No. 7/7 Notre Dame Plays Final Home Series Of 2007 Versus Nebraska-Omaha Mavericks

- Irish coming off Rensselaer Holiday Tournament championship.

MAVERICK INVASION: Notre Dame returns home for its final home series of the 2007 portion of the schedule when the Irish play host to the Nebraska-Omaha Mavericks on Fri., Nov. 30 and Sat., Dec. 1 at the Joyce Center. Friday's game has a 7:35 p.m. start while Saturday's game will begin at 7:05 p.m. The Irish will next be home on Sunday, Jan. 13 against Michigan State. Notre

Dame brings a five-game winning streak into the series, having won all five games over a nine-day span between Nov. 16 and Nov. 24. The Irish have also won four straight games at the Joyce Center. With a record of 12-4-0 overall and 8-2-0 in the CCHA, Notre Dame is currently ranked seventh in both the USA Today/American Hockey Magazine and the USCHO.com/CSTV polls. The Irish are coming off their first-ever tournament win (in three tries) at the Rensselaer Holiday Tournament last weekend where they defeated Alabama-Huntsville (4-1) and Rensselaer (4-3) in the title game. Nebraska-Omaha is now 5-5-1 on the year and 4-5-1 in conference play. After starting the season with a 1-4-0 mark, the Mavericks are currently 4-1-1 over their last six games. Last weekend, the Mavs beat Alaska, 4-3, in the series opener and then tied the Nanooks, 4-4, in Saturday's contest.

IRISH VERSUS MAVERICKS: The two teams have met 23 times in the all-time series with Notre Dame holding a 10-9-4 edge in the games played. At the Joyce Center, the series is even at 4-4-2. Last year, the teams met four times with Notre Dame having a 2-1-1 edge. At the Joyce Center, the Irish were 1-0-1 in a pair of February games. The last time UNO won in South Bend was Feb. 5, 2005, a 6-3 Maverick win.

TWO-TIMER: Defenseman Kyle Lawson (So., New Hudson, Mich.) has been named the CCHA defenseman of the week for the second consecutive week. Lawson, who helped the Irish to three wins in the week, had one goal and three assists for four points and was +2. In the Nov. 20, 2-1 win over Bowling Green, Lawson was

NOVEMBER NUMBERS: Notre Dame enters the final game of November on Friday night against Nebraska-Omaha with an 8-1-0 record during the month. The lone loss came to No. 1 ranked Miami on Nov. 10 by a 3-1 margin. In the eight wins, the Irish have outscored the opposition by a 32-12 margin. The last time a Notre Dame hockey team won eight games in a single month came in Jan. of 1988 when that team went 8-0-0. In Nov. of 1983, the Irish were 9-0-0 to open the season.

RENSSELAER HOLIDAY WRAP-UP: Notre Dame participated in the R.P.I Holiday Tournament for the third time in the program's history and got its first tournament victory. The Irish defeated Alabama-Huntsville, 4-1, in the opening game and then had to rally from a three-goal deficit to defeat Rensselaer, 4-3, in the championship game. Against UAH, the game was scoreless until the 17:36 mark of the second period when Ian Cole (Fr., Ann Arbor, Mich.) scored his first of the season to give Notre Dame a 1-0 lead. In the third period, the lead would go to 3-0 in favor of the Irish as Ryan Thang and Ben Ryan (Fr., Brighton, Mich.) scored in a 2:06 span at 2:13 and 4:19 to give Notre Dame the 3-0 goal lead. Freshman goaltender Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.) lost his shutout bid at 4:50 when Joe Federoff scored for the Chargers. Kevin Deeth (So., Gig Harbor, Wash.) snapped a 14-game goal-less drought at 14:47 of the third period with a power-play goal for the 4-1 final. Notre Dame out shot Alabama-Huntsville, 41-14 in the game. Phillips got his second win of the year, making 13 saves.

In the championship game against Rensselaer, the Irish surrendered first-period goals to Chase Polacek and Tyler Helfrich (ppg) for a 2-0 lead in favor of the Engineers. That lead would go to 3-0 when Jonathan Ornelas added a power-play goal in the second period at 5:30, putting Notre Dame down 3-0. The Irish began their comeback at 8:16 of the middle period when Deeth scored his second power-play goal in as many games to cut the lead to 3-1. Justin White (Jr., Traverse City, Mich.) converted an RPI turnover at 9:20, drilling a shot past goaltender Jordan Alford to make it 3-2. În the third period, defenseman Dan VeNard (Sr., Vernon Hills, Ill.) scored on a nice rush for a power-play goal to tie the game at 3-3. Thang then closed out the scoring with a goal at 16:04, for his second game winner of the weekend. Defensman Kyle Lawson set the play in motion, carrying the puck behind the net before centering it to Thang. Notre Dame out shot R.P.I., 33-18 in the game, holding the Engineers to just seven shots over the final two periods. Jordan Pearce (Jr., Anchorage, Alaska) made 15 saves for the Irish while Alford had 29 in the R.P.I. net.

TOURNAMENT HARDWARE: Three Notre Dame players were named to the all-tournament team at the Rensselaer Holiday Tournament. Junior right wing Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.) recorded three assists on the weekend and was the lone Irish forward selected. Defensemen Brett Blatchford (So., Temperance, Mich.) and Ian Cole joined Condra on the team. Sophomore left wing Ryan Thang was named the tournament MVP after scoring the game-winning goal in each of Notre Dame's victories.

**BOWLING GREEN RECAP: Jordan Pearce** made 27 saves and got goals from Ben Rvan and defenseman Kyle Lawson in a 2-1 win over the Bowling Green Falcons Tuesday night at the Joyce Center. Derek Whitmore scored the lone goal for Bowling Green. Ryan gave Notre Dame a 1-0 lead at 6:29 of the first period with his third goal of the season. Whitmore tied the game at 9:15 with his 12th goal of the season and the teams went to the first intermission tied 1-1. In the second, the Irish took the lead for good at 2:05 when Lawson scored from the slot for his third goal of the season. Pearce made the one-goal lead stand up, stopping all 14 shots he faced over the final two periods. Bowling Green out shot Notre Dame, 28-24 in the game. Nick Eno made 22 saves for the Falcons. BG was 0-for-5 on the power play while the Irish were 0-for-4.

FIVE-IN-NINE: The Rensselaer Holiday Tournament closed out a stretch of five games in nine days for Notre Dame. In the nine-day period (Nov. 16-Nov. 24) the Irish won all five games, defeating Western Michigan, 4-1 and 5-1, in a home-and-home series on Nov. 16-17, before defeating Bowling Green on Nov. 20, 2-1 at the Joyce Center. That was followed by the two wins at the R.P.I. Tournament. This was the second time this season that the Irish played five games in nine days. The first time occured beween Oct. 18-27, with Notre Dame going 3-2-0 in that span.

**TOURNEY RESULTS:** With the victory at the R.P.I. Tournament, the Irish have now appeared in 29 in-season tournaments, winning six times, finishing second, six times with sixth third-place finishes and 11 fourth spots. Notre Dame has now won two of the last three in-season tournaments that the Irish have played in, winning the 2006 Lightning Collegiate Hockey Classic in Oct. of 2006 in Tampa, Fla. All time, the Irish are 22-33-3 in tournament play.

**CENTURY CLUB:** Notre Dame's "Century Club" added its newest member last weekend with junior **Erik Condra** picking up his 100th career point in the 4-3 win over Rensselaer on Nov. 24. In 94 career games, Condra now has 26 goals and 74 assists for 100 career points in 94 games. Here's who is ahead of Condra.

HOT HAND: During November's hot streak, goaltender Jordan Pearce has played a major role in the team's success. Pearce has played in seven games with a 6-1-0 record, a 1.86 goals-against average and a .914 save percentage. For the year, Pearce is 10-4-0 with a 2.01 goals-against average and a .915 save percentage with one shutout. His 834:54 minutes played is second in the nation, less than seven minutes behind national leader Billy Sauer of Michigan (841:24). Prior to this season, Pearce had played in 12 career games with 621:56 minutes.

**CLUTCH SCORER:** Sophomore left wing **Ryan Thang** leads Notre Dame with nine goals on the season. Of those nine, four have come on the power play and three are game winners. In 58 career games, Thang has now scored 29 goals with 14 coming on the power play and nine of them game winners. His nine game-winning goals already tie him for ninth on the all-time game-winning goals list at Notre Dame.

GOOD NEWS AND BAD NEWS: Through 16 games this season, the Irish have good news and bad news to report. In Notre Dame's 12 victories, the Irish have scored 47 goals for a 3.92 average. In the four losses, Notre Dame has scored just three goals for a 0.75 goals-per game mark. In the 12 wins, the Irish have given up just 19 goals (1.58 goals-against average) while in the four losses, they have given up 13 goals (3.25 goals against).

**DYNAMIC DUO:** Notre Dame's defensive duo of **Brock Sheahan (Sr., Lethbridge, Alb.)** and **Teddy Ruth (Fr., Naperville, Ill.)** have proven to be one of the CCHA's top defensive pairs through the first 16 games of the season. Both Irish defensive stalwarts are +8 for the season, meaning they have been on the ice for eight more goals scored by Notre Dame than the Irish have given up at even strength. That ties them for eighth in the CCHA.

**TICKLING THE TWINE:** Sophomore center **Kevin Deeth** snapped a 14-game goal-less streak with power-play goals in each of Notre Dame's wins in the R.P.I. Tournament. Deeth is now tied for fifth on the team in scoring with two goals and eight assists for 10 points. As a freshman, Deeth had 17 goals and 22 assists for 39 points a year ago.

**THE SNIPER:** Notre Dame defenseman **Dan VeNard** continues to contribute to the Irish offense. He scored his third goal of the season in Notre Dame's 4-3 win over R.P.I., this one on the power play. In his senior season, VeNard has picked up his first game winner and first powerplay tallies. In has already doubled his career goal-scoring output as he now has five goals and six assists in 87 career games.

**IRON MAN:** Senior center **Mark Van Guilder (Roseville, Minn.)** has his sights set on Notre Dame's all-time record for most consecutive games played. The record of 153 straight games was set by **Tim Wallace '06** who played in every game of his career – 153 straight. Van Guilder has now played in every game of his career - 132 consecutive games played through the first 16 games this year.

STINGY DEFENSE: Notre Dame surrendered just two goals in the weekend series against Western Michigan. In the two games, the Irish out shot the Broncos by a 76-23 margin. In Friday's game, Notre Dame gave up just 12 shots and followed that by giving up just 11 in Saturday's game. The 11 shots are the fewest given up by the Irish this season as were the two shots given up in the third period of the Nov. 17 game.

**KILLING PENALTIES:** Rensselaer scored a five-on-three power-play goal on Nov. 24 to snap a streak of 18 consecutive penalties killed by the Irish. Over the last five games, Notre Dame has killed 21-of-22 opponent power plays for a 95.5% success rate. For the season, the Irish are second in the CCHA and third in the nation in penalty killing. Notre Dame has surrendered just five power-play goals on 76 chances this season for a 93.4% penalty killing rate.

HIGHS AND LOWS: Notre Dame's 44 shots in the Nov. 16 win over Western Michigan are a season high for the Irish. The 11 shots given up by Notre Dame in Saturday's game (Nov. 17) are the fewest the Irish have given up this season. Notre Dame's 11 power-play chances on Friday night were also a season high.

CONDRA CAPERS: Right wing Erik Condra now has a five-game point-scoring streak that started on Nov. 16. Condra has two goals and six assists for eight points during the five-game run. He now has four multiple-point games this season. On Nov. 1, he recorded the second, five-point game of his career in the 7-3 win over Lake Superior. Condra scored twice and added three assists for five points on the night. His previous five-point game came on Jan. 5, 2007 at Robert Morris when he had a goal and four assists. Condra currently leads the Irish in scoring with six goals and 12 assists for 18 points in the first 16 games of the season.

**VERSUS THE BEST:** Notre Dame's 2-1 win over Miami on Nov. 9 marked the 10th time in the program's history that the Irish knocked off a top-ranked team. In fact, the last four times that Notre Dame has faced a No.1 team, the Irish have come away with the victory. Here's a list of Irish wins over No. 1 ranked teams in the 40-year history of the program.

WINNING AT MIAMI: Notre Dame's 2-1 win over the RedHawks on Nov. 9 snapped a six-game Irish winless streak (0-5-1) at Oxford, Ohio. The previous Irish win was on March 16, 2003 when they defeated Miami, 5-0, in game three of the first round of the CCHA playoffs to advance to Joe Louis Arena. Last Friday's win came in Notre Dame's first-ever appearance at Steve Cady Arena.

SENIOR CLASS HONORS: Notre Dame team captain Mark Van Guilder (Sr., Roseville, Minn.) has been nominated for the Lowes Senior CLASS (Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School) Award. The CLASS award was designed to honor the attributes of seniors who remain committed to their university and elects to pursue the many rewards that a senior season can bring. This award provides a fitting honor for a senior leader that has stood up to the challenge. In the end, the award hopes to recognize the prestige and dignity of being a senior hockey player at the college level. Former Irish goaltender David Brown '07 won the Lowes Senior CLASS award following the 2006-07 season.

**POWER ON:** With two power-play goals in the win over Rensselaer, Notre Dame has now scored two or more power-play goals in a game six times this season. The Irish have at least one power-play goal in 11 of the team's 16 games this season. For the year, Notre Dame is 18-for-96 with the power play for an 18.8% success rate.

**THE KISSEL EFFECT:** Sophomore left wing **Dan Kissel (Crestwood, Ill.)** collected his first goal of the season in the 2-1 win at Miami. The goal also proved to be the game winner. He added his second goal in the 5-1 win at Western Michigan. In Kissel's career, he has now played in 35 career games and has scored eight goals. Of his eight goals, four have been game winners. Last season, three of his six goals were winning goals.

**STRONG SCHEDULE:** Through the first 16 games of the season, Notre Dame has played five games versus nationally ranked teams. The Irish opened the year dropping a 4-1 decision to #14/#15 Wisconsin. They then split a series in South Bend with #5/#5 Denver, winning, 4-3 and losing, 3-1. On Nov. 9-10, Notre Dame split with #1/#1 Miami with a 2-1 win on Friday and a 3-1 loss on Saturday. The Irish are 2-3-0 against ranked teams this season.

FRIENDLY CONFINES: Notre Dame has had three sellouts (2,713) in its first six home games and just missed a fourth against Bowling Green on Nov. 20 with a crowd of 2,711 in attendatnce. The previous two sellout crowds of 2,857 were the largest crowds to watch a Notre Dame hockey game since March 3, 1995 when 3,310 saw the Irish defeat Illinois-Chicago. Following that season, new seating was installed, reducing capacity at the Joyce Center. At the beginning of November, a new section of seating was added to the student section to increase the capacity. Through six games this year, the Irish are averaging 2,620 fans per game.

ON THE MARK: Senior center Mark Van Guilder recorded the second four-point game of his career on Nov. 1 against Lake Superior State. Van Guilder scored twice and set up two others in the game. His previous four-point night came at Bowling Green on Feb. 17, 2006 as a sophomore when he had three goals and an assist against the Falcons. The Notre Dame captain is second in goals (7) and leads the team in power-play goals (5) this season.

RANKINGS UPDATE: Notre Dame opened the 2007-08 season ranked eighth in the nation by both the USA Today/American Hockey Magazine and USCHO.com/CSTV polls. The Irish finished the 2006-07 season ranked fourth in the final USA Today/American Hockey Magazine poll that included the NCAA tournament. The Irish finished the year first in the USCHO.com/CSTV polls that ended with the end of the CCHA Tournament. In all, Notre Dame was ranked for 20 consecutive weeks and was ranked No.1 for seven straight weeks from Feb. 5 to March 25. The Irish have been ranked every week so far this season. **NEW KID:** Freshman goaltender **Brad Phillips** has had a strong start in his young career for the Irish as he is now 2-0-0 with a 1.00 goals-against average and a .935 save percentage. His last win came on Nov. 23 when he made 13 saves to defeat Alabama-Huntsville. His first career win came on Nov. 2 against Lake Superior State.

ROAD WARRIORS: Notre Dame's two wins on the road between Oct. 23 and Oct. 27 (at Bowling Green and Ferris State) gave the Irish seven-consecutive road wins, dating back to Jan. 19, 2007. The seven-consecutive road wins tied a program record that was set between Jan. 7 and Feb. 4, 1977. That seven-game streak also became part of the team's longest road unbeaten run as the Irish went 8-0-1 between Jan. 7 and Feb. 24 of that season. The streak was snapped on Oct. 28 in a 3-0 loss at Ferris State.

**SPECIAL MENTION:** Notre Dame freshmen forward **Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.)** earned special mention for CCHA rookie of the month honors for October after scoring two goals and adding five assists for seven points in his first month of play. Miami's Carter Camper took the rookie of the month honors over Ryan.

**SEVEN HEAVEN:** The seven goals scored by the Irish on Nov. 1 is the most they have scored in a game since March 9, 2007 when they also hung seven goals on Alaska in the first game of the second round of the CCHA playoffs. Notre Dame won that game, 7-1.

HOME SWEET HOME: After six home games this season, Notre Dame is 5-1-0 (.833) at the Joyce Center. A year ago, Notre Dame was 13-2-2 at home for an .824 winning percentage. That was the best mark since the 2003-04 season when the Irish were 14-2-2 at the Joyce Center for an .833 winning percentage. Only two other Irish teams have had better home records – 1987-88 team was 18-2-0 (.900) and the 1969-70 team was 12-1-1 (.893).

**TAKE THE HIGHWAY:** The Irish have had their share of success on the road over the last two seasons. This year, Notre Dame is 5-2-0 on the road. A year ago, the Irish were 12-4-1 (.735) away from the Joyce Center. The 12 road wins equaled a school record (1979-80 and 1997-98) for road wins. Only the 1983-84 team's 10-3-1 road mark (.750) is better.

**LONG TIME COMING:** Notre Dame's 4-3 win over Denver on Oct. 18 snapped a 10-game (0-9-1) winless streak for the Irish against the Pioneers. The last time they had beaten Denver was Nov. 3, 1978, a 3-2 win at the Joyce Center. Notre Dame and Denver played in the WCHA for 10 years from 1971-81 before the Irish left for the CCHA. Prior to last weekend's series, the two teams had met just three times with Denver going 2-0-1.

**BIG WIN:** Notre Dame's win over Denver on Oct. 18 was the first this season for the Irish against a nationally-ranked team as they are now 1-2-0 on the year. A year ago, Notre Dame was 10-2-1 against ranked teams. The Pioneers were the highest-ranked team that Notre Dame has beaten at the Joyce Center since beating fourth-ranked Michigan State, 4-1, on Nov. 17, 2006.

CCHA OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Senior center Mark Van Guilder was the CCHA offensive player of the week for the week ending Oct. 14. Van Guilder scored three goals in Notre Dame's two games at the Lefty McFadden Invitational. In the 4-1 loss to Wisconsin, Van Guilder scored a second-period, power-play goal to tie the game at 1-1. In Saturday's 4-0 victory versus Mercyhurst, Van Guilder scored a pair of goals, including one on the power play and one for the game winner. In the game, he set a career high with 12 shots on goal.

**GETTING OFFENSIVE:** Senior defenseman **Brock Sheahan (Lethbridge, Alb.)** was a finalist last season for the CCHA's defensive defenseman award. This season, Sheahan is showing his offensive game as he already has five assists in the first 16 games of the season. For his career, Sheahan now has three goals and 22 assists for 25 points.

CAPTAINS: Senior right wing Mark Van Guilder will serve as Notre Dame's captain for the 2007-08 season. Joining Van Guilder as alternate captains in '07-'08, are senior defensemen Brock Sheahan (Lethbridge, Alb.) and Dan VeNard (Vernon Hills, Ill.). They will be joined by junior forward Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.). This is the first season for all four players to serve as captains at Notre Dame.

MR PRESIDENT: Senior defenseman Dan Ve-Nard has been named president of Notre Dame's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) for the 2007-08 school year. VeNard served as hockey's representative to the group last season and was selected president by the group in M. The committee represents Notre Dame's studentathletes with the Irish athletic department. NEW KIDS: Six of Notre Dame's freshmen made their Irish debuts at the Lefty McFadden Invitational (Oct. 12-13). Leading the way was right wing Ben Ryan who recorded three assists in his first two games. Also playing in both games were forwards Robin Bergman (Stockholm, Sweden) and Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm, Sweden) along with defensemen Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.) and Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.). Joining those five was right wing Ryan Guentzel (Woodbury, Minn.) who played his first game against Mercyhurst in the second game of the weekend. Goaltender Brad Phillips saw his first action on Nov. 2, making his first career start in the 4-1 win over Lake Superior.

**SWEDISH CONNECTION:** For the first time in the 40-year history of the Notre Dame hockey program, the Irish have two natives of Sweden on the roster. Freshmen **Robin Bergman** (Stockholm) and **Calle Ridderwall** (Stockholm) join the roster this season. Both played last year in the USHL; Bergman for Cedar Rapids and Ridderwall for Tri-City. Bergman had 26 goals and 17 assists for 43 points. His 17 power-play goals were second in the league. Ridderwall led Tri-City in scoring with 27 goals and 35 assists for 62 points. He had 14 power-play goals and seven game winners, the most in the league in that category.

**ALL TIED UP:** Notre Dame's 3-2 overtime win versus Alabama-Huntsville in the NCAA Regionals on March 23, 2007 gave the Irish a 3-1-3 record in overtime last year. The three overtime wins were the most for the Irish in a single season. In two seasons under **Jeff Jackson**, Notre Dame is 3-1-7 in extra play.

**TOP CLASSES:** Notre Dame's incoming freshman class of seven was been ranked among the best for the 2007-08 season. Inside College Hockey.com ranked the group fourth in it's preseason rankings while *Red Line Report* ranked the group fifth in the nation last spring. Inside College Hockey.com rankings:

Red Line Report rankings had Wisconsin first, followed by Boston University, Michigan, Boston College, Notre Dame, Minnesota, Ohio State and North Dakota. Four of Notre Dame's seven freshmen were drafted – Ian Cole (first round, St. Louis), Teddy Ruth (second round, Washington), Ben Ryan (fourth round, Nashville) and Brad Phillips (seventh round, Philadelphia).

WELCOME BACK: Junior defenseman Luke Lucyk (Fox Point, Wis.) returns to the Notre Dame lineup this season after spending the 2006-07 season with the Tri-City Storm of the USHL. Lucyk played in 44 games for the Irish between 2004-06 with one goal and one assist for two points. He returned to Tri-City last season to get more playing time and had nine goals and 13 assists for 22 points in 59 games.

JUNIOR EVALUATIONS: Three members of the Notre Dame freshman class participated in the U.S. Junior Evaluation Camp this past August in hopes of making the United States' roster for the 2007 World Junior Championships. Freshmen defensemen Ian Cole and Teddy Ruth were joined by center Ben Ryan. Irish head coach Jeff Jackson served as one of the assistant coaches at the camp.

NHL DRAFTEES: The Irish have seven players on the 2007-08 roster who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Last June, a total of five Notre Dame players were selected. Leading the way was freshman defenseman Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.) who was a first-round selection of the St. Louis Blues who took him with the 18th pick overall. Cole became the first Irish player ever selected in the first round and was selected earlier than any other Notre Dame player (Rob Globke '04 was the previous highest selection when he was picked 40th overall by Florida in 2002). Cole was followed by fellow freshman defenseman Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.) who went in the second round, 46th overall to the Washington Capitals. Sophomore Ryan Thang (Edina, Minn.) was selected in the third round, 81st overall by the Nashville Predators. Incoming freshman Ben

Ryan (Brighton, Mich.) joined Thang when the Predators made him the 114th pick (fourth round). Freshman goaltender Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.) rounded out the Notre Dame selections in the last draft when the Philadelphia Flyers selected him in the seventh round, 182nd overall. Those five join junior right wing Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.) who was selected in the seventh round, 211th overall by the Ottawa Senators in 2006 and sophomore defenseman Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.) who was selected in the 2005 NHL Draft by the Carolina Hurricanes in the seventh round, 198th overall.

**WORST TO FIRST:** Just two seasons ago (2004-05), Notre Dame was 5-27-6 overall and finished last in the CCHA with a 3-20-5 record. In the CCHA's 35-year history, no team has ever gone from worst-to-first in one season. There have been three teams go from worst to first in a two-season span. They are:

**1975-76 Bowling Green** – Falcons finished last in 1973-74 in a three team conference and finished first in '75-'76 in a five-team league.

**1992-93 Miami** – RedHawks were last in 1990-91 with nine points in a nine-team conference. They finished first in 1992-93 with 49 points in a 12-team conference for a 40-point improvement over two seasons.

**2006-07 Notre Dame** – Irish were last in 2004-05 with 11 points in a 12-team conference. In '06-'07, the Irish took first place with 45 points for a 34-point improvement over two seasons.

FAMILY MATTERS: Two members of the Notre Dame hockey team – forwards Erik Condra and Garrett Regan (Hastings, Minn.) – have family ties to the Irish hockey program. Condra's uncle is All-American forward Kirt Bjork ('83) who played at Notre Dame from 1979-83. He scored 76 goals with 85 assists for 161 career points in 141 career games. He took All-America honors in 1983 when he had 29 goals and 34 assists for 63 points. Regan's uncle - Sean Regan - was a defenseman for the Irish from 1981-83 before finishing his career at the University of Minnesota.

MORE FAMILY MATTERS: Freshman goaltender Brad Phillips also has a family connection to Notre Dame. His uncle is former Irish quarterback Terry Andrysiak who played at Notre Dame from 1985 to 1988.

PUTTING ON THE FOIL: Notre Dame junior Christian Hanson (Venetia, Pa.) is the sixth player to play for the Irish whose father played in the National Hockey League. His father, Dave Hanson, played 10 years of professional hockey between 1974-75 and 1983-84, including stints with the Detroit Red Wings and the Minnesota North Stars and the World Hockey Association's (WHA) Minnesota Fighting Saints and the New England Whalers. Fans might also be familiar with Dave Hanson, as one of the famed Hanson Brothers, made famous in the hockey movie - Slapshot. Hanson currently is the director

of the Island Sports Center, home of Robert Morris University's hockey team, in suburban Pittsburgh.

RIVALRY CLUSTERS: - The CCHA begins its sixth season with the 12 teams grouped in "rivalry pairings." In the pairings, Notre Dame is paired with Bowling Green. The league's other pairings include Michigan-Michigan State, Miami-Ohio State, Lake Superior State-Northern Michigan, Ferris State-Western Michigan and Alaska Fairbanks-Nebraska-Omaha. Each season the teams are divided into three, four-team clusters and play a 28-game conference schedule. Cluster teams will face each other four times during the season with two games against each of the remaining eight teams. In 2007-08, Notre Dame will play Bowling Green, Ferris State and Western Michigan four times with two games at home and two away. The Irish will also play home-and-home series with Michigan and Michigan State. Notre Dame hosts two-game home series with Lake Superior, Nebraska-Omaha and Ohio State while playing two-game road series at Alaska, Miami and Northern Michigan. Last year, the Irish were 10-1-1 against Bowling Green, Alaska and Nebraska-Omaha, the three teams in their cluster.

# THE IRISH AND THE U.S. NATIONAL TEAM DEVELOPMENTAL PROGRAM:

Notre Dame's current roster includes five players who have past experience with USA Hockey, as members of the National Team Development Program (NTDP). Since the program began, the Irish have had a total of 19 NTDP alums grace their roster. The current contingent includes junior goaltender Jordan Pearce, sophomore defenseman Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.) and freshmen defensemen Ian Cole and Teddy Ruth plus goaltender Brad Phillips.
