2019-20 NOTRE DAME WOMEN'S BASKETBALL HEADLINES

- Muffet McGraw
 - 33rd season at Notre Dame, 835-234 (.781)
 - 38th season overall, 923-275 (.770)
 - Fourth fastest coach to reach 900 wins
 - Seven trips to the NCAA Division I national championship game, including six times in the past nine years (2011, 2012, 2014, 2015, 2018 and 2019)
 - Nine trips to the NCAA Women's Final Four (1997, 2001, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2018, 2019) — ranks fourth behind Auriemma, Summitt, VanDerveer.
- What We've Lost
 - Lost all five starters to graduation/WNBA Draft. Became the first starting five to be drafted in top two rounds.
 - 1st pick – Jackie Young, Las Vegas Aces
 - 5th pick – Arike Ogunbowale, Dallas Wings
 - 11th pick – Brianna Turner, Phoenix Mercury
 - 16th pick – Jessica Shepard, Minnesota Lynx
 - 19th pick – Marina Mabrey, LA Sparks
 - In addition, ND became the first program with three players on the WNBA All-Rookie team with Ogunbowale, Young and Turner.
 - Ogunbowale, Young, Mabrey, Shepard and Turner will officially go down as the most prolific scoring five-some in NCAA Division I history. The ND quintet amassed a total of 10,230 points, becoming the first group to ever accumulate 10,000 points or more. The 2017-18 Ohio State squad is in second place with 8,492 points. The highest total on the men's side - the 2008-09 North Carolina team with 8,216 points.
 - Ogunbowale left as the program's all-time leading scorer with 2,626 career points. Mabrey left as the program's leader in made three-pointers with 274. Then Turner left with the program's top marks in both rebounds (1,048) and blocks (372)
 - With combining the starting five with the departures of transfers Danielle Patterson and Jordan Nixon, the Irish has lost 3,201 points of their 3,454 total last year. That equates to 92.7 percent of their offense which (for Power Five schools) ranks only behind the 2017-18 Ohio State Buckeyes. Furthermore, the Irish lost 82.1 ppg, which ranks as the most all-time. All-together, the Irish averaged 88.6 ppg, which ranked first in the country.
 - After 12 years on the coaching staff at Notre Dame, Niele Ivey accepted an assistant coaching position with the Memphis Grizzlies. She became the ninth active female assistant coach in the NBA.
- Program Notes
 - 24 straight NCAA Tournament appearances – fourth longest active streak in the country.
 - The Irish are an impressive 90-5 against ACC opposition since joining the league for the 2013-14 season. Notre Dame is 48-0 inside Purcell Pavilion against ACC foes.
 - Six straight ACC regular season titles. Eight consecutive conference regular season titles dating back to the last two years in the Big East. The eight in a row marks the second highest active streak in the country, behind Baylor (9)
 - Furthermore, the Irish have won the ACC Tournament five times (lone exception came in 2018).

- Notre Dame and UConn extended its series for four more years, adding December contests from 2020-2023. The Irish have defeated UConn five times in the NCAA Tournament, more than doubling the next team's total on the list. Over the past decade, Notre Dame has defeated UConn nine times, while all other Division I teams have combined for eight wins.
 - Over the last 112 games at home, the Irish have only lost three times – all against UConn.
 - Will begin the 2019-20 season with 999 program wins.
 - 232 consecutive weeks ranked inside the AP Poll – which ranks third
 - 67 NCAA Tournament wins – fourth most in Division I
 - What We Have Back
 - Four returning scholarship players: Katelyn Gilbert, Danielle Cosgrove, Abby Prohaska and Mikayla Vaughn.
 - Gilbert played in seven games before a shoulder injury took her out for the season. She averaged 3.6 ppg and scored a season high 14 points vs Gonzaga.
 - Prohaska played in 38 games, with three starts. Was Notre Dame's primary and lone guard option off the bench during the NCAA Tournament. She sparked the third quarter comeback against Stanford in last year's Elite Eight.
 - Cosgrove played in 27 games, averaging 4.9 minutes.
 - Vaughn played in 38 games, averaging 9.6 minutes. Averaged 3.3 ppg and 2.4 rpg.
 - Katie Cole was awarded a scholarship for her senior season.
 - The New Additions
 - Michaela Mabrey joined Muffet McGraw's staff as the new assistant coach. Mabrey graduated from Notre Dame in 2016 and has spent coaching stints at Miami, Miami (Ohio) and LSU. It will also mark the eighth straight year with a Mabrey on campus after her sister Marina graduated in 2019.
 - Graduate transfers Marta Sniezek from Stanford and Destinee Walker from North Carolina.
 - Sniezek
 - Two-time Pac-12 All-Defensive Honorable Mention. Played in 108 games with 50 starts.
 - Became the eighth Stanford freshman to reach 100 assists (109).
 - As a junior for the 2017-18 season, Sniezek averaged 5.5 points, 3.5 rebounds, 4.3 assists, while shooting 35.9 percent from the field. Sniezek scored in double figures six times, including a career high 13 points twice. The Virginia native averaged 6.3 points and 4.3 assists in three NCAA Tournament games.
 - Walker
 - Named to the ACC All-Freshman Team after averaging 13.9 points, 3.7 rebounds and 2.7 assists per game. She led the team in double-digit scoring games with 28, which included a career high of 32 points.
 - Averaged 12.4 points, 3.7 rebounds and 2.0 assists as a sophomore.
 - Twice selected as the team's Defensive Player of the Year.

-
- All-in-all, in 57 career contests at UNC, Walker was a 43.8 percent shooter from two-point range and a career 78.3 percent shooter from the free-throw line.
 - McDonald's All-American Freshmen Sam Brunelle and Anaya Peoples
 - Class Ranking – 11
 - Brunelle ranked 4th – reached as high as No. 1.
 - Brunelle is the reigning Gatorade player of the year in Virginia after averaging 30.0 points, 15.6 points and 13.5 assists per game at William Monroe
 - won a pair of international gold medals in 2018, winning the three-on-three title at the Youth Olympic Games and the five-on-five title at the FIBA U17 World Cup.
 - Two-time Naismith High School All-American, the 2018 Gatorade Virginia POTY, the 2018 USA Today Virginia POTY.
 - Won the three-point contest at the McDonald's All-America game.
 - Finished career with 2,229 points and 1,272 rebounds. Averaged 17.6 ppg and 10.3 rpg as a senior and 30.0 points and 15.6 rebounds as a junior.
 - Peoples ranked 21st
 - Led Schlarman High to back-to-back state titles.
 - Won a gold medal at the 2018 FIBA Americas with the U18 USA team.
 - 2019 Jordan Brand Classic, three-time All-State in Illinois and the 2018 USA Today All-Illinois Player of the Year
 - Finished with 2,086 points.
 - The Schedule
 - Of the 12 non-conference games slated, the Irish will clash with eight teams who made the 2019 NCAA Tournament – five of which were conference champions.
 - Miscellaneous
 - 2015 alum Natalie Achonwa will be this year's Ring of Honor inductee. She will have her banner hung in the rafters alongside Ruth Riley, Skylar Diggins, Niele Ivey, Beth Cunningham and Kayla McBride.
 - Last season, Coach Owens was named the WBCA Division I Assistant Coach of the Year and was also inducted into the A Step Up Assistant Coaches Hall of Fame.
 - This past summer, alumnae Ruth Riley was inducted into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, becoming the first Irish student-athlete to do so.
 - A one-hour documentary on this year's team aired on the ACC Network on Sept. 29.
 - The Irish will debut new white and gold uniforms this season.
