Storylines

- Notre Dame is making its third appearance in the Preseason WNIT and first since winning the title in 2004.
- The Irish are 17-3 (.850) in season openers under head coach Muffet McGraw, including an active 12-game winning streak.

otre Dame will be hoping history repeats itself when it opens the 2007-08 season Friday at 9 p.m. (ET) against Miami (Ohio) in the first round of the Preseason Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT) at the Joyce Center. The last time the Irish played in the Preseason WNIT in 2004, they reeled off four consecutive wins, the last two against top-10 opponents, to win the tournament championship and ignite a 27-win season.

Notre Dame completed its exhibition schedule on Monday with a 96-64 win over Division II member Hillsdale at the Joyce Center. Six Irish players scored in double figures, led by senior guard Tulyah Gaines, who converted 8 of 11 shots from the floor.

Miami (Ohio) brings back all five starters and 11 letterwinners from last year's squad that went 12-18, with a 6-10 record (fourth-place finish) in the Mid-American Conference's East Division. The RedHawks played two closed scrimmages during the preseason and will make their '07-08 public debut Friday night.

Setting The Standard

Under the guidance of 21st-year head coach Muffet McGraw, Notre Dame has evolved into one of the country's leading women's basketball powers. The Irish have appeared in 14 NCAA Tournaments (including a current streak of 12 in a row) and advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 six times in the past 11 years. Notre Dame also has reached the NCAA Women's Final Four twice, winning college basketball's ultimate prize with the 2001 national championship.

In its history, Notre Dame has developed nine All-Americans, nine WNBA players (including six draft picks in the past seven years) and four USA Basketball veterans (nine medals won). Now in their 31st season in 2006-07, the Irish own an all-time record of 613-278 (.688).

A Quick Look At The Fighting Irish

Even after a 20-12 record and a trip to the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 2006-07, Notre Dame still continues to fly below the national radar. Head coach Muffet McGraw wouldn't want it any other way.

Last year, the Irish learned quickly that respect is something that isn't handed to you, but rather earned on the court. It's also a quality that takes time to develop and doesn't come from trophy cases or record books. So although Notre Dame doesn't appear in the preseason ESPN/ USA Today coaches poll (it was ranked 24th in the first AP poll of the year), and was tabbed fifth in the preseason BIG EAST Conference balloting, it's not a great concern to McGraw and her charges. Instead, they focus on the things they can control and prefer to let the outside world judge them when the season is over.

This year could prove to be unlike any in recent memory for Notre Dame. For one, the Irish will roll out some impressive depth, going virtually two-deep at every floor position. In addition, Notre Dame's new offensive system (a Princeton-based set with four guards and a post) continues to evolve, building upon last year's 70.1 point-per-game average that was its highest since the 2000-01 NCAA national championship season.

Senior guard Charel Allen is the top returning scorer and rebounder for the Irish. leading the team in both categories last year (17.0 ppg., 6.2 rpg.). She also was a first-team all-BIG EAST and WBCA honorable mention All-America selection, and was a finalist for the 2007 USA U21 World

Allen's backcourt partner and classmate is point guard Tulyah Gaines. Now in her second full season at the helm of the Notre Dame offense, the speedy Gaines averaged 9.6 points per game along with team highs of 3.9 assists and 2.0 steals per contest. She also is a two-year team captain who commands instant respect from teammates, coaches and opponents.

The Irish will benefit from the return of junior guard Lindsay Schrader, who missed the entire 2006-07 season with a torn ACL in her right knee. Schrader, who retains three years of athletic eligibility, was Notre Dame's second-leading scorer (10.5 ppg.) and top rebounder (5.4 rpg.) as a rookie in 2005-06 and will look to regain that form this season.

Last year saw Notre Dame break new ground by becoming the first school ever to put three players on the BIG EAST All-Freshman Team. Guards Ashley Barlow (10.3 ppg., 5.4 rpg.) and Melissa Lechlitner (6.3 ppg., 2.7 apg.) will provide a superb complement to the veteran Allen-Gaines tandem, while center Erica Williamson (6.1 ppg., 5.3 rpg., 1.3 bpg.) showed flashes of potential throughout her rookie season and is poised for increased development this year.

Headlining a three-player freshman class (ranked 11th nationally by Blue Star Basketball) is Devereaux Peters, a smooth 6-2 forward who was a consensus All-American as a senior last year at national powerhouse Fenwick High School in Oak Park, Ill. Fellow post Becca Bruszewski (Valparaiso, Ind.) finished third in last season's Indiana Miss Basketball voting and was a perennial all-state pick. And, guard Brittany Mallory (Baltimore, Md.) offers a perimeter shooting threat, as well as a cerebral player who will mesh well in the Irish offensive system.

2007 was ranked 11th in the nation by Blue Star Basketball, marking the 11th consecutive season that the Irish attracted a Top 25 recruiting class. Notre Dame is one of only three schools (along with Connecticut and Tennessee) to have an active streak of that length.

Texas Tech

Last season, Notre Dame ranked 10th nationally in attendance (6,364 fans per game), marking the seventh consecutive campaign the Irish were among the national top 20 in attendance. Notre Dame also has attracted 5,000-or-more fans to 94 of its last 96 home games, including three Joyce Center sellouts of 11,418 (most recently on Dec. 31, 2005 vs. Tennessee).

Media members also may speak to Irish team personnel before or after practice sessions. While most practices are open to the media, some may be closed at the coaching staff's discretion - contact Chris Masters for the latest practice schedule and availability.

On game days, no interviews will be granted with any Notre Dame player or coach prior to competition.

Credentials / Parking

Season credentials will be issued to all media covering the Irish on a regular basis. Please note - any Notre Dame men's basketball season credentials also offer access to all Irish women's basketball games.

A bank of statistics monitors is located on press row for the media's convenience. Final statistics books include an official NCAA box score and play-by-play. Telephone, copier and fax services are available on a first-come, firstserved basis. The Jovce Center also offers wireless Internet capability- check with Chris Masters for access.

in the WNBA Draft in recent years, as six Notre Dame players have been selected in the past seven seasons. Megan Duffy was the most recent Irish player to be chosen, going to the Minnesota Lynx in the third round (31st overall pick) of the 2006 WNBA Draft. Duffy and Ruth Riley (San Antonio) both have been active in the league during the 2007 season, with Riley making her sixth playoff appearance (on her third different team) in a solid seven-year pro career. All told, seven Notre Dame alums have competed in WNBA regular-season play, with three of them combining to win four league championships - Riley won a pair of crowns with the Detroit Shock (2003 Finals MVP, 2006), Coquese Washington toiled for the 2000 Houston Comets, while Jacqueline Batteast was Riley's teammate on the '06 title-winning squad in Detroit.

Notre Dame has been an elite program in the classroom as well. For the second year in a row, the Irish posted a perfect 100-percent Graduation Success Rate (GSR), according to figures released by the NCAA in October 2007. Notre Dame was one of 23 Division I-A programs to achieve this distinction, and one of only two BIG EAST schools (Syracuse was the other). Furthermore, since Muffet McGraw became the Irish head coach in 1987, every Notre Dame women's basketball player that has completed her athletic and academic eligibility at the University has graduated (a perfect 53-for-53 success rate).

A Quick Look At Miami (Ohio)

Records don't always tell the whole story, and that definitely was the case for Miami (Ohio) last year. The RedHawks went 12-18 (6-10 in the Mid-American Conference East Division), but seven of those losses came by 10 points or less. What's more. MU was above .500 (11-10) entering the final month of the season before dropping seven of its final eight games.

Last year's lessons could translate into this year's successes for Miami, as the RedHawks return 11 letterwinners and all five starters from last year's club. Leading the way is senior guard Amanda Jackson, a first-team all-MAC selection last year who averaged a team-high 17.7 points per game (20.0 ppg in conference play) and 2.7 steals per night. She also is one of the top 10 scorers in school history, currently standing eighth (1,267 pts).

Junior point guard Jenna Schone capably runs the Miami offense, having logged 11.8 points and 4.5 assists per game last year. Classmate and backcourt partner Ashley Hawkins also scored in double figures (10.9 ppg) and was second behind Jackson in steals (2.3 spg).

Head coach Maria Fantanarosa is beginning her 10th season at her alma mater. A 1990 graduate of Miami, she holds a 138-122 (.531) record at the RedHawks' helm and is the winningest coach in program history. She came back to MU after spending the 1997-98 season as the boss at Western Carolina, going 7-20 that year. She has never faced Notre Dame .

The Notre Dame-Miami (Ohio) Series

Friday will mark the sixth meeting in the series between Notre Dame and Miami (Ohio), with the RedHawks holding a 4-1 edge on the Irish. The teams have not played since the 1994-95 season, when MU edged Notre Dame, 79-76 in the consolation game of the Seattle Times Husky Classic.

Three of the five series games have been played at the Joyce Center, with Miami winning twice (93-53 on Jan. 17, 1981; 69-65 on Feb. 17, 1991 - the team's most recent meeting in South Bend). The only Irish win in the series came on Dec. 10, 1982 at the Joyce Center, when Notre Dame took a 64-59 victory behind 16 points and six rebounds from Shari Matvey.

The Last Time Notre Dame And Miami (Ohio) Met

Future All-Americans Katryna Gaither and Beth Morgan combined for 50 points and a .667 field goal percentage, but it wasn't enough as Notre Dame dropped a narrow 79-76 decision to Miami (Ohio) in the consolation game of the Seattle Times Husky Classic on Dec. 28, 1994 at Hec Edmundson Pavilion in Seattle.

Gaither was virtually unstoppable in the paint, collecting a double-double with 26 points (11-16 FG) and 12 rebounds in 32 minutes. Morgan provided a solid complement from the perimeter with 24 points on 9-of-14 shooting. As a team, the Irish shot 54.6 percent from the field (30-of-55) and outrebounded MU. 34-27. However, the difference in the game proved to be bench play and three-point shooting - the RedHawks reserves outscored their Notre Dame counterparts, 17-4 (15 from Meredith Shelley) and made seven triples (compared to only two for the Irish).

Jennifer Wenclewicz led five Miami players in double figures with 17 points, while Lisa Kovack matched Shelley's 15 points for the RedHawks.

Notre Dame made a strong early push, moving out to a 7-2 lead in the first 70 seconds of the game. The Irish still led by three at the 14:44 mark before Miami reeled off 14 unanswered points during the next five minutes to seize control. The 11-point margin held up until the closing moments of the first half, when Notre Dame went on a 9-2 run, but Monica Niemann's putback at the horn gave MU a 37-31 lead at the break.

The RedHawks seemed to pull away for good in the second half, steadily increasing their lead to as much as 69-51 on a Wenclewicz steal and layup with 8:31 left. That's when the Irish got back in the game, using a 16-4 spurt in a span of less than five minutes and getting within 69-67 on a layup by Letitia Bowen with 3:53 to go.

Notre Dame would get as close as two points on two other occasions down the stretch, the last coming at 78-76 when Jeannine Augustin sank two free throws with 12 seconds left. Wenclewicz then left the door open for the Irish by making only one of two foul shots two seconds later, but Notre Dame was unable to convert on a last-ditch three-point attempt to force overtime.

- Miami assistant coach Heather Oesterle was on the Michigan roster (but didn't see action) when the Wolverines fell to Notre Dame, 88-54 in the second round of the 2001 NCAA Tournament at the Joyce Center. The following season, Oesterle came off the bench to log one point, one rebound and two assists in 10 minutes of a 78-63 UM victory at the Women's College Basketball Showcase in Grand Rapids, Mich.
- Notre Dame sophomore guard Melissa Lechlitner and freshman forward Becca Bruszewski played alongside Miami sophomore guard Courtney Reed with the Indiana Elite AAU squad that is based at Midwest Basketball Academy in Mishawaka, Ind.; MU junior center Stephanie Ford also is a product of that AAU program.
- Lechlitner and Reed also were teammates (along with Irish sophomore guard Ashley Barlow) on the 2006 Indiana All-Star Team that swept a two-game series vs. the Kentucky All-Stars.
- Miami senior forward/center Jaclyn Leininger is a native of Winona Lake, Ind., (located approximately halfway between South Bend and Fort Wayne) and a 2004 graduate of Warsaw Community High School, where she led Class 4A in scoring as a senior (25.3 ppg.) on the way to earning Indiana Miss Basketball honors.
- Notre Dame senior guard/tri-captain Amanda Tsipis is a native of Perry, Ohio, and a 2004 graduate of Perry High School. She departed as the Pirates' No. 2 all-time scorer and was a three-time all-state selection, in addition to being tabbed a finalist for the Wendy's High School Heisman Award in the state of Ohio. Tsipis is the ninth Ohio product to suit for the Irish in the program's 31-year

Notre Dame is 30-14 (.682) all-time against the current Mid-American Conference alignment, including a 19-4 (.826) record at home. The Irish also sport a 15-5 (.750) record against MAC schools in the Muffet McGraw era, with a 10-1 (.909) ledger at home.

Notre Dame also has won its last 13 games against current MAC schools since an 87-

64 loss at Northern Illinois on March 10, 1995 in the semifinals of the Midwestern Collegiate Conference Tournament. Last year, the Irish swept home games against Central (88-66), Michigan league champion and NCAA Sweet 16 participant Bowling Green (85-81 in overtime) and Western Michigan (87-67).

are the first of three MAC opponents for the Irish this season, with road games at Central Michigan (Nov. 20) and Bowling Green (Dec. 5) on the slate in the next month.

In an interesting twist, Notre Dame will be facing a MAC school in its Preseason WNIT opener for the second time in three tournament appearances. In 1996, the Irish tipped off their season (which ended at the NCAA Women's Final Four in Cincinnati) with a 66-41 conquest of Kent State at the Joyce Center.

Blowing The Lid Off

Notre Dame is 22-8 (.733) all-time in season openers and takes a 12-game winning streak into Friday's game with Miami (Ohio). The Irish also are 17-3 (.850) in season openers in the Muffet McGraw era, with their last season-opening loss coming on Nov. 26, 1994 (65-60 in overtime to No. 25 Seton Hall).

Notre Dame also has done well in its first home game of the season, going 22-8 (.733) in Joyce Center lidlifters, including an active 12game winning streak and a 16-4 (.800) under McGraw. The last Irish home-opening loss was Nov. 30, 1994, when 13th-ranked Purdue edged out Notre Dame, 87-83.

Getting An Early Start

Friday's game will mark the earliest season debut for the Irish in their 31-year history, one day sooner than last year's 88-66 win over Central Michigan at the Joyce Center.

Late Night With The Irish

For the third time in four seasons, Notre Dame will open its season with a 9 p.m. (ET) game at the Joyce Center. In 2004, the Irish opened their run to the Preseason WNIT championship with a 92-73 win over Illinois State. A year later, Notre Dame outlasted Michigan, 55-45 to get its season off to a solid start.

The late tip time is needed because of the regularly-scheduled football pep rally, which will start at approximately 6 p.m. (ET), following the conclusion of the Irish volleyball match vs. Cincinnati.

Preseason WNIT Rewind

For the second time in four years, but just the third time in school history, Notre Dame is taking part in the Preseason Women's National Invitation Tournament (WNIT). The Irish are 7-1 (.875) all-time in the tournament, including a 5-0 record when playing at home.



Notre Dame last played in the Preseason WNIT in 2004, winning the championship with victories over Illinois State (92-73), Nebraska (73-57), No. 6 Duke (76-65) and No. 10/9 Ohio State (66-62), all at the Joyce Center. **Jacqueline Batteast** was named the event's Most Valuable Player after scoring a career-high 32 points in the final against OSU. **Megan Duffy** also earned a place on the all-tournament team. On the strength of their WNIT crown, the Irish moved as high as third in the national polls, finished as the BIG EAST Conference runner-up,

and made a trip to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Notre Dame also participated in the 1996 Preseason WNIT, advancing to the semifinals after defeating Kent State (66-41) and No. 6 lowa (61-50). Following a 72-59 loss to No. 3/2 Tennessee in the semifinals at Ruston, La., the Irish bounced back to defeat No. 8/12 North Carolina

State, 64-53 in the third-place game (which no longer exists). **Katryna Gaither** was named to the all-tournament team after making a tournament-record 42 field goals in the four-game set (a record that still stands). Notre Dame went on to log a 31-7 record in 1996-97, advancing to its first NCAA Final Four.

The Irish will be looking to continue the BIG EAST's run of success in the Preseason WNIT. BIG EAST teams have reached the tournament championship game four times in the past six years and six times in the event's 13-year history. In addition to Notre Dame's 2004 crown, Connecticut won titles in 1997, 2001 and 2005, while Rutgers has been the tourney runner-up in 1998 and 2003. Purdue is the defending Preseason WNIT champion, taking a 69-55 win at Baylor in last year's title game.

Polling Station

For the first time since the 2005-06 season, Notre Dame is appearing in the Associated Press Top 25 poll, checking in at No. 24 in the preseason edition of the media survey announced Nov.

3. The Irish last were ranked in the AP poll during the week of Jan. 23, 2005, when they were slotted 21st before losses at Rutgers (69-43) and at home to South Florida (68-64, ot) knocked them out of the AP Top 25.

Notre Dame has been ranked in the AP poll for 140 weeks during the program's history, with every one of those appearances coming in the **Muffet**

Exhibition Game #1 Recap: Southern Indiana

Behind a frenetic defense and a crisp offense, Notre Dame tipped off the 2007-08 exhibition season with a 90-38 rout of NCAA Division II member Southern Indiana on Nov. 1 before a crowd of 5,252 at the Joyce Center. The 52point margin punctuated the largest exhibition win in program history, and also was the 22nd consecutive preseason victory for Notre Dame as well as its 27th exhibition win in 28 outings during the past 15 years.

Sophomore center **Erica Williamson** led a potent inside attack for Notre Dame, scoring a game-high 18 points (7-10 FG) while adding six rebounds and four blocks in only 17 minutes of action. Freshman forward **Devereaux Peters** chipped in 16 points and seven rebounds off the bench, while senior center **Melissa D'Amico** also bolstered the Irish post game in a reserve role with a double-double (11 points, game-high 10 rebounds) in 15 minutes. Notre Dame wound up outscoring the Screaming Eagles in the paint, 54-2 and shot an even 48 percent (36-of-75) on the night.

Not to be overlooked, sophomore guard **Ashley Barlow** turned in a superb all-around effort with 13 points on 6-of-10 shooting, four rebounds, five assists and five steals. Junior guard **Lindsay Schrader** also made her return to action after a year-long layoff with a torn ACL, finishing with eight points, seven rebounds and four assists.

As a team, Notre Dame was outstanding at the defensive end, forcing 37 USI turnovers and holding the Screaming Eagles to a .240 field goal percentage (12-of-50). The Irish also parlayed those 37 takeaways into 44 points at the offensive end. Carly Clendenen was the lone USI player to score in double figures, finishing with 11 points.

Notre Dame wasted little time in taking control of Thursday's game, scoring 16 of first 18 points in a little more than six minutes. Southern Indiana battled back to within 20-8 when Jasmine Baines hit a jumper with 11:41 left in the first half. The Irish then stepped on the gas and pulled clear of the Screaming Eagles, going on a 31-5 run to end the period.

The second half proved to be much of the same, as Barlow converted a fast break layup to hike the Notre Dame lead to 66-16 with 14:35 to play. The Irish would remain in front by at least 45 points the rest of the way, opening up its largest margin at 84-27 on a layup by freshman forward **Becca Bruszewski** at the 5:45 mark.

Exhibition Game #2 Recap: Hillsdale

Senior guard **Tulyah Gaines** scored a team-high 16 points to lead six players in double figures as No. 24 Notre Dame defeated Hillsdale, 96-64 in an exhibition game on Monday night before a crowd of 5,325 at the Joyce Center. With their 23rd consecutive preseason victory, the Irish improved to 31-5 (.861) all-time in exhibition play, including a 28-1 (.966) mark in the past 15 years.

Gaines connected on eight of 11 shots from the floor, helping Notre Dame to a .506 field goal percentage for the night. Sophomore guard **Ashley Barlow** ended up with 13 points, five rebounds and a game-high five steals. Freshman guard **Brittany Mallory** came off the bench to toss in 11 points, while three veteran guards added 10 points apiece — senior **Charel Allen**, junior **Lindsay Schrader** and sophomore **Melissa Lechlitner**.

Katie Cezat scored a game-high 23 points on 11-of-22 shooting, and grabbed eight rebounds for NCAA Division II member Hillsdale, which was making its season debut on Monday. Julie Slot chipped in 20 points for the Chargers before fouling out with six minutes to play.

Following much the same pattern as its first exhibition outing, Notre Dame jumped to a 6-0 lead in the first 91 seconds, as Schrader stuck back a pair of offensive rebounds and added a jumper in the lane. Hillsdale answered with four consecutive points, but the Irish countered with an 11-2 run, including seven points from freshman forward **Devereaux Peters**, to push their lead into double figures, where it would remain the rest of the way.

Yet, the Chargers stayed within striking distance, playing Notre Dame even for the next six minutes before Barlow reeled off seven consecutive points to push the Irish on top, 42-22 with 3:35 to go in the first half. Hillsdale got the lead back to 16 points, but Notre Dame went over the half-century mark just before halftime on two Mallory free throws, going to the locker room with a 51-32 edge.

The Irish began the second half like they did the first, ringing up eight unanswered points in the opening 2:37 of action. The Chargers then put together their best offensive surge of the night with an 11-3 spurt, capped by a threepointer from **Kara McCormick** at the 12:43 mark that trimmed the Notre Dame lead to 62-43. The Irish then put Hillsdale away for good with a 16-5 run during the ensuing five minutes and the Chargers never got closer than 27 points the rest of the way.

Irish Picked Fifth In BIG EAST Poll

Notre Dame was projected to finish fifth in the BIG EAST Conference this season, according to a preseason vote of the league's 16 head coaches that was announced Oct. 25 during BIG EAST Women's Basketball Media Day at the ESPNZone in New York City. The Irish collected 165 points, with Connecticut (15 first-place votes, 225 points), Rutgers (one first-place vote, 211 points), West Virginia (186 points) and Pittsburgh (169 points) joining Notre Dame in the top five.

Senior guard **Charel Allen** was one of 11 players selected to this year's Preseason All-BIG EAST Team. Allen averaged a team-high 17.0 points and 6.2 rebounds per game last season and ranked second in the BIG EAST with 19.3 points per game in league play. She went on to earn first-team all-BIG EAST and honorable mention All-America laurels. while helping the Irish go 20-12 and reach the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Half And Half

During the past eight seasons, Notre Dame has been nearly unbeatable when it has the lead at halftime. The Irish are 124-12 (.912) since the start of the 2000-01 campaign when they go into the dressing room with the lead, including wins in 52 of their last 58 such contests. Notre Dame led at the break 17 times last year, winning on 15 occasions. The only blemishes came at Pittsburgh (Jan. 31) and against DePaul in the first round of the BIG EAST Championship (March 3).

The Best Offense Is A Good Defense...

During the past 13 seasons, Notre Dame has discovered that a solid defensive effort can almost certainly guarantee a victory. In fact, since the beginning of the 1995-96 season (Notre Dame's first in the BIG EAST Conference), the Irish have an amazing 168-10 (.944) record when they hold their opponents to less than 60 points in a game. Notre Dame held 10 foes under 60 points last season, going 9-1 in those games (losing only to Indiana).

...But Sometimes You Have To Score If You Want To Win

Not resting solely on its defensive laurels, Notre Dame also seemingly has found the magic mark when it comes to outscoring its opponents. During the past 13 seasons (1995-96 to present), the Irish are 100-3 (.971) when they score at least 80 points in a game. The only blemishes on that record are a pair of overtime losses to Texas A&M (88-84) and Michigan State (87-83) in 1995 and a 106-81 loss to Connecticut in 1998.

Notre Dame topped the 80-point mark nine times last season, winning each time (Central Michigan, Bowling Green, Western Michigan, Richmond, Prairie View A&M, Cincinnati, St. John's, Syracuse and Providence). The nine 80-point games were the most for the Irish in a single season since 2000-01, when Notre Dame reached that level 15 times during its run to the national championship.

Now That's A Home Court Advantage

One of the hallmarks of Notre Dame's success has been its stellar play at home. In fact, the Irish have been virtually untouchable at home in recent years, winning 149 of their last 167 games (.892) at the 11,418-seat Joyce Center, including winning streaks of 51 and 25 games in that span. Notre Dame also has an 87-13 (.870) record in BIG EAST Conference play at the Joyce Center, sporting a 31-game league winning streak at home before it ended with a 48-45 loss to Villanova in the '02 home finale.

The Irish have been particularly strong when it comes to non-conference games at home, winning 64 of their last 69 non-BIG EAST contests (.928) at the Joyce Center, dating back to the 1994-95 season. Four of the losses in that span came at the hands of Big Ten Conference opponents – Wisconsin in 1996 (81-69), Purdue in 2003 (71-54), Michigan State in 2004 (82-73 OT) and Indiana in 2006 (54-51) – with the fifth defeat coming to Tennessee in 2005 (62-51). The Purdue



loss also snapped a 33-game non-conference home winning streak which began after the UW setback.

Since its inaugural season in 1977-78, Notre Dame has played all of its games at the Joyce Center, posting a 299-79 (.791) record at the venerable facility. Three times (1999-2000, 2000-01 and 2003-04), the Irish went a perfect 15-0 at home, setting a school record for home wins in a season. For the third time in four years, and the second consecutive season, Notre Dame will equal the most regular-season home games (16) in school history. However, in 2004-05, the Irish played host to all four rounds of the Preseason WNIT before its regular 12-game home slate began. Notre Dame also will play at least two Preseason WNIT games at home this season, in addition to its previously-scheduled 14-game Joyce Center docket.

Notre Dame On The Small Screen

Notre Dame will have a school-record 22 regular-season games televised during the upcoming 2007-08 season. Highlighting this year's television schedule are nine nationally-televised Irish women's basketball contests, including one appearance on CBS (Jan. 5 vs. Tennessee), four games on the ESPN family of networks, and another four contests on CSTV.

In addition, Notre Dame has expanded its broadcast reach globally on the Internet. All Irish home games (11 regular-season, two exhibition) that have not been selected for commercial TV coverage will be televised live on the official Notre Dame athletics web site, *UND.com*.

This year's TV slate continues a recent trend that has seen the Irish become a regular fixture on television. Since the start of its 2000-01 NCAA championship season, Notre Dame has played in 92 televised games, including 52 that were broadcast nationally.

Oh Captain, My Captain

Senior guards **Charel Allen, Tulyah Gaines** and **Amanda Tsipis** are team captains for the 2007-08 season. Gaines is in her second year as a captain for the Irish, while Allen and Tsipis are first-time captains. All three players received the captain's honor through a vote of their teammates prior to the season.

Joyce Center Arena Renovation On Tap

On Oct. 3, 2007, Notre Dame announced that construction on the Joyce Center arena addition and renovation will begin in September 2008. The University has selected the architects for the project, and they currently are in the process of completing final design plans.

The first phase of the project, to begin next September, involves construction of a new three-story structure at the south end of the arena. That structure will include a new twostory lobby, the Notre Dame ticket operations (approximately 4,500 square feet) and a varsity shop to sell apparel and souvenirs (approximately 3,000 square feet), in addition to a new club seating and hospitality area.

Replacement of the Joyce Center arena seating, including installation of chair-back

seating throughout the arena, is expected to take place after the University's Commencement Exercises in May 2009. The project is scheduled for completion in January 2010. The arena is expected to re-open by mid-October 2009, in time for the start of the men's and women's basketball seasons and the end of the women's volleyball season.

The University announced last October that this \$26.3 million project had received a \$12.5 million leadership gift from Notre Dame alumnus and Trustee **Philip J. Purcell III.** A month later, another major gift of \$5 million from Notre Dame graduate **Vincent J. Naimoli** was announced.

The arena will be named Purcell Pavilion at the Joyce Center — and the new club/hospitality area and two outdoor patios will be named for the Naimoli family.

Irish Fans Crave A Big Mac Attack

Notre Dame has introduced a new promotion this season, offering fans a coupon for a free Big Mac from South Bend-area McDonald's restaurants if the Irish score at least 88 points in a game. The coupons are issued at the Joyce Center gates as fans leave the arena following the game.

Next Game: Preseason WNIT

With a victory, Notre Dame would meet the winner of the Western Kentucky/East Tennessee State game in the Preseason WNIT quarterfinals Tuesday at 7 p.m. (ET) at the Joyce Center. The Irish have never faced either school in women's basketball.

Should Notre Dame lose to Miami (Ohio), it would be placed in a pool with the other losing teams from the first round of the Preseason WNIT. Those squads would be placed in a pair of four-team consolation brackets (matchups TBA based upon geographic considerations and preventing matchups vs. '07-08 regularseason opponents) — two schools will be chosen to host the consolation games, which will take place Nov. 16-17.

Notre Dame Student-Athletes Rank Among Nation's Best

Eighteen of 22 athletics programs at the University of Notre Dame compiled graduation rates of 100 percent, and none were below 90 percent, according to the third year of Graduation Success Rate measurements developed by the NCAA and released Oct. 3.

None of the 120 Division I-A football-playing programs in the country had a higher percentage of 100 GSR scores than did Notre Dame with its .818 figure.

NCAA figures showed that, among Notre Dame's men's sports, baseball, cross country/track, fencing, ice hockey, soccer, swimming and tennis achieved 100 percent GSR scores. Lacrosse scored 97 percent, football scored 93 percent, golf was 91 percent and basketball was 91 percent. The same seven Irish men's programs also scored 100 percent in both the 2005 and 2006 data.

All 11 Irish women's programs posted a GSR of 100 percent — basketball, cross country/track, fencing, golf, lacrosse, rowing, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis and volleyball. That's one more perfect score than a year ago for the Irish women, after soccer scored a 94 percent GSR in 2006.

Rowing, like men's lacrosse, was included for the first time last year in 2006 for Notre Dame, because the University offered grants in aid during the years covered in the survey. Beyond rowing, the other nine Irish women's programs earning 100 percent ratings in 2006 also earned 100 percent figures in 2005.

In 2005, among the 119 NCAA Division I-A football-playing institutions, Notre Dame had the highest percentage of its sports with 100 percent scores, with a .800 figure (16 of 20). The 2006 data put Notre Dame's percentage at .773 (17 of 22), to rank second behind the U.S. Naval Academy. The 2007 data put Notre Dame's percentage at .818 (18 of 22), which again ranks number one.

The GSR was created two years ago by the NCAA to more accurately reflect actual graduation rates by including transfer data in the calculation. The graduation rate methodology used by the Department of Education counts all student-athletes who transfer from or leave an institution for any reason as non-graduates from their initial school, even if they leave in good academic standing.

The 2007 national GSR for Division I-A is 77 percent, the same as a year ago (and up one percent from the 76 figure in 2005).

The 2007 GSR data is based on entering classes from 1997 to 2000. The 2006 GSR data was based on entering classes from 1996 to 1999. The 2005 first-year GSR data was based upon the entering classes from 1995 to 1998.

Academic All-Americans

Entering the 2006-07 academic year, Notre Dame ranks second in the nation with 176 Academic All-America® selections, including 14 last year alone. The Academic All-America® Program is administered by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA), whose membership votes on the award winners, and the program is sponsored this year by ESPN The Magazine.

The Notre Dame women's basketball program has produced five Academic All-America® honorees in its 30-year history, with those five players winning a total of seven citations. In addition, two-time first-team Academic All-America® pick **Ruth Riley** was tapped as the 2001 Academic All-America® Women's Basketball Team Member of the Year, as well as the Academic All-America® Team Member of the Year. Riley also is one of only 10 student-athletes in Notre Dame history to earn All-American and Academic All-America® honors twice in her career.

In 2006, **Megan Duffy** was named a first-team Academic All-America® selection, becoming the second Irish player ever to attain that distinction. Duffy graduated in May 2006 with a 3.576 grade-point average (GPA) and a degree in psychology and computer applications from Notre Dame's College of Arts and Letters. She also garnered Dean's List honors in four of her final five semesters (spring 2004, fall 2004, spring 2005, fall 2005).
