Irish Get Three-Game Road Swing Off To A Strong Start With 4-2 Win Over Bowling Green On Tuesday Night

- Notre Dame visits Ferris State for weekend series Oct. 26-27.
- Irish and Bulldogs meet for first two-game series in Big Rapids, Mich., since 2002-03 season.
- Three-game week is first for Notre Dame since 2004-05 season.

ONE DOWN, TWO TO GO: Notre Dame opened it's three-game road week on Tuesday, Oct. 23, traveling to Bowling Green. The Irish rallied from 1-0 and 2-1 deficits in the game to take a 4-2 win at the BGSU Ice Arena. The win was the first of the season for the Irish on the road. Games two and three of the week come on Fri.-Sat., Oct. 26-27 as Notre Dame visits Big Rapids, Mich., for a

weekend series with the Ferris State Bulldogs. Both games at Ewigleben Arena start at 7:05 p.m. The Irish will bring a 3-2-0 overall record into the game and are 1-0-0 in the CCHA. Ferris State has opened the year with a 1-2-1 mark after four games and will be playing in its' CCHA opener. Notre Dame and Ferris State have met 56 times in the all-time series with the Bulldogs holding a 34-17-5 edge in the games played. Alltime, the Irish are 7-13-2 at Ewigleben Arena. In a scheduling fluke, the Irish have played just three of the last 20 meetings with Ferris State in Big Rapids, dating back to the 1999-00 season. Notre Dame's last win at Ferris State came on Feb. 11, 2006, a 3-2 victory. Last season, the two teams split a pair of games at the Joyce Center with the Bulldogs winning, 5-2, and the Irish taking a 2-0 decision.

THE LAST TIME: The Irish played three games in a week was the 2004-05 season, during the week of Jan. 16-22. Notre Dame traveled to Green Bay, Wis., on Tues., Jan. 18 to play Michigan Tech, then faced Wisconsin on Jan. 21-22 in South Bend and Chicago. Notre Dame dropped all three games, losing to Michigan Tech, 6-2 and then suffered a pair of 2-0 shutouts at the hands of the Badgers.

SPECIAL TEAMS: Notre Dame special teams played a key role in the Irish win at Bowling Green. The Irish were 1-for-8 on the power play and killed off all five Falcon power-play chances in the game. For the year, Notre Dame has scored at least one power-play goal in all

five games, scoring on 7-of-32 chances for a 21.9% success rate. Since giving up a power-play goal to Wisconsin with 35 seconds left in the 4-1 loss on Oct. 12, the Irish have killed off 21 consecutive opponent power-play chances. For the season, Notre Dame has stopped the opposition with the man advantage on 23-of-24 occassions for a 95.8% success rate. The Irish even scored a goal short-handed against Bowling Green as Erik Condra (Jr., Livonia, Mich.) scored unassisted in the third period on Tuesday night.

BOWLING GREEN RECAP: Notre Dame ran its unbeaten streak to nine games (8-0-1) versus Bowling Green over the last three seasons with a 4-2 win on Tuesday night in Ohio. After falling behind 1-0 on a Dan Sexton goal, Notre Dame's Mark Van Guilder (Sr., Roseville, Minn.) tied the score at 17:43 of the first with a power-play goal. The Falcons would retake the lead just 1:50 into the second period when Derek Whitmore picked up his third goal of the year. The Irish tied the game at 2-2 just over one minute later at 2:51 when Garrett Regan (Jr., Hastings, Minn.) jammed a rebound past Jimmy Spratt. Notre Dame took the lead for good at 18:46 when Evan Rankin (Sr., Portage, Mich.) pounced on a rebould for his first goal of the year. Erik Condra closed the scoring with a short-handed goal at 4:35 of the third period for the 4-2 final. The Irish out shot Bowling Green, 30-20, in the game. Jordan Pearce (Jr., Anchorage, Alaska) made 18 saves for the Irish, including 10 in the third period. Spratt had 26 stops for the Falcons.

TAKE THE HIGHWAY: Notre Dame opened its road schedule with a 4-2 win at Bowling Green on Oct. 23. Going back to last season, the Irish have now won six straight road games. The last road loss for Notre Dame came on Jan. 19, 2007 at Western Michigan, a 3-2 decision. A year ago, the Irish were 12-4-1 (.735) away from the Joyce Center. The 12 road wins equaled a school record (1979-80 and 1997-98) for road wins. Only the 1983-84 team's 10-3-1 road mark (.750) is better.

CCHA OPENERS: This is Notre Dame's 17th season in the CCHA. The Irish joined the conference in 1981-82, left following the '82-'83 season and then returned in 1992-93. The win over the Falcons in the CCHA opener gives Notre Dame an 8-7-2 all-time mark in conference lid lifters.

TAKING OVER: After serving as David Brown's back up in goal for his first two seasons, junior goaltender **Jordan Pearce** has become Notre Dame's go-to-guy. Pearce has started all five games for the Irish this season and has a 3-2-0 record with a 2.21 goals-against average and a .906 save percentage with one shutout. He is expected to make his sixth consecutive start Friday night versus Ferris State.

THE SPECIALIST: Senior center Mark Van Guilder leads the Irish in goals and shots on goal through the first five games. He has scored four times on 19 shots. Three of Van Guilder's goals have come on the power play as he leads the team in that category.

NEW FACES: While Van Guilder and Garrett Regan (his third of the year) scored versus Bowling Green, a pair of seniors got their first goals of the season against the Falcons. Evan Rankin picked up the game winner late in the second period with his first goal of the year and Erik Condra got his first on an unassisted, shorthanded goal in the third period. The short-handed goal was the second of Condra's career.

EARLY SCORING STRUGGLES: Through the first five games of the season, Notre Dame has scored just two goals in the first period while giving up five. A year ago, one of the keys to the success of the Irish was their first-period scoring

as Notre Dame out scored opponents by a 43-13 margin. The Irish also scored the first goal of the game in 32-of-42 games, going 26-4-2 in those contests. The Irish have excelled in the second period this year, scoring nine goals to one for the opposition.

DENVER RECAP: The Irish are coming off a weekend split with the fifth-ranked University of Denver on Oct. 18-19 at the Joyce Center. In Thursday's game, Notre Dame rallied from a pair of one-goal deficits to hand the fifth-ranked Pioneers a 4-3 loss in front of 2,413 at the Joyce Center. The Irish got goals from Garrett Regan (Jr., Hastings, Minn.), Kyle Lawson (So., New Hudson, Mich.), Ryan Thang (So., Edina, Minn.) and Ben Ryan (Fr., Brighton, Mich.) in the win. Ryan got the game winner at 7:23 of the third period. Kyle Ostrow, Tyler Bozak and Brock Trotter scored for Denver. The Pioneers out shot Notre Dame by a 20-18 margin. Jordan Pearce (Jr., Anchorage, Alaska) made 17 saves for the Irish while Peter Mannino had 14 in the Denver goal. On Friday night, the Pioneers turned the tables, taking a 3-1 victory in front of a standing-room only crowd of 2,763 at the Joyce. Chris Nutini scored the opening goal of the game for Denver when he lashed a slapshot that deflected past Pearce at 15:55 of the first to give the Pioneers the 1-0 lead. Denver out shot the Irish, 11-1, in the opening stanza. The Irish would tie the game with a power-play goal at 10:55 of the second period when Thang converted an Erik Condra centering pass for his second goal of the weekend. Denver got the game winner at 12:24 of the third period on a goal by Anthony Maiani and Tom May added an empty-net goal at 19:43 to close the scoring. The Pioneers out shot the Irish by a 28-20 margin in the game. Pearce finished with 25 saves while Mannino had 19 on the night for Denver.

HOME OPENERS: Thursday (10/18) night's win over Denver in the home opener gives Notre Dame a 22-17-1 record in Joyce Center openers. The Irish have won two straight home openers after beating Minnesota State, 6-1, last season.

LONG TIME COMING: Notre Dame's 4-3 win over Denver on Oct. 18 snapped a 10-game (0-9-1) winless streak for the Irish against the Pioneers. The last time they had beaten Denver was Nov. 3, 1978, a 3-2 win at the Joyce Center. Notre Dame and Denver played in the WCHA for 10 years from 1971-81 before the Irish left for the CCHA. Prior to last weekend's series, the two teams had met just three times with Denver going 2-0-1.

TOUGH SCHEDULE: Three of Notre Dame's first four games have come against teams ranked in the top 15 in the nation. The Irish opened the year with a 4-1 loss to #14/#15 Wisconsin (10/12), before splitting a pair with #5/#5 Denver last weekend. The Irish won 4-3 in the series opener before falling 3-1 on Friday night to the Pioneers. The Irish are now 1-2-0 against ranked teams this season. They were 10-2-1 a year ago.

BIG WIN: Notre Dame's win over Denver on Oct. 18 was the first this season for the Irish against a nationally-ranked team as they are now 1-2-0 on the year. A year ago, Notre Dame was 10-2-1 against ranked teams. The Pioneers were the highest-ranked team that Notre Dame has beaten at the Joyce Center since beating fourth-ranked Michigan State, 4-1, on Nov. 17, 2006.

CONTINUED IMPROVEMENT: Notre Dame's most improved player for 2006-07, Garrett Regan, continued his strong play early this season when he scored his third goal of the season in the 4-2 win at Bowling Green. Regan also had a big game versus Denver on Oct. 18, scoring a power-play goal in the first period before setting up Ben Ryan's game winner in the third period. Last season, Regan had 14 goals and 12 assists for 26 points. This season, he's scored three and added an assist for four points in the first five games.

THE REAL THANG: Sophomore left wing **Ryan Thang** had his three-game point and goal-scoring streak stopped at Bowling Green on Oct. 23. On the young season, Thang has goals versus Mercyhurst (10/13) and one in each game versus Denver (10/18-19). His longest career

goal-scoring streak is a four-game run last season between Jan. 5 and Jan. 13. In his career, Thang now has 23 goals with 12 of them coming on the power play.

CAREER FIRST: Freshman right wing Ben Ryan recorded the first goal of his career in the 4-3 win over Denver on Oct. 18. Ryan's goal at 7:23 of the third period proved to be the game winner and the goal came on the power play. Through the first four games of the season, Ryan leads the Irish in scoring with one goal and three assists for four points. Fellow freshman Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.) also collected his first collegiate point in Friday's game when he set up Garrett Regan's first-period, power-play goal.

MORE RYAN: Freshman Ben Ryan leads Notre Dame in scoring after the first five games with a goal and five assists for six points. Ryan collected his second multiple-point game of the year on Tuesday at Bowling Green when he assisted on two Irish goals.

BRINGING DOWN THE HOUSE: Notre Dame saw its' streak of eight consecutive sellouts snapped in the home opener on Oct. 18 as 2,413 fans saw the Irish defeat Denver, 4-3. A

new sellout streak started the following night as a standing-room only crowd of 2,763 saw Notre Dame drop a 3-1 decision to the Pioneers. A year ago, the Irish sold out their final eight games of the season and 10 of the last 11. For the year, they had 11 sellouts (2,763) in 17 home dates and averaged 2,478 per game. Through two games this season, Notre Dame is averaging 2,588 fans per game.

IRON MAN: Senior center **Mark Van Guilder** has his sights set on Notre Dame's all-time record for most consecutive games played. The record of 153 straight games was set by **Tim Wallace** '06 who played in every game of his career – 153 straight. Van Guilder has now played in every game of his career - 121 consecutive games played through the first four games this year.

FIRST TIMERS: Sophomore right wing Stewart Carlin (Jeannette, Pa.) made his first career appearance versus Denver (10/19). Carlin did not play in any games last year and lined up at right wing in his first appearance, getting one penalty for two minutes. Fellow sophomore Dan Kissel (Crestwood, Ill.) made his first appearance of the season since being sidelined in the first week of practice with an injury.

A BANNER NIGHT: Notre Dame raised its' CCHA Championship banner at Friday's game (Oct. 18) with Denver. On hand to represent the 40-year history of the program were associate athletics director **Tom Nevala**, the first head coach and assistant coach of the Irish hockey program, **Lefty Smith** and **Tim McNeill**, the 2006-07 team captain, T.J. Jindra, this year's captain, **Mark Van Guilder** and head coach **Jeff Jackson**. Jindra pushed the button to lower the banner which now hangs near the Gate 3 entrance over the end of the ice that Notre Dame defends twice. The banner joins the regular-season banner and the NCAA Tournament banner.

RANKINGS UPDATE: Notre Dame opened the 2007-08 season ranked eighth in the nation by both the USA Today/American Hockey Magazine and USCHO.com/CSTV polls. The Irish finished the 2006-07 season ranked fourth in the final USA Today/American Hockey Magazine poll that included the NCAA tournament. The Irish finished the year first in the USCHO.com/CSTV polls that ended with the end of the CCHA Tournament. In all, Notre Dame was ranked for 20 consecutive weeks and was ranked No.1 for seven straight weeks from Feb. 5 to March 25. Week-by-week with the Irish this season:

CCHA OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Senior center Mark Van Guilder (Roseville, Minn.) was the CCHA offensive player of the week for the week ending Oct. 14. Van Guilder scored three goals in Notre Dame's two games at the Lefty McFadden Invitational. In the 4-1 loss to Wisconsin, Van Guilder scored a second-period, power-play goal to tie the game at 1-1. In Saturday's 4-0 victory versus Mercyhurst, Van Guilder scored a pair of goals, including one on the power play and one for the game winner. In the game, he set a career high with 12 shots on goal.

SNIPER SUPREME: Sophomore Ryan Thang and his linemates Erik Condra (Jr., Livonia, Mich.) and Kevin Deeth (So., Gig Harbor, Wash.) continue to put up points. Thang has scored three goals this season while Condra has a goal and three assists and Deeth has chipped in two helpers. As a line the last four games, the trio has four goals, five assists and nine points.

GETTING OFFENSIVE: Senior defenseman **Brock Sheahan (Lethbridge, Alb.)** was a finalist last season for the CCHA's defensive defenseman award. This season, Sheahan is showin his offensive game as he already has three assists in the first five games of the season. For his career, Sheahan now has three goals and 20 assists for 23 points.

CAPTAINS: Senior right wing **Mark Van Guilder** will serve as Notre Dame's captain for the 2007-08 season. Joining Van Guilder as alternate captains in '07-'08, are senior defensemen **Brock**

Sheahan (Lethbridge, Alb.) and Dan VeNard (Vernon Hills, Ill.). They will be joined by junior forward Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.). This is the first season for all four players to serve as captains at Notre Dame.

NEW KIDS: Six of Notre Dame's freshmen made their Irish debuts at the Lefty McFadden Invitational (Oct. 12-13). Leading the way was right wing Ben Ryan who recorded three assists in his first two games. Also playing in both games were forwards Robin Bergman (Stockholm, Sweden) and Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm, Sweden) along with defensemen Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.) and Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.). Joining those five was right wing Ryan Guentzel (Woodbury, Minn.) who played his first game against Mercyhurst in the second game of the weekend. Only goaltender Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.) has yet to play among the freshman class.

HOME SWEET HOME: Notre Dame was 13-2-2 at home in 2006-07 for an .824 winning percentage. That was the best mark since the 2003-04 season when the Irish were 14-2-2 at the Joyce Center for an .833 winning percentage. Only two other Irish teams have had better home records – 1987-88 team was 18-2-0 (.900) and the 1969-70 team was 12-1-1 (.893).

MR PRESIDENT: Senior defenseman Dan Ve-Nard has been named president of Notre Dame's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) for the 2007-08 school year. VeNard served as hockey's representative to the group last season and was selected president by the group in M. The committee represents Notre Dame's studentathletes with the Irish athletic department.

SWEDISH CONNECTION: For the first time in the 40-year history of the Notre Dame hockey program, the Irish will have two natives of Sweden on the roster. Freshmen **Robin Bergman** (Stockholm) and **Calle Ridderwall** (Stockholm) join the roster this season. Both played last year in the USHL; Bergman for Cedar Rapids and Ridderwall for Tri-City. Bergman had 26 goals and 17 assists for 43 points. His 17 power-play goals were second in the league. Ridderwall led Tri-City in scoring with 27 goals and 35 assists for 62 points. He had 14 power-play goals and seven game winners, the most in the league in that category.

DROP THE PUCK: For the third season in a row, the Irish opened the year with the "Drop The Puck Reception" at the Joyce Center. This year's event took place on Oct. 10 with former Detroit Red Wings' great and current team vice-president Steve Yzerman serving as guest speaker. This year's reception took place prior to the annual Blue/Gold intrasquad scrimmage. Yzerman joins Chicago Blackhawk TV analyst Ed Olczyk and Scotty Bowman who were guest speakers in 2006 and 2005 respectively. Bowman, who won nine Stanley Cups in his illustrious coaching career, also was invited by Notre Dame head football coach Charlie Weis to address his team at practice, just four days prior to the upset win at Michigan in 2005.

THE KIDS WERE ALRIGHT: Notre Dame placed three players on the CCHA all-rookie team in 2007. Forwards Kevin Deeth (Gig Harbor, Wash.) and Ryan Thang (Edina, Minn.) were joined by defenseman Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.). Notre Dame became the third school in CCHA history to have three players on the all-rookie team, joining Michigan (five times) and Michigan State (once). The 1993-94 Michigan team set the record with four freshmen named to that team. Thang became the first Irish freshman to score 20 or more goals in a season since **Dave Poulin '82** had 28 in his rookie year of 1978-79. His 20 goals were the sixth most by a Notre Dame freshman while his 41 points tied for eighth best. Deeth's 17 goals tied him for the eighth-best total and his 39 points tied him for 10th among Irish freshmen.

TOP CLASSES: Notre Dame's incoming freshman class of seven has been ranked among the best for the 2007-08 season. Inside College Hockey.com ranked the group fourth in it's preseason rankings while *Red Line Report* ranked the group fifth in the nation last spring. Inside College Hockey.com rankings:

Four of Notre Dame's seven freshmen were drafted – Ian Cole (first round, St. Louis), Teddy Ruth (second round, Washington), Ben Ryan (fourth round, Nashville) and Brad Phillips (seventh round, Philadelphia).

LEADER OF THE PACK: Notre Dame head coach **Jeff Jackson** begins his third season behind the Irish bench in 2007-08. In his first two years he compiled a 45-26-7 (.622) record, highlighted by last season's 32-7-3 campaign. He was named the CCHA coach-of-the-year and followed that

IRISH VERSUS TOP 15-RANKED TEAMS: Notre Dame opened the 2007-08 season, playing three of its' first four games against ranked teams. The Irish opened against #14/#15 Wisconsin, dropping a 4-1 decision at Dayton, Ohio. Versus fifth-ranked Denver, the Irish won the opening game (4-3) before dropping the second by a 3-1 score. Last season, the Irish were 10-2-1 against ranked teams, going 4-1 on the road, 5-0-0 at home and 1-1 on neutral ice.

with the Spencer Penrose Award as the national coach-of-the-year. Jackson enters the '07-'08 season with the best winning percentage among Division I coaches with five or more years. His current overall record stands at 227-78-32 for a .721 winning percentage. His 227 wins rank him 21st on the all-time active list. In six seasons at his previous collegiate stop – Lake Superior State (1990-96) – Jackson's teams were 182-52-25 with two national championships, two CCHA regular-season titles and four CCHA tournament championships. Included in his 227 career wins are 41 postseason victories and a .804 winning percentage (41-10 in postseason). In eight trips to the CCHA postseason, Jackson's teams are 28-4 (.875). Those totals include a 24-2 mark at Lake Superior and a 4-2 record at Notre Dame. In those eight seasons, Jackson has seen his teams advance to the CCHA finals seven times, winning five tournament championships (four at Lake Superior and one at Notre Dame).

IN THE SHOW: Three former Notre Dame players opened the season on National Hockey League rosters. Defensemen Mark Eaton and Brett Lebda '04 opened the season on the blue lines for Pittsburgh and Detroit respectively. Forward Rob Globke '04 started the year with the Florida Panthers.

NUMERO UNO: The Notre Dame hockey program achieved many firsts during the 2006-07 season and one of those was being ranked number one in the nation for the first time ever. The Irish moved into the top spot in both the USA Today/American Hockey Magazine and USCHO.com/CSTV polls on Mon., Feb. 5, 2007 and remained there for seven consecutive weeks through March 25. The Irish finished the year ranked fourth in the USA Today poll that covers the entire season and finished number one in the USCHO.com poll that ended with the finish of the regular season. The Irish entered the 2007-08 season ranked eighth in both polls to start the year.

NHL DRAFTEES: The Irish have seven players on the 2007-08 roster who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Last June, a total of five Notre Dame players were selected. Leading the way was freshman defenseman Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.) who was a first-round selection of the St. Louis Blues who took him with the 18th pick overall. Cole became the first Irish player ever selected in the first round and was selected earlier than any other Notre Dame player (Rob Globke '04 was the previous highest selection when he was picked 40th overall by Florida in 2002). Cole was followed by fellow freshman defenseman Teddy Ruth (Naperville, III.) who went in the second round, 46th overall to the Washington Capitals. Sophomore Ryan Thang (Edina, Minn.) was selected in the third round, 81st overall by the Nashville Predators. Incoming freshman Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.) joined Thang when the Predators made him the 114th pick (fourth round). Freshman goaltender Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.) rounded out the Notre Dame selections in the last draft when the Philadelphia Flyers selected him in the seventh round, 182nd overall. Those five join junior right wing Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.) who was selected in the seventh round, 211th overall by the Ottawa Senators in 2006 and sophomore defenseman Kyle Lawson (New **Hudson, Mich.)** who was selected in the 2005 NHL Draft by the Carolina Hurricanes in the seventh round, 198th overall.

WELCOME BACK: Junior defenseman Luke Lucyk (Fox Point, Wis.) returns to the Notre Dame lineup this season after spending the 2006-07 season with the Tri-City Storm of the USHL. Lucyk played in 44 games for the Irish between 2004-06 with one goal and one assist for two points. He returned to Tri-City last season to get more playing time and had nine goals and 13 assists for 22 points in 59 games.

LEADING THE NATION: Defense was the key to Notre Dame's success in 2006-07 as the Irish led the nation in several categories. As a team, Notre Dame surrendered just 1.67 goals as a team and was also tops in the area of goal differential as they scored 1.74 more goals than they game up to rank first in that category. Goaltender **David Brown '07** led the nation with a 1.58 goals-against average and his 30 wins were also tops. In the area of penalty killing, the Irish also did it best as they allowed just 20 opponent power-play goals on 209 chances for a 90.4% success rate.

WORST TO FIRST: Just two seasons ago (2004-05), Notre Dame was 5-27-6 overall and finished last in the CCHA with a 3-20-5 record. In the CCHA's 35-year history, no team has ever gone from worst-to-first in one season. There have been three teams go from worst to first in a two-season span. They are:

1975-76 Bowling Green – Falcons finished last in 1973-74 in a three team conference and finished first in '75-'76 in a five-team league.

1992-93 Miami – RedHawks were last in 1990-91 with nine points in a nine-team conference. They finished first in 1992-93 with 49 points in a 12-team conference for a 40-point improvement over two seasons.

2006-07 Notre Dame – Irish were last in 2004-05 with 11 points in a 12-team conference. In '06-'07, the Irish took first place with 45 points for a 34-point improvement over two seasons.

JUNIOR EVALUATIONS: Three members of the Notre Dame freshman class participated in the U.S. Junior Evaluation Camp this past August in hopes of making the United States' roster for the 2007 World Junior Championships. Freshmen defensemen Ian Cole and Teddy Ruth were joined by center Ben Ryan. Irish head coach Jeff

Jackson served as one of the assistant coaches at the camp.

ALL TIED UP: Notre Dame's 3-2 overtime win versus Alabama-Huntsville in the NCAA Regionals on March 23, 2007 gave the Irish a 3-1-3 record in overtime last year. The three overtime wins were the most-ever for the Irish in a single season. In 59 overtime games since the start of the 1999-2000 season, the Irish are 10-7-42 in overtime. In two seasons under Jeff Jackson, Notre Dame is 3-1-7 in extra play.

HOMETOWNS: The 2007-08 Notre Dame hockey team features players from eight states, one Canadian province and Sweden. Over the past 13 seasons, the Irish have had monogram winners from 21 different states and provinces – those listed below, plus: Delaware, Massachusetts, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, North Dakota, Ontario, Prince Edward Island, Quebec, Saskatchewan and British Columbia. This season, freshmen Robin Bergman (Stockholm) and Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm) become the first Notre Dame hockey players from Sweden.

FAMILY MATTERS: Two members of the Notre Dame hockey team – forwards Erik Condra and Garrett Regan (Hastings, Minn.) – have family ties to the Irish hockey program. Condra's uncle is All-American forward Kirt Bjork ('83) who played at Notre Dame from 1979-83. He scored 76 goals with 85 assists for 161 career points in 141 career games. He took All-America honors in 1983 when he had 29 goals and 34 assists for 63 points. Regan's uncle - Sean Regan - was a defenseman for the Irish from 1981-83 before finishing his career at the University of Minnesota.

MORE FAMILY MATTERS: Freshman goaltender Brad Phillips also has a family connection to Notre Dame. His uncle is former Irish quarterback Terry Andrysiak who played at Notre Dame from 1985 to 1988.

PUTTING ON THE FOIL: Notre Dame junior Christian Hanson (Venetia, Pa.) is the sixth player to play for the Irish whose father played in the National Hockey League. His father, Dave Hanson, played 10 years of professional hockey between 1974-75 and 1983-84, including stints with the Detroit Red Wings and the Minnesota North Stars and the World Hockey Association's (WHA) Minnesota Fighting Saints and the New England Whalers. Fans might also be familiar with Dave Hanson, as one of the famed Hanson Brothers, made famous in the hockey movie - Slapshot. Hanson currently is the director of the Island Sports Center, home of Robert Morris University's hockey team, in suburban Pittsburgh.

RIVALRY CLUSTERS: - The CCHA begins its sixth season with the 12 teams grouped in "rivalry pairings." In the pairings, Notre Dame is paired with Bowling Green. The league's other pairings include Michigan-Michigan State, Miami-Ohio State, Lake Superior State-Northern Michigan, Ferris State-Western Michigan and Alaska Fairbanks-Nebraska-Omaha. Each season the teams are divided into three, four-team clusters and play a 28-game conference schedule. Cluster teams will face each other four times during the season with two games against each of the remaining eight teams. In 2007-08, Notre Dame will play Bowling Green, Ferris State and Western Michigan four times with two games at home and two away. The Irish will also play home-and-home series with Michigan and Michigan State. Notre Dame hosts two-game home series with Lake Superior, Nebraska-Omaha and Ohio State while playing two-game road series at Alaska, Miami and Northern Michigan. Last year, the Irish were 10-1-1 against Bowling Green, Alaska and Nebraska-Omaha, the three teams in their cluster.

THE IRISH AND THE U.S. NATIONAL TEAM DEVELOPMENTAL PROGRAM:

Notre Dame's current roster includes five players who have past experience with USA Hockey, as members of the National Team Development Program (NTDP). Since the program began, the Irish have had a total of 19 NTDP alums grace their roster. The current contingent includes junior

goaltender Jordan Pearce, sophomore defenseman Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.) and freshmen defensemen Ian Cole and Teddy Ruth plus goaltender Brad Phillips. Other NTDP alums who played at Notre Dame include: Brett Henning (1997-98), Michael Chin (1997-98), Connor Dunlop (1997-99), Paul Harris (1997-99), John Wroblewski (1997-99), Neil Komadoski (1998-2000), Brett Lebda (1998-2000), Rob Globke (1998-2000), Derek Smith (2000-01) and Tim Wallace (2002-06), Noah Babin (2003-07), Michael Bartlett (2003-07), Tom Sawatske (2005-07) and Josh Sciba (2003-07).
