BY THE NUMBERS

1	Dick Corbett Head Football Coach Brian Kelly is just one win away from tying Knute Rockne (105) for most wins all-time by a Notre Dame coach.
4	Since the start of 2018, Notre Dame is 35-5 (.875). That rate ranks fourth among all teams who have made an appearance in the College Football Playoff since its inception in 2014. Among those teams, Notre Dame is one of just four teams that have totaled five or fewer losses (Clemson, Alabama, Ohio State) since the start of 2018.
8	Notre Dame has won eight-straight games against in-state opponents. Their last lost against an in-state foe was against Purdue on Sept. 29, 2007.
10	With the win over Toledo, Notre Dame has won 10-consecutive home openers under Brian Kelly. It ties for the longest win streak in home-openers since 1964-73, when Ara Parseghian also won 10-straight home openers.
11	Brian Kelly improved his home opening record to 11-1 after the win over Toledo. He is now tied with Knute Rockne for the most home opening wins in Notre Dame history.
11	Linebacker JD Bertrand led the Irish in tackles with 11 for the second-straight game against Toledo. He is the first Irish defender to have back-to-back games with double digit tackles since Alohi Gilman in 2018 (Southern Cal and Clemson).
25	Notre Dame has won 25-consecutive games at home, setting its modern-era record for longest home win streak. It is the second longest active streak in FBS.
34	With the 32-29 win over Toledo, the Irish have won 34-straight games against unranked opponents dating back to the 2016 season.
105	The Irish have 105 wins all-time over in-state opponents with a record of 105-33-4 (.754).
373[^]	Career games coached by Brian Kelly, second among active NCAA coaches to Mack Brown (North Carolina).
2009	With the 32-29 win over Toledo, Notre Dame won both of its first two games by three points. It is the first time since 2009 that the Irish won back-to-back games by three points or less.

MEDIA INFORMATION

GAME CREDENTIALS

All requests for working press and broadcast credentials for Notre Dame's 2021 home football games must be made through the online credential form at UND.com/credentials. Because of the demand for credentials and the limited space available, media agencies covering the visiting school on a regular basis receive top priority. All other credentials for print media are issued on the basis of circulation. Only local radio stations with a full-time sports director conducting a daily sports show receive consideration for credentials. Non-originating, out-of-town radio stations cannot be accommodated.

CREDENTIAL DISTRIBUTION

Media credentials will neither be mailed nor will be available for early pickup. Credentials will ONLY be distributed on game day at the Hammes Auditorium (the Joyce Center's basketball interview room, located between Gates 1 and 2). A government-issued ID is required for pickup and each individual must claim only his/her own pass. All media members MUST be vaccinated to cover a Notre Dame home game this season. If you have not attended a Notre Dame event before the game, you must show your vaccine card at credential distribution in order to gain entrance to the event.

PARKING

Parking requests will be accommodated on a space-available basis. Parking passes will be electronic for the 2021 season. They will be sent out during the week of the game.

BRIAN KELLY AVAILABILITY

The Dick Corbett Head Football Coach Brian Kelly conducts a weekly press conference at noon ET each Monday in person in the Notre Dame Stadium Media Room and also available via zoom. The half hour weekly conference previews the upcoming game. All media members who plan to attend the session in person MUST be vaccinated. To obtain the link for Monday's press conference, media members should contact assistant athletics director, football communications Katy Lonergan.

STUDENT-ATHLETE INTERVIEWS

Interviews with Notre Dame student-athletes will occur on Tuesday during each game week in person at the Irish Athletics Center and also via zoom. All media members who plan to attend the session in person MUST be vaccinated. Interview requests for student-athletes must be submitted to Katy Lonergan by Noon ET the Sunday before the proposed interview. A player availability schedule will be distributed each Monday during the season. Media are not permitted to directly contact student-athletes or coaches to arrange interviews.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS

Post-game interviews for Dick Corbett Head Football Coach Brian Kelly and Notre Dame players will be held in the Stadium Media Room, along with zoom. Requests for student-athlete interviews should be submitted by the eight-minute mark of the fourth quarter to Katy Lonergan. For home games, submit to Katy Lonergan via email or Matt Paras (located in the press box or available by email at mparas1@nd.edu). Transcripts from Coach Kelly's presser will be available approximately 60 minutes following the conclusion of his post-game comments.

STATISTICAL SERVICES

All media members will be provided with access to game notes via UND.com. At the quarter breaks and halftime, quickie stats and drive charts will be distributed via email. Following the game, a complete post-game statistics package will be distributed via email and will contain a scoring summary, final team statistics, final individual statistics, complete play-by-play, drive charts for both halves, halftime statistics, defensive statistics, substitution chart, post-game quotes from both head coaches and players and post-game notes. Live in-game statistics will be available via StatBroadcast.

Following each Notre Dame home game, the athletic communications office will be happy to email whatever information media members need to their respective agencies. Please ask any member of the athletic communications staff for assistance on this matter.

NOTRE DAME STADIUM

- In its 92nd season as the home of Fighting Irish Football, Notre Dame boasts a 364-114-5 (.759) record in Notre Dame Stadium.



HOME FIELD WIN STREAK

- Notre Dame has won 25-straight games at home dating back to Sept. 30, 2017, starting with a victory over Miami (Ohio) and extending to this season with the win over Toledo (32-29).
- It continues the modern-era record for longest home winning streak for the Irish (28-straight from 1942-50). With the 52-0 shutout of South Florida, the Irish topped the previous modern streak of 19-straight from 1987-90.
- Clemson is the only Power 5 program that boasts a home streak of more than 25 games:

- With the win over Syracuse in the 2020 home finale, the Irish completed an undefeated home slate for the third-consecutive season, after two-straight perfect home seasons in 2018-19.
- Notre Dame had not achieved three-straight undefeated home seasons since 1987-89.
- Football student-athletes who are true seniors have not lost a home game in their careers and boast a 20-0 record in Notre Dame Stadium.

BEATING NO. 1 AT HOME

- The last two times the Irish have played at Notre Dame Stadium as a top-five team against a No. 1 program, the Irish are undefeated (1993 vs. Florida State and 2020 vs. Clemson).

HOME SWEET HOME

- With the Irish trailing by five with 1:35 left in the home-opener against Toledo, quarterback **Jack Coan** led the Irish on the 75-yard game-winning drive in just three plays that was capped off with an 18-yard touchdown pass to **Michael Mayer**. After the two-point conversion, the Irish took a 32-29 lead that they would not relinquish to improve to 2-0 on the season.
- It was **Coan's** first game-winning drive in the final two minutes of the game in his career and it improved his career record to 14-6 as a starter.
- The last time the Irish had a game-winning drive in the final minutes of the game was in 2019 when Ian Book led an 18-play, 87-yard touchdown drive to defeat Virginia Tech 21-20.
- Coan** finished the game with 239 yards and two touchdowns. It is just the third time in his career that he has had back-to-back multi-touchdown games.
- Fellow quarterback **Tyler Buchner** made his collegiate debut against the Rockets and ripped off a 26-yard run on the first snap of his career.
- Buchner** led the Irish on a five-play, 96-yard drive in his first-career series than ended in a 43-yard touchdown run from **Kyren Williams**.
- In the fourth quarter, **Buchner** recorded his first touchdown pass when he connected with **Chris Tyree** for a 55-yard strike.
- It was **Tyree's** longest-career-reception and his first-receiving touchdown of his career.
- The win extended Notre Dame's longest modern era home winning streak to 25 games, a streak that dates back to the 2017 season.
- The Irish also collected their 34th-consecutive win over an unranked opponent with the victory over Toledo.
- The win gave the Irish their second-consecutive win by three points or less. It is the first time since the 2009 season that Notre Dame has won back-to-back games by three points or less. In 2009, the Irish defeated Michigan State 33-30 and followed it up with a 24-21 win over Purdue.
- Notre Dame won its first game when trailing at halftime since Sep. 28, 2019, when they defeated Virginia, 35-20, after trailing, 17-14, at the half.

BE LIKE MIKE

- Tight end **Michael Mayer** was a ball magnet again for the Irish in the win over Toledo, as he led the team in receptions and receiving yards for the third-straight game dating back to last season.
- Mayer** finished the game with seven receptions for 81 yards and two touchdowns.
- It was the first time in **Mayer's** career that he tallied a multi-touchdown game.
- He has three touchdowns through two games this season,

surpassing last year's total of two for the entire season.

- Dating back to last season, **Mayer** has collected seven or more receptions in his last three games. The last Irish receiver to have three-consecutive games with seven or more receptions was Michael Floyd in 2011 (Maryland - 8; Boston College - 10 and Stanford - 8).
- Through two games this season, **Mayer** has totaled 16 receptions for 201 yards and three touchdowns.
- Among tight ends in FBS, his is tied for the national lead for touchdowns and ranks second in receptions and receiving yards.

BALLIN' BERTRAND

- Linebacker **JD Bertrand** has a knack for the ball as he led the Irish in tackles for the second straight game against Toledo.
- Bertrand** totaled 11 tackles against Toledo to lead the squad, after he tallied 11 tackles in the season-opener against Florida State.
- He is the first Irish player to have back-to-back double digit tackle games since Alohi Gilman in 2018. Gilman had 10 tackles against Southern Cal and then 18 against Clemson in the College Football Playoff Semifinal.
- His 22 tackles this season ranks eighth in the country and he is tied for second in the NCAA with 16 solo tackles.
- Bertrand** also set a career high with 1.0 sacks against Toledo and recovered his first career fumble to seal the game in the fourth quarter.

BATTLE OF THE SHILLELAGH TROPHY

- For the first time since 2014, Notre Dame and Purdue will meet for the Battle of the Shillelagh Trophy this upcoming weekend.
- The Irish lead the all-time series against the Boilermakers 58-26-2 (.686) that dates all the way back to the 1896 season.
- The game had occurred annually from 1946 up until their previous meeting in 2014. The two teams were set to meet last season before COVID-19 altered both team's schedules.
- The Irish have won their last seven games against the Boilermakers, keeping the Shillelagh Trophy on campus since the 2008 season.
- The Irish currently hold all five of their traveling trophies (Jeweled Shillelagh, USC; Leahy Memorial Bowl, Boston College; Legends Trophy, Stanford and the Megaphone Trophy, Michigan State) and have had all five since the 2018 season.

SUNDAY'S BEST

- The Irish opened the 2021 season as the only college football game on Labor Day Sunday and they did not disappoint in their 41-38 overtime thriller over the Seminoles.

PURDUE - THE LAST TIME

- **September 13, 2014 - Notre Dame 30, Purdue 14:** Everett Golson was quick on his feet Saturday night. He had to be. With Amir Carlisle out with an injured right knee and an already short-handed defense getting even thinner, Golson did what he does best - tucked the ball and improvised. The senior quarterback scrambled for a 15-yard touchdown just before halftime to erase Notre Dame's first deficit of the season, kept a second-half TD drive going with a 17-yard completion on the run and helped the 11th-ranked Fighting Irish score the final 20 points to pull away from rival Purdue 30-14.
- Golson finished 25 of 40 for 259 yards with two touchdown passes and ran 18 times for a season-high 56 yards and one touchdown, the nifty scramble that gave Notre Dame the lead for good.
- The combination was good enough to send the Shillelagh Trophy back to South Bend, Indiana, for a seventh consecutive year, where it will stay until these teams resume the rivalry in 2020 following a five-year hiatus. The series has been played every year since 1946.

PURDUE CONNECTIONS

- Current NBC color analyst Drew Brees was the quarterback at Purdue from 1997-2000. He started three games against Notre Dame and was 1-2 in his career against the Irish. The Irish came out on top in both games at Notre Dame Stadium (31-30, 1998 and 23-21, 2000). Brees picked up his only win against the Irish in 1999 at home, 28-23.
- Current Purdue special teams coordinator Marty Biagi was a special teams analyst for the Irish during the 2016 season.

- Graduate student **Jonathan Doerer** hit a 41-yard field goal in the first overtime to clinch the win for the Irish. He was awarded the game ball following the game. He was also named a Lou Groza Award Star of the Week following his performance against the Seminoles.
- It was the first Irish win on the final play of the game since 2014 when the Irish defeated LSU in the Music City Bowl on a 32-yard Kyle Brindza field goal as time expired.
- Notre Dame recorded its first overtime road win in program history against the Seminoles. The Irish were previously 0-3 in road overtime games since it was adopted prior to the 1996 season.
- The Irish continued a number of streaks with their win Sunday night. They won their 33rd-consecutive game against an unranked opponent, which dates back to the 2016 season.
- Notre Dame also extended its regular season winning streak to 20-games against ACC opponents. The Irish are 24-1 against ACC foes in the regular season since the beginning of the 2017 season.
- The Irish also claimed their fifth-consecutive season opening win. Notre Dame improved to 10-2 under head coach **Brian Kelly** in season openers.
- Notre Dame tallied 41 points in the win, the most in a season-opener since 2017 when they scored 49 in the win over Temple.
- The Irish improved to 26-5-2 in true road games to open the season with the win. They have won four of their last five true road season-openers.
- Notre Dame has won 23-consecutive games when they have scored 40 or more points. The Irish are 37-2 all-time under Kelly when they score 40 or more points.

THE MAYER OF TALLAHASSEE

- Sophomore tight end **Michael Mayer** did not waste any time making an impact this season for the Irish, as he was the main target on their very first drive of the season.
- One the first play from scrimmage, Coan hit Mayer in the flat for a 25-yard pass. Four plays later, the pair connected on a 41-yard touchdown pass on fourth-and-one to put the Irish ahead 7-0. The 41-yard reception was a career best mark for Mayer.
- At the half, Mayer had five receptions for 89 yards. The 89 yards had already bested his previous career high mark of 73 yards.
- He finished the game with 120 receiving yards for his first 100-yard game of his career.
- He was the first Irish tight end to record a 100-yard game since Cole Kmet had 108 yards against Georgia in 2019.
- He finished the night with career-best marks in receptions (nine) and yards (120).
- The 120 yards receiving was the most by an Irish tight end since Sept. 11, 2010 when Kyle Rudolph hauled in 164 yards against Michigan.
- It also ranks fifth all-time in Notre Dame history for most receiving yards in a single game by a tight end.
- He tied for the NCAA lead for receiving yards among tight ends in Week 1. He was the only player tied for the lead who played in a true road game.

JACK OF ALL TRADES

- Graduate student **Jack Coan** had one of the best games of his collegiate career as he set career highs with 366 yards and four touchdowns along with tying a career high with 26 completions in the win over Florida State.
- The 366 yards set a Notre Dame record for most passing yards in a season-opening game. The previous record was held by current offensive coordinator **Tommy Rees** when he threw for 346 yards against Temple in 2013.
- **Coan** also tied the Notre Dame record for most passing touchdowns in a season-opener with four. He tied with Jimmy Clausen (2009) and Ron Powulus (1994).
- His 366 yards ranked fifth nationally for Week 1 and he was the only quarterback in the Top-5 who had a true road game.
- He became the eighth-straight quarterback to record a win in their first start with the Irish, a streak dating back to the 2007 season.
- On the first drive of the game, **Coan** connected with **Michael Mayer** for a 41-yard touchdown pass on fourth-and-one to give the Irish an early 7-0 advantage just over two minutes into the game.
- **Coan** got the Irish back in front when he hit **Joe Wilkins**

I AM KYLE HAMILTON

- Junior safety Kyle Hamilton made his presence known in the season opening win over the Seminoles.
- He recorded two interceptions for the first multi-interception game of his career. He also totaled six tackles on the night.
- Hamilton was tied for the lead nationally for interceptions during Week 1. He was just one of two players to have two interceptions in true road games.
- He is the first Irish to record two interceptions in a game since Alohi Gillman had two against Syracuse in 2018.
- After both interceptions, the Irish offense scored a touchdown.

CHASING ROCKNE

- Head coach **Brian Kelly** is in his 12th season at the helm of the Fighting Irish and is on the tail of one of the greatest coaches in team history.
- **Kelly** sits second all-time in wins at Notre Dame with 104⁺ and is just one win shy of tying Knute Rockne for the most all-time in Notre Dame history.
- **Kelly** stands alone as the only Irish coach in history to post six seasons with 10 wins or more (2012⁺, 2015, 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020).
- **Kelly** is just the second coach in Notre Dame history to coach 12 or more years in South Bend (Rockne - 13).
- Last season, **Kelly** eclipsed the 100-win plateau after a 45-31 road win over Boston College, which tied Lou Holtz for second all-time in wins.
- The very next week, **Kelly** surpassed Holtz when the Irish defeated No. 19 North Carolina on the road, 31-17.

2021 CAPTAINS

- Dick Corbett Head Football Coach Brian Kelly announced seven team captains for Notre Dame's 2021 football campaign this fall. They include Avery Davis, Kyle Hamilton, Kurt Hinish, Jarrett Patterson, Myron Tagovailoa-Amosa, Drew White and Kyren Williams. All seven players were SWAT captains during the summer workouts.
- The seven captains tie for the most in a single season in Notre Dame history. The Irish named seven captains prior to the 2017 and 2019 seasons.

RUN IT BACK

- The Irish return a stable of experienced running backs heading into the 2021 season.
- Led by the 2020 Second Team All-American and ACC Rookie of the Year **Kyren Williams**, the Irish return 2,010 rushing yards from the previous season.
- **Chris Tyree** and **C'Bo Flemister** round out the running back group returning from last season and the trio all had at least one 100-yard rushing game in 2020.
- The Irish were one of three Power 5 teams to have 100-yard rushing performances from three or more players.
- The Irish were one of just two schools to have three separate running backs achieve that feat in 2020.
- Tyree and Williams were the first 100-yard rushing tandem for the Irish since 2017 against Southern Cal when Josh Adams and Brandon Wimbush both rushed for over 100-yards in the win.
- Tyree also went over the 100-yard plateau in the regular season finale against Syracuse. He busted off a 94-yard run for a touchdown which was the longest rushing play

of the season for an Irish player. It is the longest rush since Dexter Williams scampered for a 97-yard touchdown against Virginia Tech in 2018.

- Flenister went over the 100-yard mark in the 52-0 win over South Florida. He rushed for 127 yards on the afternoon to break the 100-yard mark for the first time in his career.

NEW SHERIFF IN TOWN

- After spending four years at Wisconsin to begin his collegiate career, graduate student Jack Coan transferred to the Irish in the Spring of 2021.
- He played in 25 games for the Badgers, and made 18 starts to finish with a 12-6 career record.
- Coan finished his career at UW third all-time in completion percentage (68%) and third in pass efficiency rating (144.7).
- Prior to this season, Coan was named to the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award Watch List.

CHANGING OF THE GUARD

- After having one of the most experienced offensive lines in the country in 2020, the Irish have a number of new faces on the line this year.
- **Jarrett Patterson** and **Josh Lugg** are the two most experienced lineman returning from the 2020 squad.
- Patterson, a team captain for 2021, has made 22 career starts in his career and is coming off a 2020 season where he was named an honorable mention All-American by Phil Steele.
- Heading into this season, Patterson was named to the Rimington Trophy, Outland Trophy and Rotary Lombardi Award Watch Lists.
- Lugg has played in 38 games and made nine starts on the line.
- In 2020, he played in 11 of 12 games and made three starts for the offensive line that was a finalist for the Joe Moore Award.
- Prior to this season, Lugg was one of six Irish named to the Reese's Senior Bowl Watch List.
- An impact transfer who will help the Irish on the offensive line is **Cain Madden** who joins the Irish from Marshall.
- Madden was a 2020 Walter Camp Second Team All-American and an AP Second Team All-American.
- He started 9-of-10 games for the Thundering Herd in 2020 and the offensive line paved the way for Marshall to outrush their opponents in 7-of-10 games and outpass opponents in six.
- Prior to the 2021 season, Madden has earned preseason All-American honors from Walter Camp (first team) and the Associated Press (second team). He was also named to the Outland Trophy and Rotary Lombardi Award Watch Lists.

DEEP DEFENSIVE LINE

- Even after losing two starters from last year to the NFL Draft, the Irish bring back some of their most experienced players on the defensive line.
- Graduate student **Kurt Hinish** is the most experienced player returning on the team as he has played 52 games in his career, starting in 27-consecutive games over the past three seasons.
- In 2020, Hinish had the best season of his career with a career-best 19 tackles, 7.5 tackles-for-loss and 2.0 sacks.
- Hinish was one of the seven captains named prior to the 2021 season.
- Fellow graduate student **Myron Tagovailoa-Amosa** also brings a wealth of experience back on the line as he has logged 40 games played and 22 starts in his career.
- In 2020, Tagovailoa-Amosa posted career-high numbers with six tackles-for-loss and 2.5 sacks. After the season, he earned second team All-ACC honors.
- Heading into 2021, he joined Hinish in being named one of the seven team captains.
- Tagovailoa-Amosa is also on a number of watch lists heading into the season including the Nagurski Trophy, Wuerffel Trophy, Reese's Senior Bowl and Polynesian Player of the Year. He was also named to the AFCA Good Works Team this preseason.

SUPER SECONDARY

- As with much of the Irish defense, experience reigns key, especially with the secondary unit.
- Leading the secondary cast is junior **Kyle Hamilton** who has played and started in 26-of-27 games through his first three seasons.
- In 2020, Hamilton led the defense with 63 tackles, including 51 solo. He was also one of seven defenders to tally an interception on the season.
- After the season, Hamilton earned All-American honors from the Football Writers Association (first team), Phil Steele (first team), the American Football Coaches Association (second team), Walter Camp (second team) and The Athletic (second team).
- 2021 is no different in terms of accolades for Hamilton. He was named a preseason first team All-American by Walter Camp and the Associated Press.
- Hamilton is also on a number of preseason watch lists including Bednarik Award, Thorpe Award, Nagurski Trophy, Lott IMPACT Trophy and Walter Camp Player of the Year Watch List.
- Fellow safety **Houston Griffith** joins Hamilton in bringing experience back to the secondary.
- Griffith has played in 38 games in his Irish career, including each game over the past three seasons.
- Last season, Griffith tied a career-best with 14 tackles, including a career-high 13 solo tackles.

- Sophomore **Clarence Lewis** burst onto the scene in his freshman season in 2020.
- He played in all 12 games last year and made six starts, including earning a start in just his second collegiate game.
- He earned ACC Defensive Back of the Week honors after recording a career-best 12 tackles and one forced fumble in the regular-season-finale win against Syracuse.
- The 12 tackles were the most by an Irish player since Julian Love had 12 in 2018 against Southern Cal.
- After the season, Lewis was named a second team Freshman All-American by The Athletic.

LETHAL LINEBACKERS

- Senior captain **Drew White** leads the group of returning linebackers back who look to thrive in Marcus Freeman's new defense.
- White has played in 31 career games and made starts in 26 of the last 27 games for the Irish.
- He earned the game ball in Notre Dame's road win over No. 19 North Carolina, after posting five tackles, 2.0 tackles-for-loss, 0.5 sacks and one pass breakup.
- White led the Irish with nine tackles in the College Football Playoff Semifinal Game against Alabama.
- Heading into this season, he was named a team captain and is on the Reese's Senior Bowl Watch List.
- Sophomore **Jack Kiser** adds to the Irish depth at linebacker after coming onto the scene in 2020 against South Florida.
- In his first career start, he led the Irish with eight tackles (seven solo) and added 2.0 tackles-for-loss and one QB hurry. After the game, Kiser was awarded the game ball.
- Another sophomore in the mix at linebacker is **JD Bertrand**.
- Bertrand played in 11 games last season, mainly on special teams. He has played in 15 games over the past two seasons.



NOTRE DAME ACC SCHEDULING AGREEMENT

- In a partnership that began in 2014, the University of Notre Dame and the Atlantic Coast Conference agreed to schedule the Irish to play, on average, five ACC opponents each season. Originally scheduled through the 2025 season, the games have now been scheduled through the 2037 campaign.
- Notre Dame is 32-7 (.821) against ACC opponents since the scheduling agreement began during the 2014 season:

- In 2020, the Irish went 9-0 in ACC play, with wins over Duke, Florida State, Louisville, Pitt, Georgia Tech, Clemson, Boston College, North Carolina and Syracuse.
- In 2019, the Irish went undefeated against the ACC, beating Louisville, Virginia, Virginia Tech, Duke and Boston College as part of the scheduling agreement.
- The Irish improved to 24-1 in regular-season games against Atlantic Coast Conference opponents over the last four seasons (2017-21).
- Notre Dame has won nine-straight ACC road games and 12-consecutive ACC home games.
- There have been, and in the future there will be, seasons when the Irish face just four ACC opponents but will eventually even out the agreement by facing six ACC teams in another year (this occurred in 2014 and 2015 and is set to occur in 2021-22 and 2022-23).

- OL Liam Eichenberg (second round, Miami Dolphins), OL Aaron Banks (second round, San Francisco 49ers), LB Jeremiah Owusu-Koramoah (second round, Cleveland Browns), TE Tommy Tremble (third round, Carolina Panthers), OL Robert Hainsey (third round, Tampa Bay Buccaneers), QB Ian Book (fourth round, New Orleans Saints), DL Daelin Hayes (fifth round, Baltimore Ravens), DL Ade Ogundeji (fifth round, Atlanta Falcons) and WR Ben Skowronek (seventh round, Los Angeles Rams) represented the Irish in the 2021 NFL Draft.
- The nine draft picks were the most during the Brian Kelly era and the most all-time since the 1994 draft when 10 players were selected.

BRIAN KELLY - THE DICK CORBETT HEAD FOOTBALL COACH

- Winningest coach in FBS (275^{*} wins)
- One of only four active FBS coaches with more than 300 games as a head coach.
- With the win over North Carolina, Kelly passed Lou Holtz to claim sole possession of second all-time in program history in career wins at Notre Dame.
- Joins Knute Rockne (13), Frank Leahy (11), Ara Parseghian (11) and Lou Holtz (11) as the only Notre Dame coaches to spend 10 or more seasons on the Irish sidelines.
- Only three-time winner of the Home Depot Coach of the Year Award ('09, '12, '18)
- With 10 or more wins in 2012^{*}, 2015, 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020, Kelly is the only Notre Dame coaches to hit the double-digit mark in wins six times.
- With 10-win seasons in five of the last six years, Kelly is the first Irish coach to have five seasons of double-digit wins in a six-year stretch since Lou Holtz from 1988-93.
- Notched his first win over an AP No. 1 team with the 47-40 win over Clemson (Nov. 8, 2020)
- Ranks second in winning percentage among active FBS coaches (.740^{*}) who have coached in 300 or more career games (Nick Saban - .798).
- Second-youngest coach to reach 200 career victories at a major school.
- Has finished .500 or better in 28 of 30 seasons as a head coach.
