 16-12 record and placed fourth in the West Division of the Great Lakes Valley Conference (GLVC) with a 10-9 mark. However, with eight newcomers on board, the future for USI is exceptionally bright, as it looks to return to the national spotlight that saw the Eagles finish as the 1997 NCAA Division II runner-up and reach the 2001 NCAA Division II Elite Eight as part of seven NCAA Tournament appearances.

Southern Indiana was picked to finish third in the GLVC West this season, according to a preseason poll of the league's head coaches. The Eagles are led by senior forward **Jasmine Baines**, who started 20 games last season, averaging 11.8 points and 5.5 rebounds a night. No other player on the USI roster averaged more than four points or four rebounds per game last season.

Highlighting the large incoming class for Southern Indiana is sophomore guard **VaNita Smart**, who transferred from Indiana during the offseason. Smart played in 23 games for the Hoosiers last season, averaging 1.6 points per game. She actually is the only current USI player who has ever played a college game at the Joyce Center, seeing one minute of action in IU's 54-51 win over Notre Dame on Dec. 3, 2006.

Southern Indiana is playing a Division I opponent in exhibition play for the second consecutive season and fourth time since the 2001-02 season. The Eagles are 1-2 against Division I foes, most recently pulling out a 75-74 victory at

Morehead State on a last-second three-pointer by current senior guard **Marshay Jolly**.

**Rick Stein** is beginning his ninth season as the head coach at his alma mater, following eight years (1991-99) as an assistant coach. He has a career record of 143-92 (.609).

### The Notre Dame-Southern Indiana Series

Thursday will mark the first time Notre Dame and Southern Indiana have ever faced one another on the hardwood.

### Other Notre Dame-Southern Indiana Series Tidbits

- Southern Indiana is the second GLVC opponent for Notre Dame in exhibition play. The Irish defeated Indianapolis, 84-59, exactly two years ago on Nov. 1, 2005, at the Joyce Center. Guard **Megan Duffy** led four Notre Dame players in double figures with 18 points and seven assists, while center **Melissa D'Amico** collected 16 points and seven rebounds, and guard **Lindsay Schrader** added 13 points and seven boards.
- During the program's infancy, Notre Dame faced two other current GLVC schools — St. Joseph's (Ind.) and Southern Illinois-Edwardsville. The Irish are 4-3 all-time against SJC (the alma mater of Notre Dame athletics director **Kevin White**), last playing the Pumas on Dec. 2, 1981 and taking a 78-44 victory at the Joyce Center. Meanwhile, the Irish played SIU-E for the only time on Jan. 11, 1980, defeating the Cougars, 65-51 at the Huskie Invitational in DeKalb, Ill.
- Not only have Notre Dame and Southern Indiana never met in women's basketball, they have only played previously in one sport. On March 9, 1989, the Irish and Eagles split a softball doubleheader in Evansville, with USI taking the opener, 6-1, and Notre Dame winning the nightcap, 1-0. That was the first weekend of action for the Irish as a varsity softball program, with current Notre Dame assistant athletic director **Brian Boulac** serving as head coach, and **Joe Speybroeck**, husband of Irish head equipment manager **Kathy Speybroeck**, filling the assistant coach's chair.
- Although Notre Dame has had a program-high 18 players from Indiana during its 30 seasons of existence (including three Hoosiers on this year's roster), the Irish have never had a player from the Evansville area suit up. The closest any Notre Dame player has lived to Evansville is Bloomington (140 miles to the northeast), which was the hometown of two-time All-American and Irish career scoring leader **Beth Morgan** (1993-97).

### Exhibition Excellence For Irish

Notre Dame has been nearly unbeatable in exhibition games during the past 14 seasons. Since the 1993-94 campaign, the Irish are 26-1 (.963) in these preseason tilts and own an active 21-game exhibition winning streak. During that time, Notre Dame has outscored its preseason opponents by an aggregate score of 2,337-1,621, which is good for an average score of 87-60. The last squad to



defeat the Irish in exhibition play was the Lithuanian National Team, which edged Notre Dame, 94-89 in 1996-97. But the Irish were not fazed by that loss — they went on to reach their first NCAA Final Four that year.

New NCAA rules in recent years have allowed Division I teams to play exhibitions against Division II, III or NAIA institutions. The Irish are 5-0 against these College Division programs, having downed four NCAA Division II schools since 2001 (Christian Brothers in 2001-02, Indianapolis and Ferris State in 2005-06, Lake Superior State and Northwood (Mich.) in 2006-07).

BIG EAST Women's Basketball Media Day at the ESPNZone in New York City. The Irish collected 165 points, with Connecticut (15 first-place votes, 225 points), Rutgers (one first-place vote, 211 points), West Virginia (186 points) and Pittsburgh (169 points) joining Notre Dame in the top five.

Senior guard **Charel Allen** was one of 11 players selected to this year's Preseason All-BIG EAST Team. Allen averaged a team-high 17.0 points and 6.2 rebounds per game last season and ranked second in the BIG EAST with 19.3 points per game in league play. She went on to earn first-team all-BIG EAST and honorable mention All-America laurels. While helping the Irish go 20-12 and reach the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

### Other Storylines For The Irish In '07-08

- Notre Dame is poised to reach a pair of milestones this season, and could do so as early as its season opener vs. Miami (Ohio). A victory over the RedHawks on Nov. 9 would not only give the Irish their 300th all-time win at the Joyce Center (currently 299-79, .791), but it also would be the 450th career victory for head coach **Muffet McGraw** in her 21-year tenure at Notre Dame (currently 449-179, .715).
- The Irish will make their third appearance in the Preseason WNIT when it tips off with Miami (Ohio) on Nov. 9 at the Joyce Center. Notre Dame finished third in 1996, then won the Preseason WNIT title in 2004, defeating No. 6 Duke and No. 10/9 Ohio State in its final two tournament games. That marked the second time in program history that the Irish defeated top-10 opponents in consecutive games. This year's Preseason WNIT is structured differently from past events, with teams guaranteed to play a minimum of three games.
- Senior guard **Charel Allen** is one of 25 players chosen for the 2007-08 State Farm Wade Trophy Preseason List, and one of 30 tapped for this year's John R. Wooden Women's Award Preseason List, both of which identify some of the prime candidates for elite national player-of-the-year awards. Allen was a State Farm Coaches' honorable mention All-American and first-team all-BIG EAST Conference choice last year. Her appearances on the "Wade Watch" and Wooden Award watch list this season are the fourth in the past five years for a Notre Dame player (for both charts). Allen also has been named a 2007-08 preseason All-American by both *The Sporting News*

## First meeting in 2007-08

- (second team) and CSTV.com (honorable mention), joined on the latter squad by sophomore guard **Melissa Lechlitner**.
- Junior guard **Lindsay Schrader** returns to action this season after missing all of the 2006-07 campaign with a torn anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) in her right knee, an injury suffered on the fourth day of preseason practice (Oct. 15) last year. Schrader averaged 10.5 points and 5.4 rebounds per game while starting 27 times during her freshman season, capped by a career-high 29 points against Boston College in the NCAA Tournament.
- Notre Dame sent three players — sophomore guards **Melissa Lechlitner** and **Ashley Barlow**, and senior guard **Charel Allen** — to USA Basketball National Team Trials in May 2007. Lechlitner and Barlow tried out for the U.S. U19 World Championship Team, with Lechlitner making the final cut (see note below). Meanwhile, Allen was named one of 14 finalists for the American U21 World Championship Team that struck gold in Moscow, Russia, in July 2007.
- Notre Dame makes a change among its assistant coaching ranks, as **Niele Ivey** replaces **Coquese Washington**, who was named the head coach at Penn State in April 2007. Ivey played for the Irish from 1996-2001, earning third-team All-America honors and the Frances Pomeroy Naismith Award (top senior 5-8 and under) during her final season when she helped pilot Notre Dame to its first NCAA championship. In addition, Notre Dame's third-year assistant coach **Angie (Potthoff) Barber** has changed her name following her marriage to Luke Barber on Aug. 18 in Erie, Pa.

- NCAA Tournament for the 12th consecutive season and 14th time in program history. The ninth-seeded Irish defeated No. 8 seed California, 62-59 in the first round of the NCAA Dallas Region before falling to top-seeded (and second-ranked) North Carolina, 60-51 in the second round.
- For the 13th time in 14 years, Notre Dame registered a 20-win season. The Irish also have now reached that threshold 21 times in the program's 30-year history, including 17 times in the first 20 seasons of the **Muffet McGraw** era.
- The Irish set a school record for free throw accuracy, connecting at a .760 clip (506-666) in 2006-07. That smashed the old program standard of .743 that was set during Notre Dame's 1996-97 Final Four season.
- That '96-97 campaign also marked the last time prior to this past season that the Irish had three players collect 60+ steals in the same year. Last year, guards **Tulyah Gaines** (66), **Charel Allen** (63) and **Ashley Barlow** (63) led the sticky-fingered brigade, with the team's 335 steals tying for fourth-most in school history.
- Notre Dame knocked off two ranked teams last season, defeating No. 10/9 Purdue, 67-58, and No. 17/16 Louisville, 64-55, in games at the Joyce Center. The Irish now have defeated 42 ranked opponents in the past nine seasons (averaging nearly five such victories per year), with 20 of those wins coming against top-10 opponents.

### Notre Dame's Golden Girl

Sophomore guard **Melissa Lechlitner** earned a gold medal after helping the United States defeated Sweden, 99-57 in the title game of the FIBA U19 World Championships on Aug. 5 in Bratislava, Slovakia. The Americans went 9-0 during the tournament and claimed their third U19 World Championship gold medal in the past four tournaments, dating back to 1997.

A 5-7 native of Mishawaka, Ind., Lechlitner appeared in every game for the USA during the nine-game event, averaging 4.6 points and 1.4 assists per game. She also shared team-high honors with a .808 free throw percentage (third-best at the tournament) and tied for third on the squad with 13 steals.

Lechlitner's gold marks the third time in the past four years and the fourth time in program history that a Notre Dame women's basketball player has climbed to the top of the medal stand in international competition. **Beth Morgan** (1997 World University Games), **Ruth Riley** (2004 Olympics) and **Megan Duffy** (2005 World University Games) also earned gold medals with USA Basketball squads. All told, Irish cagers have garnered nine medals in international play — four gold, three silver, two bronze.

### 2006-07 Season Rewind

- Notre Dame finished with a 20-12 record (10-6 in the BIG EAST/tie-fifth), advancing to the

### Joyce Center Arena Renovation On Tap

On Oct. 3, 2007, Notre Dame announced that construction on the Joyce Center arena addition and renovation will begin in September 2008. The University has selected the architects for the project, and they currently are in the process of completing final design plans.

The first phase of the project, to begin next September, involves construction of a new three-story structure at the south end of the arena. That structure will include a new two-story lobby, the Notre Dame ticket operations (approximately 4,500 square feet) and a varsity shop to sell apparel and souvenirs (approximately 3,000 square feet), in addition to a new club seating and hospitality area.

Replacement of the Joyce Center arena seating, including installation of chair-back seating throughout the arena, is expected to take place after the University's Commencement Exercises in May 2009. The project is scheduled for completion in January 2010. The arena is expected to re-open by mid-October 2009, in time for the start of the men's and women's basketball seasons and the end of the women's volleyball season.

The University announced last October that this \$26.3 million project had received a \$12.5 million leadership gift from Notre Dame alumnus and Trustee **Philip J. Purcell III**. A month later, another major gift of \$5 million from Notre Dame graduate **Vincent J. Naimoli** was announced.

The arena will be named Purcell Pavilion at the Joyce Center — and the new club/hospitality area and two outdoor patios will be named for the Naimoli family.

## Half And Half

During the past eight seasons, Notre Dame has been nearly unbeatable when it has the lead at halftime. The Irish are 124-12 (.912) since the start of the 2000-01 campaign when they go into the dressing room with the lead, including wins in 52 of their last 58 such contests. Notre Dame led at the break 17 times last year, winning on 15 occasions. The only blemishes came at Pittsburgh (Jan. 31) and against DePaul in the first round of the BIG EAST Championship (March 3).

## The Best Offense Is A Good Defense...

During the past 13 seasons, Notre Dame has discovered that a solid defensive effort can almost certainly guarantee a victory. In fact, since the beginning of the 1995-96 season (Notre Dame's first in the BIG EAST Conference), the Irish have an amazing 168-10 (.944) record when they hold their opponents to less than 60 points in a game. Notre Dame held 10 foes under 60 points last season, going 9-1 in those games (losing only to Indiana).

## ...But Sometimes You Have To Score If You Want To Win

Not resting solely on its defensive laurels, Notre Dame also seemingly has found the magic mark when it comes to outscoring its opponents. During the past 13 seasons (1995-96 to present), the Irish are 100-3 (.971) when they score at least 80 points in a game. The only blemishes on that record are a pair of overtime losses to Texas A&M (88-84) and Michigan State (87-83) in 1995 and a 106-81 loss to Connecticut in 1998.

Notre Dame topped the 80-point mark nine times last season, winning each time (Central Michigan, Bowling Green, Western Michigan, Richmond, Prairie View A&M, Cincinnati, St. John's, Syracuse and Providence). The nine 80-point games were the most for the Irish in a single season since 2000-01, when Notre Dame reached that level 15 times during its run to the national championship.

## Now That's A Home Court Advantage

One of the hallmarks of Notre Dame's success has been its stellar play at home. In fact, the Irish have been virtually untouchable at home in recent years, winning 149 of their last 167 games (.892) at the 11,418-seat Joyce Center, including winning streaks of 51 and 25 games in that span. Notre Dame also has an 87-13 (.870) record in BIG EAST Conference play at the Joyce Center, sporting a 31-game league winning streak at home before it ended with a 48-45 loss to Villanova in the '02 home finale.

The Irish have been particularly strong when it comes to non-conference games at home, winning 64 of their last 69 non-BIG EAST contests (.928) at the Joyce Center, dating back to the 1994-95 season. Four of the losses in that span came at the hands of Big Ten Conference opponents — Wisconsin in 1996 (81-69), Purdue in 2003 (71-54), Michigan State in 2004 (82-73 OT) and Indiana in 2006 (54-51) — with the fifth defeat coming to Tennessee in 2005 (62-51). The Purdue

loss also snapped a 33-game non-conference home winning streak which began after the UW setback.

Since its inaugural season in 1977-78, Notre Dame has played all of its games at the Joyce Center, posting a 299-79 (.791) record at the venerable facility. Three times (1999-2000, 2000-01 and 2003-04), the Irish went a perfect 15-0 at home, setting a school record for home wins in a season. For the third time in four years, and the second consecutive season, Notre Dame will equal the most regular-season home games (16) in school history. However, in 2004-05, the Irish played host to all four rounds of the Preseason WNIT before its regular 12-game home slate began. Notre Dame also will play at least two Preseason WNIT games at home this season, in addition to its previously-scheduled 14-game Joyce Center docket.

## Notre Dame On The Small Screen

Notre Dame will have a school-record 22 regular-season games televised during the upcoming 2007-08 season. Highlighting this year's television schedule are nine nationally-televised Irish women's basketball contests, including one appearance on CBS (Jan. 5 vs. Tennessee), four games on the ESPN family of networks, and another four contests on CSTV.

In addition, Notre Dame has expanded its broadcast reach globally on the Internet. All Irish home games (11 regular-season, two exhibition) that have not been selected for commercial TV coverage will be televised live on the official Notre Dame athletics web site, [UND.com](http://UND.com).

This year's TV slate continues a recent trend that has seen the Irish become a regular fixture on television. Since the start of its 2000-01 NCAA championship season, Notre Dame has played in 92 televised games, including 52 that were broadcast nationally.

## Oh Captain, My Captain

Senior guards **Charel Allen**, **Tulyah Gaines** and **Amanda Tsipis** are team captains for the 2007-08 season. Gaines is in her second year as a captain for the Irish, while Allen and Tsipis are first-time captains. All three players received the captain's honor through a vote of their teammates prior to the season.

## Next Game: Hillsdale (exhibition)

Notre Dame closes out its exhibition schedule on Monday, Nov. 5, when it plays host to Hillsdale (Mich.) in a 7 p.m. (ET) contest at the Joyce Center. The Chargers, who will be making their 2007-08 debut with next week's visit to South Bend, went 19-9 last season, including a 12-5 record in the Southern Division of the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC). However, Hillsdale will be dealing with the loss of more than 75 percent of its offense in the form of seven departed letterwinners.
