NOTRE DAME-DUKE HISTORY

- Notre Dame leads the all-time series, 14-1, and has won each of the last 12 meetings since an 80-62 Blue Devil victory on Nov. 22, 1997 at Cameron Indoor Arena.
- At 15 games, the Duke series is by far Notre Dame's longest against any ACC school which was not also once a fellow member of the BIG EAST Conference, doubling the eight-game histories against Georgia Tech and North Carolina.
- The Irish hold an 8-0 record against Duke since Notre Dame joined the ACC for the 2013-14 season, recording a 5-0 record in regular-season contests and a 3-0 record in the ACC Tournament. The Irish and Blue Devils have yet to miss each other in the league's annual showcase, colliding in the 2014 final, 2015 semifinals and 2016 quarterfinals.
- In addition to the three ACC Tournament games, Notre Dame and Duke have met on two other instances in the post-season. The Irish downed the Blue Devils, 87-76, in a 2013 NCAA Elite Eight game played in Norfolk, Virginia. Notre Dame also beat Duke, 74-67 in the 1986 WNIT semifinals.
- Duke is the third school Notre Dame has ever faced in four consecutive conference championships, joining Dayton (1990-93 MCC) and UConn (1996-99 and 2010-13 BIG EAST).
- On Jan. 26 at Notre Dame, **Brianna Turner** scored 25 points with 12 rebounds while **Lindsay Allen** contributed a career-high-tying 12 assists as the Irish beat Duke, 62-58. Both teams shot under 40% in the evenly-played defense-heavy battle.

CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT SUCCESS

- The Irish ride a 14-game conference tournament winning streak into Sunday's game, including a perfect 11-0 mark in ACC play.
- Overall, Notre Dame is 47-19 in conference tournament play, including its time in the MCC (now Horizon League), BIG EAST and ACC.
- The Irish are vying for their 10th conference tournament championship and fifth in a row. Nationally, only Notre Dame, Albany (America East) and Baylor (Big 12) have won their conference tournament each of the past four years.
- This marks the eighth consecutive year the Irish have played for a conference tournament championship, previously going 4-3. The Irish fell to UConn in 2010-12 (all played in Hartford), downed the Huskies in the 2013 BIG EAST final at the XL Center, and then won ACC crowns against Duke (2014), Florida State (2015) and Syracuse (2016).
- Notre Dame is playing a conference tournament on a neutral floor for just the fourth time - all coming in the ACC era.
- With the Virginia win, the Irish have won at least one game in each of their last nine conference tournaments, dating back to a 2008 loss to Pittsburgh in its BIG EAST Tournament opener at the XL Center in Hartford.

IRISH AMONG HOTTEST TEAMS IN THE COUNTRY

- Notre Dame currently rides a 13-game winning streak which stands as the seventh-longest active winning streak nationally after Ohio State's loss to Purdue on Saturday. The Irish have not lost since a Jan. 16 setback at Tennessee.
- The Irish also won each of their last 15 ACC games of the year. The run ties New Mexico State (WAC) for the fourth-longest active conference winning streak in the country.
- Helping the Irish to these runs has been its success away from Purcell Pavilion. The Irish went 12-2 on the road this year. As of Monday, only UConn (14) and Belmont (13) had more road wins in 2016-17.

IRISH AIMING FOR ACC, NATIONAL HISTORY

- The Irish have claimed their sixth consecutive outright regular season conference title and are now in position to extend a couple of historic tournament championship streaks.
- The Irish are vying for their fourth consecutive dual outright ACC regular season and tournament championships, a feat only previously accomplished in the league by Duke from 2001-04.
- Including the final days of BIG EAST membership, Notre Dame is looking for five consecutive dual outright regular season and conference tournament championships, a feat no one else can actively claim.

CONSISTENT WINNERS

• Notre Dame has been one of the best teams in the nation on an annual basis in recent vintage. Over the past six seasons (2011-12 through Friday night), only UConn (214) has won more games than Notre Dame's 205. Baylor has claimed 204. Stanford (181) and Maryland (180) round out the top five.

IRISH SHOOT FOR 30

• Notre Dame is in search of its 30th win of the season on Sunday. It would mark the seventh consecutive 30-win season for Notre Dame and the ninth in school history, joining the 1996-97 and 2000-01 squads.
 • Nationally, only UConn has a longer active streak of 30-win seasons at 12. Baylor matches the Irish with a streak that began in 2010-11.

ALLEN, TURNER, YOUNG AND BOLEY HONORED BY ACC

• **Brianna Turner** stopped plenty of opponents this winter and the ACC's coaches couldn't be stopped from recognizing her as the league's defensive player of the year. She also won the accolade in 2015-16 and was the ACC's rookie of the year in 2014-15.
 • The junior center leads the ACC, and ranks 15th nationally in blocked shots with 78 on the year. Her 255 career blocked shots already rank 11th in ACC history and second in Irish lore behind only Ruth Riley's 370. Turner is eighth among all active players in blocked shots and second among her peers in the junior class. The centerpiece in a defense which held its foes to 61.2 points per game and a .393 shooting percentage while facing the nation's second-toughest schedule, Turner also has 26 steals and 7.3 rebounds per game.
 • On Tuesday, Turner and **Lindsay Allen** were named to the Blue Ribbon Panel's all-ACC first team while **Jackie Young** was named all-freshman.
 • Allen has yet to miss a start in her 144 games at Notre Dame and, on Friday, broke the school's and ACC's career assist record. She now has 798. On the season, she has helped 239 buckets, ranking third on the school's single-season chart. Allen both leads the ACC and ranks among the top six nationally in assists, assists per game and assist to turnover ratio. She chips in 9.1 points per game and has 72 steals to place among the league leaders there as well.
 • Young has averaged 7.3 points her game in her debut campaign for the Irish, appearing in 28 of the team's 32 games. She has averaged 4.6 rebounds per game, fourth on the squad. Her career-high 12 rebounds proved to be crucial in the narrow Feb. 19 win at No. 21 Syracuse. An athletic presence whose defense has continued to improve along with her renowned scoring touch, Young also contributed 36 assists and 26 steals while blocking eight shots. She was named the ACC Rookie of the Week twice this year, claiming the prize on both Dec. 5 and Feb. 13.
 • Also, **Erin Boley** earned a spot on the ACC's All-Academic team for her combination of good grades and good play.

McGRAW NAMED HALL OF FAME FINALIST

• Already enshrined in the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, **Muffet McGraw** took the penultimate step towards the sport's ultimate lifetime honor as she was included on the list of 14 finalists for the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame's Class of 2017, announced on Feb. 18.
 • Also a finalist for enshrinement in 2016, McGraw will learn if she is one of the latest enshrines on April 3 at the men's

basketball Final Four in Glendale, Arizona. Joining McGraw as women's committee finalists are Rebecca Lobo, Kim Mulkey and the pioneering teams from Wayland Baptist University as a collective unit.

• McGraw, who guided the Irish to the 2001 national championship and seven Final Four appearances, is the winningest single-sport coach in Irish lore with 761 wins. Over her 30-year coaching career, McGraw is 849-267 (.761), making her the sixth-winningest active coach nationally and the 10th-winningest all-time at the Division I level.
 • She is the 2017 recipient of the Wooden Awards' Legends of Coaching Award, becoming just the third female to receive this honor, joining Tennessee's Pat Summitt and Stanford's Tara VanDerveer. She is the fourth women's coach to be recognized with this honor, joining Summitt, VanDerveer and UConn's Geno Auriemma.
 • Among her many accomplishments, McGraw is one of five coaches (men's or women's) in Division I history with 800 wins, seven Final Fours and five NCAA title game appearances, joining the elite company of Summitt, Auriemma, Duke men's coach Mike Krzyzewski and the late North Carolina men's coach Dean Smith, all of whom are enshrined in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.
 • She is also the only coach to be named the consensus national coach of the year three times, sweeping the Associated Press, Women's Basketball Coaches Association, Naismith Award and United States Basketball Writers Association honors in 2001, 2013 and 2014.

McGRAW WINS 750TH GAME AT NOTRE DAME

• The Women's Basketball Hall of Fame career of **Muffet McGraw** reached yet another milestone as she claimed her 750th win at Notre Dame on Jan. 22 at North Carolina.
 • She is one of just four women (and seven overall) to win at least 750 women's basketball games at a single Division I school, joining Pat Summitt (Tennessee), Tara VanDerveer (Stanford) and Jody Conradt (Texas).
 • McGraw's 849 career wins overall including her five years at Lehigh are the sixth-most all-time by a female Division I women's basketball coach (10th overall).
 • All of the other women on these two charts are also enshrined in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame, an honor for which McGraw was a finalist in 2016.

• Notre Dame's current 11-game ACC Tournament winning streak is the longest since North Carolina won 13 in a row from 2005-09.
 • The Irish have lost no more than one ACC league game each of the past four years - the longest such streak in conference history. Duke went three consecutive years from 2002-04 with no more than one ACC loss per season.
 • The first loss came at Miami on Jan. 8, 2015, and the Irish won all 29 regular season games and 35 games in a row vs. ACC teams including conference tournament play until the Dec. 29, 2016, loss at NC State.
 • The 35-game ACC streak including tournament games is the 15th-longest in NCAA history and the second-longest in ACC history behind a 51-game run by Duke from 2001-04.

2016-17 Notre Dame Women's Basketball Game Notes

- The 29-game ACC regular season winning streak is the 24th-longest such streak in NCAA history and the second-longest in ACC history behind just a 42-game run by Duke from 2001-04.
- The Irish maintain an active streak of 32 consecutive home wins in ACC play, part of an overall streak of 42 consecutive home league wins including the final years of Notre Dame's BIG EAST membership.

ALLEN SETS CAREER RECORDS, CLOSES IN ON SEASON

- **Lindsay Allen's** name appears countless places in Notre Dame's record book and she moved up the final rung on two major career-leaders chart on March 3 when she surpassed **Mary Gavin's** 30-year old school record of 778 and **Shanee Zoll's** ACC career record of 785. She set both marks in Notre Dame's ACC quarterfinal victory over Virginia as she had 10 assists, marking her seventh double-digit assist game of the season.
- Allen has reached this total at a clip of 5.4 assists per game - third in Irish lore behind **Mary Gavin** (7.0) and **Ivey** (5.5).

- Allen could match another school record on Sunday as she tries for her third-consecutive double-digit assist game. Allen did it earlier this year against North Carolina (11 on Jan. 22), Duke (12 on Jan. 26) and Virginia (10 on Jan. 29). It had only previously been done at Notre Dame by Gavin who did it four times, most recently in 1988.

MATCHING MILLENNIAL MILESTONES

- Less than two minutes into the Iowa game on Nov. 30, **Brianna Turner** became the 36th player in Irish lore to crack the 1,000 career point plateau when **Marina Mabrey** lobbed a pass over the arms of a defender in the paint.
- **Lindsay Allen** had previously hit the 1,000-point marker this season during the game on Nov. 17 against Green Bay.
- Notre Dame last had two players reach the 1,000 career point plateau in the same season in 2013 when **Kayla McBride** and **Natalie Achonwa** each hit the millennial mark. Seven other Irish teams also saw two players hit the milestone but the school record of three was set back in 1985 (**Trena Keys**, **Mary Beth Schueth** and **Carrie Bates**).

TURNER SWATS AWAY 200TH SHOT

- As a part of a six-block night at Chattanooga on Dec. 27, junior **Brianna Turner** recorded her 200th career blocked shot when she rejected Jasmine Joyner's shot with 8:19 left in the third quarter for her fourth block of the game.
- Turner is the third Irish player with 200 career blocks, joining **Ruth Riley** (370) and **Devereaux Peters** (227).
- Turner ranks tied for eighth among all active players nationally with her 255 career blocks and second among juniors.
- Additionally, Turner's 255 blocks rank 11th in ACC history. The next benchmark is the Top 10. Chante Black of Duke holds 10th position currently with 261 career blocks from 2005-09.
- Turner has found her shot-blocking form of late. After swatting away just 14 shots over Notre Dame's first 11 games, she has recorded 64 blocks in the past 21 games, an average of 3.0 per game that exceeds her career average of 2.7 blocked shots per game.

- Junior **Brianna Turner** is seldom shy about shooting the ball, taking 934 shots to date in her 97-game Irish career (9.6 shots per game). Where she has been historically great though is her conversion rate on her shots.
- Turner has connected on 581 of her 934 career field goals for a .622 percentage. This success rate stands second in Irish lore (trailing just **Ruth Riley's** .632) and fourth in ACC history.

- Senior **Lindsay Allen** has proved to be both dependable and durable throughout her Irish career and those numbers are reflected in her standing on several Notre Dame career record charts. The point guard has never missed a start in her Notre Dame career and seldom even leaves the court. Eight times this season (and 12 times in her career), Allen has played all 40 minutes of a game.
- Allen's streak of 144 consecutive starts has long since set a school record and she is now tied for the most total starts in school history alongside **Skylar Diggins** (2009-13).
- ND boasts a 134-9 (.937) record in games started by Allen.
- Allen ranks second in school history with 4,365 career minutes played. Fittingly, Allen had two assists in the milestone 4,000th minute of her career, coming Jan. 26 vs. Duke.
