Irish Open Second Half Of Season On The Road At Northern Michigan

- Final 16 games of regular season to come versus CCHA foes.
- Irish coming off third-place finish at Lightning College Hockey Classic, losing to No. 9 Massachusetts before defeating No. 17 Rensselaer.
- Erik Condra and Luke Lucyk named to all-tournament team.
- Loss to UMass snaps nation's longest winning streak at nine games.

BACK TO CCHAACTION: The Irish return to action in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) for the first time since Dec. 1 when they travel to Marquette, Michigan to face the Northern Michigan Wildcats on Fri.-Sat., Jan. 4-5. Both games at the Berry Events Center will be played at 7:35 p.m. Saturday's game will be televised live by Comcast Local with Ben Holden and Lyle Phair handling the play-by-play duties. The game can be seen in South Bend on Comcast Cable Channel

3, the local access channel. The Irish open the second half of the CCHA schedule currently tied for second in the conference with Miami as each team has 20 points. That trails first-place Michigan by two points as the Wolverines are first with 22 points. Overall, Notre Dame is 17-5-0 and currently ranked sixth in both the USA Today/American Hockey Magazine and USCHO.com/CSTV polls. The Irish have won 10 of their last 11 games overall and own a five-game CCHA winning streak. Notre Dame finished third at the recent Lightning College Hockey Classic, losing to Massachusetts, 4-3, before defeating Rensselaer, 3-1. Northern Michigan opens the 2008 portion of the schedule with an 8-11-1 overall record and a 5-9-0 mark in the CCHA. The Wildcats are tied with Bowling Green for seventh in the conference with 10 points in league play. They finished third at last weekend's Denver Cup Tournament, losing to Dartmouth, 4-1, before defeating Sacred Heart, 5-2.

IRISH VS. WILDCATS: The two teams have met 36 times in the all-time series with Northern Michigan holding an 18-13-5 lead. At Marquette, Mich., Northern is 8-4-2 against the Irish in 14 meetings. Last season, Notre Dame took a pair of wins from the Wildcats, winning 4-3 at Ft. Wayne, Ind., and then 4-2 at the Joyce Center. The Irish have won three straight in the series with the last win at Northern Michigan coming on Jan. 21, 2006, a 4-3 win.

LIGHTNING COLLEGE HOCKEY CLAS-SIC WRAP UP: Notre Dame finished third at the Lightning College Hockey Classic after dropping a 4-3 decision to ninth-ranked Massachusetts in the opener and then defeating Rensselaer in the third-place game on Sunday afternoon, 3-1. Colorado College downed Rensselaer, 3-2, in that first round game with the Tigers then lost a 5-4 overtime decision to Massachusetts in the title game. Versus UMass, the Irish surrendered three power-play goals in the loss that snapped a nine-game Irish winning streak, the longest in the country. Erik Condra (Jr., Livonia, Mich.), Christian Hanson (Jr., Venetia, Pa.) and Luke Lucyk (Jr., Fox Point, Wis.) scored for the Irish. UMass took a 1-0 lead on a power-play goal by Michael Kostka at 16:12 of the first period. Condra evened the score with his ninth of the year at 19:07 of the first. Cory Quirk scored just 30 seconds into the second period to give the Minutemen a 2-1 lead. Hanson beat goaltender Paul Dainton with a backhander at 1:41 to make it 2-2. Hanson had a hand in the third Irish goal when he won a face off back to Lucvk. The junior defenseman then beat Dainton with a shot from the right point for his first goal of the year at 8:54. The lead would stay 3-2 until the 17:48 mark when Justin Braun tied the game for UMass on the power play with his fourth of the year. James Marcou closed the scoring at 14:26 of the third with a power-play goal for the 4-3 win. The Irish out shot UMass, 32-25. Dainton made 29 saves for the Minutemen while Jordan Pearce (Jr., Anchorage, Alaska) had 21 saves for the Irish. Notre Dame was 0-5 on the power play while UMass was 3-for-5.

IRISH VS. RENSSELAER: Notre Dame met RPI for the second time in tournament play this year, defeating the Engineers, 3-1, to take third place in the second annual Lightning College Hockey Classic. Condra, Ryan Thang (So., Edina, Minn.) and Evan Rankin (Sr., Portage, Mich.) scored for Notre Dame and Pearce made 19 saves to get the Irish back on the winning track. Condra got Notre Dame off to a fast start when he scored his second of the weekend at 1:04 of the first period for a 1-0 lead. Thang made it 2-0 with his 11th of the season at 10:30 only to see the Engineers cut the lead to 2-1 on a Kurt Colling power-play goal at 14:01. The score would stay that way until Rankin closed the game out with an open net goal at 19:31 of the third period for a 3-1 final score. The two teams traded 20 shots on the night. Pearce finished with 19 saves while Mathias Lange had 18 stops for the Engineers.

ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM: Notre Dame placed two players on the 2007 Lightning College Hockey Classic all-tournament team. Irish forward Erik Condra and defenseman Luke Lucyk were named to the all-tournament team after helping Notre Dame to a 1-1 record. Condra had two goals and one assist in the tournament, took nine shots and was +3 on the weekend. Lucyk had one goal in two games and was +2 in the two games. They were joined by RPI goaltender Mathias Lange, Colorado College defenseman Nate Prosser and Colorado College forwards Chad Rau and Jimmy Kilpatrick. UMass forward Matt Burto, who scored the game winner in the championship game was the tournament's Most Valuable Player.

TOURNAMENT VETS: The Lightning College Hockey Classic was the third in-season tournament for the Irish this season. They opened the year at the Lefty McFadden Classic in Dayton, Ohio, losing to Wisconsin, 4-1, before defeating Mercyhurst, 4-0, to take third place. Over Thanksgiving, the Irish played in the Rensselaer Holiday Tournament, taking the championship with wins over Alabama-Huntsville (4-1) and Rensselaer (4-3).

TOURNEY RESULTS: Notre Dame has now participated in 30 in-season tournaments in the program's 40-year history, winning six times and finishing second, six times. The Irish have been third a total of seven times and there have been 11 fourth-place finishes. Notre Dame has now won two of the last four in-season tournaments that the Irish have played in, winning the 2006 Lightning Collegiate Hockey Classic in Oct. of 2006 in Tampa, Fla and the Rensselaer Holiday Tournament, Nov. 24-25, 2007 in Troy, N.Y. All time, the Irish are 23-34-3 in tournament play.

LET DOWN: After giving up just seven powerplay goals in their first 20 games, the Irish gave up four man-advantage goals in the two games of the Lightning College Hockey Classic. In the 4-3 loss to UMass, Notre Dame was lit up for three power-play goals in the game. That marked the first time the Irish have surrendered three powerplay goals in a game since Dec. 17, 2005, in a 4-0 loss to Lake Superior. Rensselaer's lone goal in Sunday's game also was a power-play goal.

STREAK SNAPPED: Notre Dame's 4-3 loss to Massachusetts snapped a nine-game Irish winning streak that began back on Nov. 16 versus Western Michigan. The nine-game streak was the longest in the nation at the time. Coming into this weekend at Northern Michigan, Notre Dame has won five consecutive CCHA games going back to the Western Michigan game on Nov. 16 and has four straight road wins.

BALANCED ACT: Notre Dame comes into the series with Northern Michigan ranked fifth in the nation in scoring with 3.50 goals per game. Despite the ranking, the Irish have just two players on the roster with 10 or more goals this season - Ryan Thang with 11 and Erik Condra with 10. The Irish have accumulated their 77 goals this year with nine players on the roster having five goals or more.

COLE NAMED TO U.S. JUNIOR NATION-AL TEAM: Notre Dame defenseman Ian Cole (Fr., Ann Arbor, Mich.) has been selected to play on the U.S. Junior National Team that will participate in the World Junior Championships in the Czech Republic from Dec. 26 to Jan. 5. Cole, a first-round draft choice (18th overall) of the St. Louis Blues, has played in 18 games for the Irish this season and has two goals and four assists for six points. He is -1 and has nine penalties for 18 minutes. Cole missed both games of the Lightning College Hockey Classic and will miss the two games versus Northern Michigan.

RECORD STREAK: Notre Dame's nine-game winning streak from Nov. 16 through Dec. 8 was the longest for the Irish since a 14-game streak from Dec. 11, 1987 to Feb. 13, 1988. During that time, the Irish were a Division I Independent. The streak is the longest for the Irish as a member of the CCHA or the WCHA.

LOOK AT LUKE: Defenseman Luke Lucyk has made the most of his playing opportunities with Ian Cole at the World Junior Championships and Teddy Ruth (Fr., Naperville, III.) sidelined with an injury. In three games, Lucyk has a goal and an assist. His goal versus Massachusetts on Dec. 29 was his first since Feb. 4, 2005 and snapped a streak of 22 games without a goal. Lucyk played two seasons for the Irish before returning to the USHL last season, where he played for the Tri-City Storm.

IRON MAN: Senior center **Mark Van Guilder (Roseville, Minn.)** has his sights set on Notre Dame's all-time record for most consecutive games played. The record of 153 straight games was set by **Tim Wallace '06** who played in every game of his career – 153 straight. Van Guilder has now played in every game of his career - 138 consecutive games played through the first 22 games this year.

CENTURY CLUB: Notre Dame's "Century Club" added its newest member on Nov. 24 when junior **Erik Condra** recorded an assist versus R.P.I. In 100 career games, Condra now has 30 goals and 77 assists for 107 points. His 77 assists rank him 27th on the all-time assist list. Here's who is ahead of Condra on the points list.

CAREER YEARS: The trio of Dan Kissel (So., Crestwood, Ill.), Christian Hanson and Evan Rankin have combined to give the Irish an effective third line in recent weeks. All of them have achieved career highs in several offensive categories. Kissel, with five goals and seven assists, has career highs for assists and points this season. Hanson (six goals, six assists) has career highs in assists and points while his goal totals equal a career high set last year. Rankin, with six goals and six assists, has career highs in goals, assists and points this season.

SENIOR CLASS HONORS: Notre Dame team captain Mark Van Guilder has been nominated for the Lowes Senior CLASS (Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School) Award. The CLASS award was designed to honor the attributes of seniors who remain committed to their university and elects to pursue the many rewards that a senior season can bring. This award provides a fitting honor for a senior leader that has stood up to the challenge. In the end, the award hopes to recognize the prestige and dignity of being a senior hockey player at the college level. Former Irish goaltender David Brown '07 won the Lowes Senior CLASS award following the 2006-07 season.

FUN RUN: Since the start of the 2006-07 season through today, Notre Dame has recorded a mark of 49-12-3 (.789) in 64 games.

PERSONAL STREAK: Notre Dame goaltender **Jordan Pearce** saw his personal seven-game winning streak snapped on Dec. 29 in the 4-3 loss to Massachusetts. During the streak, Pearce was 7-0-0 with a 1.72 goals-against average and a .902 save percentage. Since Nov. 1, Pearce is 10-2-0 with losses to No. 1 Miami and No. 9 Massachusetts. For the season, Pearce is 14-5-0 with a 2.06 goals-against average and a 909 save percentage with two shutouts.

NO GOALS FOR YOU: Junior goaltender Jordan Pearce recorded his second shutout of the season in the 5-0 win over Nebraska-Omaha on Dec. 1. The shutout also was the fourth of his career and moved him into a tie for third with Mark Kronholm '74 on Notre Dame's all-time shutout list. He trails just Morgan Cey '05 (2nd with 6) and David Brown '07 (first with 12). Pearce's first career shutout came in his second career game, a 2-0, 27-save win over Princeton on Oct. 28, 2005. Freshman goaltender Brad Phillips recorded his first career shutout on Dec. 8 with a 24-save, 7-0 whitewashing of the Princeton Tigers.

CCHA DEFENSEMAN OF THE WEEK: Senior defenseman Dan VeNard (Vernon Hills, Ill.) was named the CCHA defenseman of the week for the week ending Dec. 9. In the weekend sweep at Princeton, VeNard had two goals and two assists for four points and was +2 on the weekend. His three-point game on Dec. 8 in Notre Dame's 7-0 win was a career high for the blueliner. He now has five goals and three assists for eight points in 20 games this year. In 71 career games prior to this season, VeNard had two goals and six assists for eight points.

SHORT-CIRCUITED: Notre Dame's penalty-killing unit is one of the top groups in the nation this season. In the first 20 games this season, the Irish gave up just seven power-play goals in 96 chances for a 92.7% success rate. At the Lightning College Hockey Classic, Notre Dame gave up four power-play goals in 12 chances for a 66.7% success rate. On the season, the Irish are now sixth in the nation in penalty killing, giving up 11 goals in 108 chances for an 89.8% success rate.

CLUTCH SCORER: Sophomore left wing **Ryan Thang** leads Notre Dame with 11 goals on the season. Of those 11, four have come on the power play and four are game winners. In 64 career games, Thang has now scored 31 goals with 14 coming on the power play and 10 of them game winners. His 10 game-winning goals already tie him for sixth on the all-time game-winning goals list at Notre Dame.

TWO SHORTIES: Mark Van Guilder and Ryan Thang each scored short-handed goals in the 5-0 win over Nebraska-Omaha on Dec. 1. That marked the first time the Irish had scored a pair of short-handed goals in a game since Dec. 20, 2000 when Brett Lebda '04 and Dan Carlson '01 scored short-handed goals in a 7-3 win at Nebraska-Omaha. As a team, the Irish have seven short-handed goals, the most of any team in the nation.

WITH A KISS-EL: Sophomore left wing Dan Kissel turned in a career-best four-point game in Notre Dame's 7-0 win at Princeton on Dec. 8. The speedy forward scored twice and added two assists in the contest while turning in a +4 plus/minus. He and his linemates - Evan Rankin (Sr., Portage, Mich.) and Christian Hanson (Jr., Venetia, Pa.) had a big night in the win. Rankin had a career-best three-point game (1g, 2a) and Hanson added a goal and an assist in the win as the line combined for four goals and five assists and nine points in the game.

THE KISSEL EFFECT: Sophomore left wing **Dan Kissel** has career highs in assists (7) and points (12) this season after his four-point game at Princeton on Dec. 8. For his career, Kissel has played in 40 games with 11 goals and 10 assists for 21 points. Of his 11 goals, he has two power-play goals, two shorthanded tallies and four game winners.

NIFTY NOVEMBER: Notre Dame finished November with a 9-1-0 record, including wins in the last six straight. Some other numbers for the month: The Irish were 7-1-0 in the CCHA and 5-0-0 at home while going 3-1-0 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites ... the Irish out scored the opposition by a 38-19 margin (3.8 gpg to 1.9 gpg) ... Notre Dame out shot the opposition by a 31.0 - 20.1 margin ... the Irish were 13-for-52 on the power play (25.0%) and killed 41-of-46 opponent power plays for an 89.1% success rate ... Erik Condra (Jr., Livonia, Mich.) led the team in scoring with six goals and 10 assists for 16 points and was followed by **Kevin Deeth (So.,** Gig Harbor, Wash.), Mark Van Guilder (Sr., Roseville, Minn.) and Kyle Lawson (So., New Hudson, Mich.) with 10 points each ... Jordan Pearce was 7-1-0 with a 2.13 goals-against average and a .900 save percentage ... Brad Phillips (Fr., Farmington Hills, Mich.) was 2-0-0 with a 1.00 goals-against and a .935 save percentage.

LETTERS OF INTENT: Irish head coach Jeff Jackson has announced that three players have signed national letters of intent in the early signing period to attend Notre Dame beginning in the fall of 2008. The trio - defensemen Sean Lorenz (Littleton, Colo.) and Eric Ringel (Hinckley, Ohio) and forward Patrick Gaul (Pittsburgh, Pa.) - will join Billy Maday (Burr Ridge, Ill.) who signed in Nov. of 2007 but deferred until next fall. Lorenz and Gaul are members of the U.S. National Team Development Program's Under-18 team. Ringel plays in the North American Hockey League for the Mahoning Valley Phantoms and Maday is a member of the Waterloo Black Hawks of the United States Hockey League (USHL).

GOOD NEWS AND BAD NEWS: Through the first 22 games of the season, when the Irish are good, they are very good. In the 17 wins this season, Notre Dame has scored 71 goals (4.18 per game). In the five losses, Notre Dame has scored just six goals for a 1.20 goals-per game mark. In the 17 wins, the Irish have given up just 26 goals (1.53 goals-against average) while in the five losses, they have given up 17 goals (3.40 goals against).

GETTING THE BOUNCES: Sophomore center Kevin Deeth (Gig Harbor, Wash.) went without a goal in Notre Dame's first 14 games this season. In his last seven contests, the speedy Deeth has scored three times and added four assists for seven points. All three goals have come on the power play. He is currently tied for third on the team in scoring with three goals and 12 assists for 15 points.

MR. CONSISTENT: Sophomore defenseman Kyle Lawson (So., New Hudson, Mich.) has proven to be one of the CCHA's most consistent defensemen this season. A two-time CCHA defenseman of the week this season, Lawson

leads all Notre Dame defensemen in scoring with three goals and 11 assists for 14 points. Already this year, he has a power-play goal and a pair of game-winning goals. Lawson's 14 points tie him for fifth among CCHA defensemen this season. He is tied for second on the team with a +11 on the year.

RANKINGS UPDATE: Notre Dame opened the 2007-08 season ranked eighth in the nation by both the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* and USCHO.com/CSTV polls. The Irish finished the 2006-07 season ranked fourth in the final *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* poll that included the NCAA tournament. The Irish finished the year first in the USCHO.com/CSTV polls that ended with the end of the CCHA Tournament. In all, Notre Dame was ranked for 20 consecutive weeks and was ranked No.1 for seven straight weeks from Feb. 5 to March 25. The Irish have been ranked every week so far this season. TWO-TIMER: Defenseman Kyle Lawson has been named the CCHA defenseman of the week twice this season (Nov. 25 and Nov. 18). Lawson, who helped the Irish to three wins from Nov. 20-24, had one goal and three assists for four points and was +2. In the Nov. 20, 2-1 win over Bowling Green, Lawson was +1 and scored the game-winning goal in the 2-1 victory. Versus Alabama-Huntsville on Nov. 23, Lawson was even and set up one goal. In the championship game against Rensselaer, Lawson set up two goals, including Ryan Thang game winner with 3:56 left in the game and was +1.

TOURNAMENT HARDWARE: Three Notre Dame players were named to the all-tournament team at the Rensselaer Holiday Tournament. Junior right wing Erik Condra recorded three assists on the weekend and was the lone Irish forward selected. Defensemen Brett Blatchford (So., Temperance, Mich.) and Ian Cole joined Condra on the team. Sophomore left wing Ryan Thang was named the tournament MVP after scoring the game-winning goal in each of Notre Dame's victories.

IRISH VERSUS TOP-RANKED TEAMS: The Lightning College Hockey Classic featured four teams that were ranked nationally going into the tournament. The Irish dropped a 4-3 decision to No. 9 Massachusetts before defeating No. 17 Rensselaer, 3-1. So far this season, Notre Dame is 2-4-0 against teams ranked in the USA Today/American Hockey Magazine poll and 4-4-0 versus teams ranked by U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV poll. Last season, the Irish were 10-2-1 against ranked teams, going 4-1 on the road, 5-0-0 at home and 1-1 on neutral ice.

HOME SWEET HOME: After eight home games this season, Notre Dame is 7-1-0 (.875) at the Joyce Center. A year ago, Notre Dame was 13-2-2 at home for an .824 winning percentage. That was the best mark since the 2003-04 season when the Irish were 14-2-2 at the Joyce Center for an .833 winning percentage. Only two other Irish teams have had better home records – 1987-88 team was 18-2-0 (.900) and the 1969-70 team was 12-1-1 (.893).

FRIENDLY CONFINES: Notre Dame has had three sellouts (2,713) in its first eight home games and just missed a fourth against Bowling Green on Nov. 20 with a crowd of 2,711 in attendatnce. The previous two sellout crowds of 2,857 were the largest crowds to watch a Notre Dame hockey game since March 3, 1995 when 3,310 saw the Irish defeat Illinois-Chicago. Following that season, new seating was installed, reducing capacity at the Joyce Center. At the beginning of November, a new section of seating was added to the student section to increase the capacity. Through eight games this year, the Irish are averaging 2,621 fans per game.

TAKE THE HIGHWAY: The Irish have had their share of success on the road over the last two seasons. This year, Notre Dame is 7-2-0 (.778) on the road. A year ago, the Irish were 12-4-1 (.735) away from the Joyce Center. The 12 road wins equaled a school record (1979-80 and 1997-98) for road wins. Only the 1983-84 team's 10-3-1 road mark (.750) is better.

HIGHS AND LOWS: Notre Dame's 44 shots in the Nov. 16 win over Western Michigan are a season high for the Irish. The 11 shots given up by Notre Dame on Nov. 17 are the fewest the Irish have given up this season. Notre Dame's 11 power-play chances against Western Michigan (Nov. 16) were also a season high.

NEW KID: Freshman goaltender **Brad Phillips** has had a strong start in his young career for the Irish as he is now 3-0-0 following his 7-0 shutout at Princeton on Dec. 8. Phillips has given up just two goals this season for a 0.67 goals-against average and he has a .964 save percentage.

VERSUS THE BEST: Notre Dame's 2-1 win over Miami on Nov. 9 marked the 10th time in the program's history that the Irish knocked off a top-ranked team. In fact, the last four times that Notre Dame has faced a No.1 team, the Irish have come away with the victory. Here's a list of Irish wins over No. 1 ranked teams in the 40-year history of the program.

WINNING AT MIAMI: Notre Dame's 2-1 win over the RedHawks on Nov. 9 snapped a six-game Irish winless streak (0-5-1) at Oxford, Ohio. The previous Irish win was on March 16, 2003 when they defeated Miami, 5-0, in game three of the first round of the CCHA playoffs to advance to Joe Louis Arena. Last Friday's win came in Notre Dame's first-ever appearance at Steve Cady Arena.

ON THE MARK: Senior center Mark Van Guilder recorded the second four-point game of his career on Nov. 1 against Lake Superior State. Van Guilder scored twice and set up two others in the game. His previous four-point night came at Bowling Green on Feb. 17, 2006 as a sophomore when he had three goals and an assist against the Falcons. The Notre Dame captain is second in goals (8) and leads the team in power-play goals (5) this season.

ROAD WARRIORS: Notre Dame's two wins on the road between Oct. 23 and Oct. 27 (at Bowling Green and Ferris State) gave the Irish seven-consecutive road wins, dating back to Jan. 19, 2007. The seven-consecutive road wins tied a program record that was set between Jan. 7 and Feb. 4, 1977. That seven-game streak also became part of the team's longest road unbeaten run as the Irish went 8-0-1 between Jan. 7 and Feb. 24 of that season. The streak was snapped on Oct. 28 in a 3-0 loss at Ferris State.

LONG TIME COMING: Notre Dame's 4-3 win over Denver on Oct. 18 snapped a 10-game (0-9-1) winless streak for the Irish against the Pioneers. The last time they had beaten Denver was Nov. 3, 1978, a 3-2 win at the Joyce Center. Notre Dame and Denver played in the WCHA for 10 years from 1971-81 before the Irish left for the CCHA. Prior to last weekend's series, the two teams had met just three times with Denver going 2-0-1.

BIG WIN: Notre Dame's win over Denver on Oct. 18 was the first this season for the Irish against a nationally-ranked team. A year ago, Notre Dame was 10-2-1 against ranked teams. The Pioneers were the highest-ranked team that Notre Dame has beaten at the Joyce Center since beating fourth-ranked Michigan State, 4-1, on Nov. 17, 2006.

CCHA OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Senior center Mark Van Guilder was the CCHA offensive player of the week for the week ending Oct. 14. Van Guilder scored three goals in Notre Dame's two games at the Lefty McFadden Invitational. In the 4-1 loss to Wisconsin, Van Guilder scored a second-period, power-play goal to tie the game at 1-1. In Saturday's 4-0 victory versus Mercyhurst, Van Guilder scored a pair of goals, including one on the power play and one for the game winner. In the game, he set a career high with 12 shots on goal.

CAPTAINS: Senior right wing Mark Van Guilder will serve as Notre Dame's captain for the 2007-08 season. Joining Van Guilder as alternate captains in '07-'08, are senior defensemen Brock Sheahan (Lethbridge, Alb.) and Dan VeNard (Vernon Hills, Ill.). They will be joined by junior forward Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.). This is the first season for all four players to serve as captains at Notre Dame.

MR PRESIDENT: Senior defenseman Dan Ve-Nard has been named president of Notre Dame's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) for the 2007-08 school year. VeNard served as hockey's representative to the group last season and was selected president by the group in M. The committee represents Notre Dame's studentathletes with the Irish athletic department.

SWEDISH CONNECTION: For the first time in the 40-year history of the Notre Dame hockey program, the Irish have two natives of Sweden on the roster. Freshmen **Robin Bergman** (Stockholm) and **Calle Ridderwall** (Stockholm) join the roster this season. Both played last year in the USHL; Bergman for Cedar Rapids and Ridderwall for Tri-City. Bergman had 26 goals and 17 assists for 43 points. His 17 power-play goals were second in the league. Ridderwall led Tri-City in scoring with 27 goals and 35 assists for 62 points. He had 14 power-play goals and seven game winners, the most in the league in that category.

ALL TIED UP: Notre Dame's 3-2 overtime win versus Alabama-Huntsville in the NCAA Regionals on March 23, 2007 gave the Irish a 3-1-3 record in overtime last year. The three overtime wins were the most for the Irish in a single season. In two seasons under **Jeff Jackson**, Notre Dame is 3-1-7 in extra play.

WELCOME BACK: Junior defenseman Luke Lucyk (Fox Point, Wis.) returns to the Notre Dame lineup this season after spending the 2006-07 season with the Tri-City Storm of the USHL. Lucyk played in 44 games for the Irish between 2004-06 with one goal and one assist for two points. He returned to Tri-City last season to get more playing time and had nine goals and 13 assists for 22 points in 59 games.

NHL DRAFTEES: The Irish have seven players on the 2007-08 roster who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Last June, a total of five Notre Dame players were selected. Leading the way was freshman defenseman Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.) who was a first-round selection of the St. Louis Blues who took him with the 18th pick overall. Cole became the first Irish player ever selected in the first round and was selected earlier than any other Notre Dame player (Rob Globke '04 was the previous highest selection when he was picked 40th overall by Florida in 2002). Cole was followed by fellow freshman defenseman Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.) who went in the second round, 46th overall to the Washington Capitals. Sophomore Ryan Thang (Edina, Minn.) was selected in the third round, 81st overall by the Nashville Predators. Incoming freshman Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.) joined Thang when the Predators made him the 114th pick (fourth round). Freshman goaltender Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.) rounded out the Notre Dame selections in the last draft when the Philadelphia Flyers selected him in the seventh round, 182nd overall. Those five join junior right wing Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.) who was selected in the seventh round, 211th overall by the Ottawa Senators in 2006 and sophomore defenseman Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.) who was selected in the 2005 NHL Draft by the Carolina Hurricanes in the seventh round, 198th overall.

WORST TO FIRST: Just two seasons ago (2004-05), Notre Dame was 5-27-6 overall and finished last in the CCHA with a 3-20-5 record. In the CCHA's 35-year history, no team has ever gone from worst-to-first in one season. There have been three teams go from worst to first in a two-season span. They are:

1975-76 Bowling Green – Falcons finished last in 1973-74 in a three team conference and finished first in '75-'76 in a five-team league.

1992-93 Miami – RedHawks were last in 1990-91 with nine points in a nine-team conference. They finished first in 1992-93 with 49 points in a 12-team conference for a 40-point improvement over two seasons.

2006-07 Notre Dame – Irish were last in 2004-05 with 11 points in a 12-team conference. In '06-'07, the Irish took first place with 45 points for a 34-point improvement over two seasons.

FAMILY MATTERS: Two members of the Notre Dame hockey team – forwards Erik Condra and Garrett Regan (Hastings, Minn.) – have family ties to the Irish hockey program. Condra's uncle is All-American forward Kirt Bjork (*83) who played at Notre Dame from 1979-83. He scored 76 goals with 85 assists for 161 career points in 141 career games. He took All-America honors in 1983 when he had 29 goals and 34 assists for 63 points. Regan's uncle - Sean Regan - was a defenseman for the Irish from 1981-83 before finishing his career at the University of Minnesota.

MORE FAMILY MATTERS: Freshman goaltender Brad Phillips also has a family connection to Notre Dame. His uncle is former Irish quarterback Terry Andrysiak who played at Notre Dame from 1985 to 1988.

PUTTING ON THE FOIL: Notre Dame junior Christian Hanson (Venetia, Pa.) is the sixth player to play for the Irish whose father played in the National Hockey League. His father, Dave Hanson, played 10 years of professional hockey between 1974-75 and 1983-84, including stints with the Detroit Red Wings and the Minnesota North Stars and the World Hockey Association's (WHA) Minnesota Fighting Saints and the New England Whalers. Fans might also be familiar with Dave Hanson, as one of the famed Hanson Brothers, made famous in the hockey movie - Slapshot. Hanson currently is the director of the Island Sports Center, home of Robert Morris University's hockey team, in suburban Pittsburgh.

THE IRISH AND THE U.S. NATIONAL TEAM DEVELOPMENTAL PROGRAM:

Notre Dame's current roster includes five players who have past experience with USA Hockey, as members of the National Team Development Program (NTDP). Since the program began, the Irish have had a total of 19 NTDP alums grace their roster. The current contingent includes junior goaltender **Jordan Pearce**, sophomore defenseman Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.) and freshmen defensemen Ian Cole and Teddy Ruth plus goaltender Brad Phillips.
