IRISH PLAY HOST TO BOWLING GREEN TO START BUSY WEEK: Notre Dame starts a busy holiday week schedule on Tuesday, November 20 when the Irish play host to the Bowling Green Falcons in a 7:35 p.m. game at the Joyce Center. Tuesday's game is the first of three for Notre Dame

this week as the Irish will travel to Troy, N.Y., this weekend to participate in the 57th annual Rensselaer Holiday Tournament. On Friday, Nov. 23, the Irish will face Alabama-Huntsville at 4:00 p.m. The third-place and championship games will be played on Nov. 24 at 4:00 or 7:15 p.m. Notre Dame faces Bowling Green coming off a weekend sweep of Western Michigan, winning by 4-1 and 5-1 scores. The Irish are 9-4-0 on the season and 7-2-0 in CCHA play. They moved to ninth in both the USA Today Poll and the USCHO. com poll. Bowling Green visits the Joyce Center for the first time this season and brings a 6-3-0 overall mark and a 5-2-0 conference record. The two teams met on Oct. 23 at Bowling Green with the Irish taking a 4-2 win at the BGSU Ice Arena. Notre Dame leads the all-time series with a 40-34-6 record. At the Joyce Center, Notre Dame has a 22-12-4 edge. The Irish are unbeaten in their last nine games (8-0-1) against the Falcons. The last Bowling Green win at the Joyce Center came on Jan. 29, 2005. Since then, the Falcons have lost four straight at the Joyce Center.

CCHA DEFENSEMAN OF THE WEEK: Sophomore defenseman Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.) has been selected as the CCHA defenseman of the week for the week ending Nov. 18. In the weekend sweep of Western Michigan, Lawson collected two assists in Friday's 4-1 win and was +2 in the series. Lawson and the Notre Dame defense limited the Broncos to 23 shots in the two games and killed all seven WMU powerplay chances on the weekend.

**BUSY SCHEDULE:** Notre Dame is in the midst of five games in nine days with the Bowling Green game being game number three of the streak. The Irish are 2-0-0 in the first two contests and will

WESTERN MICHIGAN RECAP: Notre Dame swept its home-and-home series with Western Michigan, taking a 4-1 win at the Joyce Center on Friday night and a 5-1 win at Lawson Arena on Saturday. Here's a look at the series: Notre Dame got goals from Ryan Thang (So., Edina, Minn.), Dan VeNard (Sr., Vernon Hills, Ill.), Erik Condra (Jr., Livonia, Mich.) and Mark Van Guilder (Sr., Roseville, Minn.) on the way to a 4-1 win over Western Michigan on Friday at the Joyce Center. The Irish out shot the Broncos, 44-12, in the game and scored twice on the power play. Mike Lesperance scored the lone Western Michigan goal. Condra and Van Guilder each added an assist for two-point games while defenseman Kyle Lawson (So., New Hudson, Mich.) had a pair of helpers on the night. Thang scored the game's first goal at 10:41 of the opening period, his sixth of the season. Lesperance closed the period with a goal at 19:02 as he beat Jordan Pearce (Jr., Anchorage, Alaska) on a rebound to make it 1-1 after one period. The Irish would score three times in the second stanza to break the game open. VeNard collected his second of the season and the game winner at 2:16 for a 2-1 lead. Condra notched his fifth of the year on the power play at 16:48 and Van Guilder closed the scoring with his team-best seventh goal of the year at 18:52 on a five-on-three power-play chance for the final of 4-1. Western goaltender Riley Gill finished with 40 saves in the game while Pearce made 11. The Irish were 2-for-11 on the power play while the Broncos were 0-for-1.

On Saturday night, Notre Dame spotted Western Michigan the first goal when Max Campbell scored his third of the year just 1:32 into the game to take a 1-0 lead. The Irish answered with firstperiod goals from freshman Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm, Sweden) and Justin White (Jr., Traverse City, Mich.). The lead would go to 4-1 after two periods as Dan Kissel (So., Crestwood, Ill.) converted an Evan Rankin (Sr., Portage, Mich.) centering feed at 8:11 and Ryan Thang got his second power-play goal of the weekend at 19:49. Erik Condra closed the scoring in the third period when he scored a short-handed goal at 7:55 for the 5-1 final score. The Irish out shot Western Michigan by a 32-11 margin. Jordan **Pearce** made 10 saves while Riley Gill stopped 27 shots. Notre Dame was 1-for-6 on the power play while the Broncos were 0-for-6.

STINGY DEFENSE: Notre Dame surrendered just two goals in the weekend series against Western Michigan. In the two games, the Irish out shot the Broncos by a 76-23 margin. In Friday's game, Notre Dame gave up just 12 shots and followed that by giving up just 11 in Saturday's game. The 11 shots are the fewest given up by the Irish this season as were the two shots given up in the third period of Saturday's game.

HIGHS AND LOWS: Notre Dame's 44 shots in Friday night's win over Western Michigan are a season high for the Irish. The 11 shots given up by Notre Dame in Saturday's game are the fewest the Irish have given up this season. Notre Dame's 11 power-play chances on Friday night were also a season high.

SPREAD THE WEALTH: Notre Dame scored nine goals in the two games of the series against Western Michigan. Seven different players lit the lamp for the Irish. Only Erik Condra and Ryan Thang scored more than one goal. Also scoring for the Irish on the weekend were Dan VeNard, Mark Van Guilder, Calle Ridderwall, Justin White and Dan Kissel.

THE MARKSMEN: Senior Mark Van Guilder and sophomore Ryan Thang each scored their seventh goals of the season in the series against Western Michigan. Van Guilder got his seventh on Nov. 16, scoring his fifth power-play goal of the season. That ties him for 4th in the CCHA and tied him for 5th in the nation. Thang scored once in each game with both goals coming on the power play. Thang now has four man-advantage goals, which ties him for sixth in the CCHA and eighth in the nation.

CONDRA CAPERS: Right wing Erik Condra recorded back-to-back multiple-point games (a goal and an assist) in the wins over Western Michigan. That gives him three multiple-point games this season. On Nov. 1, he recorded the second, five-point game of his career in the 7-3 win over Lake Superior. Condra scored twice and added three assists for five points on the night. His previous five-point game came on Jan. 5, 2007 at Robert Morris when he had a goal and four assists. Condra currently leads the Irish in scoring with six goals and eight assists for 14 points in the first 13 games of the season.

**CENTURY CLUB:** Notre Dame's "Century Club" will soon be accepting a new member as junior right wing **Erik Condra** comes into the Bowling Green game with 96 points in his career. Condra now has 26 goals and 70 assists in 91 career games. Here's who is ahead of Condra.

**FIRSTS:** Two Notre Dame players scored their first goals of the season in the 5-1 victory at Western Michigan. Freshman **Calle Ridderwall** picked up his first goal of the year and the first of his collegiate career when he scored at 12:10 of the first to tie the game at 1-1. **Justin White** followed with his first at 17:31 off a face off to give the Irish a 2-1 lead while also collecting the game-winning goal.

THE PUCK STOPS HERE: Junior goaltender Jordan Pearce continued his strong play this season, winning his seventh and eighth games of the year versus Western Michigan. On Friday night, Pearce made 11 saves in the 4-1 win at the Joyce Center. In Saturday's game, Pearce made 10 saves in the 5-1 victory at Lawson Arena. Pearce has now made four straight starts. He recorded back-to-back 32-save games in the previous weekend in a split at Miami. Pearce has started 12 of Notre Dame's 13 games this season with the 12 appearances being a career high. His eight wins are the most in a season and he is second in the CCHA and the nation in minutes played with 715:03. For the year, Pearce is 8-4-0 with a 2.01 goals-against average and a .915 save percentage with one shutout on the year.

**THE SNIPER:** Notre Dame defenseman **Dan VeNard** scored his second goal of the season in the 4-1 win over Western Michigan, the most he has ever scored in a season. The goal was also the game winner, the first of VeNard's career.

GOOD NEWS AND BAD NEWS: Through 13 games this season, the Irish have some good news and some bad news to report. In Notre Dame's eight victories, the Irish have scored 36 goals for a 4.00 average. In the four losses, Notre Dame has scored just three goals for a 0.75 goals-per game mark. In the nine wins, the Irish have given up just 14 goals (1.56 goals-against average) while in the four losses, they have given up 13 goals (3.25 goals against).

**VERSUS THE BEST:** Notre Dame's 2-1 win over Miami on Nov. 9 marked the 10th time in the program's history that the Irish knocked off a top-ranked team. In fact, the last four times that Notre Dame has faced a No.1 team, the Irish have come away with the victory. Here's a list of Irish wins over No. 1 ranked teams in the 40-year history of the program.

WINNING AT MIAMI: Notre Dame's 2-1 win over the RedHawks on Nov. 9 snapped a six-game Irish winless streak (0-5-1) at Oxford, Ohio. The previous Irish win was on March 16, 2003 when they defeated Miami, 5-0, in game three of the first round of the CCHA playoffs to advance to Joe Louis Arena. Last Friday's win came in Notre Dame's first-ever appearance at Steve Cady Arena.

**IRON MAN:** Senior center **Mark Van Guilder** has his sights set on Notre Dame's all-time record for most consecutive games played. The record of 153 straight games was set by **Tim Wallace** '06 who played in every game of his career – 153 straight. Van Guilder has now played in every game of his career - 129 consecutive games played through the first 13 games this year.

STRONG SCHEDULE: Notre Dame goes into the weekend series with Western Michigan having opened the season by playing five of its first 13 games versus nationally ranked teams. The Irish opened the year dropping a 4-1 decision to #14/#15 Wisconsin. They then split a series in South Bend with #5/#5 Denver, winning, 4-3 and losing, 3-1. Last weekend, Notre Dame split with #1/#1 Miami with a 2-1 win on Friday and a 3-1 loss on Saturday. The Irish are 2-3-0 against ranked teams this season.

**THE KISSEL EFFECT:** Sophomore left wing **Dan Kissel (Crestwood, Ill.)** collected his first goal of the season in the 2-1 win at Miami. The goal also proved to be the game winner. He added his second goal in the 5-1 win at Western Michigan. In Kissel's career, he has now played in 31 career games and has scored eight goals. Of his eight goals, four have been game winners. Last season, three of his six goals were winning goals.

**DYNAMIC DUO:** Notre Dame's defensive duo of **Brock Sheahan (Sr., Lethbridge, Alb.)** and **Teddy Ruth (Fr., Naperville, Ill.)** have proven to be one of the CCHA's top defensive pairs through the first 13 games of the season. Both Irish defensive stalwarts are +8 for the season, meaning they have been on the ice for nine more goals scored by Notre Dame than the Irish have given up at even strength. That ties them for sixth in the CCHA.

**POWER ON:** After going 0-for-7 on the power play at Miami, the Irish scored twice with the man advantage on Friday night in the 4-1 win. They followed with a 1-for-6 night in the 5-1 win on Saturday. The Irish have scored two or more power-play goals in a game five times this season.

**HOT HAND:** Junior center **Christian Hanson** picked up goals in back-to-back games for the Irish as he scored short-handed in the 4-1 win over Lake Superior on Nov. 2 and then had the first goal of the game in the 2-1 win over Miami on Nov. 9. Hanson has two goals and two assists through the first 13 games this season. The short-handed goal was the first of his career.

SENIOR CLASS HONORS: Notre Dame team captain Mark Van Guilder (Sr., Roseville, Minn.) has been nominated for the Lowes Senior CLASS (Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School) Award. The CLASS award was designed to honor the attributes of seniors who remain committed to their university and elects to pursue the many rewards that a senior season can bring. This award provides a fitting honor for a senior leader that has stood up to the challenge. In the end, the award hopes to recognize the prestige and dignity of being a senior hockey player at the college level. Former Irish goaltender David Brown '07 won the Lowes Senior CLASS award following the 2006-07 season.

FRIENDLY CONFINES: Notre Dame recorded its second consecutive sellout crowd of 2,857 on Nov. 16 and the third sellout in five home games this season. Those crowds of 2,857 are the largest crowds to watch a Notre Dame hockey game since March 3, 1995 when 3,310 saw the Irish defeat Illinois-Chicago. Following that season, new seating was installed, reducing capacity at the Joyce Center. At the beginning of November, a new section of seating was added to the student section to increase the capacity. Through five games this year, the Irish are averaging 2,601 fans per game.

**PENALTY KILLERS:** The Irish surrendered their fourth power-play goal of the season in Saturday's 3-1 loss to Miami. On the weekend, Notre Dame killed 8-of-9 RedHawk power plays. For the year, the Irish are second in the CCHA and fourth in the nation, having killed 57-of-61 opponent power-play chances for a 93.4% success rate.

RANKINGS UPDATE: Notre Dame opened the 2007-08 season ranked eighth in the nation by both the USA Today/American Hockey Magazine and USCHO.com/CSTV polls. The Irish finished the 2006-07 season ranked fourth in the final USA Today/American Hockey Magazine poll that included the NCAA tournament. The Irish finished the year first in the USCHO.com/CSTV polls that ended with the end of the CCHA Tournament. In all, Notre Dame was ranked for 20 consecutive weeks and was ranked No.1 for seven straight weeks from Feb. 5 to March 25. The Irish have been ranked every week so far this season. ON THE MARK: Senior center Mark Van Guilder recorded the second four-point game of his career on Nov. 1 against Lake Superior State. Van Guilder scored twice and set up two others in the game. His previous four-point night came at Bowling Green on Feb. 17, 2006 as a sophomore when he had three goals and an assist against the Falcons. The Notre Dame captain leads the Irish in goals (7) and power-play goals (5) this season.

**NEW KID:** Freshman goaltender **Brad Phillips** (Fr., Farmington Hills, Mich.) made his first career start in goal for Notre Dame on Nov. 2 in the 4-1 win over Lake Superior State. Phillips stopped 16 of the 17 shots he faced, giving up just a five-on-three power-play goal in the game.

ROAD WARRIORS: Notre Dame's two wins on the road between Oct. 23 and Oct. 27 (at Bowling Green and Ferris State) gave the Irish seven-consecutive road wins, dating back to Jan. 19, 2007. The seven-consecutive road wins tied a program record that was set between Jan. 7 and Feb. 4, 1977. That seven-game streak also became part of the team's longest road unbeaten run as the Irish went 8-0-1 between Jan. 7 and Feb. 24 of that season. The streak was snapped on Oct. 28 in a 3-0 loss at Ferris State.

**SPECIAL MENTION:** Notre Dame freshmen forward **Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.)** earned special mention for CCHA rookie of the month honors for October after scoring two goals and adding five assists for seven points in his first month of play. Miami's Carter Camper took the rookie of the month honors over Ryan.

**SEVEN HEAVEN:** The seven goals scored by the Irish on Nov. 1 is the most they have scored in a game since March 9, 2007 when they also hung seven goals on Alaska in the first game of the second round of the CCHA playoffs. Notre Dame won that game, 7-1.

**HOME SWEET HOME:** After five home games this season, Notre Dame is 4-1-0 at the Joyce Center. A year ago, Notre Dame was 13-2-2 at home for an .824 winning percentage. That was the best mark since the 2003-04 season when the Irish were 14-2-2 at the Joyce Center for an .833 winning percentage. Only two other Irish teams have had better home records – 1987-88 team was 18-2-0 (.900) and the 1969-70 team was 12-1-1 (.893).

**THE REAL THANG:** Sophomore left wing **Ryan Thang** has now scored goals in seven of Notre Dame's first 13 games this season. He now has goals in back-to-back games and has scored 27 goals in his first 55 career games with 14 of them coming on the power play.

TAKE THE HIGHWAY: The Irish have had their share of success on the road over the last two seasons. This year, Notre Dame is 4-2-0 on the road. A year ago, the Irish were 12-4-1 (.735) away from the Joyce Center. The 12 road wins equaled a school record (1979-80 and 1997-98) for road wins. Only the 1983-84 team's 10-3-1 road mark (.750) is better.

**LONG TIME COMING:** Notre Dame's 4-3 win over Denver on Oct. 18 snapped a 10-game (0-9-1) winless streak for the Irish against the Pioneers. The last time they had beaten Denver was Nov. 3, 1978, a 3-2 win at the Joyce Center. Notre Dame and Denver played in the WCHA for 10 years from 1971-81 before the Irish left for the CCHA. Prior to last weekend's series, the two teams had met just three times with Denver going 2-0-1.

**BIG WIN:** Notre Dame's win over Denver on Oct. 18 was the first this season for the Irish against a nationally-ranked team as they are now 1-2-0 on the year. A year ago, Notre Dame was 10-2-1 against ranked teams. The Pioneers were the highest-ranked team that Notre Dame has beaten at the Joyce Center since beating fourth-ranked Michigan State, 4-1, on Nov. 17, 2006.

**FIRST TIMERS:** Sophomore right wing **Stewart Carlin (Jeannette, Pa.)** made his first career appearance versus Denver (10/19). Carlin did not play in any games last year and lined up at right wing in his first appearance, getting one penalty for two minutes. Fellow sophomore **Dan Kissel (Crestwood, Ill.)** made his first appearance of the season since being sidelined in the first week of practice with an injury.

CCHA OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Senior center Mark Van Guilder was the CCHA offensive player of the week for the week ending Oct. 14. Van Guilder scored three goals in Notre Dame's two games at the Lefty McFadden Invitational. In the 4-1 loss to Wisconsin, Van Guilder scored a second-period, powerplay goal to tie the game at 1-1. In Saturday's 4-0 victory versus Mercyhurst, Van Guilder scored a pair of goals, including one on the power play and one for the game winner. In the game, he set a career high with 12 shots on goal.

**GETTING OFFENSIVE:** Senior defenseman **Brock Sheahan (Lethbridge, Alb.)** was a finalist last season for the CCHA's defensive defenseman award. This season, Sheahan is showing his offensive game as he already has five assists in the first 13 games of the season. For his career, Sheahan now has three goals and 22 assists for 25 points.

CAPTAINS: Senior right wing Mark Van Guilder will serve as Notre Dame's captain for the 2007-08 season. Joining Van Guilder as alternate captains in '07-'08, are senior defensemen Brock Sheahan (Lethbridge, Alb.) and Dan VeNard (Vernon Hills, Ill.). They will be joined by junior forward Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.). This is the first season for all four players to serve as captains at Notre Dame.

MR PRESIDENT: Senior defenseman Dan Ve-Nard has been named president of Notre Dame's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) for the 2007-08 school year. VeNard served as hockey's representative to the group last season and was selected president by the group in M. The committee represents Notre Dame's student-athletes with the Irish athletic department.

Notre Dame opened the 2007-08 season, playing three of its first four games against ranked teams. The Irish opened against #14/#15 Wisconsin, dropping a 4-1 decision at Dayton, Ohio. Versus fifth-ranked Denver, the Irish won the opening game (4-3) before dropping the second by a 3-1 score. Last season, the Irish were 10-2-1 against ranked teams, going 4-1 on the road, 5-0-0 at home and 1-1 on neutral ice.

NEW KIDS: Six of Notre Dame's freshmen made their Irish debuts at the Lefty McFadden Invitational (Oct. 12-13). Leading the way was right wing Ben Ryan who recorded three assists in his first two games. Also playing in both games were forwards Robin Bergman (Stockholm, Sweden) and Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm, Sweden) along with defensemen Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.) and Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.). Joining those five was right wing Ryan Guentzel (Woodbury, Minn.) who played his first game against Mercyhurst in the second game of the weekend. Goaltender Brad Phillips saw his first action on Nov. 2, making his first career start in the 4-1 win over Lake Superior.

**SWEDISH CONNECTION:** For the first time in the 40-year history of the Notre Dame hockey program, the Irish have two natives of Sweden on the roster. Freshmen **Robin Bergman** (Stockholm) and **Calle Ridderwall** (Stockholm) join the roster this season. Both played last year in the USHL; Bergman for Cedar Rapids and Ridderwall for Tri-City. Bergman had 26 goals and 17 assists for 43 points. His 17 power-play goals were second in the league. Ridderwall led Tri-City in scoring with 27 goals and 35 assists for 62 points. He had 14 power-play goals and seven game winners, the most in the league in that category.

**ALL TIED UP:** Notre Dame's 3-2 overtime win versus Alabama-Huntsville in the NCAA Regionals on March 23, 2007 gave the Irish a 3-1-3 record in overtime last year. The three overtime wins were the most for the Irish in a single season. In two seasons under **Jeff Jackson**, Notre Dame is 3-1-7 in extra play.

**TOP CLASSES:** Notre Dame's incoming freshman class of seven was been ranked among the best for the 2007-08 season. Inside College Hockey.com ranked the group fourth in it's preseason rankings while *Red Line Report* ranked the group fifth in the nation last spring. Inside College Hockey.com rankings:

Red Line Report rankings had Wisconsin first, followed by Boston University, Michigan, Boston College, Notre Dame, Minnesota, Ohio State and North Dakota. Four of Notre Dame's seven freshmen were drafted—Ian Cole (first round, St. Louis), Teddy Ruth (second round, Washington), Ben Ryan (fourth round, Nashville) and Brad Phillips (seventh round, Philadelphia).

THE KIDS WERE ALRIGHT: Notre Dame placed three players on the CCHA all-rookie team in 2007. Forwards Kevin Deeth (Gig Harbor, Wash.) and Ryan Thang (Edina, Minn.) were joined by defenseman Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.). Notre Dame became the third school in CCHA history to have three players on the all-rookie team, joining Michigan (five times) and Michigan State (once). The 1993-94 Michigan team set the record with four freshmen named to that team. Thang became the first Irish freshman to score 20 or more goals in a season since Dave Poulin '82 had 28 in his rookie year of 1978-79. His 20 goals were the sixth most by a Notre Dame freshman while his 41 points tied for eighth best. Deeth's 17 goals tied him for the eighth-best total and his 39 points tied him for 10th among Irish freshmen.

WELCOME BACK: Junior defenseman Luke Lucyk (Fox Point, Wis.) returns to the Notre Dame lineup this season after spending the 2006-07 season with the Tri-City Storm of the USHL. Lucyk played in 44 games for the Irish between 2004-06 with one goal and one assist for two points. He returned to Tri-City last season to get more playing time and had nine goals and 13 assists for 22 points in 59 games.

JUNIOR EVALUATIONS: Three members of the Notre Dame freshman class participated in the U.S. Junior Evaluation Camp this past August in hopes of making the United States' roster for the 2007 World Junior Championships. Freshmen defensemen Ian Cole and Teddy Ruth were joined by center Ben Ryan. Irish head coach Jeff Jackson served as one of the assistant coaches at the camp.

**NHL DRAFTEES:** The Irish have seven players on the 2007-08 roster who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Last June, a total of five Notre Dame players were selected. Leading the way was freshman defenseman Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.) who was a first-round selection of the St. Louis Blues who took him with the 18th pick overall. Cole became the first Irish player ever selected in the first round and was selected earlier than any other Notre Dame player (Rob Globke '04 was the previous highest selection when he was picked 40th overall by Florida in 2002). Cole was followed by fellow freshman defenseman Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.) who went in the second round, 46th overall to the Washington Capitals. Sophomore Ryan Thang (Edina, Minn.) was selected in the third round, 81st overall by the Nashville Predators. Incoming freshman Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.) joined Thang when the Predators made him the 114th pick (fourth round). Freshman goaltender Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.) rounded out the Notre Dame selections in the last draft when the Philadelphia Flyers selected him in the seventh round, 182nd overall. Those five join junior right wing Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.) who was selected in the seventh round, 211th overall by the Ottawa Senators in 2006 and sophomore defenseman Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.) who was selected in the 2005 NHL Draft by the Carolina Hurricanes in the seventh round, 198th overall.

WORST TO FIRST: Just two seasons ago (2004-05), Notre Dame was 5-27-6 overall and finished last in the CCHA with a 3-20-5 record. In the CCHA's 35-year history, no team has ever gone from worst-to-first in one season. There have been three teams go from worst to first in a two-season span. They are:

**1975-76 Bowling Green** – Falcons finished last in 1973-74 in a three team conference and finished first in '75-'76 in a five-team league.

**1992-93 Miami** – RedHawks were last in 1990-91 with nine points in a nine-team conference. They finished first in 1992-93 with 49 points in a 12-team conference for a 40-point improvement over two seasons. **2006-07 Notre Dame** – Irish were last in 2004-05 with 11 points in a 12-team conference. In '06-'07, the Irish took first place with 45 points for a 34-point improvement over two seasons.

HOMETOWNS: The 2007-08 Notre Dame hockey team features players from eight states, one Canadian province and Sweden. Over the past 13 seasons, the Irish have had monogram winners from 21 different states and provinces – those listed below, plus: Delaware, Massachusetts, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, North Dakota, Ontario, Prince Edward Island, Quebec, Saskatchewan and British Columbia. This season, freshmen Robin Bergman (Stockholm) and Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm) become the first Notre Dame hockey players from Sweden.

FAMILY MATTERS: Two members of the Notre Dame hockey team – forwards Erik Condra and Garrett Regan (Hastings, Minn.) – have family ties to the Irish hockey program. Condra's uncle is All-American forward Kirt Bjork (\*83) who played at Notre Dame from 1979-83. He scored 76 goals with 85 assists for 161 career points in 141 career games. He took All-America honors in 1983 when he had 29 goals and 34 assists for 63 points. Regan's uncle - Sean Regan - was a defenseman for the Irish from 1981-83 before finishing his career at the University of Minnesota.

MORE FAMILY MATTERS: Freshman goaltender Brad Phillips also has a family connection to Notre Dame. His uncle is former Irish quarterback Terry Andrysiak who played at Notre Dame from 1985 to 1988.

PUTTING ON THE FOIL: Notre Dame junior Christian Hanson (Venetia, Pa.) is the sixth player to play for the Irish whose father played in the National Hockey League. His father, Dave Hanson, played 10 years of professional hockey between 1974-75 and 1983-84, including stints with the Detroit Red Wings and the Minnesota North Stars and the World Hockey Association's (WHA) Minnesota Fighting Saints and the New England Whalers. Fans might also be familiar with Dave Hanson, as one of the famed Hanson Brothers, made famous in the hockey movie - Slapshot. Hanson currently is the director

of the Island Sports Center, home of Robert Morris University's hockey team, in suburban Pittsburgh.

**RIVALRY CLUSTERS:** – The CCHA begins its sixth season with the 12 teams grouped in "rivalry pairings." In the pairings, Notre Dame is paired with Bowling Green. The league's other pairings include Michigan-Michigan State, Miami-Ohio State, Lake Superior State-Northern Michigan, Ferris State-Western Michigan and Alaska Fairbanks-Nebraska-Omaha. Each season the teams are divided into three, four-team clusters and play a 28-game conference schedule. Cluster teams will face each other four times during the season with two games against each of the remaining eight teams. In 2007-08, Notre Dame will play Bowling Green, Ferris State and Western Michigan four times with two games at home and two away. The Irish will also play home-and-home series with Michigan and Michigan State. Notre Dame hosts two-game home series with Lake Superior, Nebraska-Omaha and Ohio State while playing two-game road series at Alaska, Miami and Northern Michigan. Last year, the Irish were 10-1-1 against Bowling Green, Alaska and Nebraska-Omaha, the three teams in their cluster.

## THE IRISH AND THE U.S. NATIONAL TEAM DEVELOPMENTAL PROGRAM:

Notre Dame's current roster includes five players who have past experience with USA Hockey, as members of the National Team Development Program (NTDP). Since the program began, the Irish have had a total of 19 NTDP alums grace their roster. The current contingent includes junior goaltender Jordan Pearce, sophomore defenseman Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.) and freshmen defensemen Ian Cole and Teddy Ruth plus goaltender Brad Phillips. Other NTDP alums who played at Notre Dame include: Brett Henning (1997-98), Michael Chin (1997-98), Connor Dunlop (1997-99), Paul Harris (1997-99), John Wroblewski (1997-99), Neil Komadoski (1998-2000), Brett Lebda (1998-2000), Rob Globke (1998-2000), Derek Smith (2000-01) and Tim Wallace (2002-06), Noah Babin (2003-07), Michael Bartlett (2003-07), Tom Sawatske (2005-07) and Josh Sciba (2003-07).
