### JUNIOR SEASON (2017-18)

- Sidelined with knee pain for the final two games of the season (vs. Hampton and Penn State in the NIT).
- Matched his career-high for rebounds (7) in just 11 minutes of action against Pittsburgh (2/28/18).
- Contributed a solid 13 minutes in the win over Florida State (2/10/18) with five points and two rebounds. His shot-clock-beating jumper at the top of the key with 6:58 left put the Irish up five points at a key time in the contest.
- Played 19 minutes (second-highest total of his career) at Duke (1/29/18). Logged solid minutes against Virginia Tech (1/27/18) and pulled down a career-high seven rebounds, including three offensive boards.
- Made his first career start at Georgia Tech (1/10/18), finishing with two points and three rebounds in 15 minutes of action.
- Played the best game of his career back in his home state at Syracuse (1/6/18), logging a career-high 21 minutes with seven points - and made two key plays down the stretch of the victory.
- His put back with 4:45 remaining cut the Syracuse lead to one point and he followed with two clutch free throws with 59 seconds remaining to put the Irish up 49-46 in the game's final minute. The Irish would go on to win 51-49.
- Grabbed six rebounds in 13 minutes of action against Southeastern Louisiana (12/21/17).
- Broke out for seven points against Mount St. Mary's (11/13/17), playing 15 minutes and hitting his first career three-point field goal.
- First big man off the bench in Notre Dame's season-opening victory at DePaul (11/11/17).

### SOPHOMORE SEASON (2016-17)

- Ended up appearing in 11 games during his first active year with the program, including four ACC game appearances.
- Logged eight minutes of action against North Carolina A&T (12/4/16).
- Recorded his first official field goal, a dunk, in the victory over Chicago State (11/26/16) also posting three rebounds.
- Saw his first action in a Notre Dame uniform in the season-opening victory over Bryant (11/12/16), playing six minutes and hitting five-of-six free throws.

### FRESHMAN SEASON (2015-16)

- Did not play in 2015-16 after recovering from offseason ankle surgery.

### HIGH SCHOOL

- Spent three years at LaSalle Institute in his hometown of Troy, NY, before transferring to Blair Academy in Blairstown, NJ, where he played two years.
- Blair Academy program has produced current National Basketball Association players Luol Deng, Royal Ivey and Charlie Villanueva.
- Underwent ankle surgery in March of 2015 and was unable to participate

in any postseason events.

- Invited to play in Jordan Brand Regional All-Star game.
- Earned a spot on the 2014 U18 United States squad that played in the Albert Schweitzer Tournament in Mannheim, Germany, an international basketball competition held every two years and played between junior youth national basketball teams. Helped his team to the silver medal in the 16-team competition after losing to Italy in the championship game.
- Member of Albany City Rocks from 2012-14 and guided two of his squads to consecutive top-three finishes at the national championships -- second place (2014) and third place (2013).

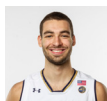

## SOPHOMORE SEASON (2017-18)

- Matched his career high with nine rebounds in 25 minutes in the NIT opening win over Hampton (3/13/18).
- Played 34 turnover-free minutes at Wake Forest (2/24/18) while pulling down a career-best nine rebounds.
- With Rex Pflueger missing the Miami (FL) game due to injury, played a career-high 37 minutes against the Hurricanes, scoring seven points and grabbing five rebounds.
- Stepped up in a crucial time in the second half at Boston College (2/6/18) with Rex Pflueger sidelined after taking a hard fall on a drive to the basket. Took over defensive responsibilities for BC's Jerome Robinson while also making key plays on offense - including a big three-point field goal when BC had cut the Irish lead to nine points with 5:32 remaining in the game.
- Hit double-digit scoring for the second time in his career at No. 4/5 Duke (1/29/18), finishing with 10 points.
- Made his first career start against Virginia Tech (1/27/18), becoming the first Canadian-born player to start at game at Notre Dame. Finished the game by playing 34 minutes with three points, two blocks and a steal.
- Stepped up in the battle with No. 20/18 North Carolina (1/13/18), scoring a career-high 12 points with four rebounds - hitting back-to-back three pointers late in the game to give the Irish a six-point lead in an eventual one-point loss.
- Played 24 minutes at Georgia Tech (1/10/18) and responded with five points and three rebounds.
- Missed the game against Southeastern Louisiana (12/21/17) while he recovered from an illness.
- Logged seven key minutes vs. Indiana (12/16/17) in the Crossroads Classic, finishing with three points and two rebounds.
- Saw his earliest playing time of the year at Delaware (12/9/17), as he was the second substitute to enter the game in the first half, finished with a three pointer in four minutes of action.
- Connected on his first career three-point field goal in the victory over LSU (11/21/17) at the 2017 Maui Invitational.
- Played 10 minutes in the victory over Chicago State (11/16/17), dishing out four assists.
- Made his Notre Dame debut in the second half against Mount St. Mary's (11/13/17).

### SOPHOMORE SEASON (2017-18)

- Finished the season with 1,348 minutes played, the third-most in school history and 10th-most in the NCAA for 2017-18. His 704 minutes played in ACC games is the second-most in school history.
- Finished the season with 552 points, the ninth-best single-season total for a sophomore in Notre Dame history.
- Posted perhaps his finest game in an Irish uniform against Boston College (2/6/18), scoring a career-best 28 points with five three-point field goals (shooting 8-for-11 from the field), five rebounds and three assists.
- Continued to play big minutes, logging 38 or more minutes for the eighth straight game at Duke, leading the team with 22 points.
- Went all 40 minutes with 27 points, five assists and five three pointers in the regular season contest against Virginia Tech (1/27/18) - including a half court shot to end the first half.
- Played 38 minutes at No. 20/18 Clemson (1/20/18), scoring 18 points with four rebounds and two assists.
- Played a career-high 48 minutes in the double overtime loss to Louisville (1/16/18), finishing with 12 points and two steals.
- Scored 19 points with six assists and five rebounds in the battle vs. North Carolina (1/13/18).
- Dished out a career-high-matching seven assists in the loss at Georgia Tech (1/10/18).
- Earned first ACC Player of the Week award on Monday, January 8, 2018 after leading the Irish to a 2-0 week in the ACC with wins over NC State and at Syracuse, averaging 20.0 ppg, 5.5 rpg and 4.5 apg.
- Carried the Irish through a tough-shooting first half at Syracuse, finishing the first 20 minutes 5-of-10 from the floor with 14 points and three rebounds. The effort kept the Irish in the game, as the rest of the team would finish 1-19 from the floor in the eventual 51-49 victory.

- His two free throws with 2:25 remaining gave Notre Dame its first lead of the game at Syracuse since the Irish were up 1-0 in the early minutes of the contest.
- Stepped up in the victory over NC State (1/3/18), with both Bonzie Colson and Matt Farrell sidelined with injuries, to score 22 points with career-best seven rebounds while shooting seven-of-eight from the free throw line.
- Broke out for 21 points in the victory at Delaware (12/9/17), shooting four-of-seven from three-point range in 38 minutes.
- The key scorer in Notre Dame's victory over LSU (11/21/17) in the Maui Invitational, scoring 26 points with six three pointers and four assists.
- Led the Irish to a season-opening victory at DePaul (11/11/17) with 21 points on 7-of-11 shooting, four three-point field goals and zero turnovers in 38 minutes of action.

### FRESHMAN SEASON (2016-17)

- Provided a spark off the bench against Boston College (3/1/17) with four points, a team-high four assists, three rebounds and two steals - both of them coming during a 15-0 run in the first half to help Notre Dame take control of the game.
- Made his first career start vs. No. 14/15 Florida State (2/11/17), logging 21 minutes, five points, two assists and four rebounds.
- Came off the bench to score 12 points, including 2-for-2 from three-point range against No. 21/21 Duke (1/30/17).
- Played 25 minutes, scoring 12 points (first back-to-back double-digit scoring games of his career) at No. 10/12 Florida State (1/18/17), shooting four-of-five from the field with two three pointers.
- Delivered huge bench minutes in the victory at Virginia Tech (1/14/17), scoring a career-high 13 points while shooting five-of-seven from the floor.
- Played a key role in the road victory at Pittsburgh (12/31/16) - his first career ACC game - stepping up in the second half off the bench to tie the game at 49-49 with a three pointer (13:32 remaining). Also deflected a handful of passes at the top of the 2-3 zone, allowing the Irish to get key defensive stops.
- Logged 20 minutes, scored 12 points and dished off a career-high seven assists in the victory over North Carolina A&T (12/4/16).

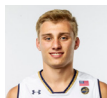

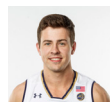
