BACK IN THE SHOW: Notre Dame returns to the NCAA Tournament for the fourth time in the last five years and for the fifth time in the program's history. The Irish are a three-seed in the Northeast Regional that will be played in Manchester, N.H., at the Verizon Wireless Arena. Notre Dame will face second-seed Merrimack in the second game of the regional at 7:30 p.m. on Saturday, March 27. The first game will feature top-seeded Miami from the CCHA versus fourth-seed New Hampshire at 4:00 p.m. Both of Saturday's games will be televised by ESPNU and ESPN3.com with Justin Kutcher and Damian DiGiulian calling all the action. The Notre Dame-Merrimack game will be shown on ESPNU on tape delay at 11:30 p.m., Locally, the game can be seen live on Comcast South Bend on Channel 3 and in Chicago on Chicago Comcast 101 Saturday night. Sunday's regional championship game is scheduled for 8:00 p.m. and will be televised live on ESPNU and ESPNU3. com. Notre Dame enters the Northeast Regional with an overall record of 23-13-5 and is coming off a pair of losses at the CCHA Tournament, losing to Miami, 6-2, in the semifinals before falling to Michigan, 4-2, in the third-place game. Merrimack is 25-9-4 this season and is coming off a 1-1 weekend at the Hockey East championship in Boston. The Warriors defeated New Hampshire, 4-1, in the semifinals and then lost to Boston College in the title game. Miami is 23-9-6 this year and is coming off winning its first CCHA championship ever last weekend in Detroit at Joe Louis Arena. New Hampshire is 21-10-6 for the 2010-11 season and lost in the Hockey East semifinal to Merrimack on March 18, 4-1.

IRISH NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY: This is Notre Dame's fifth trip to the NCAA Tournament in the 43-year history of the program. The Irish advanced in 2004, 2007, 2008 and 2009 prior to this season. In NCAA Tournament games, Notre Dame is 4-4 all-time. In 2004, the Irish, a fourth seed, advanced to the Grand Rapids (Mich.) Regional to face two-time defending NCAA champion, Minnesota, dropping a 5-2 decision in the opening-round game to the Gophers. In 2007, Notre Dame was the No. 1 seed in the tournament and again played in Grand Rapids. The Irish faced Alabama-Huntsville in the opening game and beat the Chargers, 3-2, in double overtime. In the regional championship game, they fell to Michigan State, 2-1, as the Spartans went on to win the 2007 NCAA title. In March of 2008, the Irish were a fourth seed in the West Regional at Colorado Springs, Colo., and advanced to the Frozen Four with wins over New Hampshire (7-3) and Michigan State (3-1). In the Frozen Four at Denver, the Irish upset Michigan with a 5-4 overtime win to advance to the title game against Boston College where they lost, 4-1. In 2009, Notre Dame was again the tournament's top seed and played in Grand Rapids, facing Bemidji State. The Irish were upset, 5-1, in the opening game of the tournament.

IRISH VERSUS WARRIORS: Notre Dame and Merrimack have met five times in the all-time series with the last meeting coming on Nov. 26, 1991. The Warriors lead the series, 3-2-0. The first time the two teams met was on Dec. 18, 1969 in the championship game of the Merrimack Tournament in Billerica, Mass. Notre Dame won that tournament with a 5-1 victory. During the 1988-89 season, the teams played three times with the Warriors winning twice at Notre Dame's Joyce Center, 3-1 and 4-3, on Nov. 23 and 25 and then at North Andover on Jan. 7, 1989, 6-0. The final meeting was on Nov. 26, 1991, at Merrimack with the Irish taking a 2-1 decision.

NOTRE DAME AND MIAMI: The Irish and RedHawks are old friends who face each other in the CCHA on a regular basis, having met 62 times in the all-time series. Miami has a 36-16-10 advantage to date, including a 4-0 mark in games played on neutral ice. The teams faced each other last Friday night in the CCHA semifinals with the RedHawks taking a 6-2 win. During the regular season, the teams met four times with the series being even at 1-1-2.

IRISH VERSUS WILDCATS: Notre Dame and New Hampshire have met five times in the all-time series with the Wildcats holding a 4-1-0 series lead. The first meeting came on Jan. 2, 1991 at Durham, where the Wildcats prevailed 5-3. The following year (1991-92), New Hampshire visited South Bend for a pair of games, Nov. 8-9 at the Joyce Center and again the Wildcats won, taking 7-1 and 8-2 decisions. The fourth meeting came in Durham on Nov. 27, 1999 with UNH taking a 2-1 win. The Irish finally got a win versus New Hampshire on March 28, 2008 in Colorado Springs, Colo. in the NCAA Regionals, winning a 7-3 game to move on to the regional finals versus Michigan State. Three players remain on the roster from that game - seniors Ryan Guentzel (Woodbury, Minn.), Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm, Sweden) and Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.).

THE RANKINGS: Four of the top 11 teams in the nation will meet in this weekend's Northeast Regional in Manchester, N.H. Top-seed Miami is ranked fourth in both the USA Today/American Hockey Magazine poll and the USCHO.com poll. Second-seed Merrimack is seventh in both rankings while third-seed Notre Dame is ranked ninth in the nation. New Hampshire, the fourth seed is ranked 11th in both polls to start this week.

JACKSON AND THE NCAAS: Irish head coach Jeff Jackson has seen his teams make the NCAA Tournament in 10 of his 12 seasons as a Division I head coach (four with Notre Dame and six with Lake Superior State). During that time, his teams own a record of 17-8 (.680) in the NCAA Tournament. That includes a 13-5 record at Lake State and a 4-3 record at Notre Dame. Jackson also has seen his teams make it to the Frozen Four four times (1992, 1993, 1994 at LSSU and 2008 at Notre Dame), winning twice at Lake Superior. His record in the Frozen Four is 6-2 overall.

THE COACH AND THE PLAYOFFS: Irish head coach Jeff Jackson has had his share of success in the CCHA playoffs. In his 12 CCHA seasons (six at Lake Superior State and six at Notre Dame), Jackson is 36-12 (.750) in conference postseason play. At Lake Superior, his teams were 24-2 while at Notre Dame, he is 12-10. His teams have advanced to the finals in 10 of the 12 seasons (six at LSSU and four at Notre Dame). In those 12 seasons, his teams won six CCHA titles (four at LSSU and two at Notre Dame).

DID YOU KNOW: The last time Merrimack was in the NCAA Tournament was 1988. That year, the Warriors defeated Northeastern in the first round and then were eliminated by Lake Superior State in the second. Current Irish head coach **Jeff Jackson** was an assistant on that Lakers team that was on its way to the first of three NCAA Championships.

IRISH VERSUS HOCKEY EAST: When Notre Dame squares off against Merrimack on Saturday night, it won't be the first game for the Irish versus a team from Hockey East. Notre Dame played Boston College once and Boston University twice this season and was 1-1-1 versus the Eagles and Terriers. The Irish defeated then, No. 1 Boston College, 2-1, at the Joyce Center on Oct. 23. Their second game of the season came versus BU in the IceBreaker Tournament where the Terriers defeated Notre Dame, 5-4, in the championship game on Oct. 10. On Jan. 2, the two teams met in the third-place game of the Shillelagh Tournament in Hoffman Estates, Ill., with that game ending in a 3-3 tie.

NO STRANGERS: Two members of the Notre Dame hockey roster are no strangers to the East Coast and to Merrimack College or the University of New Hampshire. Irish defenseman and team captain **Joe Lavin** is from Shrewsbury, Mass., and spent the first year and a half of his career at Providence College before transferring to Notre Dame. Irish associate head coach **Paul Pooley** was the head coach at Providence College for 11 years from 1994-2005 before leaving to rejoin Jeff Jackson at Notre Dame. The two worked together at Lake Superior State.

CCHARECAP: The Irish returned to Joe Louis Arena for the fourth time in the last five years last weekend after missing the trip in 2009-10. The results weren't quite what the Irish were looking for as they lost in the semifinals to Miami, 6-2, on March 18 and followed with a 4-2 loss to Michigan in the third-place game the following night. Versus Miami, the RedHawks jumped out to a 4-0 lead in the first period and never looked back on the way to the 6-2 win. Junior Billy Maday (Burr Ridge, Ill.) scored on a 5-on-3 power play and Calle Ridderwall got a late second period goal to cut the lead to 5-2 at the end of two periods but that was as close as the Irish would get. In the third-place game, Notre Dame's Riley Sheahan (So., St. Catharine's, Ont.) got the first goal of the game, but Michigan made it 2-1 after one period. With the Wolverines leading 3-1, T.J. Tynan (Fr., Orland Park, Ill.) scored in the final two minutes with the goaltender pulled to cut the Michigan lead to 3-2 before the Wolverines got an empty net goal with five second left for the 4-2 win.

THE KIDS ARE ALRIGHT: Notre Dame's freshman class has played a key role in Notre Dame's success this season. The "rookies" accounted for one goal and three assists in the two losses in the CCHA Tournament with the team getting four goals and six assists for 10 points. Through 41 games, the freshman class has accounted for 77 of the team's 142 goals (54.2%), 120 of the 252 assists (47.6%) and 197 of team's 394 points this season (50.0%). Freshman goaltender **Steven Summerhays** has five of the team's 23 wins in goal.

50 AND OVER: With a goal and two assists in the CCHA Tournament, freshman center T.J. Tynan became just the third Irish rookie to score over 50 points in his career. Tynan now has 22 goals and 30 assists for 52 points this season. That moves him into third on the all-time list behind Dave Poulin '82 and John Noble '74, who had 59-point campaigns in their rookie seasons. are ahead of Tynan. Earlier this season, Tynan and fellow freshman Anders Lee (Edina, Minn.) became the 11th and 12th freshmen to go over 40 points in their first year at Notre Dame. Lee now has 22 goals and 19 assists for 41 points. The duo is just the eighth and ninth Notre Dame freshmen to score 20 or more goals in a season as they have the sixth-best total among Irish rookies.

DYNAMIC DUO: T.J. Tynan and **Anders** Lee enter the NCAA Tournament with 22 goals each this season. This marks the first time that Notre Dame has had two 20-goal scorers in one season since 1990-91 when Lou Zadra '92 had 24 goals and **Mike Curry '92** added 20 for the Irish. Lee and Tynan's 22 goals are the most by a Notre Dame player since **Aniket Dhadphale** '99 scored 25 during the 1997-98 season. Tynan became the first player to record 50 points in a season since 1991-92 when **Curtis Janicke '93** scored 50 points. His 52 points are the most by a Notre Dame players since 1989-90 when **David Bankoske '93** had 56.

THE PUCK STOPS HERE: Prior to dropping both games at the CCHA Tournament, Notre Dame was 8-2-2 in the previous 12 games, dating back to Jan. 22. During that span, sophomore goaltender Mike Johnson (So., Verona, Wis.) played in nine of the 12 games going 6-1-1. The Irish are now 8-4-2 since Jan. 22 and Johnson is 6-2-1 with a 2.63 goals-against average and a .903 save percentage. For the season, Johnson is 18-9-4 with a 2.62 goals-against and a .903 save percentage. His 18 wins are a career high. Behind Johnson is freshman Steven Summerhays (Anchorage, Alaska) who saw action in both games of the CCHA Tournament. Since Jan. 22, Summerhavs is 2-2-1 with a 2.14 goals-against average and a .903 save percentage. For the season, he is 5-4-1 overall with a 3.04 goals-against average and a .863 save percentage.

LATE ADDITIONS: Center T.J. Tynan's outstanding rookie season (22g, 30a) has been a key to the 23-13-5 record for the Irish. The 5-8, 156-pound center has moved in to become one of the team's quarterbacks on the power play. The Orland Park, Ill., native wasn't even supposed to be on this year's team. Even though he signed a national letter-of-intent in Nov. of 2009. Tynan was going to defer and play another year with the Des Moines Buccaneers in the USHL where he was the Bucs' leading scorer in '09-'10 and a member of the USHL's all-rookie team. When Kyle Palmieri decided to sign with the Anaheim Ducks in early August, the call went out to Tynan and he joined the Irish roster. Freshman defenseman Kevin Lind (Homer Glen, Ill.) also signed a letter-of-intent in Nov. of '09 and was going to be playing this season with Tri-Cities in the USHL. He was asked to join the team in mid-August after Jarred Tinordi opted to play in the OHL. The 6-3, 221-pound Lind has played in 30 games and has seven points (one goal, 10 assists for 11 points) with a + 8 for the year.

MR. CLUTCH: Freshman left wing Anders Lee has had a banner freshman year for the Irish in 2010-11. He leads the team with 22 goals and is tied for the team lead with six power-play goals. His six game winners are tops on the team and tie him for eighth in the CCHA.

CCHAHONORS: Three members of the Notre Dame hockey team were honored at the CCHA Awards Show on March 17 at the Fox Theatre in Detroit, Mich. Freshman T.J. Tynan was named the CCHA rookie of the year after leading the league's rookies in scoring. Junior defenseman Sean Lorenz (Littleton, Colo.) was named the league's top defensive defenseman as he led all players with a +27 for the year. Head coach Jeff Jackson was named the conference's coach of the year as the Irish rebounded from nine league wins in 2009-10 to 18 in '10-'11 and they did it with as many as 10 freshmen per night in the lineup. Previously, the CCHA began handing out its postseason awards. Freshmen T.J. Tynan and Anders Lee were unanimous selections to the CCHA all-rookie team. Defenseman Stephen Johns was honorable mention. Senior left wing Calle Ridderwall was Notre Dame's choice for the CCHA all-academic team. Tynan and Lee also were chosen second team all-CCHA. Defenseman Sam Calabrese (So., Park Ridge, III.) was an honorable mention all-CCHA selection and senior right wing Ryan Guentzel (Woodbury, Minn.) was the only other Notre Dame player to receive votes. Lee was Notre Dame's winner of the Perani Cup for most points in three-star balloting following CCHA games.

20-WIN SEASON: Notre Dame moves into the NCAA Tournament with a 23-13-5 overall record, giving them 10 more wins than last year when they were 13-17-8. The 20-win season is the 11th in the 43-year history of the program and the Irish have now won 20 or more games in four of the last five seasons. The 23 wins are the fifth-best win total in the program's history.

COMEBACK KID: Sophomore defenseman Sam Calabrese leads Notre Dame defensemen in scoring with six goals and 12 assists for 18 points this season. As a freshman in 2009-10, Calabrese saw action in just three games all season, suffering a broken leg on Dec. 4, 2009 at Miami. Of Calabrese's six goals this season, two have come short-handed. He is second on the team with a +21 and capped his great comeback year by being named honorable mention all-CCHA for the '10-'11 campaign.

ROAD WARRIORS: Notre Dame's sweep at Ferris State (Feb. 18-19) was the second road sweep for the Irish this season (Jan. 7-8 at Northern Michigan) and the 3-2 win at Western Michigan (2/25) improved them to 9-5-2 on the road. A year ago, Notre Dame was 3-10-4 away from the Joyce Center. The Irish are 6-1-0 in their last five road games, dating back to Jan. 7th versus Northern Michigan. At home this season, Notre Dame is 13-4-2.

THE LAST TIME: Prior to Jeff Costello's (Fr., Milwaukee, Wis.) overtime game winner in game one of the series with Lake Superior on March 11, the last time a Notre Dame player scored in overtime in the postseason was April 10, 2008 when Calle Ridderwall (Sr., Stockholm, Sweden) scored in overtime to beat Michigan, 5-4, in the Frozen Four semifinal game in Denver, Colo. Ridderwall was a freshman that season.

STREAK ENDER: Notre Dame's 2-0 loss to Western Michigan (2/26) in the regular-season finale was the first shutout against the Irish in a year and a day. The previous shutout came on Feb. 25, 2010 when Michigan blanked Notre Dame, 4-0, in Ann Arbor. The loss also snapped a five-game Irish winning streak that started on Feb. 11 and an eight-game (6-0-2) unbeaten streak that began on Jan. 22. Both of those streaks were the longest of the season for Notre Dame. The eight-game unbeaten streak was the longest for the Irish since they ran off 10 straight wins from Feb. 13 through March 21, 2009.

IN GOOD COMPANY: For the past eight weeks, the Notre Dame hockey team has been in good company with the Notre Dame men's and women's basketball teams. All three programs are ranked in the top 10 in the nation in their respective polls, making Notre Dame the only school in the country with a top 10 program in all three sports. The Irish hockey team is ranked ninth in both the USA Today/American Hockey Magazine and USCHO.com polls. With a 27-7 overall record, the Irish men's basketball team entered the week ranked fifth in the Associated Press poll and the ESPN/USA Today rankings. The Notre Dame women's team is 28-7 and ranked ninth in the Associated Press poll and seventh in the ESPN/USA Today rankings. The week of Jan. 31, 2010 marked the first time since Dec. 9, 2002 that both basketball programs were ranked in the top 10 at the same time. Notre Dame is the only Division I school in the country to have its men's and women's basketball programs and its hockey program in the NCAA Tournament.

PUT THE BISCUIT IN THE BASKET: Notre Dame is sixth in the nation in goals scored with 142 through 41 games this season. The Irish trail North Dakota (166), Boston College (149), Yale (146), Miami (145) and Union College. Per game, Notre Dame is 10th overall with a 3.46 average. Yale is tops in the nation with 4.29 per game. The 3.46 goals-per-game is the most for the Irish since 1990-91 when they averaged 4.06 per game.

FABULOUS FRESHMEN: Freshmen T.J. Tynan and Anders Lee come into the NCAA Tournament ranked first and second in the nation and the CCHA in rookie scoring. Tynan has 22 goals and 30 assists for 52 points while Lee has 22 goals and 19 assists for 41 points. The 22 goals are tops among freshmen goal scorers in the conference. Fellow freshman Mike Voran (4g, 15a, 19 pts) is seventh and is followed by Bryan Rust (6g, 12a) at eighth with 18 points and Jeff Costello (11g, 6a, 17 pts) who is ninth. Defenseman Stephen Johns is tied for 19th with 12 points (1g, 11a) and center David Gerths (8g, 3a, 11pts) and defenseman Kevin Lind (1g, 10a) each have 11 points. Costello's 11 goals rank him fifth among league freshmen.

HOBEY BAKER NOMINEE: Freshman center **T.J. Tynan** was one of 68 Division I college hockey players that were nominated for the 2011 Hobey Baker Award. He did not advance to the final 10 candidates that were selected on March 17th. The winner of the award will be announced at the Frozen Four on April 8. Award

criteria include candidates emulating the exceptional character traits exhibited by the award's namesake, Hobey Baker, a World War I flying star better known as America's greatest amateur athlete in his day. Award candidates must demonstrate strength of character both on and off the ice, contribute to the integrity of his team and display outstanding skills in all phases of the game. Consideration should be given to scholastic achievement and sportsmanship.

SHORT-HAND SUCCESS: For most of the season, Notre Dame led the nation in shorthanded goals with 12, but were passed by Boston College last weekend as the Eagles notched their 13th of the year. Freshman left wing Anders Lee scored Notre Dame's 12th short-handed goal on Jan. 14 to become one of nine Irish players with short-handed markers this season. Defensemen Joe Lavin and Sam Calabrese join T.J. Tynan with two each while Lee, Bryan Rust (Fr., Novi, Mich.), Riley Sheahan, Ryan Guentzel, Billy Maday and Sean Lorenz all have one each. The 12 short-handed goals are the most for the Irish since setting a school record with 19 during the 1981-82 season.

JOIN THE CLUB: Senior center Ben Ryan is on the verge of becoming the 46th player in the history of the Notre Dame hockey program to score 100 or more points in his career. Going into the NCAA Tournament, Ryan needs just four more points to reach the "Century Club" as he has 35 goals and 61 assists for 96 points in 156 career games. Following Ryan, senior Calle Ridderwall also has a shot at the 100-point mark. He has 55 goals and 34 assists for 89 points in 153 career games.

He is currently third on the team in scoring with six goals and 31 assists for 37 points, all career highs. Earlier this season, Guentzel had a career-best, and a season high for the Irish, seven-game point streak (1g, 9a). His previous best season was 2008-09 when he had four goals and seven assists for 11 points. He is currently tied for seventh in the CCHA in scoring with 37 points and his 31 assists are third in the conference.

THE SPECIALIST: Senior left wing Calle Ridderwall is third on the team in goals with 14 through the first 41 games this season with four of those goals coming on the power play. His goal versus Canisius on Dec. 29th was the 50th of his Notre Dame career. With 14 goals this season, Ridderwall has now been in double figures in goals in each of the last three seasons for the Irish after getting 17 in 2008-09 and 19 last season in 2009-10. Over the last two-plus seasons, Ridderwall has scored 50 goals with 26 of them coming via the power play. Last season, his 11 power-play goals led the CCHA. Ridderwall had 11 power-play goals in '08-'09 to match last season's total and has two this year. His 26 power-play goals rank him sixth on Notre Dame's all-time power-play goal list. For his career, Ridderwall has 55 goals and 34 assists for 89 career points in 153 games. He missed five games between Jan. 8 and Jan. 29 due to an injury suffered on Jan. 8 at Northern Michgian.

On Feb. 15, both **Erik Condra** '09, by Ottawa, and **Christian Hanson** '09 by Toronto, were recalled to their respective clubs. For Condra it was his first game in the NHL while the other three have played previously in the NHL. Condra recorded an assist in his first NHL game against the New York Islanders.

NOSE FOR THE NET: Freshman left wing Jeff Costello ranks fourth on the Irish roster with 11 goals this season and is tied for the team lead with six power-play goals. In 41 games, Costello has 11 goals and six assists for 17 points. He is fifth among CCHA freshmen in goals.

WHATEVER IT TAKES: Freshman center-David Gerths (Ankeny, Iowa) has become a specialist when it comes to scoring those "dirty" goals. The 6-0, 208-pounder does his best work right in front of the goal. He scored his eighth goal of the season on a backhander from the low slot in the 5-2 win versus Ferris State on Feb. 19. In 40 games this season, he has scored eight goals with three assists for 11 points. In 55 games last season in the USHL with Lincoln and Green Bay, Gerths scored just five goals. His eight goals rank him sixth for Notre Dame this season.

GOING ON THE OFFENSIVE: Two of Notre Dame's defensive, defensemen - Sam Calabrese and Sean Lorenz (Jr., Littleton, Colo.) - have gone on the offensive this season, turning in career years. Calabrese, who saw action in just three games last season, leads Irish defensemen in scoring with six goals and 12 assists for 18 points. Lorenz has four goals and nine assists for 13 points, all career highs for the junior blueliner. The duo is tops in the CCHA in plus-minus as Lorenz is +26 and Calabrese is +21 going into the CCHA Championships.

SHOOTING THE PUCK: Through the first 41 games of the season, Notre Dame has out shot the opposition in 32 of those games. The Irish are 20-9-3 when they out shoot their opponent. In games the opposition has the most shots, Notre Dame is 3-4-2. For the year, the Irish are averaging 33.3 shots per game while giving up 26.0 per contest.

ANOTHER MILESTONE: Notre Dame's Oct. 30, 3-2 win over Western Michigan was the 200th CCHA win for Irish coach **Jeff Jackson**. Now in his 12th season at the Division I level, Jackson is 215-87-47 in his career in CCHA play in six seasons at Lake Superior State (1990-96) and six seasons at Notre Dame. Earlier in October (Oct. 14 vs. Lake Superior State), Jackson won his 300th career game as a Division I coach. His all-time record stands at 319-127-52 for a .693 winning percentage. His winning percentage is the tops among active coaches with 10 or more seasons.

SHOOTOUT FACTS AND FIGURES: So far this season, the Irish have had three CCHA games go to the shootout and a fourth, the third-place game at the Shillelagh Tournament go to penalty shots. The Irish are 2-1 in the CCHA in the shootout and 3-1 on the year after winning the one against Boston University for third place in the Shillelagh Tournament. In the three seasons that the CCHA has had the shootout, the Irish are 7-6 all-time (3-0 in '08-'09; 2-5 in '09-'10 and 2-1 in '10-'11).

HCA ROOKIE OF THE MONTH: Notre Dame freshman left wing Anders Lee (Edina, Minn.) was selected as the Hockey Commissioners' Association national Rookie of the Month for December. The CCHA Rookie of the Month, Lee had two goals and six assists for eight points in five games during December to finish second to T.J. Tynan in scoring in the CCHA for the month. Lee had points in four of the five games, including three with two or more points. On Dec. 3, at Miami, he had a career-best three assists as he helped the Irish rally from a two-goal deficit to beat Miami, 5-4. The three-point game equaled a career-high for Lee who now has 19 goals and 18 assists for 37 points to rank second on the Irish in scoring and second to Tynan in the conference freshman scoring race.

CCHAPLAYER OF THE MONTH: Notre Dame freshman standout T.J. Tynan has been selected as the CCHA's RBC Financial Group Player of the Month for December. The 5-8, 156-pound freshman center led all CCHA scorers in December in scoring as he had five goals and four assists for nine points in five games during the month. Tynan, who is the top rookie scorer in the nation, had points in four of the five games during the month and had three games with two or more points, including a career-best four-point game (2g, 2a) in a 10-2 win over Canisius on Dec. 29. Tynan currently leads Notre Dame in scoring with 18 goals and 21 assists for 39 points on the year. He was the CCHA rookie of the week for last week and was the conference's and the nation's rookie of the month for November. Tynan was an honorable mention selection for the HCA player of the month in December.

TYNAN HONORED: Notre Dame freshman center T.J. Tynan was named the Hockey Commissioners' Association rookie of the month for November to add to his honors this month after being named CCHA rookie of the month for the month of November. In eight games during November, Tynan led all CCHA rookies with six goals and six assists for 12 points. Two goals came on the power play, two were short-handed and one was a game winner. He was +5 for the month and took just 19 shots for a .316 shooting percentage. During November, Tynan scored in seven of the team's eight games with five of the contests being multiplepoint games. He was named the CCHA rookie of the month on two occasions - for games the week of Nov. 1 and Nov. 8. Tynan is the second Irish player to take CCHA rookie of the month honors this season as teammate Anders Lee was October's winner.

TOUGH SCHEDULE: From Oct. 31 through Dec. 4, Notre Dame played nine of 11 games on the road, including a streak of eight straight games versus nationally ranked teams. The Irish came through that streak with a 4-3-1 record. Starting on Nov. 12-13 the Irish faced #9/#8 Michigan in Ann Arbor, Mich where they split with the Wolverines. On Nov. 19-20, the Irish played host to

rv/#17 Michigan State at the Joyce Center, taking two wins versus the Spartans. The weekend of Nov. 26-27 saw the Irish face #10/#9North Dakota in Grand Forks where they had a loss and a tie. Against #6/#6 Miami Dec. 3-4, the Irish again had a split to give them a 4-3-1 record in the eight games against ranked teams. Game Notes • Page 7

FUTURE IRISH: Notre Dame head coach Jeff Jackson announced in early December that five players had signed national letters-of-intent to play hockey at the University beginning for the 2011-12 season. The group includes three defensemen and two forwards. the defensemen are Eric Johnson (Verona, Wis.), Robbie Russo (Westmont, Ill.) and Andrew Ryan (Brighton, Mich.). The forwards are Peter Schnedier (Vienna, Austria) and Garrett Peterson (Manhattan, Ill.). Peterson signed his letter-of-intent in Nov. of 2009 but returned to the USHL this season with the Lincoln Stars. In making the announcement, Jackson said, "We're very excited about this group of players. We think they have the potential to step in and play. What I like most about them is that they are all strong skaters that play with a little grit to their game." Two of the players - Russo and Ryan - play for USA Hockey's National Team Developmental Program. The other three are all currently playing in the United States Hockey League (USHL). Russo and Ryan are currently listed by the National Hockey League's Central Scouting in their preliminary ratings. For more information on the five players check the Notre Dame website at und.com

TEN SPOT: Notre Dame's 10-goal out burst against Canisius on Dec. 29 marked the first time the Irish had 10 or more goals in a game since Oct. 14, 1995 when the Irish defeated St. Francis Xavier by a 10-2 score.

PENALTY SHOTS: The Irish were awarded two penalty shots this season. In the regular season finale, T.J. Tynan got one with 29 seconds left in the 2-0 loss to Western Michigan. He was stopped by Bronco goaltender Jerry Kuhn. Senior center Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.) was awarded a penalty shot just 22 seconds into the Nov. 20 game with Michigan State and was stopped by goaltender Will Yanakeff. It was the first penalty shot by a Notre Dame player since Jan. 31, 2009 when **Rvan Thang '10**, scored in a 3-2 win at Michigan. It was the fourth for the Irish since the 2001-02 season. They are 2-for-4 in that span. The last time the opposition had a penalty shot against teh Irish came on Dec. 4, 2009 when Miami's Carter Camper was stopped by Mike Johnson.

GOT THEIR NUMBER: From 1992-93 through the 2007-08 season, Notre Dame struggled when it came to facing Michigan State. In that time span, the Irish were just 5-32-7 versus the Spartans. Since March 29, 2008, a span of 10 games, Notre Dame is 7-0-3 against Michigan State, including a 5-0-1 mark at the Joyce Center.

FULL HOUSE: With two sellout crowds of 2.859 at the Jovce Center for the Lake Superior State series, the Irish have now sold out 16 of their 19 home games this season with only the series against Northern Michigan (Dec. 11-12) and game three against Lake Superior last Sunday night having empty seats. Notre Dame has now had sell outs in 30 of the team's last 37 home games and this past year averaged 2,801 fans per game. Since Dec. 13, 2008, the Irish have recorded sellouts in 39 of their last 46 home games. A sellout at the Joyce Center is 2,713 with 2,857 capacity with standing room. Twice during the '09-'10 season - Jan. 15 vs. Michigan State and Jan. 29 against Nebraska-Omaha - 3,007 fans jammed into the Joyce Center. Prior to that number, the largest crowd to see an Irish hockey game was 3,310 on March of 1995 when Notre Dame play Illinois-Chicago. The following season, new seating was installed and capacity was reconfigured.

IRISH WINS VERSUS NO. 1: Notre Dame's win over No. 1 ranked Boston College on Oct. 23 marked the 12th time in the program's history that the Irish have defeated the nation's top team. Prior to Oct. 23, 2010, the last time came on April 10, 2008 in the NCAA semifinals versus No. 1 Michigan. A year ago, the Irish played twice versus the No. 1 team in the nation - Miami University - and lost both games on Dec. 4-5. Notre Dame has defeated Boston College when the Eagles were ranked No. 1 four times since the 2003-04 season. Here's a list of previous Irish wins versus top-ranked teams.

POWER LESS: In the Nov. 12 game at Michigan, a 3-1 Irish win, Notre Dame did not have one power-play chance in the game. That marked the first time in seven seasons - since March 5, 2004 - a span of 258 games - that the Irish did not have a power-play opportunity in a game. In the weekend series at Michigan, the Irish did not get their first power-play on the weekend until there was 6:09 left in the third period, a span of 113:51 over the two games without a power play. In the final six minutes of Saturday's game, the Irish did get three straight power plays.

FAST START: Notre Dame freshman left wing **Anders Lee** knows how to get his career off to a fast start. The 6-3, 218-pounder scored a goal on his first shot in the 6-3 win over Holy Cross (Oct. 8), just 1:58 into the first period. He went on to record two more goals for a hat trick in his first-ever collegiate game. Lee then added an assist in the 5-4 loss to Boston University in the championship game of the Warrior Ice Breaker Tournament. For his efforts, Anders Lee was named the CCHA rookie of the week for the week ending Oct. 10. He joins **John Noble '73** as the

only other freshman to score three goals in his first game as Noble did the trick on Nov. 15, 1969 in an 8-3 win over Windsor. He joins recent Irish players - **Billy Maday**, **Christiaan Minella '10** and **Tim Wallace '06** - as freshmen who scored on their first shot on goal. Lee added a goal and an assist in the Oct. 15 win over Lake Superior State and through the first 17 games of the season, he leads the team with nine goals, is tied for the top spot with three power-play goals and is fourth in points with 15 (9g, 6a). He was named the CCHA rookie of the month for October.

CAPTAINS: Four members of the Irish senior class will serve as captains for the 2010-11 season. Defenseman Joe Lavin (Shrewsbury, Mass.) will wear the "C" for Jeff Jackson's squad this year. His three assistant captains will be Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm, Sweden), Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.) and Ryan Guentzel (Woodbury, Minn.). For all four players, this is their first time as captains at Notre Dame.

LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD: Senior left wing Calle Ridderwall is one of 20 Division I hockey players to be selected as a candidate for the 2010-11 Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. The award is presented annually to an NCAA Division I student-athlete in 10 sports based on achievement's in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition. CLASS is an acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School and the award focuses and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. This is the fifth year that Lowe's has sponsored an award for hockey. In 2006-07, former Irish goaltender David Brown `07 won the Senior CLASS Award while in 2007-08, Mark Van Guilder `08 and in 2008-09, Jordan Pearce `09 and Erik Condra `09 were among the top 10 finalists. Team captain Rvan Thang `10 was the team's nominee last season.

HOME OPENERS: Notre Dame's home opener on Thursday, Oct. 14, a 4-2 win over Lake Superior State, gives Notre Dame an all-time record of 24-18-1 in home openers at the Joyce Center. With the win on Oct. 8 against Holy Cross, Notre Dame is now 21-20-2 in season-opening games.

FAMILY GUYS: Three members of the Notre Dame hockey team - sophomore forwards Kevin Nugent (New Canaan, Conn.) and Riley Sheahan (St. Catharine's, Ont.) and freshman goaltender Joe Rogers (Marysville, Mich.) have family ties to the Irish hockey program. Nugent's father, Kevin Nugent, Sr. '78 was a member of the Notre Dame hockey team from 1974-78. During his career he played in 131 games, scoring 54 goals with 75 assists for 129 career points. His son becomes the second Irish player to follow his father to Notre Dame. He joins Rory Walsh '06 who followed his father, Brian Walsh '77 who was a teammate of Nugent, Sr. Sheahan is a second cousin of former Irish defenseman Brock Sheahan '08 who played for the Irish from 2004-08. Rogers is a cousin of former Notre Dame defenseman Tony Bonadio '83 is a Port Huron, Mich., native. Bonadio played in 79 games between 1980-83, scoring one goal with nine assists for 10 points.

NHL DRAFTEES: The Irish have 10 players on the 2010-11 roster who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Leading the way is sophomore Riley Sheahan (St. Catharine's, Ont.) who became Notre Dame's third-ever, first-round pick last June when he was chosen 21st overall by the Detroit Red Wings. He joins former defenseman Ian Cole (2007 - St. Louis) who was selected 18th overall and former right wing Kyle Palmieri (2009 - Anaheim), the 26th pick overall. Sheahan was followed by freshman defenseman Stephen Johns (Wampum, Pa.), who went in the second round, 60th overall to the Chicago Black Hawks. One round later in the third round, with the 80th overall pick, freshman forward Bryan Rust (Novi, Mich.) was chosen by the Pittsburgh Penguins. Notre Dame's final player selected in 2010 was defenseman Kevin Lind (Homer Glen, Ill.), who was picked in the sixth round, 177th overall by the Anaheim Ducks. Two other Irish freshman were selected in the 2009 draft. Left wing Jeff Costello (Milwaukee, Wis.) was chosen by the Ottawa Senators in the fifth round, 146th overall and six picks later, center Anders Lee (Edina. Minn.) was a New York Islanders' choice in the sixth round, 152nd overall. The new group of draftees join sophomore left wing Nick Larson (Apple Valley, Minn.), a 2008 selection of the Calgary Flames in the fourth round, 108th overall; junior defenseman Sean Lorenz (Littleton, Colo.), a member of the 2008 draft class, by the Minnesota Wild in the fourth round, 115th overall and seniors Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.) and Joe Lavin (Shrewsbury, Mass.). Ryan was picked in the 2007 entry draft by Nashville in the fourth round with the 114th pick and Lavin was a Chicago Black Hawks choice in the fifth round, 126th overall

NEW HOME FOR THE IRISH: Construction on Notre Dame's new, on-campus ice facility -The Compton Family Center - began in March of 2010 and is on pace to be finished for the Notre Dame hockey team to begin play there during the 2011-12 campaign.

On Sept. 11, 2010, a project blessing ceremony for the \$50-million facility was held with many of the key benefactors in attendance. At the ceremony, Notre Dame director of athletics, **Jack Swarbrick**, announced that the building would be named the Compton Family Center in honor of the generous donation from Kevin and Gayla Compton and their family. The Comptons are part of the ownership group of the National Hockey League's San Jose Sharks.

Rev. John I. Jenkins, C.S.C., Notre Dame's President began the ceremony with a blessing of the site and offering of a prayer for the safety of those working on the project.

Irish head coach **Jeff Jackson** followed by talking about the original plans and how those plans changed to become the Compton Family Center.

"When I first came here, we were talking about a renovation in the Joyce Center," said Jackson, now in his sixth season behind the Notre Dame bench.

"With Jack's (Swarbrick) foresight and Tom [Nevala] and everyone involved in pushing for this to happen, waiting an additional year to have a new facility is something that is going to have a tremendous impact on the future of our program, and we're very proud of that."

Jackson also thanked the benefactors in attendance for their generosity towards the project.

Notre Dame's head coach was followed by Irish junior **Billy Maday** (**Burr Ridge**, **III**.) who spoke for his teammates to the benefactors in attendance.

Swarbrick spoke last at the ceremony, and touched upon how important the Compton Family Center will be for the Michiana community.

"There's a limit to how much the community can use our dormitories and our classrooms and our laboratories, but the athletic facilities can be a special point of contact," Swarbrick said. "I hope we win national championships with

"I hope we win national championships with teams that train here and I hope we build new programs for our athletes and our students. But the ultimate success of this facility will be if we inspire a young boy or a young girl from the community to shoot higher, if we challenge them to be better people because they spend time on our campus. Then we've realized the potential of athletics at Notre Dame."

The original announcement for the new building was made on Feb. 12, 2009 by Notre Dame executive vice-president John Affleck-Graves and Swarbrick after the University's Board of Trustees approved the plan.

The Compton Family Center will house both the Charles "Lefty" Smith rink, within the new 5,000-person capacity, home of the Irish hockey team and a second sheet of ice (Olympic-sized) with limited seating availability. The majority of the general public arena seating will be of the chair-back variety.

The Compton Family Center also will include offices for the Notre Dame coaching staff, a state-of-the art locker room suite that includes both wet and dry locker rooms, meeting rooms, a sports medicine area that includes hot and cold hydrotherapy, cardio and weight rooms, a players' lounge, equipment areas, video operations and a multi-purpose room that will be the location for weekly team Mass and serve as a study lounge and dining area.

The arena also will feature a balcony level with a 200-seat, Irish pub-themed club, multiple concession areas on both levels, spacious restrooms and a merchandise shop.

The Compton Family Center also will serve the Notre Dame and South Bend community as a place for the Irish Youth Hockey League (IYHL) and local figure skating groups to flourish. On campus it will become the home of club and interhall hockey, the figure skating club and intramural broomball, curling and physical education classes.

Multiple locker rooms also will be available for campus and community use of the facility.

Design and construction of the Compton Family Center are under the auspices of the Southfield, Mich., office of Barton Malow, a national design and construction services firm and their project partner Rossetti Architects, also of Southfield, Mich.

LEFTY'S RINK: When Notre Dame's new ice hockey arena is built the new ice hockey rink will be named the Charles W. "Lefty" Smith, Jr., Rink, in honor of the first coach in the program's history, **Charles "Lefty" Smith**. The announcement was made in April of 2008 at the team's annual awards banquet. The plans for naming the new ice surface in honor of Smith were made possible by the generosity of the John and Mary Jo Boler family of Inverness, III., and Sanibel Island, Fla., their daughter Jill Boler McCormack '84 and her husband, Dan; and their son Matthew Boler '88 and his wife, Christine. They were joined by the family of Frank '57 and Mary Beth O'Brien of Albany, N.Y., who have six children who all graduated from Notre Dame. Their late son, Frankie, played both lacrosse and hockey for the Irish from 1984-88.

Smith came to Notre Dame in 1968 to start the varsity hockey program and coached the Irish for 19 years, retiring in 1987 with 307 career victories. Under his tutelage, Notre Dame produced six All-Americans but most importantly, all 126 student-athletes who played for him completed their collegiate eligibility and earned college degrees.

Smith, who continues to work as the director of the Loftus Sports Center on campus, served two years as the president of the American Hockey Coaches Association. He was inducted into the Minnesota Hockey Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 1992. He played an integral in bringing the International Special Olympics to Notre Dame in 1987.

Married for 57 years, Lefty, who lost his wife, Mickey on Nov. 9, 2009, is the father of seven living children, 16 grandchildren and two great grandchildren.
