BACK TO ACTION: The Notre Dame hockey team returns to action this weekend as the 2010-11 season heads into the home stretch. The Irish return from their bye to face the Bowling Green Falcons in a two-game series at the Joyce Center, Feb. 11-12. Friday's game has a 7:35 p.m. start time with Saturday's contest set to start at 7:05 p.m. Notre Dame enters February action with a 16-9-5 overall record and is 13-6-3-2 in the CCHA, good for 44 points and second place in the conference title race.

The Irish trail first-place Miami (45) by one point with two games in hand on the RedHawks. The Irish have six games left on the regular-season schedule with two this weekend versus Bowling Green, two at Ferris State (Feb. 18-19) and a home-and-home series with Western Michigan on Feb. 25-26. The Irish lead third-place Michigan (43) by one point, fourth-place Western Michigan (39) by five points and fifth-place Ferris State (38) by six in the race for a first-round bye in the CCHA playoffs. Bowling Green comes into the weekend with an 8-19-3 overall mark and the Falcons are 3-16-3-1 in conference play, good for 13 points in the league standings.

IRISH VERSUS FALCONS: Notre Dame and Bowling Green have met 93 times in the all-time series with the Irish holding a 49-36-8 advantage heading into this weekend's games. At the Joyce Center, Notre Dame is 27-12-5 all-time against the Falcons, including 9-0-1 in the last 10 meetings. The last time that Bowling Green won at the Joyce Center was Jan. 29, 2005, a 6-2 win over the Irish. The two teams met twice at Bowling Green this season on Nov. 5-6 with that series ending in a split. The Falcons won the opener, 3-2, and Notre Dame took the second game by a 6-3 verdict. In the last five meetings between the two schools, Bowling Green is 2-1-2 versus the Irish.

WHILE WE WERE AWAY: Notre Dame senior left wing Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm, Sweden) was named one of 10 finalists for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award that honors student athletes who excel both on and off the ice and have notable achievements in four areas of excel-



IN GOOD COMPANY: For the past two weeks, the Notre Dame hockey has been in good company with the Notre Dame men's and women's basketball teams. All three programs are ranked in the top 10 in the nation in their respective polls, making Notre Dame the only school in the country with a top 10 program in all three sports. With a 20-4 overall record, the Irish men's basketball team entered the week ranked eighth in the Associated Press poll and seventh in the ESPN/USA *Today* rankings. The Notre Dame women's team is 21-4 and ranked eighth in both the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today rankings. The week of Jan. 31 marked the first time since Dec. 9, 2002 that both basketball programs were ranked in the top 10 at the same time.

OFFENSIVE IRISH: Notre Dame continues to lead the nation in goals with 110 in the first 30 games of the season. The Irish lead Union (109), Miami (108) and North Dakota (106) going into this weekend's action. The Irish are ranked fifth in the nation in goals per game with 3.67 per contest. Yale currently leads the nation with 4.35 goals per game and is followed by Boston College and Merrimack with 3.81 per game. New Hampshire leads the Irish with 3.69 per contest.

CCHA ROOKIE OF THE WEEK: Freshman left wing Anders Lee (Edina, Minn.) was named CCHA rookie of the week for the second time this season following Notre Dame's series with Miami. For the weekend, Lee had two goals and three assists for five points and was +3 in the two games. In the Jan. 28, 5-5 tie, Lee had three assists on the night and helped the Irish rally from a 5-3 deficit in the third period by setting up goals by Riley Sheahan (So., St. Catharine's, Ont.) and T.J. Tynan (Fr., Orland Park, Ill.) to even the score. In the Jan. 29, 2-2 tie, Lee scored both Notre Dame goals for his third multiple-goal game of the season.

A LOOK BACK AT MIAMI:

Friday, Jan. 28 - Notre Dame rallied with two goals in the final 7:13 of the third period to tie Miami, 5-5, at the Joyce Center in front of a sellout crowd of 2,957. The RedHawks took the extra point in the CCHA standings as they won the shootout, 3-2, in four rounds. Freshmen T.J. Tynan and Anders Lee sparked the comeback with Tynan getting two goals and one assist and Lee three assists for three-point nights each. Riley Sheahan, Billy Maday (Jr., Burr Ridge, Ill.) and Jeff Costello (Fr., Milwaukee, Wis.) each had single goals for the Irish. Miami was led by senior center Andy Miele, the nation's leading scorer, who had a goal and three assists for a four-point night. Reilly Smith added two goals with Pat Cannone and Justin Vaive scoring single goals. The RedHawks were three-for-four on the power play in the contest. In the shootout, Notre Dame got goals from Ben Ryan (Sr., Brighton, Mich.) and Tynan while Miami matched those two with markers by Smith and Miele. Cannone ended the extra session in the fourth round with the shootout game winner against Irish goaltender Mike Johnson (So., Verona, Wis.). Notre Dame outshot Miami, 32-28, in the game. Connor Knapp had 27 saves for the RedHawks while Johnson had 23 for Notre Dame.

Saturday, Jan. 29 - Freshman Anders Lee scored both Notre Dame goals as the Irish battled Miami to a 2-2 overtime tie in the second game of the weekend series. T.J. Tynan scored the only goal of the shootout to give Notre Dame a 1-0 win for the extra point in the standings. Irish goaltender Steven Summerhays (Fr., Anchorage, Alaska) made 13 saves in regulation and in overtime before stopping three of the CCHA and the nation's top scorers -Andy Miele, Carter Camper and Reilly Smith - in the shootout. Lee scored the game's first goal at 11:08 of the first period to give the Irish an early advantage. Alden Hirschfeld tied the game at 11:11 of the second period for the RedHawks only to see Lee get his second of the night, this one on the power play to give Notre Dame a 2-1 lead after two periods. Smith would then get the equalizer at 13:50 of the third period on a Miami power play to tie the game at 2-2. The Irish out shot the RedHawks, 26-15, in the game. Cody Reichard had 24 saves for Miami.

FATHER'S DAY GIFTS ... When Notre Dame and Miami settled for 5-5 and 2-2 ties at the Joyce Center on Jan. 28-29, it marked the first time that the Irish had back-to-back ties in a weekend series since Nov. 6-7, 1987 when they battled Kent State to 5-5 and 6-6 ties.

EXTRAHOCKEY: Notre Dame's back-to-back ties with Miami on Jan. 28-29 were the fourth and fifth ties of the season for the Irish. That extended their unbeaten streak in overtime to 19 games as they are now 3-0-16 in games that have gone to overtime since their last overtime loss on March 21, 2008, a 2-1 overtime loss to Miami at the CCHA semifinals. Notre Dame is now 0-0-5 in overtime this season. During the '09-'10 season, the Irish were involved in nine overtime contests, finishing 1-0-8 in those games. The eight ties equaled a Notre Dame record set during the 1999-2000 season. All eight ties in '09-'10 went to a shootout where the Irish were 3-5 in those games. The lone overtime win came on Nov. 27, 2009 versus Bowling Green (2-1) and was the first for the Irish since Feb. 20, 2009 at Nebraska-Omaha, a 4-3 win.

HOBEY BAKER NOMINEE: Freshman center T.J. Tynan is one of 68 Division I college hockey players that have been nominated for the 2011 Hobey Baker Award. The first phase of the voting is now underway at hobeybakeraward.com. The fan voting phase will run through March 6. On March 17, the list of 10 finalists will be announced followed by the Hobey Hat Trick (3 finalists) on March 31. The winner of the award will be announced at the Frozen Four on April 8. Award criteria include candidates emulating the exceptional character traits exhibited by the award's namesake, Hobey Baker, a World War I flying star better known as America's greatest amateur athlete in his day. Award candidates must demonstrate strength of character both on and off the ice, contribute to the integrity of his team and display outstanding skills in all phases of the game. Consideration should be given to scholastic achievement and sportsmanship.

THE KIDS ARE ALRIGHT: Notre Dame's freshman class has played a key role in the 16-9-5 start for the Irish. In the first 30 games of this season, the freshman class has accounted for 60 of the team's 110 goals (54.5%), 87 of the 196 assists (43.9%) and 148 of team's 306 points this season (48.4%). Freshman goaltender Steven Summerhays (Anchorage, Alaska) has three of the team's 16 wins in goal.

JOIN THE CLUB: Senior center Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.) is on the verge of becoming the 46th player in the history of the Notre Dame hockey program to score 100 or more points in his career. Going into the series with Bowling Green, Ryan needs just five more points to reach the "Century Club" as he has 34 goals and 61 assists for 95 points in 145 career games. Following Ryan, senior Calle Ridderwall also has a shot at the 100-point mark. He has 52 goals and 33 assists for 85 points in 142 career games.

COMEBACK KID: Sophomore defenseman Sam Calabrese (Park Ridge, Ill.) has bounced back from a season he'd love to forget to become Notre Dame's top scorer from the blue line this year. As a freshman in 2009-10, Calabrese saw action in just three games all season, suffering a broken leg on Dec. 4, 2009 at Miami. This season, Calabrese has five goals (two short-handed) with nine assists for 14 points to lead all Irish defensemen in scoring. He also leads the team and the CCHA with a +21.

WARMING UP: After struggling through most of the season, Notre Dame's power play started to click prior to the bye week. In the four games prior to the break, the Irish had six power-play goals on 20 attempts for a 30.0% success rate. On the year, Notre Dame is now 25-for-147 with the man advantage for a 17.0% rate.

SHORT-HAND SUCCESS: Freshman left wing Anders Lee scored Notre Dame's 12th short-handed goal of the season in the Jan. 14, 2-1 win over Alaska. The 12 short-handed goals are tops in the nation with two teams - Boston College and Army - second with eight. With his goal, Lee became the ninth Notre Dame player to get a short-handed goal this season. Defensemen Joe Lavin (Sr., Shrewsbury, Mass.) and Sam Calabrese join T.J. Tynan with two each while Lee, Bryan Rust (Fr., Novi, Mich.), Riley Sheahan, Ryan Guentzel (Sr., Woodbury, Minn.), Billy Maday and Sean Lorenz (Jr., Littleton, Colo.) all have one each. The 12 short-handed goals are the most for the Irish since setting a school record with 19 during the 1981-82 season.

SHOOTOUT FACTS AND FIGURES: So far this season, the Irish have had three CCHA games go to the shootout and a fourth, the third-place game at the Shillelagh Tournament go to penalty shots. The Irish are 2-1 in the CCHA in the shootout and 3-1 on the year after winning the one against Boston University for third place in the Shillelagh Tournament. In the three seasons that the CCHA has had the shootout, the Irish are 7-6 all-time (3-0 in '08-'09; 2-5 in '09-'10 and 2-1 in '10-'11).

HOT IRISH: Three members of the Notre Dame hockey team carry scoring streaks into this weekend against Bowling Green. T.J. Tynan has a four-game streak with three goals and three assists for six points in those games. Anders Lee checks in with four goals and three assists for seven points in his three-game streak and Riley Sheahan has a goal and three assists for four points over his three-game point streak.

CAREER YEAR: Senior right wing Ryan Guentzel had the best game of his career with three goals and an assist in the win over Canisius (Dec. 29). He is currently third on the team in scoring with six goals and 24 assists for 30 points, all career highs. Earlier this season, Guentzel had a career-best, and a season high for the Irish, seven-game point streak (1g, 9a). His previous best season was 2008-09 when he had four goals and seven assists for 11 points. He is currently tied for eighth in the CCHA in scoring with 30 points and his 24 assists are third in the conference.

16th with 10 points. **David Gerths** (7g, 2a, 9 pts) is tied for 20th with his nine points.

ALL-JOYCE CENTER VOTING: Fans can vote for the All-Joyce Center Team at und.com to select the top players to play at the Joyce Center over the 43-year history of the building. Teams were selected to cover four decades - 1968-80, 1980-90, 1990-2000 and 2000-10. Those players then went on the ballot that includes eight goaltenders, 17 defensemen and 24 forwards Fan voting will select three goaltenders, six defensemen and nine forwards who will be named to the All-Joyce Center team that will be announced on Feb. 26 at the final regular-season home game versus Western Michigan.

THE PUCK STOPS HERE: Sophomore goaltender Mike Johnson has now appeared in 19 of Notre Dame's last 21 games, making 18 starts in that span that began on Nov. 12 versus Michigan. In his last seven CCHA starts, Johnson is 4-2-1 with a 2.49 goals-against average and a .914 save percentage, dating back to Jan. 7 at Northern Michigan. Johnson is 13-7-4 on the year with a 2.63 goals against average and a .902 save percentage. His 13 wins are a career high for the sophomore puck stopper. As a freshman, Johnson took CCHA all-rookie team honors, playing in 29 games in '09-'10, going 10-13-5 with a 2.60 goals-against average and a .910 save percentage. Behind Johnson are a pair of freshmen - Steven Summerhays and Joe Rogers (Marysville, Mich.). Summerhays is now 3-2-1 with a 3.55 goals-against average and a .829 save percentage. He made his first start in a month (since Dec. 29) when he faced Miami on Jan. 29 in a 2-2 tie. Summerhays made 13 saves, but in the shootout, stopped three of the nation's top scorers - Andy Miele, Carter Camper and Reilly Smith - to earn the Irish the extra point in the standings. The freshman goaltender owns wins over Canisius, Bowling Green and Western Michigan while his losses have been to Boston University (10/10) and Miami (12/4). Summerhays joined the Irish after playing the last two seasons with the USHL's Green Bay Gamblers. In '09-'10, Summerhays was a first team all-USHL selection and the USHL goaltender of the year after going 31-2-3 with a 2.17 goals-against average and a .914 save percentage. **Joe Rogers** made his first career appearance in the Canisius game, playing the final 20 minutes while stopping eight-of-nine shots. He is 0-0-0 with a 3.00 goals-against average and a .889 save percentage. Rogers joins the Notre Dame roster after playing last season in the North American Hockey League (NAHL) with the Albert Lea Thunder. Rogers was 13-19-2 with a 3.97 goals-against average and a .891 save percentage.

SHOOTING THE PUCK: Through the first 30 games of the season, Notre Dame has out shot the opposition in 23 of those games. The Irish are 14-6-3 when they out shoot their opponent. In games the opposition has the most shots, Notre Dame is 2-3-2. For the year, the Irish are averaging 32.8 shots per game while giving up 26.1 per contest.

ROAD SWEEP: Notre Dame's back-to-back road wins at Northern Michigan (Jan. 7-8) marked the first sweep for the Irish this season since Nov. 19-20, 2010 against Michigan State. The CCHA road sweep was the first for the Irish since winning twice at Nebraska-Omaha on Feb. 20-21, 2009, taking a 4-3 overtime win and a 1-0 victory over the Mavericks. Since that sweep, the Irish went 10 road series overall and nine CCHA road series, covering a year-and-a-half, without winning consecutive games on the road.

ROAD WARRIORS: Notre Dame's road win at Ohio State on Jan. 22 improved the Irish to 6-5-2 on the road this season. A year ago, Notre Dame was 3-10-4 away from the Joyce Center.

CAREER NIGHT: Sophomore center Riley Sheahan (St. Catharines, Ont.) had the best game of his Notre Dame career on Jan. 7 against Northern Michigan when he scored his first goal of the season (shg) and added three points for the first four-point game of his career. Sheahan now has two goals and 13 assists for 15 points in 26 games this season.

HCA ROOKIE OF THE MONTH: Notre Dame freshman left wing Anders Lee (Edina, Minn.) was selected as the Hockey Commissioners' Association national Rookie of the Month for December. The CCHA Rookie of the Month, Lee had two goals and six assists for eight points in five games during December to finish second to **T.J. Tynan** in scoring in the CCHA for the month. Lee had points in four of the five games, including three with two or more points. On Dec. 3, at Miami, he had a career-best three assists as he helped the Irish rally from a two-goal deficit to beat Miami, 5-4. The three-point game equaled a career-high for Lee who now has 18 goals and 15 assists for 33 points to rank second on the Irish in scoring and second to Tynan in the conference freshman scoring race.

LATE ADDITIONS: Center T.J. Tynan's fast start (18g, 21a) in the first 30 games has been a key to the 16-9-3 start for the Irish. The 5-8, 156-pound center has moved in to become one of the team's quarterbacks on the power play. The Orland Park, Ill., native wasn't even supposed to be on this year's team. Even though he signed a national letter-of-intent in Nov. of 2009, Tynan was going to defer and play another year with the Des Moines Buccaneers in the USHL where he was the Bucs' leading scorer in '09-'10 and a member of the USHL's all-rookie team. When Kyle Palmieri decided to sign with the Anaheim Ducks in early August, the call went out to Tynan and he joined the Irish roster. Freshman defenseman Kevin Lind (Homer Glen, Ill.) also signed a letter-of-intent in Nov. of '09 and was going to be playing this season with Tri-Cities in the USHL. He was asked to join the team in mid-August after Jarred Tinordi opted to play in the OHL. The 6-3, 221-pound Lind has played in 21 games and has seven points (one goal, six assists) with a +6 for the year.

THE SPECIALIST: Senior left wing Calle **Ridderwall** is third on the team in goals with 11 through the first 28 games this season and tied for the team lead with four power-play goals. His goal versus Canisius on Dec. 29th was the 50th of his Notre Dame career. With 11 goals this season, Ridderwall has now been in double figures in goals in each of the last three seasons for the Irish after getting 17 in 2008-09 and 19 last season in 2009-10. Over the last two-plus seasons, Ridderwall has scored 47 goals with 26 of them coming via the power play. Last season, his 11 power-play goals led the CCHA. Ridderwall had 11 power-play goals in '08-'09 to match last season's total and has two this year. His 26 power-play goals rank him sixth on Notre Dame's all-time power-play goal list. For his career, Ridderwall has 52 goals and 33 assists for 85 career points in 141 games. He has missed five of the last six games with a thigh contusion suffered on Jan. 8 at Northern Michgian but will return to the lineup this weekend against Bowling Green.

GOING ON THE OFFENSIVE: Two of Notre Dame's defensive, defensemen - Sam Calabrese and Sean Lorenz - have gone on the offensive this season, turning in career years. Calabrese, who saw action in just three games last season, leads Irish defensemen in scoring with five goals and nine assists for 14 points. Lorenz has four goals and six assists for 10 points, all career highs for the junior blueliner. The duo is 1-2 in the CCHA in plus-minus as Calabrese is +21 and Lorenz is +19 for the year.

TEN SPOT: Notre Dame's 10-goal out burst against Canisius on Dec. 29 marked the first time the Irish had 10 or more goals in a game since Oct. 14, 1995 when the Irish defeated St. Francis Xavier by a 10-2 score.

CCHA PLAYER OF THE MONTH: Notre Dame freshman standout T.J. Tynan has been selected as the CCHA's RBC Financial Group Player of the Month for December. The 5-8, 156-pound freshman center led all CCHA scorers in December in scoring as he had five goals and four assists for nine points in five games during the month. Tynan, who is the top rookie scorer in the nation, had points in four of the five games during the month and had three games with two or more points, including a career-best four-point game (2g, 2a) in a 10-2 win over Canisius on Dec. 29. Tynan currently leads Notre Dame in scoring with 18 goals and 21 assists for 39 points on the year. He was the CCHA rookie of the week for last week and was the conference's and the nation's rookie of the month for November. Tynan was an honorable mention selection for the HCA player of the month in December.

FUTURE IRISH: Notre Dame head coach Jeff Jackson announced in early December that five players had signed national letters-of-intent to play hockey at the University beginning for the 2011-12 season. The group includes three defensemen and two forwards. the defensemen are Eric Johnson (Verona, Wis.), Robbie Russo (Westmont, Ill.) and Andrew Ryan

(Brighton, Mich.). The forwards are Peter Schnedier (Vienna, Austria) and Garrett Peterson (Manhattan, Ill.). Peterson signed his letter-of-intent in Nov. of 2009 but returned to the USHL this season with the Lincoln Stars. In making the announcement, Jackson said, "We're very excited about this group of players. We think they have the potential to step in and play. What I like most about them is that they are all strong skaters that play with a little grit to their game." Two of the players - Russo and Ryan - play for USA Hockey's National Team Developmental Program. The other three are all currently playing in the United States Hockey League (USHL). Russo and Ryan are currently listed by the National Hockey League's Central Scouting in their preliminary ratings. For more information on the five players check the Notre Dame website at und.com

TYNAN HONORED: Notre Dame freshman center T.J. Tynan was named the Hockey Commissioners' Association rookie of the month for November to add to his honors this month after being named CCHA rookie of the month for the month of November. In eight games during November, Tynan led all CCHA rookies with six goals and six assists for 12 points. Two goals came on the power play, two were short-handed and one was a game winner. He was +5 for the month and took just 19 shots for a .316 shooting percentage. During November, Tynan scored in seven of the team's eight games with five of the contests being multiple-point games. He was named the CCHA rookie of the month on two occasions - for games the week of Nov. 1 and Nov. 8. Tynan is the second Irish player to take CCHA rookie of the month honors this season as teammate Anders Lee was October's winner.

TOUGH SCHEDULE: From Oct. 31 through Dec. 4, Notre Dame played nine of 11 games on the road, including a streak of eight straight games versus nationally ranked teams. The Īrish came through that streak with a 4-3-1 record. Starting on Nov. 12-13 the Irish faced #9/#8 Michigan in Ann Arbor, Mich where they split with the Wolverines. On Nov. 19-20, the Irish played host to rv/#17 Michigan State at the Jovce Center, taking two wins versus the Spartans. The weekend of Nov. 26-27 saw the Irish face #10/#9 North Dakota in Grand Forks where they had a loss and a tie. Against #6/#6 Miami Dec. 3-4, the Irish again had a split to give them a 4-3-1 record in the eight games against ranked teams.

GOING TO THE GOAL: Freshman center-David Gerths (Ankeny, Iowa) has become a specialist when it comes to scoring those "dirty" goals. The 6-0, 208-pounder does his best work right in front of the goal. He picked up his seventh of the season at Ohio State on Jan. 22, scoring on a rebound from his knees in front of the goal, poking the puck between Buckeye goaltender Cal Heeter's pads to make it a 4-1 game. In 29 games this season, he has scored seven goals with two assists for nine points. In 55 games last season in the USHL with Lincoln and Green Bay, Gerths scored just five goals. His seven goals are tied for fourth most for Notre Dame this season.

NOSE FOR THE NET: Freshman left wing Jeff Costello (Milwaukee, Wis.) is tied for the team lead in power-play goals with five this season. In 30 games this year, Costello has seven goals and three assists for 10 points.

CAREER NIGHTS: Two members of Notre Dame's freshman class set career highs in the win over Miami on Dec. 3. Right wing Bryan Rust set career highs for goals (2) and points in a game (3) with his three-point night. Left wing Anders Lee had a career high with three assists in the contest and equaled a career high with three points in the game.

ANOTHER MILESTONE: Notre Dame's Oct. 30, 3-2 win over Western Michigan was the 200th CCHA win for Irish coach Jeff Jackson. Now in his 12th season at the Division I level, Jackson is 210-86-47 in his career in CCHA play in six seasons at Lake Superior State (1990-96) and six seasons at Notre Dame. Earlier in October (Oct. 14 vs. Lake Superior State), Jackson won his 300th career game as a Division I coach. His all-time record stands at 314-126-52 for a .691 winning percentage. His winning percentage is the tops among active coaches with 10 or more seasons.

PENALTY SHOTS: Senior center Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.) was awarded a penalty shot just 22 seconds into the Nov. 20 game with Michigan State and was stopped by goaltender Will Yanakeff. It was the first penalty shot by a Notre Dame player since Jan. 31, 2009 when Ryan Thang '10, scored in a 3-2 win at Michigan. It was the fourth for the Irish since the 2001-02 season. They are 2-for-4 in that span. The last time the opposition had a penalty shot against teh Irish came on Dec. 4, 2009 when Miami's Carter Camper was stopped by Mike Johnson.

GOT THEIR NUMBER: From 1992-93 through the 2007-08 season, Notre Dame struggled when it came to facing Michigan State. In that time span, the Irish were just 5-32-7 versus the Spartans. Since March 29, 2008, a span of 10 games, Notre Dame is 7-0-3 against Michigan State, including a 5-0-1 mark at the Joyce Center.

FULL HOUSE: With two sellout crowds of 2,957 at the Joyce Center versus Miami (Jan. 28-29), the Irish have now sold out 11 of their 13 home games this season with only the series against Northern Michigan (Dec. 11-12) having empty seats. They were able to start a new streak on Dec. 29 when a sellout crowd of 2,857 saw the Irish beat Canisius, 10-2. Notre Dame has now had sell outs in 25 of the team's last 31 home games and last year averaged 2,765 fans per game. Since Dec. 13, 2008, the Irish have recorded sellouts in 34 of their last 40 home games. A sellout at the Joyce Center is 2,713 with 2,857 capacity with standing room. Twice during the '09-'10 season - Jan. 15 vs. Michigan State and Jan. 29 against Nebraska-Omaha - 3,007 fans jammed into the Joyce Center. Prior to that number, the largest crowd to see an Irish hockey game was 3,310 on March of 1995 when Notre Dame play Illinois-Chicago. The following season, new seating was installed and capacity was reconfigured.

IRISH WINS VERSUS NO. 1: Notre Dame's win over No. 1 ranked Boston College on Oct. 23 marked the 12th time in the program's history that the Irish have defeated the nation's top team. Prior to Oct. 23, 2010, the last time came on April 10, 2008 in the NCAA semifinals versus No. 1 Michigan. A year ago, the Irish played twice versus the No. 1 team in the nation - Miami University - and lost both games on Dec. 4-5. Notre Dame has defeated Boston College when the Eagles were ranked No. 1 four times since the 2003-04 season. Here's a list of previous Irish wins versus top-ranked teams.

HOMETOWN HERO: Freshman defenseman Jared Beers (Mishawaka, Ind.) has worked his way into the Notre Dame lineup and doesn't seem to want to come out. In 15 games this season, Beers has five assists for five points and is even for the year. He picked up his first career points on Nov. 6 versus Bowling Green with a two-point night. Beers joins Mike McNeill '84-'88 (South Bend), Tommy Smith '88-89 (South Bend) and Carey Nemeth'93-'94 (Granger) as local players to play for the Irish. Beers played two seasons at Culver Academy and then saw action in the NAHL with the Kenai River Brown Bears (2008-09) and the Cedar Rapids Rough Riders in the USHL in 2009-10.

POWER LESS: In the Nov. 12 game at Michigan, a 3-1 Irish win, Notre Dame did not have one power-play chance in the game. That marked the first time in seven seasons - since March 5, 2004 - a span of 258 games - that the Irish did not have a power-play opportunity in a game. In the weekend series at Michigan, the Irish did not get their first power-play on the weekend until there was 6:09 left in the third period, a span of 113:51 over the two games without a power play. In the final six minutes of Saturday's game, the Irish did get three straight power plays.

FAST START: Notre Dame freshman left wing Anders Lee knows how to get his career off to a fast start. The 6-3, 218-pounder scored a goal on his first shot in the 6-3 win over Holy Cross (Oct. 8), just 1:58 into the first period. He went on to record two more goals for a hat trick in his first-ever collegiate game. Lee then added an assist in the 5-4 loss to Boston University in the championship game of the Warrior Ice Breaker Tournament. For his efforts, Anders Lee was named the CCHA rookie of the week for the week ending Oct. 10. He joins John Noble '73 as the only other freshman to score three goals in his first game as Noble did the trick on Nov. 15, 1969 in an 8-3 win over Windsor. He joins recent Irish players - Billy Maday, Christiaan Minella '10 and Tim Wallace '06 - as freshmen who scored on their first shot on goal. Lee added a goal and an assist in the Oct. 15 win over Lake Superior State and through the first 17 games of the season, he leads the team with nine goals, is tied for the top spot with three power-play goals and is fourth in points with 15 (9g, 6a). He was named the CCHA rookie of the month for October.

CAPTAINS: Four members of the Irish senior class will serve as captains for the 2010-11 season. Defenseman Joe Lavin (Shrewsbury, Mass.) will wear the "C" for Jeff Jackson's squad this year. His three assistant captains will be Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm, Sweden), Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.) and Ryan Guentzel (Woodbury, Minn.). For all four players, this is their first time as captains at Notre Dame.

LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD: Senior left wing Calle Ridderwall is one of 20 Division I hockey players to be selected as a candidate for the 2010-11 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. The award is presented annually to an NCAA Division I student-athlete in 10 sports based on achievement's in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition. CLASS is an acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staving in School and the award focuses and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. This is the fifth year that Lowe's has sponsored an award for hockey. In 2006-07, former Irish goaltender David Brown `07 won the Senior CLASS Award while in 2007-08, Mark Van Guilder '08 and in 2008-09, Jordan Pearce '09 and Erik Condra '09 were among the top 10 finalists. Team captain Ryan Thang `10 was the team's nominee last season.

HOME OPENERS: Notre Dame's home opener on Thursday, Oct. 14, a 4-2 win over Lake Superior State, gives Notre Dame an all-time

record of 24-18-1 in home openers at the Joyce Center. With the win on Oct. 8 against Holy Cross, Notre Dame is now 21-20-2 in season-opening games.

FAMILY GUYS: Three members of the Notre Dame hockey team - sophomore forwards Kevin Nugent (New Canaan, Conn.) and Riley Sheahan (St. Catharine's, Ont.) and freshman goaltender Joe Rogers (Marysville, **Mich.)** – have family ties to the Irish hockey program. Nugent's father, Kevin Nugent, Sr. '78 was a member of the Notre Dame hockey team from 1974-78. During his career he played in 131 games, scoring 54 goals with 75 assists for 129 career points. His son becomes the second Irish player to follow his father to Notre Dame. He joins Rory Walsh '06 who followed his father, Brian Walsh '77 who was a teammate of Nugent, Sr. Sheahan is a second cousin of former Irish defenseman Brock Sheahan '08 who played for the Irish from 2004-08. Rogers is a cousin of former Notre Dame defenseman Tony **Bonadio '83** is a Port Huron, Mich... native. Bonadio played in 79 games between 1980-83, scoring one goal with nine assists for 10 points.

NHL DRAFTEES: The Irish have 10 players on the 2010-11 roster who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Leading the way is sophomore Riley Sheahan (St. Catharine's, Ont.) who became Notre Dame's third-ever, first-round pick last June when he was chosen 21st overall by the Detroit Red Wings. He joins former defenseman Ian Cole (2007 - St. Louis) who was selected 18th overall and former right wing Kyle Palmieri (2009 - Anaheim), the 26th pick overall. Sheahan was followed by freshman defenseman Stephen Johns (Wampum, Pa.), who went in the second round, 60th overall to the Chicago Black Hawks. One round later in the third round, with the 80th overall pick, freshman forward Bryan Rust (Novi, **Mich.)** was chosen by the Pittsburgh Penguins. Notre Dame's final player selected in 2010 was defenseman Kevin Lind (Homer Glen, Ill.), who was picked in the sixth round, 177th overall by the Anaheim Ducks. Two other Irish freshman were selected in the 2009 draft. Left wing Jeff

Costello (Milwaukee, Wis.) was chosen by the Ottawa Senators in the fifth round, 146th overall and six picks later, center Anders Lee (Edina, Minn.) was a New York Islanders' choice in the sixth round, 152nd overall. The new group of draftees join sophomore left wing Nick Larson (Apple Valley, Minn.), a 2008 selection of the Calgary Flames in the fourth round, 108th overall; junior defenseman Sean Lorenz (Littleton, Colo.), a member of the 2008 draft class, by the Minnesota Wild in the fourth round, 115th

overall and seniors **Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.)** and **Joe Lavin (Shrewsbury, Mass.)**. Ryan was picked in the 2007 entry draft by Nashville in the fourth round with the 114th pick and Lavin was a Chicago Black Hawks choice in the fifth round, 126th overall

NEW HOME FOR THE IRISH: Construction on Notre Dame's new, on-campus ice facility - The Compton Family Center - began in March of 2010 and is on pace to be finished for the Notre Dame hockey team to begin play there during the 2011-12 campaign.

On Sept. 11, 2010, a project blessing ceremony for the \$50-million facility was held with many of the key benefactors in attendance. At the ceremony, Notre Dame director of athletics, **Jack Swarbrick**, announced that the building would be named the Compton Family Center in honor of the generous donation from Kevin and Gayla Compton and their family. The Comptons are part of the ownership group of the National Hockey League's San Jose Sharks.

Rev. John I. Jenkins, C.S.C., Notre Dame's President began the ceremony with a blessing of the site and offering of a prayer for the safety of those working on the project.

Irish head coach **Jeff Jackson** followed by talking about the original plans and how those plans changed to become the Compton Family Center.

"When I first came here, we were talking about a renovation in the Joyce Center," said Jackson, now in his sixth season behind the Notre Dame bench.

"With Jack's (Swarbrick) foresight and Tom [Nevala] and everyone involved in pushing for this to happen, waiting an additional year to have a new facility is something that is going to have a tremendous impact on the future of our program, and we're very proud of that."

Jackson also thanked the benefactors in attendance for their generosity towards the project.

Notre Dame's head coach was followed by Irish junior **Billy Maday (Burr Ridge, III.)** who spoke for his teammates to the benefactors in attendance.

Swarbrick spoke last at the ceremony, and touched upon how important the Compton Family Center will be for the Michiana community.

"There's a limit to how much the community can use our dormitories and our classrooms and our laboratories, but the athletic facilities can be a special point of contact," Swarbrick said.

"I hope we win national championships with teams that train here and I hope we build new programs for our athletes and our students. But the ultimate success of this facility will be if we inspire a young boy or a young girl from the community to shoot higher, if we challenge them to be better people because they spend time on our campus. Then we've realized the potential of athletics at Notre Dame."

The original announcement for the new building was made on Feb. 12, 2009 by Notre Dame executive vice-president John Affleck-Graves and Swarbrick after the University's Board of Trustees approved the plan.

The Compton Family Center will house both the Charles "Lefty" Smith rink, within the new 5,000-person capacity, home of the Irish hockey team and a second sheet of ice (Olympic-sized) with limited seating availability. The majority of the general public arena seating will be of the chair-back variety.

The Compton Family Center also will include offices for the Notre Dame coaching staff, a state-of-the art locker room suite that includes both wet and dry locker rooms, meeting rooms, a sports medicine area that includes hot and cold hydrotherapy, cardio and weight rooms, a players' lounge, equipment areas, video operations and a multi-purpose room that will be the location for weekly team Mass and serve as a study lounge and dining area.

The arena also will feature a balcony level with a 200-seat, Irish pub-themed club, multiple concession areas on both levels, spacious restrooms and a merchandise shop.

The Compton Family Center also will serve the Notre Dame and South Bend community as a place for the Irish Youth Hockey League (IYHL) and local figure skating groups to flourish. On campus it will become the home of club and interhall hockey, the figure skating club and intramural broomball, curling and physical education classes

Multiple locker rooms also will be available for campus and community use of the facility.

Design and construction of the Compton Family Center are under the auspices of the Southfield, Mich., office of Barton Malow, a national design and construction services firm and their project partner Rossetti Architects, also of Southfield, Mich.

LEFTY'S RINK: When Notre Dame's new ice hockey arena is built the new ice hockey rink will be named the Charles W. "Lefty" Smith, Jr., Rink, in honor of the first coach in the program's history, **Charles "Lefty" Smith**. The announcement was made in April of 2008 at the team's annual awards banquet.

The plans for naming the new ice surface in honor of Smith were made possible by the generosity of the John and Mary Jo Boler family of Inverness, Ill., and Sanibel Island, Fla., their daughter Jill Boler McCormack '84 and her husband, Dan; and their son Matthew Boler '88 and his wife, Christine. They were joined by the family of Frank '57 and Mary Beth O'Brien of Albany, N.Y., who have six children who all graduated from Notre Dame. Their late son, Frankie, played both lacrosse and hockey for the Irish from 1984-88.

Smith came to Notre Dame in 1968 to start the varsity hockey program and coached the Irish for 19 years, retiring in 1987 with 307 career victories. Under his tutelage, Notre Dame produced six All-Americans but most importantly, all 126 student-athletes who played for him completed their collegiate eligibility and earned college degrees.

Smith, who continues to work as the director of the Loftus Sports Center on campus, served two years as the president of the American Hockey Coaches Association. He was inducted into the Minnesota Hockey Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 1992. He played an integral in bringing the International Special Olympics to Notre Dame in 1987.

Married for 57 years, Lefty, who lost his wife, Mickey on Nov. 9, 2009, is the father of seven living children, 16 grandchildren and two great grandchildren.
