### COUNTDOWN TO PUCK DROP

<b>501</b>	With Notre Dame's 3-2 win over Penn State in the Big Ten Tournament championship game last season, head coach <b>Jeff Jackson</b> recorded his 500th career win, spanning six seasons at Lake Superior State and 14 seasons at Notre Dame. He now has 501 career wins, which ranks second among active NCAA DI head coaches.
<b>51</b>	Over the 2017-18 and 2018-19 seasons, Notre Dame totaled 51 wins to rank fourth in the NCAA and first in the Big Ten over in that time span: 1. Minnesota State (61); 2. St. Cloud State (55); 3. Minnesota Duluth (54); <b>4. Notre Dame (51)</b> ; 5. Northeastern (50); 6. Clarkson (49); 7. Bowling Green (48) and Providence (48)..
<b>13</b>	Thirteen sets of brothers have suited up for the Irish, including current sets of brothers <b>Cal and Cam Burke</b> and <b>Matt and Alex Steeves</b> .
<b>8</b>	With the 2019 Big Ten tournament title, Notre Dame has won eight conference championships in program history, each under <b>Jeff Jackson</b> (three regular-season).
<b>7</b>	With <b>Dennis Gilbert</b> being re-called by Chicago on Oct. 4, seven former Notre Dame players are currently on NHL Rosters: <b>Ian Cole</b> (Colorado Avalanche), <b>Vinnie Hinostroza</b> (Arizona Coyotes), Gilbert (Chicago Blackhawks), <b>Anders Lee</b> (New York Islanders), <b>Kyle Palmieri</b> (New Jersey Devils), <b>Bryan Rust</b> (Pittsburgh Penguins) and <b>Riley Sheahan</b> (Edmonton Oilers). But Cole and Rust are on the IR.
<b>6</b>	With freshman Trevor Janicke joining the program, six father-son combinations have played for the Irish including Trevor and his father, Curtis '93, as well as sophomore Graham Slaggert and his father/Associate Head Coach Andy Slaggert '89.
<b>4</b>	Notre Dame has an active four-year NCAA tournament appearance streak, including Frozen Four appearances in 2017 and 2018, which is the longest streak in program history and is the fourth-longest active streak in the NCAA (the Irish have also appeared in seven of the last 10 NCAA Tournaments).
<b>4</b>	All four of Notre Dame's top goal scorers from last season return for the 2019-20 campaign including <b>Cal Burke</b> (12), <b>Michael Graham</b> (12), <b>Colin Theisen</b> (11) and <b>Cam Morrison</b> (11).
<b>3</b>	<b>Cam Morrison</b> has three career overtime goals, which is tied for the active lead across the NCAA. Two of his three overtime winners have come in postseason play, clinching the 2018 Big Ten Tournament championship with a goal against Ohio State and sending the Irish to the 2019 NCAA Northeast Regional Final with the OT winner versus Clarkson.
<b>.938</b>	<b>Cale Morris'</b> .938 career save percentage is tied with Ohio State's Tommy Nappier for the top mark among returning goaltenders. Morris has made 71 starts to Nappier's 26.

**FOR STARTERS**

- The No. 8/9 Notre Dame Fighting Irish officially open the 2019-20 season this Friday night against Atlantic Hockey foe Air Force.
- The two-game series will be split over Friday night (7 p.m.) and Sunday afternoon (3 p.m.).
- The Irish are 7-6-1 in season openers under Head Coach Jeff Jackson.
- Notre Dame is coming off a program-best fourth consecutive trip to the NCAA tournament in 2018-19 and advanced to a regional final for the third consecutive season (won regional final games in 2017 and 2018 to advance to the Frozen Four).
- The Irish also won the Big Ten Tournament Championship for a second consecutive season in 2019.

**NOTRE DAME 4, USNTDP 1 (RECAP)**

- In exhibition action on Sunday (Oct. 6), Notre Dame erased a 2-0 deficit to post a 4-2 comeback win over the USNTDP at the USA Hockey Arena.
- The Irish penalty kill went 5-for-5, while senior Mike O'Leary had two goals and an assist to lead the Irish offense.
- In net, Notre Dame freshman Ryan Bischel made 17 saves to earn the win, stopping all 13 shots he faced over the second and third periods.
- Senior captain Cal Burke scored the game winner, while sophomore Michael Graham also scored for the Irish.
- Notre Dame out-shot the USNTDP 28-19, while the Irish power play was 0-for-3.
- The game began with Graham Slaggert winning the opening faceoff versus one of his younger brothers, Landon, with their father/Notre Dame Associate Head Coach looking on.
- The Irish improved to 5-2-2 all-time against the USNTDP.

**THE NOTRE DAME - AIR FORCE SERIES**

- Notre Dame and Air Force have met 40 times prior to this weekend but only once since the 1992-93 season.
- Overall, the Irish lead the series 26-12-2, including a 10-3-1 mark at home.
- Thirteen of those home meetings took place at the Joyce Center, while the teams' first contest during the 1965-65 season was played at Howard Park.

- Notre Dame carries a five-game winning streak against the Falcons into the weekend.
- The last meeting between the two teams came on Oct. 28, 2006 at the St. Pete Times Forum, with the Irish winning 2-0 to capture the Lightning College Hockey Classic championship.
- Senior goaltender David Brown was the difference in the game as he stopped all 28 Falcon shots he faced.
- At 3:28 of the second period, sophomore Christian Hanson tucked the rebound of a Justin White shot past Air Force goaltender Ian Harper for his second goal of the weekend -- Hanson was then selected to the all-tournament team and named MVP of the tournament.
- Jason Paige scored the second Fighting Irish goal at 13:23 of the second period.
- Current Irish forward Colin Theisen's brother, Isaac, skated for the Falcons during the 2017-18 season.

## BIG PRESEASON HONORS

- Cale Morris was named a unanimous Preseason All-Big Ten First Team selection and Cal Burke was tabbed as an Honorable Mention honoree (Sept. 30).

## BURKE EARNS CAPTAINCY

- Senior Cal Burke was named the team captain for 2019-20, while his classmates Tory Dello and Cale Morris will take on alternate captain roles.
- Burke served as an alternate captain as a junior.
- Dello and Morris will each be donning a letter for the first time in their Irish careers.
- Morris becomes the second goaltender under Jackson to wear a letter following Cal Petersen, who served as the team's captain for the 2016-17 season.

## IRISH IN THE NHL

- Seven former Notre Dame players have made NHL rosters so far this season, with Dennis Gilbert (Chicago) being recalled on Oct. 4 to join: Ian Cole (Colorado Avalanche), Vinnie Hinostroza (Arizona Coyotes), Anders Lee (New York Islanders), Kyle Palmieri (New Jersey Devils), Bryan Rust (Pittsburgh Penguins) and Riley Sheahan (Edmonton Oilers).
- Unfortunately Cole and Rust are on the IR.
- Lee eclipsed the 50-point mark for the third consecutive season in 2018-19 while serving as captain for the New York Islanders.
- Lee led the Islanders with 28 goals while adding 23 assists in 82 contests and after the season, the Edina, Minnesota, native signed a seven-year, \$49 million contract to stay in New York.
- A 2019 NHL All-Star, Palmieri led the New Jersey Devils with 50 points (27G, 23A) in 74 contests.
- Palmieri is one of three Notre Dame hockey players to be selected in the first round of the NHL Draft, joining Cole and Sheahan.
- Rust, a two-time Stanley Cup Champion with the Pittsburgh Penguins, netted a career-high 18 goals last season while collecting 35 points in 72 games.
- Cole is set to embark on his second season with the Colorado Avalanche after posting 15 points (2G, 13A) in 71 games last season.
- Hinostroza is in his second season with the Arizona Coyotes after posting career-highs in goals (16), assists (23) and points (39) a season ago.

- Sheahan is playing his first season with the Edmonton Oilers in what will be his ninth NHL season.
- In total, 35 former Irish players have seen ice time in the NHL, 20 of whom played at Notre Dame under current head coach Jeff Jackson.

**PRO IRISH WEARING THE "C"**

- While Cal Burke has been named the captain for Notre Dame this season, Irish alums in the professional ranks are also picking up the honor and responsibility of wearing the "C" in 2019-20.
- Anders Lee, who captained the Irish in 2012-13, is in his second season serving as captain of the New York Islanders.
- Steven Fogarty, who was a two-year captain at Notre Dame in 2014-15 and 2015-16, was named the captain of the Hartford Wolfpack (AHL) to start the 2019-20 season.
- Sam Herr, an alternate captain with the Irish in 2015-16, was named the Nottingham Panthers' (EHL) for the 2019-20 season.
- Bo Brauer, a 2018 Notre Dame graduate, was named captain of the Worcester Railers (ECHL) to start the 2019-20 season as well.

**FAMILY TIES**

- The 2019-20 Notre Dame roster features two sets of brothers, Cal and Cam Burke and Matt and Alex Steeves.
- They are the 12th and 13th sets of brothers to skate together at Notre Dame and the first since Ben (2008-11) and Andy Ryan (2012-16).
- Junior goaltender Dylan St. Cyr is the son of Son of Gerry St. Cyr, who played five seasons of professional hockey including the AHL's New Haven Senators and Manon Rheaume, who played goaltender for Canada at the 1998 Olympic Winter Games and in several world championships and who was the first woman to appear in an NHL pre-season game when she skated for the Tampa Bay Lightning in 1992.
- Sophomore forward and South Bend native, Graham Slaggert, joins his father Andy Slaggert who serves as Associate Head Coach and former star for the Irish.
- The Slaggerts were the fifth father-son duo to suit up for Notre Dame.
- Sophomore forward Jake Pivonka is the son of Czech Republic native and former NHL player Michael Pivonka who played over 800 games with the Washington Capitals (1986-99).
- Freshman forward Trevor Janicke is the son of Curtis Janicke, who played for the Irish from 1989-93, appearing in 125 games while scoring 46 goals and adding 98 assists 144 points.
- Trevor and Curtis are now the sixth father-son duo to play for the Irish.
- Freshman forward Solag Bakich is the son of Huntley Bakich, who was a linebacker for the Fighting Irish football team during the Lou Holtz era.

- The win sent Notre Dame to the NCAA Tournament for a program-record fourth consecutive season.
- Spencer Stastney scored his first career goal early in the first period to give the Irish a 1-0 lead and Cal Burke also netted a first period tally for the Irish.
- It marked the eighth championship in program history, all under the guidance of head coach Jeff Jackson:
  - Regular-season: 2006-07 (CCHA), 2008-08 (CCHA), 2017-18 (B1G)
  - Tournament: 2007 (CCHA), 2009 (CCHA), 2013 (CCHA), 2018 & 2019 (B1G)
- To reach the 2019 title game, Notre Dame swept Michigan State in the quarterfinals (March 8-9) and then defeated Minnesota in the semifinals with Michael Graham's power-play goal 53 seconds into overtime proving to be the difference (March 16).
- In the first three Big Ten tournament games, Mike O'Leary, Pierce Crawford and Michael Graham accounted for Notre Dame's game-winning goals.
- Cale Morris posted a 0.75 goals-against average and a .977 save percentage in the 2019 Big Ten Tournament.

**HEAD COACH  
JEFF JACKSON**



- The 2019-20 season marks University of Notre Dame hockey coach Jeff Jackson's 15th season behind the Irish bench.
- The highly regarded Jackson now has over 30 years of coaching experience and is coming off back-to-back Big Ten championship seasons while also guiding the Irish to the 2018 national title game en route to being named the Spencer Penrose Award winner as the National Coach of the Year.
- Jackson was also named the Spencer Penrose award winner in 2007 and he is one of just 14 coaches to have earned the honor multiple times (dating back to 1951).
- Additionally, Jackson is the only coach to have earned the honor multiple times in the last 15 seasons.
- Notre Dame's Jeff Jackson era began in 2005 when the University searched for a coach who could move the program among the elite hockey schools in the country.
- Jackson's Notre Dame teams have made 10 trips to the NCAA Championship (2007-09, 2011, 2013-14, 2016-19), advancing to the Frozen Four four times and playing in the 2008 and 2018 national title games.
- During his 14-year run, Notre Dame has become one of the nation's top teams while playing in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association, Hockey East and now Big Ten.
- Under Jackson, the Irish won the CCHA regular-season title twice (2006-07 and 2008-09) while earning three Mason Cup championships (2007, 2009 and the final one in 2013).
- Then, in the team's first season in the Big Ten (2017-18), Notre Dame captured both the regular season and conference championships and followed up by once again winning the conference tournament in year two (2018-19).
- Jackson's success on the ice also has had a major impact off the ice for the Irish. With the wins came a commitment from the University that led to the new home of Irish hockey — The Compton Family Ice Arena — one of the finest college hockey facilities in the nation. The venue opened for business on Oct. 21, 2011.
- Since Jackson's arrival, the Irish have had 35 players selected in the National Hockey League Entry Draft, including three first round selections. In that same span, 24 players from USA Hockey's National Team

In addition, 19 of Jackson's Notre Dame players have gone on to play in the NHL.
- Jackson entered the 2019-20 season with a 20-year collegiate record of 501-243-82 for a .656 winning percentage, the second-highest winning percentage among all active coaches with five years or more in Division I (entering 2019-20).
- To start the 2019-20 season, Jackson's 501 career wins ranked tied for 12th all-time in Division I and second among active coaches (entering 2019-20).
