34	The Fighting Irish outscored opponents by a combined 34 goals over the second, third and overtime periods last season (93-59).
28	With a 28-8-1 record, sophomore goaltender, Hobey Baker Top 10 Finalist and Richter Award winner Cale Morris led the nation in victories in 2017-18.
14	Head coach Jeff Jackson is in his 14th season behind the Notre Dame bench. He has led the Irish to nine NCAA tournament appearances and four Frozen Fours.
8	This will be the eighth all-time meeting between Notre Dame and the USNTDP. The Irish lead the series 4-1-2.
8	The 2018-19 Irish roster boasts eight players who have been selected in the NHL Draft.
7	With the 2018 Big Ten tournament and regular season titles, Notre Dame has now won seven conference championships in program history, each under Jeff Jackson (three regular season).
2/3	The Irish came in ranked second in the nation in the USCHO.com Poll prior to the start of the 2018-19 season. They came in third in the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine Poll.

FOR STARTERS

- For the third consecutive year, the Irish open their season with exhibition play against the USNTDP. They have faced the U18 squad four times in as many years. The Irish are undefeated in that stretch, with a 2-0-2 record.
- Last season, behind third period goals from Joe Wegwerth and Colin Theisen, Notre Dame opened the season with a 4-3 exhibition win over the USNTDP at the Compton Family Ice Arena. Cam Morrison finished with a goal and assist while former Irish captain, Jake Evans, had two assists to lead the Irish to victory.
- In net, Notre Dame's Cale Morris stopped 13 of the 15 shots he faced in just over 30 minutes of play. Now-sophomore, Dylan St. Cyr played the final 29:17 of regulation and turned aside 10 of the 11 shots he faced to earn the win.

USNTDP CONNECTIONS

- The Irish have strong ties to the National Program, with 39 current or former players to have competed with the USNTDP.
- Current members of the Notre Dame team to have dressed for the USNTDP include Matt Helleickson, Dylan St. Cyr, Jake Pivonka, Graham Slaggert, Spencer Stastney and Joe Wegwerth.
- Head coach Jeff Jackson was one of the masterminds behind the U.S. National Team Development program as he laid out the plan for what would become the USNTDP while interviewing with USA Hockey.
- Current U18 Team head coach John Wroblewski and intern assistant coach Kevin Lind will be returning to their alma mater.
- Wroblewski played for the Irish from 1999-2003, and was a team captain during his senior season.
- Lind played four seasons at Notre Dame from 2011-14 and then served as a volunteer assistant coach for the 2016-17 season when Notre Dame advanced to the Frozen Four in Chicago.

THE RETURNERS

- The Irish return 18 members of the 2017-18 NCAA Frozen Four runners-up team including 11 forwards, four defensemen and three goaltenders.
- Seven of the top-ten scorers from 2017-18 will be back on the ice to represent Notre Dame this season, led by Cal Burke (2017-18: 38 GP; 14-12-26).
- Returning all three goaltenders from last season, the Irish look to continue upon their success of 2017-18 in net.
- Senior Andrew Peeke was named the 2018-19 team captain as announced by Coach Jackson in September. He is joined by alternate captains Jack Jenkins, Dylan Malmquist, Bobby Nardella and Cal Burke.

FRESH FACES

- The team adds nine new faces to the roster in 2018-19 (five forwards and four defensemen).
- Nate Clurman (Sioux City/Colorado Avalanche 2016), Nick Leivermann (Penticton/Colorado Avalanche 2017), Cam Burke (Sioux Falls), Michael Graham (Muskegon), Alex Steeves (Dubuque), Graham Slaggert (Cedar Rapids), Jake Pivonka (USNTDP), Spencer Stastney (USNTDP) and Charlie Raith (Central Illinois) make up the freshmen class.
- All nine spent time at the junior level, competing in the United States Hockey League, while one also spent time with the Penticton Veers British Columbia Hockey League.
- Three members of the freshman class had personal connections to the team prior to their arrival on campus this fall. Cam Burke and Alex Steeves join their older brothers Cal (Burke) and Matt (Steeves), while Graham Slaggert is the son of associate head coach Andy Slaggert.
- As of the most recent NHL Entry Draft, four of the freshman have heard their name called to join a draft class.
- Nate Clurman was selected in the 6th round (161 overall) by the Colorado Avalanche in 2016. Nick Leivermann joined Clurman in the Avalanche organization the following year, being picked in the seventh round (187 overall) in 2017.

- In 2018 USNTDP and now Irish teammates, Jake Pivonka and Spencer Stastney were selected in the fourth and fifth rounds respectively. Pivonka was drafted by the New York Islanders, 103rd, while the Nashville Predators selected Stastney 131st overall.

THE 2017-18 REGULAR SEASON

- The Irish opened the regular season with a weekend sweep of Alabama-Huntsville, outscoring the Chargers 9-3 while Dylan St. Cyr backstopped the Irish to a 4-0 victory in his first career start in net.
- After starting the season 3-3-1, the Irish went on a 16-game win-streak, the longest winning-streak in program history.
- Their historic 16-game win-streak began with a 5-4 triumph over Nebraska-Omaha in late October, spurring the longest win-streak in collegiate hockey last season.
- Notre Dame won their first 13 conference games in the Big Ten, marking the first time a team had swept each conference opponent during their first meeting as conference foes.
- The win streak ended at the United Center in Chicago as the Irish lost to Wisconsin, nearly three months after it began.
- The team finished with the best record in the Big Ten conference, posting a 17-6-1 conference record to claim the regular season Big Ten Championship.
- They clinched the regular season title after defeating Ohio State 2-1 in early February.

POSTSEASON SUCCESS

- Coined the "comeback kids" for their last minute success, the Irish scored in the final seconds of regulation or overtime to come out on top in five of their six postseason contests.
- With the Big Ten semifinal game tied with 31 seconds remaining in overtime, Jack Jenkins netted the game winner to send the team to the championship game against Ohio State.
- Notre Dame played host to the 2017-18 Big Ten Championship game where they defeated Ohio State 3-2 behind an overtime game-winner from Cam Morrison.
- Following two conference titles in their first season with the Big Ten, the Irish made

their third consecutive appearance in the NCAA Tournament and advanced to their second-straight Frozen Four.

- The NCAA East Regional saw both a 4-3 overtime victory over Michigan Tech for the Irish before topping Providence College in the final minute of regulation to advance to the Frozen Four.
- In their second consecutive Frozen Four appearance, hosted at the Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, Minnesota, the Irish advanced to the National Championship game after Jake Evans sent the puck home with five seconds left in the third period, defeating Michigan 4-3.
- With Notre Dame, Michigan and Ohio State in Saint Paul, the Frozen Four included at least three schools from the same conference for just the fifth time in history and the first time since 2005.
- It marked the second time Jeff Jackson has been a part of a conference sending at least three teams to the Frozen Four, as his Lake Superior State Lakers won the 1992 national title at a Frozen Four that included Michigan and Michigan State from the CCHA.

CALE SAVES EVERYTHING

- Notre Dame goaltender Cale Morris was named recipient of the 2017-18 Mike Richter Award, presented annually to the nation's top goaltender, prior to the NCAA National Championship game.
- He was also named a Hobey Baker Award Top 10 Finalist last season. Morris led the nation in save percentage (.944) and victories (27), while his 1.94 goals against average ranked eighth in the country.
- He also earned First Team West CCM/AHCA All-American honors, making him the second Irish player in as many years to earn All-American honors and first to make first-team honors since Ian Cole in 2008-09.
- Morris totaled 1,202 saves on the season, which leads the nation. He is one of just eight goalies to have surpassed 1,000 saves last year.
- In addition, he faced more shots than any other goaltender at 1,273 (Arizona State's Joey Daccord was second at 1,193) and was the only goaltender in the nation to face more than 1,200 shots.
- In Notre Dame's record book, his single-season save percentage ranks first all-time, while his goals against average is third and his total saves puts him sixth.
- In addition to earning Big Ten Tournament Most Outstanding Player honors, Big Ten Player of the Year and Big Ten Goaltender of the Year, Morris has been named a Big Ten Star of the week eight times this season, including five First Star honors. He was named to the NCAA East Regional All-Regional team.
- In a 2-2 overtime tie at Penn State (Feb. 3, 2018), Morris made a career-high 55 saves and he stopped an Andrew Sturtz penalty shot in overtime to preserve the tie and followed with two saves in the shootout to help the Irish grab the extra Big Ten point.
- Morris becomes the fourth player in Notre Dame history to make the Hobey Baker final 10, joining Anders Bjork (2017), David Brown (2007) and Dave Poulin (1982).
- A native of Larkspur, Colorado, Morris is the first player from the Centennial State to play his way into the Hobey Top 10.

2017-18 BIG AWARDS

- On March 13, Cale Morris became the second player in Notre Dame history to be named conference player of the year, while becoming the third Irish net minder to earn conference goaltender of the year awards. Morris was named Big Ten Player and Goaltender of the Year, while also earning first team All-Big Ten accolades.
- He was joined on the All-Big Ten first team by Jake Evans and Jordan Gross, while Andrew Oglevie was named Notre Dame's Big Ten Sportsmanship Award honoree.
- The last Notre Dame player to collect player and goaltender of the year awards at the conference level was also the last time an Irish player won both awards in the same year, as David Brown earned both designations from the CCHA in 2006-07. The only other Notre Dame player to earn goaltender of the year was Jordan Pearce, also in the CCHA, one season later.
- You also have to return to the CCHA days to find the last time Notre Dame had three first team all-league selections. In 2008-09, right wing Erik Condra, center Christian Hanson and defenseman Kyle Lawson were all first-team honorees. This season marks just the third time the Irish have had three first-team selections, with 2003-04 being the other year as Aaron Gill, Rob Globke and Brett Lebda all received first team All-CCHA nods.

IRISH IN THE NHL

- Eight former Notre Dame hockey players were set to appear in the early days of the 2018-19 NHL season.
- After posting 62 points in 2017-18 (40-22-62), former Irish captain Anders Lee was named the 15th captain in New York Islanders franchise history.
- Thus far, six former Irish icers have seen the ice for their respective NHL teams.
- Anders Bjork (Boston), Ian Cole (Colorado), Vinnie Hinostroza (Arizona), Anders Lee (New York Islanders), Bryan Rust (Pittsburgh) and Riley Sheahan (Pittsburgh) have all

made opening week lineups.

- Bjork became the 17th former Irish player under Jeff Jackson to reach the NHL and the program's 31st overall when Boston opened the 2017-18 season with a home win against Nashville on Oct. 5 (Bjork had an assist in that win).
- Steven Fogarty also made his NHL debut in 2017-18, taking the ice for the New York Rangers in a contest against the Philadelphia Flyers (April 7, 2018).
- Through the 2016-17 season, a program-record 10 former Notre Dame hockey players played in the NHL (nine was the previous high in 2011-12).
- The 2016-17 season also included several stretches where eight former Irish players were in the league at the same time, marking the first time in program history eight former players were on active NHL rosters at the same time (now has happened in back-to-back seasons; 2016-17 & 2017-18).
- Also during the 2016-17 season, Rust became the third former Irish player to record an NHL hat trick, joining Palmieri (1) and Dave Poulin (5) and Lee totaled 34 goals to set the record for goals in an NHL season by a former Irish player.
- With Pittsburgh winning the 2017 Stanley Cup, Rust and Cole became the third and fourth former Irish players to win back-to-back Stanley Cup Championships, joining Bill Nyrop (Montreal '76-'77-'78) and Don Jackson (Edmonton '84-'85).

- At the conclusion of the 2017-18 season, four members of the Notre Dame hockey team signed NHL contracts to further continue their hockey career.
- Seniors Jake Evans (Montreal) and Jordan Gross (Arizona) signed two-year entry level contracts while Dennis Gilbert (Chicago) and Andrew Oglevie (Buffalo) decided to forgo their senior seasons in pursuit of a professional career.
