Eighth-Ranked Notre Dame Breaks From CCHA Action To Face USA Under-18 Team On Friday Night At Joyce Center

- Irish have back-to-back 20-win seasons for first time in program's 40-year history.
- U.S. Under-18 Team features two players who signed national letters-of-intent to attend Notre Dame in September of 2008.
- Current Notre Dame roster features five U.S. Under-18 Team alums; 19 current and former Irish players came through National Team Developmental Program.

A BREAK IN THE ACTION: The Notre Dame hockey team will take a break from the rigors of the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) this week when the Irish face off against the U.S. National Team Developmental Program's Under-18 squad in an exhibition game on Friday, February 1st at the Joyce Center. Face off is set for 7:35 p.m. The Irish are coming off a weekend sweep of Bowling Green that snapped a four-game winless streak (0-3-1). The 6-1 and 4-1 wins over the Falcons improved Notre Dame to 20-9-1 overall and 13-6-1 in the CCHA. The Irish enter the week with 27 points in the conference and that puts them in fourth place, two points behind third-place Michigan State (29), four points behind second-place Michigan (31) and seven points behind first-place Miami (34). Michigan and Michigan State have two games in hand on Notre Dame. The Irish are eight points ahead of fifth-place Nebraska-Omaha (19) and nine points ahead of sixth-place Bowling Green (18). The Under-18 Team brings a 15-16-3 overall record into Friday's game, playing an mix of international, collegiate and junior teams during the season. The U.S. Team has played 14 games this year against Division I schools and is 4-9-1 with wins over Yale, Harvard, Minnesota-Duluth and last Friday's 5-2 win at Northern Michigan. They are also 3-2-0 against Division III programs.

After Friday's game with Notre Dame, the U.S. will have two more Division I games left as they play at Robert Morris and Nebraska-Omaha in

IRISH VERSUS UNDER-18 TEAM: Friday's game marks the fourth time that Notre Dame will face the U.S. Under-18 Team in exhibition play. The Irish own a 2-1-0 record versus the Under-18 team with the last meeting coming on Nov. 19, 2004, a game that Team USA won, 7-2. The other meetings came on Nov. 14, 2003, a 4-0 Irish win and Dec. 21, 2001, a 3-2 win by Notre Dame

FUTURE IRISH: Two members of the 2007-08 U.S. Under-18 Team will play their collegiate hockey at Notre Dame, beginning in the fall of 2008. Forward Patrick Gaul (Pittsburgh, Pa.) and defenseman Sean Lorenz (Littleton, Colo.) signed national letters-of-intent in November to attend Notre Dame. Gaul is currently sixth in scoring with seven goals and 11 assists for 18 points in 31 games. Lorenz has played in every game and has two goals and three assists for

THE IRISH AND THE U.S. NATIONAL TEAM DEVELOPMENTAL PROGRAM:

Notre Dame's current roster includes five players who have past experience with USA Hockey, as members of the National Team Development Program (NTDP). Since the program began, the Irish have had a total of 19 NTDP alums grace their roster. The current contingent includes junior goaltender Jordan Pearce, sophomore defenseman Kyle Lawson and freshmen defensemen Ian Cole and Teddy Ruth plus goaltender Brad Phillips. Freshman right wing **Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.)** was selected as the CCHA rookie of the week. In the Bowling Green series, Sheahan had an assist in each game, blocked three shots and was +3 while playing a key role in a 12-for-12 penalty-killing weekend. Ryan had two goals and two assists for four points and was +2. He had an assist in the 6-1 win on Friday and then had a career-best three-point game (2 ppg, 1 assist) in the 4-1 win on Saturday night.

EIGHTH IN THE NATION: Notre Dame's two-game sweep of Bowling Green last weekend helped move the Irish back to eighth in both the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* and US-CHO.com/CSTV polls. Six of Notre Dame's last 10 games have come against ranked opponents.

ON A ROLL: Notre Dame's two-game series sweep of Bowling Green on Jan. 25-26 gives the Irish a 12-game unbeaten streak (11-0-1) against the Falcons. That streak started with the 2005-06 season. The Irish are also 8-0-0 versus Bowling Green over the last two campaigns.

ON DECK: Following the exhibition contest with the U.S. Under-18 squad, Notre Dame heads into the home stretch of the 2007-08 season. The Irish will have eight CCHA games remaining with five at home and three on the road. Next week, Feb. 8-9, the Irish will play host to Ferris State in a two-game series. On Feb. 15-16, they travel to Alaska for a pair of games. Notre Dame then returns home to face Ohio State (Feb. 22-23) before closing out the season with a home-and-home series with Western Michigan (Feb. 29 at WMU, March 1 at home).

BOWLING GREEN RECAP:

January 25 - Notre Dame scored three first-period goals, including two on the power play, on the way to a 6-1 win over Bowling Green on Friday in front of 2,857 at the Joyce Center. Sophomore left wing Ryan Thang (Edina, Minn.) led the way with two power-play markers and an assist for three points in the game. Right wing Erik Condra (Jr., Livonia, Mich.) added one goal and two assists for his seventh multiple-point game of the year. Mark Van Guilder (Sr., Roseville, Minn.) added a goal and an assist while Calle Ridderwall (Fr., Stockholm, Sweden) and Christian Hanson (Jr., Venetia, Pa.) also scored for the Irish. Goaltender Jordan Pearce (Jr., Anchorage, Alaska) made 20 saves in picking up his 15th win of the year. Thang (2 ppg) and Condra staked the Irish to a 3-0 lead after one period of play as Notre Dame out shot Bowling Green by a 16-2 margin. Van Guilder (6:00) and Ridderwall (8:36) made it 5-0 before John Mazzei broke up Pearce's shutout bid at 17:49 of the second period. Hanson closed the scoring with a third-period goal, his eighth of the year. On the night, Notre Dame out shot the Falcons, 32-21. Nick Eno played the first 40 minutes and made 19 saves, while Jimmy Spratt made seven saves in the third period. The Irish were 2-for-3 on the power play while the Falcons were 0-for-6.

January 26 - Saturday's game at Bowling Green was freshman Ben Ryan's turn to lead the Irish as the right wing scored a pair of power-play goals and added an assist in the 4-1 win. The three-point game was the best of his career. Defenseman Ian Cole (Fr., Ann Arbor, Mich.) scored the game winner in the second period and Kevin Deeth (So., Gig Harbor, Wash.) added a short-handed empty-net goal to seal the win. Ryan got his first of the night at 4:33 of the first

period for his seventh goal of the season. The score stayed 1-0 until the 16:01 mark of the second when Cole combined with Mark Van Guilder on a 2-on-1 to beat goaltender Jimmy Spratt for his third of the season. Dan Sexton scored a short-handed goal for the Falcons at 11:58 of the third to cut the Notre Dame lead to 2-1. Ryan got his second power-play goal of the night off of Justin White's (Jr., Traverse City, Mich.) second assist at 16:31 and Deeth closed the scoring at 19:41 for the 4-1 win. Notre Dame out shot Bowling Green, 26-22, on the night with Jordan Pearce making 21 saves and Spratt 22. The Irish were 2-for-8 on the power-play and the Falcons were 0-for-6.

WHAT SLUMP?: After going 0-for-the-last eight games from Dec. 29 to Jan. 19 on the power-play (0-for-38 overall), the Irish found the scoring touch versus Bowling Green, going 2-for-3 on Friday night at the Joyce Center and then 2-for-8 on Saturday at the BGSU Ice Arena. The Irish are currently 4-for-11 (36.4%) over the last two games with the man advantage. For the year, they are 26-for-165 (15.8%).

BAD BOYS: Notre Dame and Bowling Green combined for 51 penalties and 157 minutes in the two-game series last week. On Friday night, the two teams had 23 penalties for 97 minutes with the Falcons getting 10-for-44 and the Irish a season-high 13-for-57. On Saturday, Notre Dame had just seven for 14 minutes while the Falcons had an opponent's season high of 11-for-46 minutes.

PERSONAL STREAK: Notre Dame goaltender Jordan Pearce snapped his own four-game winless streak (0-3-1) with the Jan. 25, 6-1 win over Bowling Green. He added a second-straight win with a 4-1 victory on Jan. 26. In the four nonwins, Pearce gave up just eight goals in a loss at Northern Michigan, 2-1, a loss at Michigan State, 3-1, a tie with the Spartans, 1-1 and a loss at Michigan, 3-2. In those four games, Notre Dame scored just five goals. Earlier this season, Pearce had a personal seven-game winning streak between Nov. 16 and Dec. 8. During the streak, Pearce was 7-0-0 with a 1.72 goals-against average and a .902 save percentage. For the season, Pearce is 16-8-1 with a 1.93 goals-against average and a .915 save percentage with two shutouts.

SHINNY ANYONE?: On Monday, Jan. 21, Notre Dame's practice had a different look. The Irish went back to their hockey roots that day as they ventured to nearby Merrifield Park in Mishawaka, Ind., to play a little shinny on the outdoor rink. Complete with temperatures in the single digits, stocking caps, hot chocolate and a great deal of laughter, the Irish spent some time having fun playing the game they love. Smiles were the number one priority and Monday's practice was a smashing success in that area.

DEFENSIVE SCORING: Through the first 30 games of the season, Notre Dame's defense has accounted for 13 of the team's 95 goals (13.6%), 42-of-149 assists (28.2%) and 55-of-244 points (22.5%). **Kyle Lawson (So., New Hudson, Mich.)** leads the group with 3-13-16 and is followed by **Dan VeNard** (5-4-9). **Brock Sheahan** and **Brett Blatchford (So., Temperance, Mich.)** each have nine assists for nine point on the year. Ian Cole is right behind them with three goals and five assists for eight points while **Teddy Ruth (Fr., Naperville, Ill.)** and **Luke Lucyk (Jr., Fox Point, Wis.)** each have a goal and an assist.

ON THE PLUS SIDE: Senior defenseman **Brock Sheahan** is one of the CCHA's top defensive defensemen. As a junior, he was a finalist for the conference's top defensive defenseman award. This season, Sheahan continues to be a force on the Irish blue line. He is currently +18 for the year to lead the team in that category. He is also tied for seventh in the CCHA with the +18 mark.

SECOND-HALF NUMBERS: Friday night's (Jan. 25) six-goal out burst was the most goals for the Irish in a game since a 7-0 win at Princeton on Dec. 8. The Irish finished the weekend, scoring a total of 10 goals overall. During the second half of the season that started on Dec. 29, the Irish have now scored 24 goals (2.40) while giving up 22 (2.20). In those 10 games, the Irish are 4-5-1. In the first half of the year (20 games) the Irish averaged 3.55 goals per game and were ranked third in the country in scoring. They are now tied for 11th, averaging 3.17 goals-per-game.

THE CENTURY CLUB: Notre Dame's "Century Club" added its newest member on Nov. 24 when junior **Erik Condra** recorded an assist versus R.P.I. In 105 career games, Condra is now 34th on the all-time points list with 31 goals and 81 assists for 112 points. His 81 assists rank him 24th on the all-time assist list. For the third season in a row, Condra leads the Irish in scoring with 11 goals and 19 assists for 30 points in 30 games. Here's who is ahead of Condra on the all-time points list.

THE PENALTY KILL: Through the first 30 games of the season, Notre Dame ranks second in the CCHA and fourth in the nation killing penalties. The Irish have killed 126-of-140 opponent power plays for an 90.0% success rate. The Irish also are tied for the national lead with Providence in short-handed goals with eight. Over the last three games, the Irish have killed 15 consecutive opponent power-play chances. Over the first 20 games, the Irish led the nation in penalty killing, killing 89-of-96 for a 92.7 % success rate. At the time, they had given up seven power-play goals while scoring seven short-handed tallies.

VAN GUILDER BREAKS SKID: Senior captain Mark Van Guilder saw his 10-game goalless streak end versus Bowling Green on Jan. 25 when he scored his ninth of the year in the second period against Bowling Green. His last goal had come on December 1 against Nebraska-Omaha. The senior center has now scored nine of his 38 career goals against Bowling Green. He finished the weekend with a goal and two assists.

THE GOOD AND THE BAD: Through the first 30 games of the season, when the Irish are good, they are very good. In the 20 wins this season, Notre Dame has scored 83 goals (4.15 per game). In the nine losses and one tie, Notre Dame has scored just 12 goals for a 1.20 goals-per game mark. In the 20 wins, the Irish have given up just 29 goals (1.45 goals-against average) while in the nine losses and one tie, they have given up 31 goals (3.10 goals against). The 2-1 loss to Northern Michigan on Jan. 4 marked the first time all season that the Irish lost a game when giving up two goals or less.

ONE-GOAL LOSSES: During the first half of the season, Notre Dame was 6-0 in one-goal games. In the second half of the season, the Irish have seen four of their nine games end in one-goal decisions with opponents winning three of the four one-goal games. For the year, Notre Dame is now 7-3 in one-goal contests.

FIVE-GOALS: Michigan's five-goal out burst on Jan. 19 marked just the second time in the last two seasons that Notre Dame has given up five goals in a game. The last time came on Feb. 23, 2007 in a 5-2 loss to Ferris State. Under head coach **Jeff Jackson**, the Irish have given up five or more in a game just seven times in his three seasons (107 games) behind the bench.

HOCKEY HUMANITARIAN: Senior defenseman Dan VeNard (Vernon Hills, Ill.) was one of 22 nominees for the College Hockey Humanitarian Award that goes to college hockey's "top citizen". The list was to 10 on Jan. 28 and VeNard did not advance. The Irish alternate captain has been heavily involved in community service work in and around the Notre Dame campus during his career. He also serves as the president of Notre Dame's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC).

HOBEY HOPEFULS: Fan voting has begun for the 2008 Hobey Baker Award at www.hobey-baker.com. Two Notre Dame players are on the ballot - junior right wing Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.) and senior right wing Mark Van Guilder (Roseville, Minn.).

BUMP IN THE ROAD: Freshman goaltender Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.) saw his four-game winning streak snapped on Jan. 19 in the 5-1 loss to Michigan. The rookie netminder played 35:16 of the game, giving up four goals on 19 shots. In the first four starts of his career, Phillips was 4-0-0 with a 0.75 goals-against average and a .958 with one shutout. His numbers are currently 4-1-0 with a 1.53 goals-against average and a .923 save percentage.

IRON MAN: Senior center **Mark Van Guilder** (Sr., Roseville, Minn.) has his sights set on Notre Dame's all-time record for most consecutive games played. The record of 153 straight games was set by **Tim Wallace '06** who played in every game of his career – 153 straight. Van Guilder has now played in every game of his career - 146 consecutive games played through the first 30 games this year.

CLUTCH SCORER: Ryan Thang's goal with 38 seconds left versus Michigan State on Jan. 13 salvaged a 1-1 tie for the Irish. The sophomore left wing has now scored four game-winning goals this season and one game-tying goal among his team-high 14 goals. In 71 career games, Thang has scored 34 goal with 16 coming on the power play and 10 of them game winners. His 10 game winners tie him for sixth on the all-time game-winning goals list at Notre Dame.

BALANCED ATTACK: Notre Dame comes into the game with the U.S. Under-18 Team ranked 11th in the nation in scoring with 3.17 goals per game. Through the first 20 games, the Irish were third in the nation, averaging 3.55 goals per game. Despite the ranking, the Irish have just two players on the roster with 10 or more goals this season - Ryan Thang with 14 and Erik Condra with 11. The Irish have accumulated their 95 goals this year with 10 players on the roster having five goals or more.

THE KISSEL EFFECT: Sophomore left wing **Dan Kissel** has career highs in assists (11) and points (17) this season. For his career, Kissel has played in 48 games with 12 goals and 14 assists for 26 points. Of his 12 goals, he has two power-play goals, two shorthanded tallies and four game winners.

MR. CONSISTENT: Sophomore defenseman Kyle Lawson (So., New Hudson, Mich.) has proven to be one of the CCHA's most consistent defensemen this season. A two-time CCHA defenseman of the week this season, Lawson leads all Notre Dame defensemen in scoring with three goals and 13 assists for 16 points. Already this year, he has a power-play goal and a pair of game-winning goals. Lawson's 16 points tie him for sixth among CCHA defensemen this season. He is tied for third on the team with a +11 on the year.

ALL TIED UP: Notre Dame's 1-1 overtime tie with Michigan State on Jan. 13 marked the first overtime game this season for the Irish. A year ago, Notre Dame was 3-1-3 in overtime. The three overtime wins were the most for the Irish in a single season. In two-plus seasons under head coach **Jeff Jackson**, Notre Dame is 3-1-8 in extra play.

HOT HANDS: Notre Dame's trio of left wing Dan Kissel (So., Crestwood, Ill.), center Christian Hanson (Jr., Venetia, Pa.) and right wing Evan Rankin (Sr., Portage, Mich.) have carried the offensive attack over the last 10 games for the Irish. The threesome has scored nine goals and added 15 assists for 24 points since Dec. 8 at Princeton. Kissel has three goals and seven assists for 10 points; Hanson checks in with four goals and three assists for seven points and Rankin has two goals and five assists for seven points. All three players have career highs in goals, assists and points this season. Kissel has six goals, nine assists and 15 points, Hanson has seven goals, six assists and 13 points and Rankin has six goals, seven assists and 13 points so far this year.

RANKINGS UPDATE: Notre Dame opened the 2007-08 season ranked eighth in the nation by both the USA Today/American Hockey Magazine and USCHO.com/CSTV polls. The Irish finished the 2006-07 season ranked fourth in the final USA Today/American Hockey Magazine poll that included the NCAA tournament. The Irish finished the year first in the USCHO.com/CSTV polls that ended with the end of the CCHA Tournament. In all, Notre Dame was ranked for 20 consecutive weeks and was ranked No.1 for seven straight weeks from Feb. 5 to March 25. The Irish have been ranked every week so far this season. SECOND-PERIOD PROWESS: The second period has been Notre Dame's best period this season as the Irish have scored 40 goals while giving up just 18 for a +22 advantage in the middle stanza. They are out scoring the opposition, 26-21, in the first period and 29-21 in the third.

RECORD STREAK: Notre Dame's nine-game winning streak from Nov. 16 through Dec. 8 was the longest for the Irish since a 14-game streak from Dec. 11, 1987 to Feb. 13, 1988. During that time, the Irish were a Division I Independent. The streak is the longest for the Irish as a member of the CCHA or the WCHA.

THREE PPG AGAINST: In the 4-3 loss to Massachusetts on Dec. 29, the Irish gave up three power-play goals to the Minutemen, the first time that has happened since Dec. 17, 2005, in a 4-0 loss to Lake Superior.

VERSUS THE BEST: Notre Dame failed to record a win in the weekend series with top-ranked Michigan last weekend, the second time this year that the Irish faced the nation's top-ranked team. On Nov. 9-10, Notre Dame met No. 1 ranked Miami twice in Oxford, Ohio, defeating the RedHawks, 2-1, on Nov. 9 befoe dropping a 3-1 decision at Miami on Nov. 10. The Nov. 9 win marked the 10th time in the program's history that the Irish knocked off a top-ranked team. Before losing on Nov. 10, Notre Dame had won four straight versus top 10 teams. BERGMAN RETURNS TO USHL: Freshman left wing Robin Bergman (Stockholm, Sweden) has left the Notre Dame hockey team and returned to the United States Hockey League (USHL). He will play for the Cedar Rapids Rough Riders, the team he played for last season. In 20 games at Notre Dame, Bergman had one goal and six assists for seven points and was +3 on the year. With Cedear Rapids last season, Bergman had 26 goals and 17 assists for 43 points to finish fourth on the team in scoring.

WELCOME BACK: Freshman defenseman Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.) returned to the Notre Dame lineup at Michigan State (Jan. 11) after participating in the World Junior Championships with the U.S. Junior National Team. At the World Championships, Cole played in all six games and had no points with six penalty minutes as the United States finished fourth in the tournament. He missed four games – the two games at the Lightning College Hockey Classic and the Northern Michigan series. Also returning on Friday night was fellow freshman defender Teddy Ruth (Naperville, III.). Ruth missed five games (Princeton, Lightning College Classic and two with Northern Michigan) due to an injury.

THE REPLACEMENTS: With Ian Cole at the World Junior Championships and Teddy Ruth sidelined with an injury, junior Luke Lucyk (Fox Point, Wis.) and sophomore Stewart Carlin (Jeannette, Pa.) stepped into the Notre Dame lineup and did yeoman's work on the blue line between Dec. 8 and Jan. 5. In five games, Lucyk had a goal and an assist, had one shot on goal and was +3. Carlin played in four games, had eight shots on goal and was +1 in his playing time. He remained in the lineup for the Jan. 11 game at Michigan State.

IRISH VERSUS TOP-RANKED TEAMS: Six of Notre Dame's last eight games have come against ranked teams with the Irish going 1-4-1 in those games. Overall, Notre Dame has faced 12 ranked teams this season. The Irish dropped a pair to No. 1-ranked Michigan last weekend, 3-2 and 5-1, to fall to 2-7-1 against teams that were ranked in the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* poll and 4-7-1 versus teams in the U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV poll. Last season, the Irish were 10-2-1 against ranked teams, going 4-1 on the road, 5-0-0 at home and 1-1 on neutral ice.

SENIOR CLASS HONORS: Notre Dame team captain Mark Van Guilder has been nominated for the Lowes Senior CLASS (Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School) Award. The CLASS award was designed to honor the attributes of seniors who remain committed to their university and elects to pursue the many rewards that a senior season can bring. This award provides a fitting honor for a senior leader that has stood up to the challenge. In the end, the award hopes to recognize the prestige and dignity of being a senior hockey player at the college level. Former Irish goaltender David Brown '07 won the Lowes Senior CLASS award following the 2006-07 season.

NO GOALS FOR YOU: Junior goaltender Jordan Pearce recorded his second shutout of the season in the 5-0 win over Nebraska-Omaha on Dec. 1. The shutout also was the fourth of his career and moved him into a tie for third with Mark Kronholm '74 on Notre Dame's all-time shutout list. He trails just Morgan Cey '05 (2nd with 6) and David Brown '07 (first with 12). Pearce's first career shutout came in his second career game, a 2-0, 27-save win over Princeton on Oct. 28, 2005. Freshman goaltender Brad Phillips recorded his first career shutout on Dec. 8 with a 24-save, 7-0 whitewashing of the Princeton Tigers.

GETTING THE BOUNCES: Sophomore center Kevin Deeth is tied for fourth on the Irish in scoring with seven goals and 12 assists for 19 points. Over his last 14 games, the speedy Deeth has scored seven times and added four assists for 11 points. Three of his seven goals have come on the power play while one was short-handed.

TOURNAMENT VETS: The Lightning College Hockey Classic was the third in-season tournament for the Irish this season. They opened the year at the Lefty McFadden Classic in Dayton, Ohio, losing to Wisconsin, 4-1, before defeating Mercyhurst, 4-0, to take third place. Over Thanksgiving, the Irish played in the Rensselaer Holiday Tournament, taking the championship with wins over Alabama-Hunts-

ville (4-1) and Rensselaer (4-3). At Tampa, Notre Dame dropped a 4-3 decision to Massachusetts and then took third place with a 3-1 win over Rensselaer.

STREAKS SNAPPED: Notre Dame's 4-3 loss to Massachusetts snapped a nine-game Irish winning streak that began back on Nov. 16 versus Western Michigan. The nine-game streak was the longest in the nation at the time. The Irish also saw a five-game CCHA winning streak (Nov. 16-Dec. 1) snapped last weekend in the 2-1 loss at Northern Michigan.

TOURNEY RESULTS: Notre Dame has now participated in 30 in-season tournaments in the program's 40-year history, winning six times and finishing second, six times. The Irish have been third a total of seven times and there have been 11 fourth-place finishes. Notre Dame has now won two of the last four in-season tournaments that the Irish have played in, winning the 2006 Lightning Collegiate Hockey Classic in Oct. of 2006 in Tampa, Fla and the Rensselaer Holiday Tournament, Nov. 24-25, 2007 in Troy, N.Y. All time, the Irish are 23-34-3 in tournament play.

ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM: Notre Dame placed two players on the 2007 Lightning College Hockey Classic all-tournament team. Irish forward Erik Condra and defenseman Luke Lucyk were named to the all-tournament team after helping Notre Dame to a 1-1 record. Condra had two goals and one assist in the tournament, took nine shots and was +3 on the weekend. Lucyk had one goal in two games and was +2 in the two games. They were joined by RPI goaltender Mathias Lange, Colorado College defenseman Nate Prosser and Colorado College forwards Chad Rau and Jimmy Kilpatrick. UMass forward Matt Burto, who scored the game winner in the championship game was the tournament's Most Valuable Player.

CCHA DEFENSEMAN OF THE WEEK: Senior defenseman Dan VeNard (Vernon Hills, Ill.) was named the CCHA defenseman of the week for the week ending Dec. 9. In the weekend sweep at Princeton, VeNard had two goals and two assists for four points and was +2 on the weekend. His three-point game on Dec. 8 in Notre Dame's 7-0 win was a career high for the blueliner. He now has five goals and three assists for eight points in 20 games this year. In 71 career games prior to this season, VeNard had two goals and six assists for eight points.

LETTERS OF INTENT: Irish head coach Jeff Jackson has announced that three players have signed national letters of intent in the early signing period to attend Notre Dame beginning in the fall of 2008. The trio - defensemen Sean Lorenz (Littleton, Colo.) and Eric Ringel (Hinckley, Ohio) and forward Patrick Gaul (Pittsburgh, Pa.) - will join Billy Maday (Burr Ridge, Ill.) who signed in Nov. of 2007 but deferred until next fall. Lorenz and Gaul are members of the U.S. National Team Development Program's Under-18 team. Ringel plays in the North American Hockey League for the Mahoning Valley Phantoms and Maday is a member of the Waterloo Black Hawks of the United States Hockey League (USHL). Ringel was ranked 163rd (sixth round) among North Americans in NHL Central Scouting's mid-term rankings that were released in January.

TWO SHORTIES: Mark Van Guilder and Ryan Thang each scored short-handed goals in the 5-0 win over Nebraska-Omaha on Dec. 1. That marked the first time the Irish had scored a pair of short-handed goals in a game since Dec. 20, 2000 when Brett Lebda '04 and Dan Carlson '01 scored short-handed goals in a 7-3 win at Nebraska-Omaha. As a team, the Irish have seven short-handed goals, the most of any team in the nation.

WITH A KISS-EL: Sophomore left wing Dan Kissel turned in a career-best four-point game in Notre Dame's 7-0 win at Princeton on Dec. 8. The speedy forward scored twice and added two assists in the contest while turning in a +4 plus/minus. He and his linemates - Evan Rankin (Sr., Portage, Mich.) and Christian Hanson (Jr., Venetia, Pa.) had a big night in the win. Rankin had a career-best three-point game (1g, 2a) and Hanson added a goal and an assist in the win as the line combined for four goals and five assists and nine points in the game.

NIFTY NOVEMBER: Notre Dame finished November with a 9-1-0 record, including wins in the last six straight. Some other numbers for the month: The Irish were 7-1-0 in the CCHA and 5-0-0 at home while going 3-1-0 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites ... the Irish out scored the opposition by a 38-19 margin (3.8 gpg to 1.9 gpg) ... Notre Dame out shot the opposition by a 31.0 - 20.1 margin ... the Irish were 13-for-52 on the power play (25.0%) and killed 41-of-46 opponent power plays for an 89.1% success rate ... Erik Condra (Jr., Livonia, Mich.) led the team in scoring with six goals and 10 assists for 16 points and was followed by Kevin Deeth (So., Gig Harbor, Wash.), Mark Van Guilder (Sr., Roseville, Minn.) and Kyle Lawson (So., New Hudson, Mich.) with 10 points each ... Jordan Pearce was 7-1-0 with a 2.13 goals-against average and a .900 save percentage ... Brad Phillips (Fr., Farmington Hills, Mich.) was 2-0-0 with a 1.00 goals-against and a .935 save percentage.

TWO-TIMER: Defenseman Kyle Lawson has been named the CCHA defenseman of the week twice this season (Nov. 25 and Nov. 18). Lawson, who helped the Irish to three wins from Nov. 20-24, had one goal and three assists for four points and was +2. In the Nov. 20, 2-1 win over Bowling Green, Lawson was +1 and scored the game-winning goal in the 2-1 victory. Versus Alabama-Huntsville on Nov. 23, Lawson was even and set up one goal. In the championship game against Rensselaer, Lawson set up two goals, including Ryan Thang game winner with 3:56 left in the game and was +1.

TOURNAMENT HARDWARE: Three Notre Dame players were named to the all-tournament team at the Rensselaer Holiday Tournament. Junior right wing Erik Condra recorded three assists on the weekend and was the lone Irish forward selected. Defensemen Brett Blatchford (So., Temperance, Mich.) and Ian Cole joined Condra on the team. Sophomore left wing Ryan Thang was named the tournament MVP after scoring the game-winning goal in each of Notre Dame's victories.

HIGHS AND LOWS: Notre Dame's 44 shots in the Nov. 16 win over Western Michigan are a season high for the Irish. The 11 shots given up by Notre Dame on Nov. 17 are the fewest the Irish have given up this season. Notre Dame's 11 power-play chances against Western Michigan (Nov. 16) were also a season high.

HOME SWEET HOME: After nine home games this season, Notre Dame is 8-1-1 (.850) at the Joyce Center. A year ago, Notre Dame was 13-2-2 at home for an .824 winning percentage. That was the best mark since the 2003-04 season when the Irish were 14-2-2 at the Joyce Center for an .833 winning percentage. Only two other Irish teams have had better home records – 1987-88 team was 18-2-0 (.900) and the 1969-70 team was 12-1-1 (.893).

FRIENDLY CONFINES: Notre Dame has had five sellouts (2,713) in its first 10 home games and just missed a fifth against Bowling Green on Nov. 20 with a crowd of 2,711 in attendatnce. The previous two sellout crowds of 2,857 were the largest crowds to watch a Notre Dame hockey game since March 3, 1995 when 3,310 saw the Irish defeat Illinois-Chicago. Following that season, new seating was installed, reducing capacity at the Joyce Center. At the beginning of November, a new section of seating was added to the student section to increase the capacity. Through 10 games this year, the Irish are averaging 2,659 fans per game.

TAKE THE HIGHWAY: The Irish have had their share of success on the road over the last two seasons. This year, Notre Dame is 9-5-0 (.643) on the road. A year ago, the Irish were 12-4-1 (.735) away from the Joyce Center. The 12 road wins equaled a school record (1979-80 and 1997-98) for road wins. Only the 1983-84 team's 10-3-1 road mark (.750) is better.

WINNING AT MIAMI: Notre Dame's 2-1 win over the RedHawks on Nov. 9 snapped a six-game Irish winless streak (0-5-1) at Oxford, Ohio. The previous Irish win was on March 16, 2003 when they defeated Miami, 5-0, in game three of the first round of the CCHA playoffs to advance to Joe Louis Arena. The first win on Nov. 9 came in Notre Dame's first-ever appearance at Steve Cady Arena.

ON THE MARK: Senior center Mark Van Guilder recorded the second four-point game of his career on Nov. 1 against Lake Superior State. Van Guilder scored twice and set up two others in the game. His previous four-point night came at Bowling Green on Feb. 17, 2006 as a sophomore when he had three goals and an assist against the Falcons. The Notre Dame captain is second in goals (8) and leads the team in power-play goals (5) this season.

ROAD WARRIORS: Notre Dame's two wins on the road between Oct. 23 and Oct. 27 (at Bowling Green and Ferris State) gave the Irish seven-consecutive road wins, dating back to Jan. 19, 2007. The seven-consecutive road wins tied a program record that was set between Jan. 7 and Feb. 4, 1977. That seven-game streak also became part of the team's longest road unbeaten run as the Irish went 8-0-1 between Jan. 7 and Feb. 24 of that season. The streak was snapped on Oct. 28 in a 3-0 loss at Ferris State.

LONG TIME COMING: Notre Dame's 4-3 win over Denver on Oct. 18 snapped a 10-game (0-9-1) winless streak for the Irish against the Pioneers. The last time they had beaten Denver was Nov. 3, 1978, a 3-2 win at the Joyce Center. Notre Dame and Denver played in the WCHA for 10 years from 1971-81 before the Irish left for the CCHA. Prior to last weekend's series, the two teams had met just three times with Denver going 2-0-1.

BIG WIN: Notre Dame's win over Denver on Oct. 18 was the first this season for the Irish against a nationally-ranked team. A year ago, Notre Dame was 10-2-1 against ranked teams. The Pioneers were the highest-ranked team that

Notre Dame has beaten at the Joyce Center since beating fourth-ranked Michigan State, 4-1, on Nov. 17, 2006.

CCHA OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Senior center Mark Van Guilder was the CCHA offensive player of the week for the week ending Oct. 14. Van Guilder scored three goals in Notre Dame's two games at the Lefty McFadden Invitational. In the 4-1 loss to Wisconsin, Van Guilder scored a second-period, powerplay goal to tie the game at 1-1. In Saturday's 4-0 victory versus Mercyhurst, Van Guilder scored a pair of goals, including one on the power play and one for the game winner. In the game, he set a career high with 12 shots on goal.

CAPTAINS: Senior right wing Mark Van Guilder will serve as Notre Dame's captain for the 2007-08 season. Joining Van Guilder as alternate captains in '07-'08, are senior defensemen Brock Sheahan (Lethbridge, Alb.) and Dan VeNard (Vernon Hills, Ill.). They will be joined by junior forward Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.). This is the first season for all four players to serve as captains at Notre Dame.

MR PRESIDENT: Senior defenseman Dan Ve-Nard has been named president of Notre Dame's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) for the 2007-08 school year. VeNard served as hockey's representative to the group last season and was selected president by the group in M. The committee represents Notre Dame's student-athletes with the Irish athletic department.

SWEDISH CONNECTION: For the first time in the 40-year history of the Notre Dame hockey program, the Irish have two natives of Sweden on the roster. Freshmen **Robin Bergman** (Stockholm) and **Calle Ridderwall** (Stockholm) join the roster this season. Both played last year in the USHL; Bergman for Cedar Rapids and Ridderwall for Tri-City. Bergman had 26 goals and 17 assists for 43 points. His 17 power-play goals were second in the league. Ridderwall led Tri-City in scoring with 27 goals and 35 assists for 62 points. He had 14 power-play goals and seven game winners, the most in the league in that category. Bergman left the Irish on Jan. 14 to return to Cedar Rapids.

NHL DRAFTEES: The Irish have seven players on the 2007-08 roster who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Last June, a total of five Notre Dame players were selected. Leading the way was freshman defenseman Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.) who was a first-round selection of the St. Louis Blues who took him with the 18th pick overall. Cole became the first Irish player ever selected in the first round and was selected earlier than any other Notre Dame player (Rob Globke '04 was the previous highest selection when he was picked 40th overall by Florida in 2002). Cole was followed by fellow freshman defenseman Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.) who went in the second round, 46th overall to the Washington Capitals. Sophomore Ryan Thang (Edina, Minn.) was selected in the third round, 81st overall by the Nashville Predators. Incoming freshman Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.) joined Thang when the Predators made him the 114th pick (fourth round). Freshman goaltender Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.) rounded out the Notre Dame selections in the last draft when the Philadelphia Flyers selected him in the seventh round, 182nd overall. Those five join junior right wing Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.) who was selected in the seventh round, 211th overall by the Ottawa Senators in 2006 and sophomore defenseman Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.) who was selected in the 2005 NHL Draft by the Carolina Hurricanes in the seventh round, 198th overall. WORST TO FIRST: Just two seasons ago (2004-05), Notre Dame was 5-27-6 overall and finished last in the CCHA with a 3-20-5 record. In the CCHA's 35-year history, no team has ever gone from worst-to-first in one season. There have been three teams go from worst to first in a two-season span. They are:

1975-76 Bowling Green – Falcons finished last in 1973-74 in a three team conference and finished first in '75-'76 in a five-team league.

1992-93 Miami – RedHawks were last in 1990-91 with nine points in a nine-team conference. They finished first in 1992-93 with 49 points in a 12-team conference for a 40-point improvement over two seasons.

2006-07 Notre Dame – Irish were last in 2004-05 with 11 points in a 12-team conference. In '06-'07, the Irish took first place with 45 points for a 34-point improvement over two seasons.

FAMILY MATTERS: Two members of the Notre Dame hockey team – forwards Erik Condra and Garrett Regan (Hastings, Minn.) – have family ties to the Irish hockey program. Condra's uncle is All-American forward Kirt Bjork (*83) who played at Notre Dame from 1979-83. He scored 76 goals with 85 assists for 161 career points in 141 career games. He took All-America honors in 1983 when he had 29 goals and 34 assists for 63 points. Regan's uncle - Sean Regan - was a defenseman for the Irish from 1981-83 before finishing his career at the University of Minnesota.

MORE FAMILY MATTERS: Freshman goaltender Brad Phillips also has a family connection to Notre Dame. His uncle is former Irish quarterback Terry Andrysiak who played at Notre Dame from 1985 to 1988.

PUTTING ON THE FOIL: Notre Dame iunior Christian Hanson (Venetia, Pa.) is the sixth player to play for the Irish whose father played in the National Hockey League. His father, Dave Hanson, played 10 years of professional hockey between 1974-75 and 1983-84, including stints with the Detroit Red Wings and the Minnesota North Stars and the World Hockey Association's (WHA) Minnesota Fighting Saints and the New England Whalers. Fans might also be familiar with Dave Hanson, as one of the famed Hanson Brothers, made famous in the hockey movie - Slapshot. Hanson currently is the director of the Island Sports Center, home of Robert Morris University's hockey team, in suburban Pittsburgh.
