This is a comprehensive camp, covering all aspects of the game of baseball (including hitting, throwing, pitching, infield, outfield, catching and base-running). The camp coaching staff will feature the entire Fighting Irish coaching staff, as well as a number of collegiate and high school coaches from across the Midwest. The camp instruction will be held at Meyo Field inside the Loftus Athletic Center (indoor football field) and at Eck Baseball Stadium indoor hitting facility. The camp will be held on Saturday, December 8th, 2007. Ages 8-11 will run from 8am-11am and ages 12-14 from 12pm-3pm. Registration will be held at Eck Baseball Stadium inside the hitting facility.

HIGH SCHOOL SKILLS CAMP

Sat.-Sun., Jan. 13-14 (Ages 13-18)

GREAT OPPORTUNITY TO BE RECRUITED AND EVALUATED BY THE NOTRE DAME STAFF AND OTHER COLLEGE COACHES! The two-day camp will provide an opportunity for players ages 13-19 to learn and develop new skills under the direction of the University of Notre Dame coaching staff. The camp will feature 14 hours of professional instruction and evaluation by the Fighting Irish staff, as well as colleges coaches from around the Midwest. Instruction will include hitting, fielding, outfield play, pitching, catching and base-running. The camp instruction will be held at Meyo Field inside the Loftus Athletic Center (indoor football field) and Eck Baseball Stadium indoor hitting facility. The camp will be held on Saturday and Sunday, January 12-13,2008 and will run from 9-5 on Saturday and 9-4 on Sunday. Lunch is the responsibility of each camper.

FATHER / SON CAMP—"Practice With the Irish"

Saturday, Jan. 26, 2008 (Grades 1-8)

This is a comprehensive camp, covering all aspects of the game of baseball (including: hitting, fielding, pitching, catching, infield, outfield and base-running). Fathers and sons will participate in practicing the proper techniques that will aid them in their development. This is a hands-on clinic where you will learn the same drills currently used by the University of Notre Dame Baseball program. An outstanding camp for fathers, coaches or even moms who would like to be a part of a Notre Dame practice while interacting with the current Fighting Irish team. The current Fighting Irish team will be available for pictures and autographs. The camp will run from 4pm-7pm on Sat. Jan. 26th.



Head Coach - Dave Schrage

Dave Schrage was introduced July 18, 2006 by athletics director Kevin White as the 19th head coach in the history of the University of Notre Dame's baseball program. Schrage, who's 20 years as a college head coach (including 17 at the Division 1 level) has had coaching stops at the University of Evansville, Northern Illinois, Northern Iowa, Waldorf and as assistant at Creighton. Coach Schrage is one of just five coaches in the history of Missouri Valley Conference baseball who have been named MVC Coach of the Year three or more times, with only two-Wichita States' Gene Stephenson (11) and former Southern Illinois head coach "Itch" Jones (4) - receiving that honor more than Schrage.

Assistant Coach/Recruiting Coordinator -

Scott Lawler

Scott Lawler serves as Notre Dame's hitting coach as well as infield instructor. Coach Lawler has spent 7 years as a Division 1 assistant with stops at the University of Arkansas-Little Rock, the University of Evansville and Northern Illinois. Most recently Coach Lawler has spearheaded the effort to land the #4 ranked recruiting class in the country (Collegiate Baseball).

Assistant Coach/Pitching Coach - Sherard Clinkscates

Coach "Clink" serves as the Irish Pitching Coach. Clinkscates brings more than 14 years of professional baseball with him to Notre Dame. After being selected in the 1st Round of the 1992 MLB Draft, Coach Clinkscates spent 4 seasons playing in the Kansas City Royals and Chicago Cubs organizations. After retiring in 1995, Coach Clink spent 11 years as a MLB Scout. He worked for the Atlanta Braves as well as served as Assistant Scouting Director for the Tampa Bay Devil Rays.

Assistant Coach/Camp Director - Graham Sikes

Graham Sikes comes to The University of Notre Dame from James Madison University (VA). He most recently served as recruiting coordinator for the Dukes. Prior to Coach Sikes' time with JMU, he spent 2006 as recruiting coordinator at Young Harris College (GA). Sikes has also coached at Nicholls State University (LA) and Independence Community College (KS) as well as served as an associate scout for the Pittsburgh Pirates from 2005-2007.

GENERAL CAMP INFORMATION

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Each camper must bring his/her own baseball equipment. Players will need their own bat, glove, batting gloves and any other gear deemed necessary to participate. catchers must bring their own gear. campers are responsible for their own meals and lodging.

INSTRUCTION

The University of Notre Dame Winter Baseball camps provide an excellent opportunity for aspiring baseball players to be instructed by the University of Notre Dame Baseball staff. The Notre Dame coaching staff will be present throughout the camps, including Head Coach Dave Schrage. The camp instructional staff will also include collegiate and high school coaches from around the Midwest. Enrollment will be limited to allow for the best possible instruction and coach-to-camper ratio.

FACILITIES

The setting for the Notre Dame Baseball camps is the nationally renowned campus of the University of Notre Dame. located on the outskirts of South Bend, Indiana, 90 miles east of Chicago on the Indiana Toll Road. The camp will. be held in the Loftus Sports Center and the Indoor Hitting/Pitching Facility at Frank Eck Stadium. The Loftus Center provides campers the opportunity to receive instruction and participate in drill work on Meyo Field, a state-of-the-art 100-yard Prestige Turf field with end zones. The Indoor Hitting/Pitching facility at Frank Eck Stadium boasts four batting cares. including two clay pitching mounds. The facility is surfaced with artificial turf.



INSURANCE

Accidental death and dismemberment coverage is provided according to schedule with a maximum principal sum of \$1,000; medical expense coverage is provided with a maximum of \$50,000. Claims up to \$250 per claim are paid on the on-excess basis, meaning that family or employer group coverage must pay its maximum first.

This refers to medical expenses incurred because of injury sustained during scheduled and supervised camp/clinic activities. Hernias are not covered. The contracting of illness or disease by campers not covered under this plan. Payment for medication and/or hospitalization needed by camper as a result of the illness or disease is the responsibility of the camper and his/her parents. Any additional coverage desired will also be the responsibility of camper's parents.

CAMP COST

All prospective campers must submit the completed application form. Applications will be processed on a first-come, first served basis until the camp is filled. Acceptance of camper will be verified upon receipt of confirmation packet which will be distributed via e-mail. Application and Consent to Treatment must be completed and returned with full payment. There will be NO REFUNDS given.

CONFIRMATION PACKET

Each camper will receive a confirmation packet via email upon receipt of a completed application form, consent to treatment form and payment. The confirmation packet will include: camp registration information, a camp itinerary, equipment requirements, lodging and transportation suggestions, parking information and directions.
